


Main components and their functions









Function keys



Accesses menu and list of functions.



Makes or answers a call.



Terminates a call or returns to standby(initial) mode.

Switches the phone on/off by pressing and holding the key for more than one second.



Erases one character at a time or clears all characters Also, by pressing the key for more than one second, exits from the current menu.



Used to save settings or retrieve numbers and names stored in memory.






Scrolls through menus, settings or memory.



Retrieves text or voice messages.



Display indicators





(Signal strength)

Shows signal strength with the number of bars(0-5).



(Roaming)

Indicates that the phone is within the service area of a cellular system other than your home resistered



(Service / No Service)

When within service area, 2 is displayed. If not, T is displayed.

(In Use)

Appears when the line is busy.



(Short message service)

Appears when text or voice messages are waiting.



(Digital mode)

Indicates that the phone is in digital mode.



(Battery Level Indicator) Shows balance of available battery power with the number of bars (0-4).





Inserting and Removing the Battery

Inserting the battery



Insert the battery into the groove at the bottom of the phone and then press the battery in the direction of ② until it snaps.




- The battery must be correctly placed in the battery compartment.
- If battery is incorrectly inserted, the phone will not power on or the battery may slip out when in use.

Removing the battery



Pull out the battery in the direction ② while pushing the separation tab in the direction (1).





Power connection

Connect the charger to a standard 120V AC outlet.

LED's will blink orange when the power is cinnected.



Charging the battery only

To charge the battery only, insert the battery pack into the charger. LED will indicate charging status.

- Red indicates charging
- Green indicates charging is complete
- Battery is not charged when you purchase the product.
- Fully charge the battery before use.






If the LED is not turned on or the red light blinks after installing a battery in the charger, it indicates that the battery is not being charged.



The operating times are approximate values and may vary depending on network configuration and handset usage.





Use only batteries and chargers approved by the phone manufacturer.

When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for longer than a week, overcharging may shorten its life.

If left unused, a fully charged battery may completely drain (discharge) in 1 - 4 weeks.

Never use any charger or battery that is damaged or worn out.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose.

Do not short circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can occur when a metallic object (e.g. coin, clip or pen) causes direct connection of the two terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery), for example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, reduces the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 41...F and 95...F (5...C and 35...C). A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work (or charge) even if the battery is fully charged.

Temperature extremes affect the ability of your battery to charge; allow it to cool down or warm up first.

When the battery is not in use, store it uncharged in a cool, dark and dry place.

The battery is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts. Do not attempt to open the case.

It is recommended that you allow your battery to fully discharge before you recharge it.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times but will eventually wear out. When the operating time is shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Do not dispose of a battery in a fire!

Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.
