## Precautions



Before you start, please make sure that the battery is fully charged.



Do not use the phone in high-temperature or high-humidity environments. If soaked with liquids, the phone may be unrepairable.

Do not take apart or modify the phone.



Keep the phone in a safe place when not in use to avoid damages resulting from vibration or impact.



Do not touch the antenna during a call.



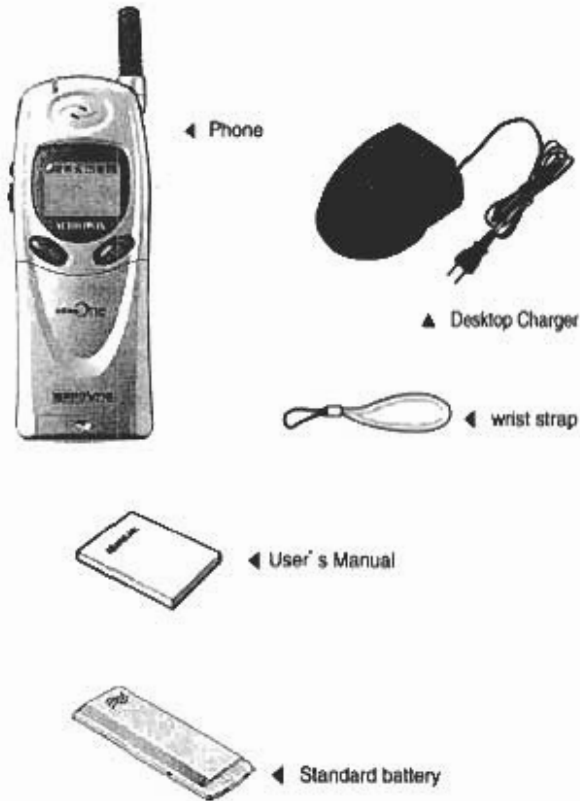
Do not clean your phone with chemical solutions such as solvent or thinner.



Do not use or place your phone near explosive materials, inflammable liquids or gases.

## Phone Overview

### Function keys











-  Accesses menu and list of functions.
-  Makes or answers a call.
-  Terminates a call or returns to standby(initial) mode.  
Switches the phone on/off by pressing and holding the key for more than one second.
-  Erases one character at a time or clears all characters Also, by pressing the key for more than one second, exits from the current menu.
-  Used to save settings or retrieve numbers and names stored in memory.
-  Scrolls through menus, settings or memory.
-  Retrieves text or voice messages.



## Phone Overview

### Display indicators



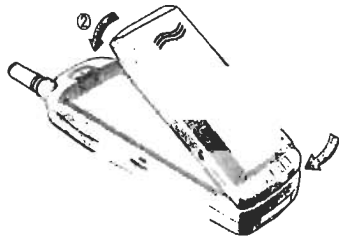
-  (Signal strength)  
Shows signal strength with the number of bars(0-5).
-  (Roaming)  
Indicates that the phone is within the service area of a cellular system other than your home registered system.
-  (Service / No Service)  
When within service area,  is displayed.  
If not,  is displayed.
-  (In Use)  
 Appears when the line is busy.
-  (Short message service)  
Appears when text or voice messages are waiting.
-  (Digital mode)  
Indicates that the phone is in digital mode.
-  (Battery Level Indicator)  
Shows balance of available battery power with the number of bars (0-4).



## Inserting and Removing the Battery

### Inserting the battery

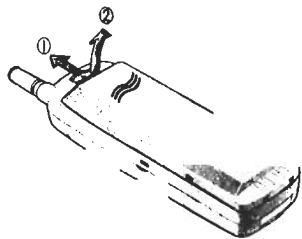
- 1 Insert the battery into the groove at the bottom of the phone and then press the battery in the direction of ② until it snaps.



- The battery must be correctly placed in the battery compartment.
- If battery is incorrectly inserted, the phone will not power on or the battery may slip out when in use.

### Removing the battery

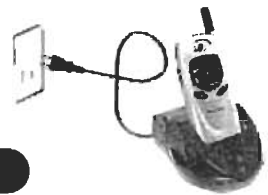
- 1 Pull out the battery in the direction ② while pushing the separation tab in the direction ①.



## Charging the Battery

### Power connection

Connect the charger to a standard 120V AC outlet. LED's will blink orange when the power is cinnected.



### Charging the battery only

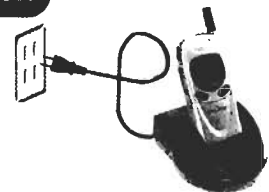
To charge the battery only, insert the battery pack into the charger. LED will indicate charging status.

- Red indicates charging
- Green indicates charging is complete



- Battery is not charged when you purchase the product.
- Fully charge the battery before use.

### Charging the battery with the handset





### Charging completion

Charging is completed when the green-colored LED stays on.

## Charging the Battery

### Status of charger LED's

Charging in progress (Red color on)	Charging completion (Green color on)
	



If the LED is not turned on or the red light blinks after installing a battery in the charger, it indicates that the battery is not being charged.

### Battery charging time

Extended battery	About 300 minutes
Standard battery	About 300 minutes



- If the surrounding temperature and that of battery itself is excessively high or low, charging may not be completed due to battery characteristics.
- So you need to charge the battery at normal temperature.

## Charging the Battery

### Power management table

- The operating times are approximate values and may vary depending on network configuration and handset usage.



## **Tips on efficient use of the battery**

Use only batteries and chargers approved by the phone manufacturer.

When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for longer than a week, overcharging may shorten its life.

If left unused, a fully charged battery may completely drain (discharge) in 1 - 4 weeks.

Never use any charger or battery that is damaged or worn out.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose.

Do not short circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can occur when a metallic object (e.g. coin, clip or pen) causes direct connection of the two terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery), for example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, reduces the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 41...F and 95...F (5...C and 35...C). A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work (or charge) even if the battery is fully charged.

Temperature extremes affect the ability of your battery to charge; allow it to cool down or warm up first.

When the battery is not in use, store it uncharged in a cool, dark and dry place.

The battery is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts. Do not attempt to open the case.

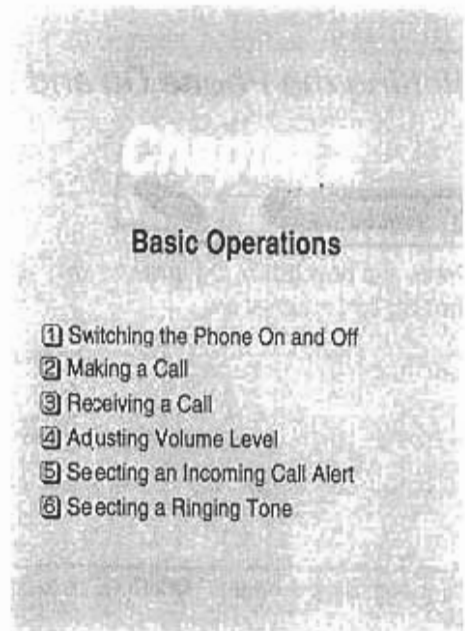
It is recommended that you allow your battery to fully discharge before you recharge it.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times but will eventually wear out. When the operating time is shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Do not dispose of a battery in a fire!

Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.

## Receiving a Call

1 When your phone rings, the answering lamp blinks and "INCOMING CALL" message is displayed on the LCD.



2 Press any key except [ 9 ] to answer.



3 Press [END/⏻] to terminate the call.



● AUTO ANSWER allows you to receive an incoming call automatically after the predefined number of rings. (See pg.47 for complete description.)

## Adjusting a Volume Level

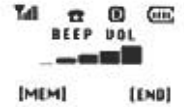
The current volume setting can be controlled in two ways; by using the volume key or the menu key.

### With the volume key



1 Press the volume key on the side of the phone to adjust volume levels of the ear-piece, ringer, beep, or hands free kit.

- Adjust earpiece volume during a call.
- Adjust beep volume in standby mode.



2 Press [MEM] to store, otherwise the setting is stored automatically in five seconds.

## Storing a Phone Number

Up to 100 phone numbers with associated names can be stored in memory.

③ Enter the associated name with the numeric keypad.

- A name may contain up to 12 alphanumeric characters.



How to correct characters.

- Press [CLR] quickly to delete one character at a time.
- Or press and hold [CLR] for more than one second to clear the entire phone number at once.

## Dialing a Stored Phone Number

This allows you to make a flash call in the convenient way.

### One-touch dialing (for memory location number 0-9)

1 Press and hold the memory location number (0-9) you want for more than 1 second.

- This allows you to call any of the phone numbers stored in the first 10 memory locations (0-9) without pressing [SEND].

### Two-touch dialing (for memory location number 10-99)
