1.Read these manuals

After unpacking this product. read the manual carefully. Follow all the operating and other instructions.

2.Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure operation of the product. These protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product a Bed, sofa, rug or other.

3.Heat

The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

4.Water and Moisture

Do not use this product near water for example, near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool.

LOCATION

Do not locate the unit in places such as:

- High temperature (40° C or higher) or high humidity (90% or higher).
- Dirty places.
- Avoid direct exposure to sunshine

DISTURBANCE

When you place this unit near a TV, radio or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the unit away from the TV, radio or VCR.

NOTES ON MOISTURE CONDENSATION

The pickup may be condensed with water under the following situation.

- When you bring the unit directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the unit in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold air from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- During the summer, when you use the unit in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- The room is vaporous or damp.

If condensation exists, the unit will not operate properly. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the unit to the wall outlet, turn on the unit, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the unit will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the unit connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



ON HANDLING DISCS

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.
- Do not attach paper or tape to disc.



ON CLEANING DISCS

Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the centre outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.




- If you can not wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl Lps. It may damage the disc.

ON STORING DISCS

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat source.
- Do not store discs in place subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing object on discs outside or their case may cause warping.

STRUCTURE OF DISC CONTENTS

Normally, DVD discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Audio CD are divided into tracks.



Each title, chapter, or track is assigned a number, which is called title number, chapter number or track number respectively.

There may be discs that do not have these number.







Connecting to a TV with Audio/Video cable




If the TV has an S-video input, connect the DVD player with an S-video cable. When using an S-video cable, do not connect the yellow video cable.

Connecting to a audio system and TV equipped with YUV video input




Connecting to an amplifier equipped with a digital audio input and TV


Loading Batteries

- 1. Open the cover.
- 2. Insert batteries.
- Make sure to match the + and on the batteries to the marks inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the cover.

Notes on batteries

- Do not insert batteries into the remote control in the wrong direction.
- Do not charge, heat, open, or short-circuit the batteries. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- If the remote control does not function correctly or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace all batteries with new ones.

Operating With The Remote Control



Notes on the remote control

- Direct the remote control at the remote sensor of the DVD player.
- Do not drop or give the remote control a shock.
- Do not leave the remote control near an extremely hot or humid
- place.
- Do not spill water or put anything wet on the remote control.
- Do not open the remote control.

BASIC PLAYBACK

Preparations

• When you want to view a disc, turn on the TV and select the video input connected to the DVD player.

Basic playback

- Press POWER switch on the front panel to ON, the DVD player turns on, the TV screen will display the start logo and DVD indicator light. If a disc is already in the tray, it will begin to play once the power is on.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE ▲ to open the disc tray, place a disc on the disc tray.
 - There are two different disc sizes. Place the disc in the correct guide on the disc tray. If the disc is out of the guide, it may damage the disc and cause the DVD player to malfunction.
 - Do not place a disc which is unplayable in this DVD player.
- Press OPEN/CLOSE to close the disc tray, the playback will automatically start.
 - Some discs may not playback automatically, you can press ENTER/PLAY button to start playback.
- 4. Some discs may start playback with a menu, use the cursor button on the remote control to select menu options and press ENTER/PLAY to start, or press digits to select a menu options directly.

Stop playback

- Press STOP button to go to stop mode, the TV screen will show the start logo. As some disc the player can recall the location where stopped, such as DVD.
- 2. Press ENTER/PLAY to playback to resume playback from the location where playback is stopped or from the beginning of the disc.
- 3. Press STOP twice to stop completely.

Previous and Next

During playing, press PREV I◀ key can back to start of this chapter, then each press this key will skip a chapter still the start of the disc.

Each press of NEXT **I** key during playing will skip the current chapter and play the next one.

Fast forward and Fast reverse

- Press F.FWD
 → to fast forward through the disc. Each time the F.FWD → button is pressed, the fast forward motion speed changes.
- 2. Press ENTER/PLAY to resume normal playback.
- 3. Press F.REV ◀ to fast reverse through the disc. Each time the F.REV ◀ button is pressed, the fast reverse motion speed changes.
- 4. Press ENTER/PLAY to resume normal playback.

Pause/Step playback

- 1. Press PAUSE/STEP II/II► first time to pause playback (still mode). The sound will be muted during still mode.
- Press PAUSE/STEP II/III continuous to single step forward to the next frame in the video.
- 3. Press ENTER/PLAY resume normal playback.

NOTES:

- "Ø" may appear on the TV screen during operation. A "Ø" means that the operation is not permitted by the unit or the disc.
- **2.** This unit controlled by CPU, under setting mode, there may be screen save, press any key to activate the unit.

ADVANCED PLAYBACK

IMPORTANT NOTE:

ALL DESCRIBING FUNCTION IS FOR DVD DISCS. IF YOU PLAY OTHER FORMAT DISC, THE OPERATION AND DISPLAY ON SCREEN WILL BE DIFFERENT.

OSD

Press this button and the screen will display some information about disc, such as : " Title Elapsed ", " Title Remain ", " Chapter Elapsed ", " Chapter Remain " and " Display Off ".

V.MODE

This button can set VIDEO output among "CVBS", "YUV" or "P-Scan".

Note: The screen disappear when press this button, press this button continuously until the screen turn normal.

SUBTITLE

Press this button and the screen will display "SUBTI-TLE 01/XX XXXXX", "01" indicates the ordinal number of this language; "XX" indicates total number of language; "XXXXXX" indicates the language of country. (the number of language depends on disc).

TITLE

According to some DVD discs, press this button will display "Title Menu", the unit will play from the disc head or you can use digits to select tracks preferred. (Depending on DVD)

ANGLE

For discs with this feature, pressing this key to view action from different angles.(Depending on the DVD)

ZOOM

Each time pressed, the picture enlarges.

In this mode, you can move the picture with CURSOR button.

VOLUME and MUTE

Press " + " at the right of VOLUME to increase volume, " - " to decrease to volume. The first press of MUTE will display MUTE (no voice), the second press will return to normal playback.

MENU

Press this button and the screen will display " Root Menu ", select item according to your preference. (This key is valid to DVD disc possessing multi-layer menu.)

PROGRAM

Press this button and the screen will display info window, press digits button to input the program number what you want, when finished, move the cursor to select the "Start "logo, at this time the unit will start program playback and the screen will display "Program" logo.

If you want to cancel this function, press " STOP " and then press "ENTER/PLAY" .
