
Check whether the player is in slow or fast playback mode. (if it is the case, then just press play button for normal playback)

Check whether the MUTE button is on.

Check whether the AV cord is properly connected.

Check if the sound setting in the setup menu is done properly.


When the player does not operate properly



When too much time is consumed for playback after pressing theplay button or after using the setup menu

In order to protect player's interior motors, it taeks a couple of minutes for playback after using the setup menu for a quite some time, or after pressing the play / stop/ eject/ buttons in a rapid sequence. This is a normal process for the player.

When the remote control doesn't work



Check if the battery supply is used up.

When it is not possible to use the setup menu while starting to play desc



Setup menu can only be used when disc is being played, loaded, and tray is open.
