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

If you have problems, do not attempt to repair the unit yourself. Return it to your Alpine dealer or the nearest Alpine Service Station for servicing.

Do not grip or pull out the disc while it is being pulled back into the player by the automatic reloading mechanism.

Inserting Discs


Your player accepts only one disc at a time for playback. Do not attempt to load more than one disc.

Make sure the label side is facing up when you insert the disc. Your player will automatically eject any disc that is inserted incorrectly. If the player continues to eject a correctly inserted disc, push the RESET switch with a pointed object such as a ballpoint pen.

Playing a disc while driving on a very bumpy road may result in skips, but this will not scratch the disc or damage the player.

New Discs

As a protective measure to prevent the CD from jamming, the CD player will automatically eject discs with irregular surfaces or inserted incorrectly. When a new disc is inserted into the player and ejected after initial loading, using your finger, feel around the inside of the centre hole and outside edge of the disc. If you feel any small bumps or irregularities, this could inhibit proper loading of the disc. To remove the bumps, rub the inside edge of the hole and outside edge of the disc with a ball-point pen or other such instrument, then insert the disc again.



Irregular Shaped Discs

Be sure to use round shape discs only for this unit and never use any special shape discs.

Use of special shape discs may cause damage to the mechanism.




Installation Location

Make sure the CDA-7998/CDA-7897 will not be installed in a location subjected to:

- Direct sun and heat
- High humidity and water
- Excessive dust
- Excessive vibrations

Correct Handling

Do not drop the disc while handling. Hold the disc so you will not leave fingerprints on the surface. Do not affix tape, paper, or gummed labels to the disc. Do not write on the disc.




Disc Cleaning

Fingerprints, dust, or soil on the surface of the disc could cause the CD player to skip. For routine cleaning, wipe the playing surface with a clean, soft cloth from the centre of the disc to the outer edge. If the surface is heavily soiled, dampen a clean, soft cloth in a solution of mild neutral detergent before cleaning the disc.




Disc Accessories

There are various accessories available on the market for protecting the disc surface and improving sound quality. However, most of them will influence the thickness and/or diameter of the disc. Using such accessories can cause the disc to be out of standard specifications and may create operational problems. We recommend not using these accessories on discs played in Alpine CD players.




Basic Operation



Opening the Front Panel

f 1 Press the **Open** button on the Front Panel.



NOTE

The display will close a half minute after the ignition key is turned to the OFF position.

Hiding the Front Panel

1 Press and hold the ≜ button on the Front Panel for at least 3 seconds.


NOTES

- The Front Panel will stop moving if there is an obstacle inside the compartment. In that case, remove the obstacle and press and hold the ≜ button again for at least 3 seconds.
- The display will close shortly after the ignition key is turned to the OFF position.

Initial System Start-Up

Be sure to press the RESET switch when using the unit for the first time, after installing the CD changer, etc., or after changing the car battery.

- Make sure that the power of the unit is off. If the power is on, press and hold the POWER button for at least 3 seconds to turn off the unit.
- 2 Press the RESET switch with a ball-point pen, or any other pointed object.



Turning Power On and Off

1 Press the **POWER** button to turn on the unit.

NOTE


The unit can be turned on by pressing any other button except the eject \(\Delta\) button, Rotary encoder and CLK button (CDA-7897 only).

The volume level gradually increases to the previous level you were listening to before the unit was turned off. Press and hold the **POWER** button for at least 3 seconds to turn off the unit.

NOTE

The first time power is turned on, the volume will start from level 12

Display Angle Adjustment



The movable display may be adjusted to 3 different angles depending upon user preference.

1 Press the ANGLE ▲▼ button to adjust the angle of the movable display.


NOTES

- The display will close a half minute after the ignition key is turned to the OFF position.
- The adjusted angle of the display is stored in memory. There
 is no need to re-adjust the angle when the power is turned
 back on.

CAUTION

Keep hands (or any other object) away from the display while it is opening or closing to avoid damage or injury. The back of the movable display will get very warm under normal operating conditions. This is not a malfunction. Do not touch.

Adjusting Volume/Balance (Between Left and Right)/Fader (Between Front and Rear)/Defeat

1 Press the MODE button repeatedly to choose the desired mode.

Each press changes the modes as follows:

Press the I◀◀ DN or ▶►I UP button after selecting the Subwoofer mode, and the subwoofer output phase is toggled "NORMAL (PHASE 0°)" or "REVERS (PHASE 180°)".

NOTES

- If the MODE button is not pressed within 5 seconds after selecting the BALANCE, FADER, DEFEAT or Subwoofer mode, the unit automatically returns to the VOLUME mode.
- When setting the 2WAY/3WAY switch (page 47) to 3WAY, you cannot adjust the FADER mode.
- *When the subwoofer mode is OFF, its level cannot be adjusted.
- 2 Turn the Rotary encoder until the desired sound is obtained in each mode.

NOTE

Depending on the connected devices, some functions and display indications do not work.

Audio Mute Function

Activating this function will instantly lower the volume level by 20 dB.


1 Press the MUTE button to activate the MUTE mode. The audio level will decrease by about 20 dB.


Pressing the **MUTE** button again will bring the audio back to its previous level.

Displaying Time

1 Press the CLK (clock) button repeatedly until the time is displayed.

Each press changes the modes as follows:





- *1 Displayed during playback of a disc with CD Text. "NO TEXT" will be displayed when the CD contains no Text data.
- *2 "NO TITLE" will be displayed when the title has not been inputted.

NOTES

- Selecting any tuner or CD function while in the clock mode will interrupt the time display momentarily. The function selected will be displayed for about 5 seconds before the time returns to the display.
- When the power is off but the ignition key is on, press the CLK button to display the time. (CDA-7897 only)

Setting Time

In the Clock display mode, press and hold the CLK (clock) button for at least 3 seconds while the time is displayed.

< CDA-7998 only >

- 2 Turn the Rotary encoder to adjust the hours while the years indication is blinking.
- When the year has been adjusted, press MODE button.
- 4 Turn the **Rotary encoder** to adjust the months, days, hours and minutes while the time indication is blinking. The time is automatically set 5 seconds after the minute adjustment. The time can be manually set by pressing the **MODE** button.

< CDA-7897 only >

- 2 Turn the Rotary encoder to adjust the hours while the hours indication is blinking.
- When the hour has been adjusted, press MODE button

4 Turn the **Rotary encoder** to adjust the minutes while the time indication is blinking. The time is automatically set 5 seconds after the minute adjustment. The time can be manually set by pressing the **MODE** button.

NOTE

To synchronize the clock to a time signal, press the MODE button for at least 3 seconds after setting the "hour." Minutes will be indicated as 00. If you press the MODE button for more than 3 seconds when the display shows over "30," hours will advance.

Equalizer Presets

3 typical equalizer settings are preset at the factory for a variety of musical source material.

- 1 Press the **EQ** button and select the EQ mode.
- 2 Press either the I◄◀ DN button or the ►►I UP button.
 - With each press of the button, the equalizer mode will Display the selected equalizer characteristic.

Basic Operation

About the Crossover

Crossover:

This unit is equipped with an Active Crossover. The crossover limits the frequencies delivered to the outputs. Each channel is controlled independently. Thus, each speaker pair can be driven by the frequencies for which they have been optimally designed.

The crossover adjusts the HPF (high pass filter) or LPF (low pass filter) of each band, and also the slope (how fast the filter rolls off the highs or lows).

Adjustments should be made according to the reproduction characteristics of the speakers. Depending on the speakers, a passive network may not be necessary. If you are unsure about this point, please consult your authorized Alpine dealer.




* When setting the high range HPF filter to FLAT, do not turn up the volume too much. This may damage the speaker.

- HPF (high pass filter): Cuts the lower frequencies and allows the higher frequencies to pass.
- LPF (low pass filter): Cuts the higher frequencies and allows the lower frequencies to pass.
- Slope: The level change (in dB) for a frequency change of one octave.
- The higher the slope value, the steeper the slope becomes.
- Adjust the slope to FLAT to bypass the HP or LP filters.
- Do not use a tweeter without the HPF on or set to a low frequency, as it may cause damage to the speaker due to the low frequency content.
- You cannot adjust the crossover frequency higher than the HPF or lower than the LPF.



About the Time Correction


The distance between the listener and the speakers in a car vary widely due to the special conditions of the mobile environment. This difference in the distances from the speakers to the listener creates a shift in the sounds image and frequency characteristics. This is caused by the time delay between the sound reaching the listener's right versus the left ear.

To correct this, the CDA-7998/CDA-7897 is able to delay the audio signal to the speakers closest to the listener. This effectively creates a perception of increased distance for those speakers. The listener can be placed at an equal distance between the left and right speakers for optimum staging.

The adjustment will be made for each speaker in a step of 0.1 ms.

Example 1. Listening Position: Front Left Seat

Adjust the time correction level of the front left speaker to a high value and the rear right to zero or a low value.



Tips

* Subwoofer speaker.

You cannot change the Time Correction value for the subwoofer, but you can set the subwoofer's apparent position to the front by adjusting the Time Correction value of the front and rear speakers.

For details, refer to the "Tips" on page 12.

Here we calculate the time correction value for the front left speaker in the diagram at the left.

Conditions:

Farthest Speaker – listening position: 2.25 m (88-9/16") Front left speaker – listening position: 0.5 m (19-11/16") Calculation: L = 2.25 m - 0.5 m = 1.75 m (68-7/8") Time correction = $1.75 \div 343* \times 1000 = 5.1 \text{ (ms)}$ *Speed of sound: 343 m/s (765 mph) at 20°C

In other words, giving the front left speaker a time correction value of 5.1 ms makes it seem as if the distance to the front left speaker is the same as the distance to the farthest speaker.

The sound is not balanced because the distance between the listening position and the various speakers is different. The difference in distance between the front left speaker and the rear right speaker is 1.75 m (68-7/8").

Time correction eliminates the differences in the time required for the sound to reach the listening position. The time of the front left speaker is corrected by 5.1 ms so that its sound reaches the listening position at the same time as the sound of other speakers.

Example 2. Listening Position: All Seats


Adjust the time correction level of each speaker to almost the same level.

- Sit in the listening position (driver's seat, etc.) and measure the distance (in meters) between your head and the various speakers.
- 2 Calculate the difference between the distance to the farthest speaker and the other speakers.
 - L = (distance to farthest speaker) (distance to other speakers)
- 3 Divide the distances calculated for the speakers by the speed of sound (343 m/s (765 mph) at 20°C). These values are the time correction values for the different speakers.


Bass Focus

The time difference between the front-rear/left-right speakers, can be adjusted at the same time. With an initial delay of 0.1 ms for each of the 0 to 99 steps, audible time correction can be done.

1 Press the T.CORR button to select the Bass Focus mode.



Press the **BAND** button to select the front-rear / left-right speakers.




- 3 Turn the Rotary encoder to adjust the front-rear / left-right delay.
- 4 For setting another channel (speaker), repeat the steps 2 and 3.
- 5 After setting, press and hold the **T.CORR** button for least 3 seconds to return to the normal mode.

NOTES

- Any manual time correction adjustments will also affect corrections made in Bass Focus.
- Bass Focus mode is automatically canceled if no buttons are pressed within 15 seconds.






Example of Steps 2 and 3 Setting

 After entering corrections for the front (left and right) speakers in STEP 15, the time difference is 1.5 ms for both front-left and front-right speakers.



- (2) After entering corrections for the left (front and rear) speakers in STEP 15, the time difference becomes 3.0 ms* for the front left speaker and 1.5 ms for the left rear speaker.
 - * Because the time difference was already set to 1.5 ms for the front left speaker in STEP 1, the additional correction in STEP 15 makes the time difference of the front left speaker 3.0 ms.



Tips

* Subwoofer speaker.

Delay (turn the rotary encoder) the audio signal to the front (left and right) speakers to make the apparent position of the subwoofer to be at the front. In doing this, the apparent position between the front (left and right) speakers and subwoofer will appear equal to the driver. After performing above, you can change the positions of left and right speakers by delaying the time .

Adjusting and Storing the Time Correction

Before performing the following procedures, refer to "About the Time Correction" (Page 10)

- Make time corrections by pressing the T.CORR button. Each press changes the modes as follows:
 - ightarrow Bass Focus mode ightarrow Time correction mode ightarrow Normal mode
- 2 Select a speaker to be adjusted by pressing the BAND button.

Setting the MX Mode

MX (Media Xpander) makes vocals or instruments sound distinct regardless of the music source. The radio, CD, and MP3, will be able to reproduce the music clearly even in cars with a lot of road noise.

- 1 Press the MX button to select MX ON.
- 2 Press the **SOURCE** button to select the source you want to MX (Media Xpander)-correct.
- 3 Press and hold the MX button for at least 2 seconds to select the MX mode.
- 4 Turn the **Rotary encoder** to select your preferred mode or OFF.

FM (MX 1 to 3):

The medium to high frequencies become more clear, and produces well balanced sound in all the bands. CD (MX 1 to 3):

CD mode processes a large quantity of data. MX uses this massive data quantity to enhance the sound cleanly.

MP3/XM (MX 1 to 3):

This corrects information that was omitted at the time of compression. This reproduces a well-balanced sound close to the original.

DVD/Video CD (MX1 to 3):

MX 1 to 2 (MOVIE): reproduces the dialog of movies more clearly.


MX 3 (MUSIC): reproduces discs containing incidental music, music clips, etc. more clearly and effectively. AUX (MX 1 to 3):

Choose the MX mode (MP3, MUSIC, or MOVIE) that corresponds to the media connected.

5 After setting, press the MODE Button to return to the normal mode.

- By "Setting the Defeat of the external input" (page 19) to ON, operation is bypassed.
- To cancel MX mode for all music sources, press the MX button to turn MX off.
- MX mode is automatically canceled if no buttons are pressed within 15 seconds.
- Each music source, such as radio, CD, and MP3 can have its own MX setting.
- On disks with both MP3 and CD-DA, as the source changes from "MP3 to CD-DA" or "CD-DA to MP3", the MX-mode needs to switch. This switching process may increase the time before a piece is actually heard.
- Setting to MX OFF makes MX mode of each music source OFF.
- This function is inoperable when DEFEAT is ON.
- MX mode does not function when MX is ON for AM radio.

Basic Operation



Quick Searching Function

You can easily select tracks and files.

- 1 Press the **SOURCE** button to set the desired source mode.
 - (CD mode is explained here as an example)
- When setting the CD mode, press and hold the Q.S. button for at least 2 seconds. The mode changes to the Q.S. (Quick Search) setting.
- 3 Select a desired track by turning the Rotary encoder to the right or left.
 - CD/Changer mode: Track can be selected.
 - XM mode: Channel can be selected. (It is not possible to select in the tuner mode)

Displaying the Title/Text

It is possible to display the CD/Station title if the title has been previously inputted. For details, see "Titling Disc/Stations" (page 15). Text information, such as the disc name and the track name, will be displayed if playing a CD text compatible disc. It is also possible to display the folder name, the file name, and the ID3 tag, etc. while playing MP3 files.

1 Press the TITLE button. The mode will change every time the button is pressed.


About "Title" and "Text"


Title: With this device, it is possible to input the CD/ Station name (refer to page 15). This inputted name is referred to as a "title."

You cannot input or display titles on MP3 discs.

Text: Text compatible CDs contain text information such as the disc name and track name. Such text information is referred to as "text."

 - "NO TAG" will be displayed when an MP3 file contains no ID3 tag information.

- If the title was not previously input, "NO TITLE" is displayed.

Titling Discs/Stations

It is possible to title your favorite CD's or radio stations. You cannot input titles on MP3 discs.

- 1 Press the **TITLE** button and select the title display mode.
 - For details, see "Displaying the Title/Text" (page 14).
- 2 Press and hold the **TITLE** button for at least 3 seconds. The first character will blink.
- 3 Press the BAND button to select the characters/ symbols.
 - \longrightarrow Upper case \rightarrow Lower case \rightarrow Numeral/Symbol
- 4 Turn the Rotary encoder to select the desired letter/ numeral/symbol available for naming.
- Press the MODE button to store the first character. The first character will stop blinking and the display will automatically advance to the next character. When that character begins to blink, you may choose the next letter or symbol of your title.
- 6 Repeat the steps 3 and 4 above to complete the titling. Pressing the MODE button after entering the 8th character, automatically stores the title into memory.


When entering a title of less than 8 characters (for example, 3 character title):

- Some of the following CDs may not play on this unit:
 Flawed CDs,w with fingerprints, CDs exposed to extreme temperatures or sunlight (e.g., left in the car or this unit), CDs recorded under unstable conditions, CDs on which a recording failed and a re-recording was attempted.
- Use discs with MP3 files written in the format compliant with ISO 9660 level 1 or level 2. For details, see page 30-31.





On handling Compact Discs (CD/CD-R/CD-RW)

- Do not touch the surface.
- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight.
- Do not affix stickers or labels and do not write on the surface.
- Clean the disc when it is dusty.
- Make sure that there are no bumps around the disc.
- Do not use commercially available disc accessories.

Do not leave the disc in the car or the unit for a long time. Never expose the disc to direct sunlight.

Heat and humidity may damage the CD and you may not be able to play it again.

Music Sensor (Skip)

1 Momentarily press the I◄◀ DN button once during CD play to return to the beginning of the current track. If you wish to access the beginning of a track further back, repeatedly press until you reach the desired track.

Press the **>> I UP** button once to advance to the beginning of the next track. If you wish to access the beginning of a track further ahead, press repeatedly until the desired track is reached.

Fast Forward and Backward



Using the KCA-400C (Multi-Changer Switching device) or the KCA-410C (Versatile Link Terminal) multiple changers can be controlled by the CDA-7998/CDA-7897. See the Multi-Changer Selection section on page 27 for selecting the CD Changers.

NOTES

- The controls on the CDA-7998/CDA-7897 for CD Changer operation are operative only when a CD Changer is connected.
- The "Changer" indicator illuminates when a CD Changer is connected.
- The DVD changer (optional) is controllable from the CDA-7998/ CDA-7897 as well as the CD changer.
- 1 Press the SOURCE button to activate the CHANGER mode. The display shows the disc number and track number.

NOTE

The source indicator varies depending on the connected source.

Press the Disc Select buttons (1 through 9,0,*,#) corresponding to one of the discs loaded in the CD Changer. The selected disc number appears in the display and CD playback starts.







files, refer to pages 30-31 before using the unit.

1 Press the ≜ button. The movable display will open.




Insert a disc containing an MP3 file with the label side facing up.

2 Insert a disc containing an MP3 file with the label side facing up.

The disc will be pulled into the unit automatically. The movable display will close and playback will begin. When a disc is already inserted, press the SOURCE button to switch to the CD mode.

The mode will change every time the button is pressed.



(* Only when the CD changer is connected)

- To pause playback, press the ►/II button. Pressing the ►/II button again will resume playback.
- **4** To eject the disc, press the \triangleq button.

NOTES

- The unit can play discs containing both audio data and MP3 data.
- The MP3 indicator is lit during MP3 playback.
- The track display for CD audio data playback is the track numbers recorded on the disc.

Playing MP3 Files with the CD Changer (Optional)

NOTE

The music sensor feature is functional in the play or pause mode.

Fast Forward and Backward

Selecting Folders



About MP3

CAUTION

Except for personal enjoyment, duplicating audio data (including MP3 data) or distributing, transferring, or copying it, whether for free or for a fee, without the permission of the copyright holder is strictly prohibited by the Copyright Act and by international treaty.

· What is MP3?

MP3, whose official name is "MPEG Audio Layer 3", is a compression standard prescribed by the ISO, the International Standardization Organization and MPEG which is a joint activity institution of the IEC.

MP3 files contain compressed audio data. MP3 encoding is capable of compressing the audio data at extremely high ratios shrinking music files by as much as one-tenth their original size. This is achieved while still maintaining near CD quality. The MP3 format realizes such high compression ratios by eliminating the sounds that are either inaudible to the human ear or masked by other sounds.

. Method for creating MP3 files

The software used to create MP3 files is widely sold or free from various sources. For details on creating MP3 files, refer to the user's manual for that software.

The MP3 files that can be played back by this device have the file extension "mp3". Files with no extension can not be played back.

Supported playback sampling rates and bit rates

Sampling rates: 32 kHz - 44.1 kHz, bit rates: 32 - 320 kbps Note that for sampling rates such as 22.05 kHz, this device's frame display (Page 15) may not display correctly.

• ID3 tags

This device supports ID3 tag v1.

If ID3 tag data is in an MP3 file, this device can display the title (track title), artist name, and album name ID3 tag data.

This device can only display single-byte alphanumeric characters and the underscore. For non-supported characters, "NO SUPPORT" is displayed.

Producing MP3 discs

MP3 files are prepared, then written to a CD-R or CD-RW using CD-R writing software. A disc can hold up to 512 files/folders (including Root Folders).

Media supported

The media that this device can play back are CD-ROMs, CD-Rs, and CD-RWs.

Corresponding File Systems

This device supports discs formatted with ISO9660 Level 1 or Level 2.

Under the ISO9660 standard, there are some restrictions to remember.

The maximum nested folder depth is 8 (including the root directory). File/folder names are limited to 31 characters (including the extension).

Valid characters for folder/file names are letters A-Z (all caps), numbers 0-9, and '_' (underscore).


This device also can play back discs in Joliet, and other standards that conform to ISO9660. However, sometimes the file names, folder names, etc. are not displayed correctly.

· Formats supported

This device supports CD-ROM XA, Mixed Mode CD, Enhanced CD (CD-Extra) and Multi-Session. This device can not correctly play back discs recorded with Track At Once or packet writing.

Order of tracks

The unit plays the files in the order that the writing software writes them. Therefore, the playing order may not be the same as the order you input. The playback order of the folders and files is as follows.



Terminology

Bit rate

This is the "sound" compression rate specified for encoding. The higher the bit rate, the higher the sound quality, but also the larger the files.

Sampling rate

This value shows how many times per second the data is sampled (recorded). For example, music CDs use a sampling rate of 44.1 kHz, so the sound level is sampled (recorded) 44,100 times per second. The higher the sampling rate, the higher the sound quality, but also the larger the volume of data.


Encoding

Converting music CDs, WAVE (AIFF) files, and other sound files into the specified audio compression format.

ID3 tag

Song information such as track titles, artist names, album names, etc., written into MP3 files.

 XM and its corresponding logos are trademarks of XM Satellite Radio Inc.

NOTES

- The controls on the CDA-7998/CDA-7897 for XM Receiver operation are operative only when an XM Receiver is connected.
- The XM1 or XM2 band illuminates when in XM mode.
- 1 Press the **SOURCE** button to select RADIO Mode.
- 2 Press the BAND button to select XM1 or XM2. Each press changes the band:

 \rightarrow FM1 \rightarrow FM2 \rightarrow XM1 \rightarrow XM2 \rightarrow AM \rightarrow

3 Press the I◄◀ DN or ►►I UP button to select the desired channel. Holding the I◄◀ DN or ►►I UP buttons will change channels continuously.

Checking the XM Radio ID Number

You need to provide XM with the unique XM Radio ID number for your XM Radio Receiver in order to subscribe to XM's programming.

This number is an 8 character alphanumeric number that is printed on a label directly on the XM Receiver. It can also be displayed on the screen of the CDA-7998/CDA-7897 in the following way.

- While receiving XM1/XM2, press the I◄◀ DN or ►►I UP button to select channel "0."
- The unit alternately displays "RADIO ID" for 2 seconds, then the ID number for 10 seconds.
- To cancel the ID number display, set the channel to other than "0."

Tips

There is another way to display your ID number.

- 1. Press and hold the **SETUP** button for at least 3 seconds.
- 2. Press the ►► UP or ► DN button repeatedly to select "ID."
- 3. Press the **BAND** button to display your ID number.

- While the category is displayed, press the I◄ DN or ►►I UP button to browse the different categories. Press the CAT button to load the first channel of the new category (or don't do anything to remain in the current category.)
- Within 5 seconds of selecting the category, press the CAT button again to select the next channel within that category. Repeatedly pressing the CAT button will load additional channels within that category. If CAT is pressed at the last channel of the category, the search begins again at the first channel of the category.

When tuned in, the category is displayed for 5 seconds, then the display returns to normal mode.

In Case of Difficulty

If you encounter a problem, please turn the power off, then on again. If the unit is still not functioning normally, please review the items in the following checklist. This guide will help you isolate the problem if the unit is at fault. Otherwise, make sure the rest of your system is properly connected or consult your authorized Alpine dealer.

Basic

No function or display.

- · Vehicle's ignition is off.
 - If connected following instructions, the unit will not operate with the vehicle's ignition off.
- · Improper power lead connections.
 - Check power lead connections.
- Blown fuse.
 - Check the fuse on the battery lead of the unit; replace with the proper value if necessary.
- Internal micro-computer malfunctioned due to interference noise etc.
 - Press the RESET switch with a ball-point pen or other pointed article.

Radio

Unable to receive stations.

- · No antenna or open connection in cable.
 - Make sure the antenna is properly connected; replace the antenna or cable if necessary.

Unable to tune stations in the seek mode.

- · You are in a weak signal area.
 - Make sure the tuner is in the DX mode.
- If the area you are in is a primary signal area, the antenna may not be grounded and connected properly.
 - Check your antenna connections; make sure the antenna is properly grounded at its mounting location.
- · The antenna may not be the proper length.
 - Make sure the antenna is fully extended; if broken, replace the antenna with a new one.

Broadcast is noisy.

- · The antenna is not the proper length.
 - Extend the antenna fully; replace it if it is broken.
- · The antenna is poorly grounded.
 - Make sure the antenna is grounded properly at its mounting location.

CD

CD Player/Changer not functioning.

- Out of operating temperature range +50°C (+120°F) for CD.
 - Allow the vehicle's interior (or trunk) temperature to cool.

CD playback sound is wavering.

- · Moisture condensation in the CD Module.
 - Allow enough time for the condensation to evaporate (about 1 hour).

CD insertion not possible.

- · A CD is already in the CD player.
 - Eject the CD and remove it.
 - The CD is being improperly inserted.
 - Make sure the CD is being inserted following instructions in the CD Player Operation section.

Unable to fast forward or backward the CD.

- · The CD has been damaged.
 - Eject the CD and discard it; using a damaged CD in your unit can cause damage to the mechanism.

CD playback sound skips due to vibration.

- · Improper mounting of the unit.
 - Securely re-mount the unit.
- · Disc is very dirty.
 - Clean the disc.
- · Disc has scratches.
 - Change the disc.
- · The pick-up lens is dirty.
 - Do not use a commercial available lens cleaner disc.
 Consult your nearest ALPINE dealer.

CD playback sound skips without vibration.

- · Dirty or scratched disc.
 - Clean the disc; damaged disc should be replaced.

Error displays (built-in CD player only)

- · Mechanical error
 - Press the ≜ button. After the error indication disappears, insert the disc again. If the above-mentioned solution does not solve the problem, consult your nearest ALPINE dealer.

MP3

MP3 is not played back.

- Writing error occurred. The CD format is not compatible.
 - Make sure the CD has been written in a supported format. Refer to "About MP3" on pages 30-31, then rewrite in the format supported by this device.

Information

Indication for CD Player

HIGH-TEMP

- · Protective circuit is activated due to high temperature.
 - The indicator will disappear when the temperature returns to within operation range.

NO DISC

- · No CD is inserted.
 - Insert a CD.
- Although a disc is inserted, "NO DISC" is displayed and the unit does not start to play or eject the disc.
 - Remove the disc by following these steps:
 - 1) Press the **\Delta** button.

The movable display will open.

Before installing or connecting the unit, please read the following and pages 3 and 4 of this manual thoroughly for proper use.

MAKE THE CORRECT CONNECTIONS.

Failure to make the proper connections may result in fire or product damage.

USE ONLY IN CARS WITH A 12 VOLT NEGATIVE GROUND.

(Check with your dealer if you are not sure.) Failure to do so may result in fire, etc.

BEFORE WIRING, DISCONNECT THE CABLE FROM THE NEGATIVE BATTERY TERMINAL.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or injury due to electrical shorts.

DO NOT ALLOW CABLES TO BECOME ENTANGLED IN SURROUNDING OBJECTS.

Arrange wiring and cables in compliance with the manual to prevent obstructions when driving. Cables or wiring that obstruct or hang up on places such as the steering wheel, gear lever, brake pedals, etc. can be extremely hazardous.

DO NOT SPLICE INTO ELECTRICAL CABLES.

Never cut away cable insulation to supply power to other equipment. Doing so will exceed the current carrying capacity of the wire and result in fire or electric shock.




