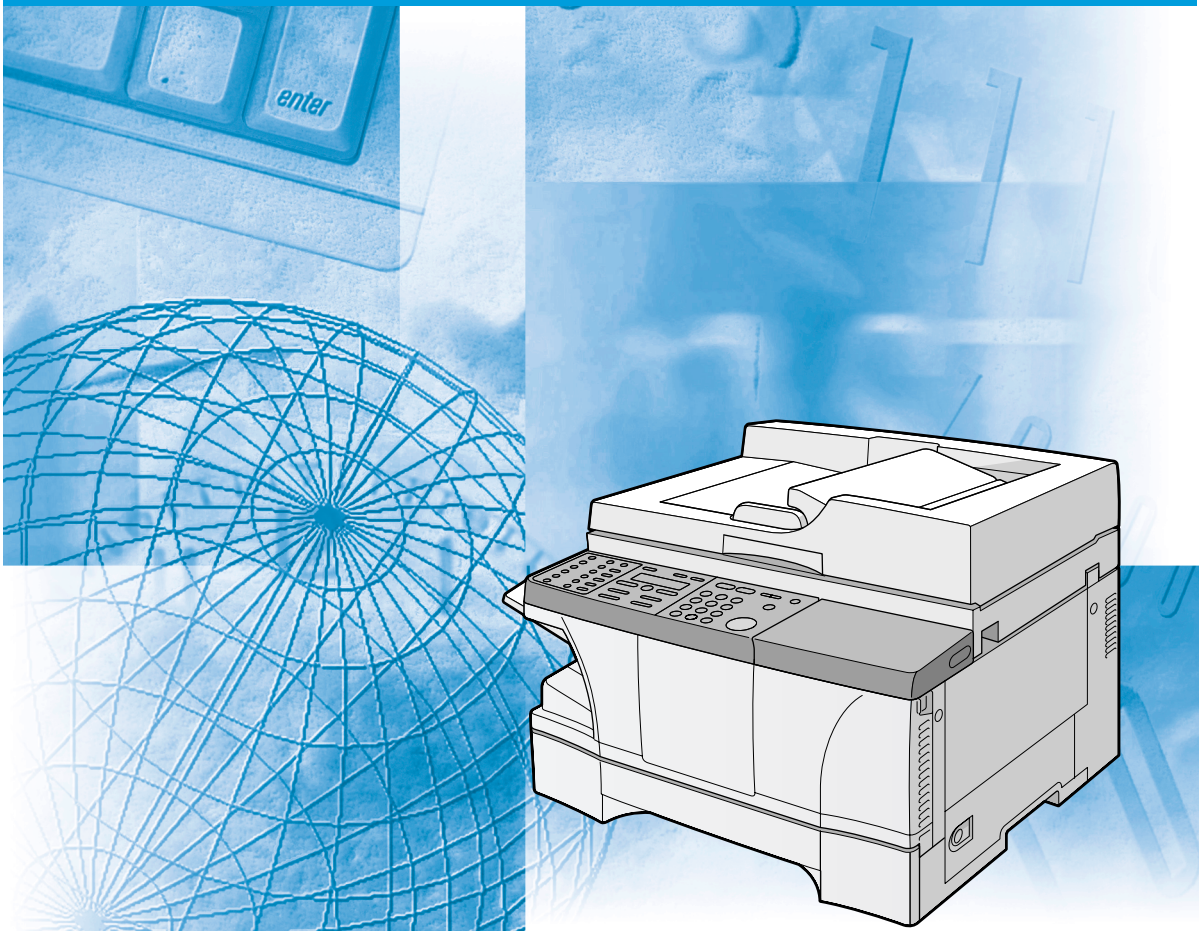

 **IMPORTANT**

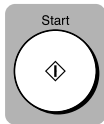



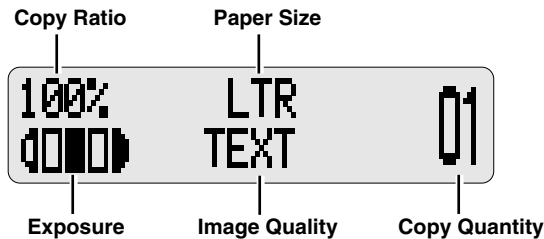

Standby Display

The standby display differs depending on whether the machine is in the Copy mode or Fax mode. In Copy mode, the display looks like this:



NOTE

- When the machine is plugged in, the LCD displays <PLEASE WAIT> for a while, then the Copy mode standby display appears.
- The Fax mode standby display appears only with the imageRUNNER 1670F model. See “Displays Used in This Manual,” in the *Facsimile Guide* for details.

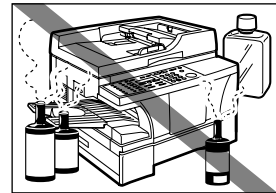

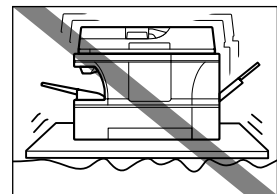

Do not place the machine near alcohol, paint thinner, or other flammable substances. If flammable substances come into contact with electrical parts inside the machine, it may result in a fire or electrical shock.

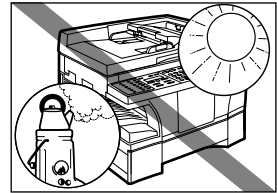
- Do not block or cover the ventilation port or any openings on the machine with objects, as this may result in a fire.
- Place the machine on a flat, stable, vibration free surface that is strong enough to support its weight (approx. 52.9 lb/24.0 kg).



- Make sure the area is free from dust.

During use, the machine generates ozone. However, the amount of ozone generated is not enough to affect the human body. 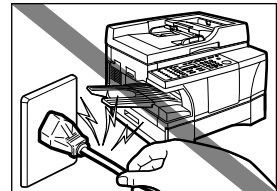
- Do not install the machine near devices that contain magnets or generate magnetic fields, such as speakers.

- Make sure the relative humidity of the area is between 40% and 70%.
- Keep the machine away from direct sunlight.
- Do not use or store the machine outdoors.



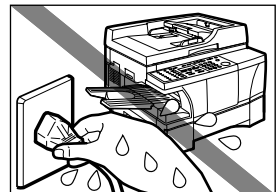
Power Supply

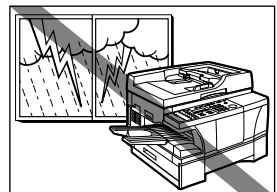


- Do not insert or disconnect the power plug with wet hands, as this may result in electrical shock.



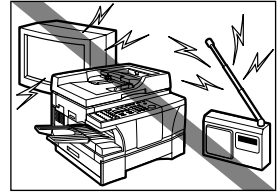

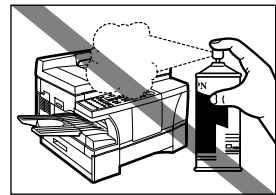
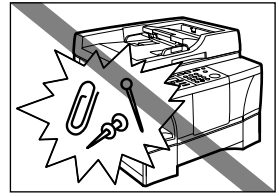


- Connect the machine to a standard 120 V AC/60 Hz, three-prong grounded outlet. Operate the machine only from the type of power supply indicated on the machine's label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your local power company.
- Use only the power cord that came with the machine.
- Disconnect the machine in the following conditions:
 - When the power cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
 - If liquid has spilled into the machine.
 - If the machine has been exposed to rain or water.
 - If the machine does not operate normally when you have followed the instructions in the guides included with your machine. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the instructions in the guides; improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the product to normal operation.
 - If the machine has been dropped or damaged.
 - If the machine exhibits a distinct change in performance, indicating a need for servicing.

Handling

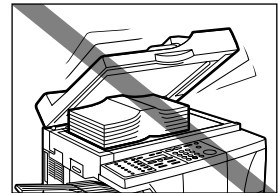
⚠ WARNING

- Do not drop paper clips, staples, or other metal objects inside the machine. Also do not spill water, liquid, or flammable substances inside the machine. If these items come into contact with high voltage parts inside the machine, fire or electrical shock may occur. If these items are dropped or spilled in the machine, disconnect the power cord immediately with dry hands. Then contact your local authorized Canon dealer.
- Do not use any highly flammable spray near the machine. If gas from a spray comes into contact with the electrical components inside the machine, it may result in fire.

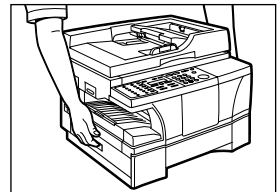

- Close the ADF, the platen glass cover, or the platen unit gently to avoid catching your hand. Failing to do so may result in personal injury.

- Disconnect the machine before moving it.
- Do not lift the machine by any of its attachments.
- If the machine exhibits a distinct change in performance, this indicates a need for servicing.

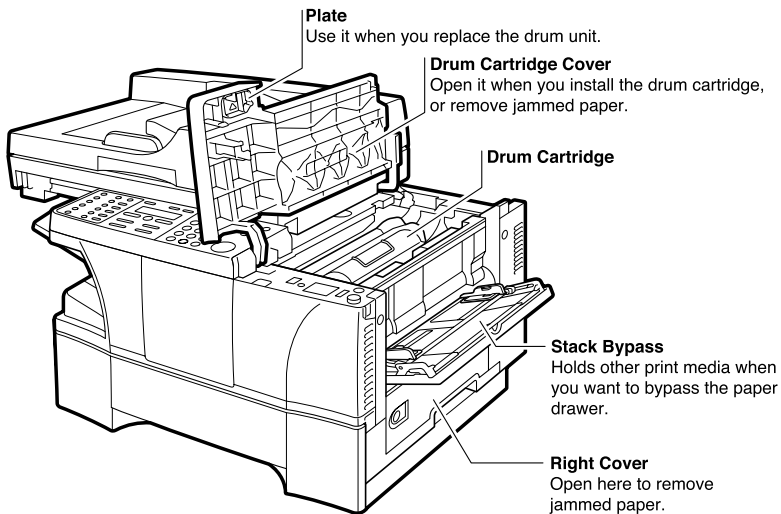


Front View of the ADF

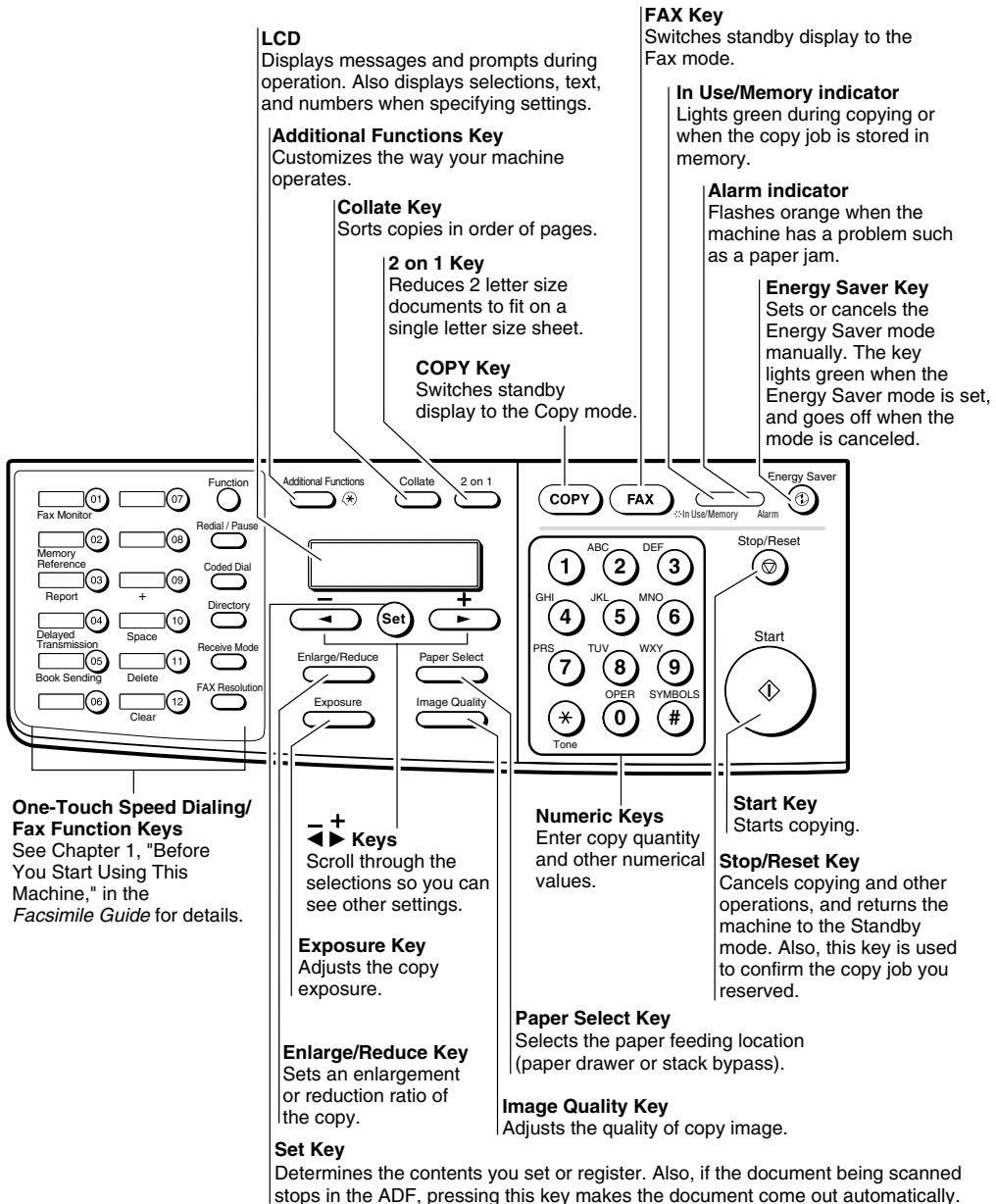

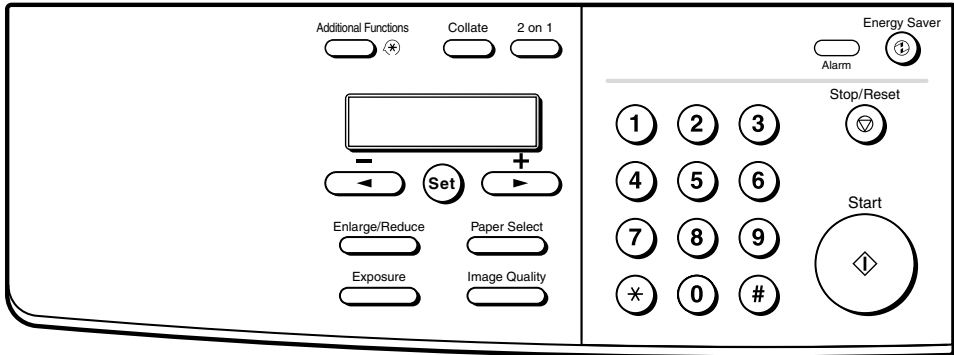

Before You Start Using This Machine

Using the Energy Saver Mode

This machine provides an Energy Saver mode. When no operations are performed for about five minutes, the machine automatically enters the Energy Saver mode.

NOTE

- You can specify the time until the machine enters the Energy Saver mode from 3 to 30 minutes. You can also turn off the Energy Saver mode. (See Chapter 4, “Customizing Settings.”)
- The Energy Saver mode does not activate when the machine is in the following states:
 - When printing out copies or faxes* or other pages
 - When sending or receiving faxes*
 - While a copy job is saved in memory or when the reserve copy or other functions are operating, or when the In Use/Memory indicator lights up*
 - When paper jams occur
 - When the platen unit is not returned to the original position
 - When an error code appears and the Alarm indicator flashes
 - When <PRESS SET KEY> is displayed
 - When the toner is empty
 - When the waste toner is full

* Only for the imageRUNNER 1670F model

Turning the Energy Saver Feature On or Off

Energy Saver



1 Press [Energy Saver].

If the machine is in the Energy Saver mode when you press [Energy Saver], the Energy Saver key light goes off and the machine enters the Standby mode.

NOTE

The machine returns to the Full Power mode immediately. However, this time may vary according to room temperature and circumstances.

If the machine is in the Full Power mode when you press [Energy Saver], the Energy Saver key light goes on and the machine enters the Energy Saver mode.

NOTE

Always wait about five seconds after an operation completes before pressing [Energy Saver].

Using the Menus and Keys

This machine has a menu system that you use to specify or register various settings. These settings allow you to customize the way your machine operates. This section provides a brief overview on how to use the control panel keys to open menus and make selections.

This section describes how to display and operate the menus from the control panel. See Chapter 4, “Customizing Settings,” for a description of the menu items and settings.



NOTE

If you pause and do not press a key for two minutes, the machine returns to the Standby mode automatically. You must then start the procedure from the beginning. You can use the <AUTO CLEAR> setting to change this timeframe. (See “Timer Settings,” on p. 4-7.)

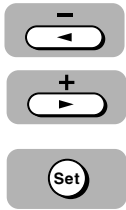

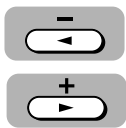

Open a Menu and Select an Item



- 1** Press [**◀**] or [**▶**] until the menu you want to open is displayed → press [**Set**].



- 2** Press [**◀**] or [**▶**] to browse through the menu items → press [**Set**] to go to the next level.



Return to Previous Level



- 1** Press [**Additional Functions**] to return to the previous level and continue browsing.

If you continue to press [Additional Functions], the machine returns to the Standby mode.

Return to Standby Mode



- 1** Press [**Stop/Reset**] to return to the Standby mode.



NOTE

If you do not press a key for two minutes, the machine automatically returns to the Standby mode.

The documents placed on the platen glass or loaded into the ADF must meet the requirements shown in the table below.

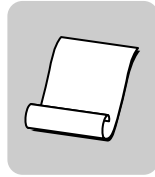
Problem Documents

To ensure the quality of your copies and the faxes you are sending, follow these guidelines:

- Make sure any glue, ink, or correction fluid on the document is completely dry before placing the document on the platen glass or loading it into the ADF.
- Remove all fasteners (such as staples or paper clips) before loading the document into the ADF.
- To prevent document jams in the ADF, do not use any of the following:



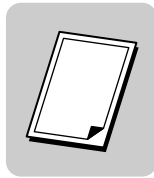

Scan Area

The scanning limit of documents set on the platen glass will differ depending on the <MAX.SCAN LENGTH> of <330 mm> or <356 mm> specified in <COPY SETTINGS>, from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu.

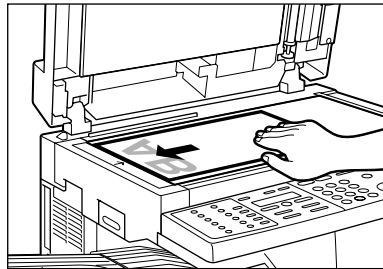


Placing Originals

For scanning, place your documents on the platen glass or load them into the ADF. Where you set up your documents depends on the size and type of documents you have.

Platen Glass

- 1** Open the ADF/platen glass cover.
- 2** Place your document face down on the platen glass. Align the document with the appropriate paper size marks.

- If you intend to make a copy and print with a thermal transfer printer on one sheet of paper, make the copy first. Failure to do so may make copies dirty or cause a paper jam.
- When copying onto transparencies, remove each transparency from the output tray as it is output.

Specifying the Paper Size

The default paper size is <FREE SIZE>. Normally, you can make copies in this setting. However, the copy images or the back of the paper may become dirty. If this happens, you can prevent the paper from getting dirty by specifying the paper size according to the following instructions.

- To specify the paper size every time you load the paper into the stack bypass, follow this procedure:

Paper Handling

Print Media Requirements

For high quality copies, use paper and transparencies recommended by Canon. Some types of paper available at office supply stores may not be suitable for this machine. If you have any questions about paper and transparencies, consult your local authorized Canon dealer.

Paper Storage

In order to prevent paper jams, follow these procedures:

- To prevent moisture buildup, store remaining paper wrapped tightly in its original package. Store paper in a dry location, out of direct sunlight.
- To prevent curling, store paper flat, not upright.
- After copying, do not leave paper in the stack bypass.

Unacceptable Paper

Do not copy on the following types of copy stock; doing so will result in paper jams.

- Severely curled or wrinkled paper
- Transparencies for full color copiers or printers
- Paper that has already been copied using a digital full color copier. (Do not copy on the reverse side.)
- Paper that has been printed on using a thermal transfer printer. (Do not copy on the reverse side.)



IMPORTANT

Do not attempt to make copies on full color transparencies. Doing so may result in copier malfunction.

Printable Areas

Please note that the term “printing area” represents both the recommended area for optimum print quality and the entire area where the machine can technically print.

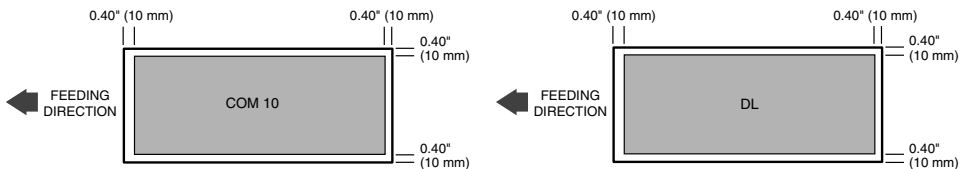
NOTE

- The printing area is shown by light shading. Canon recommends that you print within this area.
- The printing area is 0.20" (5 mm) inside from all four edges of the paper when using this machine as a printer. (For envelopes, the printing area is 0.40" (10 mm) from all four edges of the envelopes.)

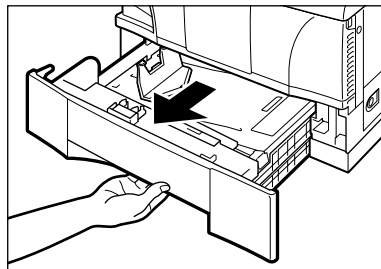
Loading Paper in the Paper Drawer

This section describes how to load paper in the paper drawer.

⚠ CAUTION

When loading paper, take care not to cut your hands on the edges of the paper.

- 1** Grip the paper drawer handle, and pull it towards you until the paper drawer comes to a stop.

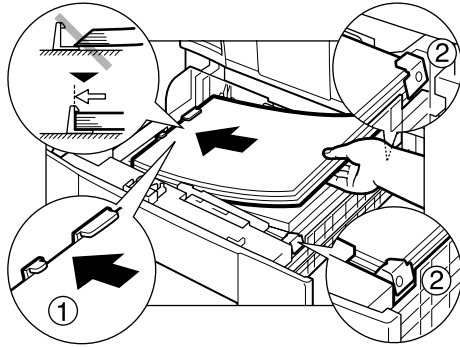


- 2** Open a package of paper, and remove a stack of paper.

✎ NOTE

- If the paper is curled, uncurl it before placing it in the paper drawer. Failure to do so may cause paper creases and/or a paper jam.
- 17 to 20 lb bond (64 to 80 g/m²) paper is acceptable.
- The paper drawer holds up to approximately 500 sheets of 20 lb bond (80 g/m²) paper.

3 Load the paper stack under the paper drawer's length guide ① and width guides ②.



NOTE

- Make sure that the paper stack does not exceed the length and width guides in the paper drawer. Failure to do so may cause paper jams.
- Do not load more paper when there is still paper left in the paper drawer.
- Only load one size of paper into the paper drawer. Do not load different sizes of paper into the paper drawer at the same time.
- The paper drawer is for plain paper, colored paper, or recycled paper only. Loading other paper in the paper drawer may cause a paper jam.
- Do not load labels or transparencies into the paper drawer.

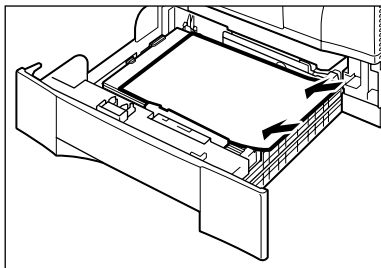
4 Gently insert the paper drawer as far as it will go.

NOTE

- If copies are curled, or a paper jam occurs, remove the paper stack from the paper drawer. Turn it over and then place it back in the paper drawer.
- If paper runs out while you are making copies, do not load a different paper size.

IMPORTANT

- When closing the paper drawer, make sure to push it in completely. If you attempt to copy when the paper drawer is not pushed in completely, paper jams may occur.
- Sometimes, when you pull out the paper drawer, paper may stick out, as shown in the illustration below. Make sure that the paper is neatly and correctly loaded into the paper drawer before you push the paper drawer back into the machine.



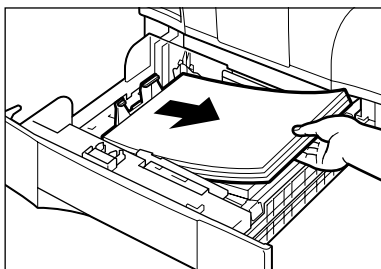
Adjusting the Paper Drawer for a Different Paper Size

If you want to load a different paper size in the paper drawer, follow the procedure described below to adjust the paper drawer guides.

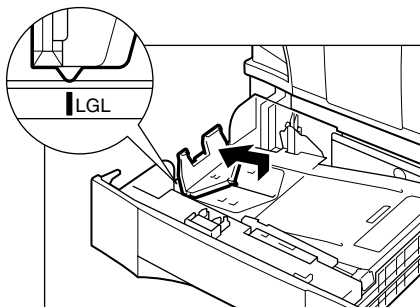
You can adjust the paper drawer to hold the following standard paper sizes: legal and letter.

If you want to make copies on any other size paper, use the stack bypass.

1 Pull out the paper drawer, and remove all loaded paper.



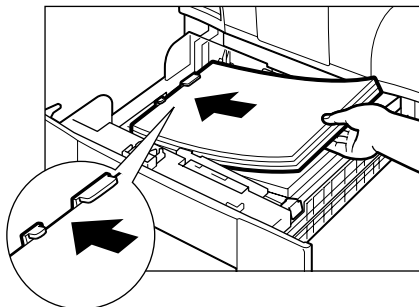
- 2** Slide the length guide while lifting it up slightly, and align the length guide with the length mark for the paper you plan to load in the paper drawer.

Be sure to align the length guide with the LGL or LTR mark.

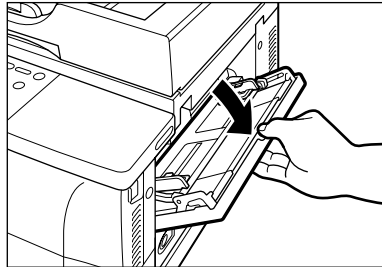

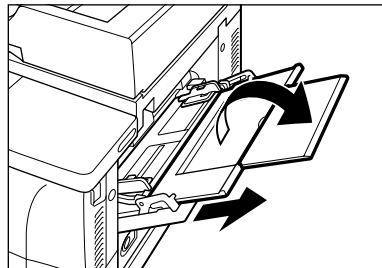
Loading Paper in the Stack Bypass

Use the stack bypass when you want to print on special paper, such as envelopes, transparencies, labels or heavy paper. You can place up to 100 sheets of 20 lb bond (80 g/m²) paper (which is a stack approximately 3/16" or 10 mm high) in the stack bypass. The paper will be automatically fed into the machine.

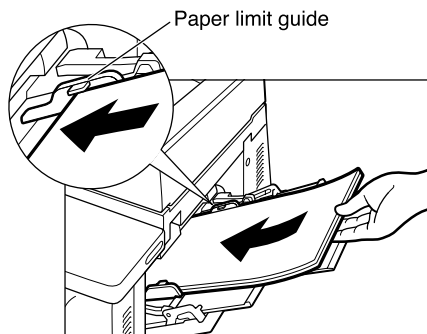
1 Open the stack bypass.



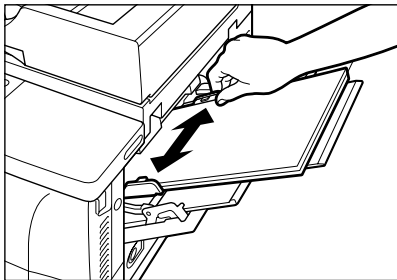
2 Pull out the paper tray and open the extension on the tray.



3 Load the paper stack facing up into the stack bypass.



4 Adjust the slide guides to fit the size of the paper stack.



IMPORTANT

If the slide guides are not adjusted correctly for the paper size, the quality of your print images may be adversely affected.

NOTE

- When making copies on letter size paper after having continuously copied on paper smaller than letter size paper, the copies may be dirty. To prevent copies from becoming dirty, wait about one minute before making copies.
- Insert the paper stack into the machine as far as it will go.
- If the paper is curled, uncurl it before placing it in the stack bypass. Failure to do so may cause paper creases and/or paper jams.
- 16 to 32 lb bond (56 to 128 g/m²) paper is acceptable.
- Make sure that the paper stack does not exceed the paper limit guide.
- Some types of paper may not feed properly into the stack bypass. For high quality copies, be sure to use the paper and transparencies recommended by Canon.
- Load transparencies one by one.
- When making copies of a small size document or thick paper, the copy speed may be slightly slower than usual.
- To specify the paper size every time you load the paper into the stack bypass, follow these steps:

Press [◀] or [▶] to display/select the following menu items. Press [Set].

– Press [Additional Functions] → <COMMON SETTINGS> → <STACK BYPASS SIZE> → <OFF> → <SET ON LOADING>

– Load the paper into the stack bypass → select the paper size using [◀] or [▶] → press [Set].

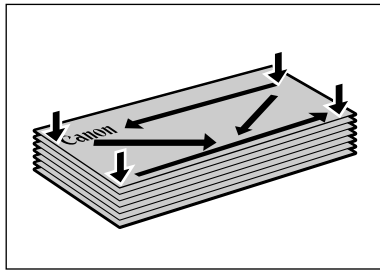

Loading Envelopes in the Stack Bypass

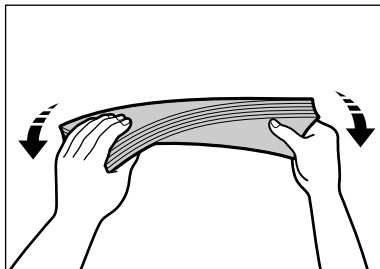
Canon recommends using these envelopes: COM10, MONARCH, DL, ISO-B5, ISO-C5, YOGATA #4, or YOGATA #2. Using other envelopes may affect the quality of the copy image.

- 1 Arrange the stack of envelopes on a firm, clean surface, and press down firmly on the edges to make the folds crisp.**

Press all the way around the envelopes to remove any curls and expel air from inside the envelopes. Also, press firmly on the area that corresponds to the edges of the back flap.

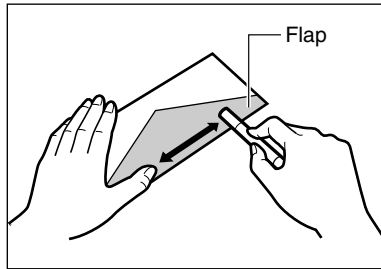


- 2 Remove any curling from the envelopes by holding the edges diagonally and bending them gently.**



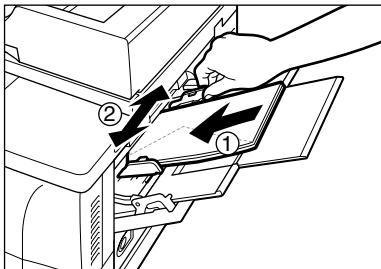
3 Run a pen or other rounded object along the back flaps to flatten them.

The flaps should not bulge more than 0.2" (5 mm).



4 Insert the stack of envelopes into the stack bypass ①, and adjust the slide guides to fit the size of the envelope ②.

- Position the envelopes with the print side up (flaps should not be visible) and load the envelope so that the right edge (stamp side) feeds first in the stack bypass.
- If the envelope to be loaded has a flap on the short edge, this edge must enter the machine first. Not loading it this way may result in paper jams.
- Make sure the stack does not exceed the paper limit guide.



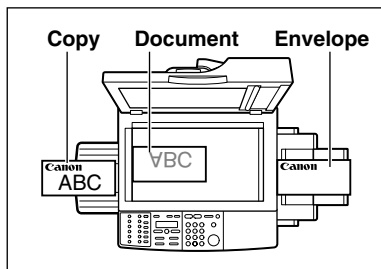
The machine is now ready to print.



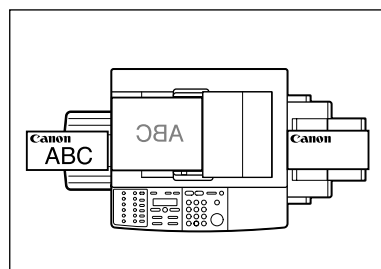
NOTE

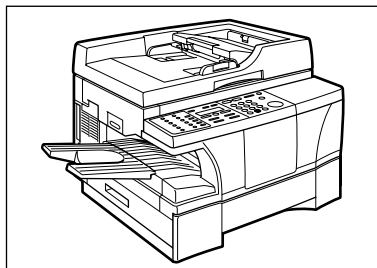
Your machine requires little periodic maintenance. This section describes the necessary cleaning procedures for your machine.

⚠ CAUTION

- When cleaning the machine's exterior or the platen glass, be sure to disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.
- For the imageRUNNER 1670F, print any received faxes stored in memory before disconnecting the power cord, because documents in memory are backed up only for about two hours when the power cord is disconnected. (See Chapter 5, "Special Sending and Receiving Features," in the *Facsimile Guide* for details.)
- Use a soft cloth to avoid scratching the components. Do not use tissue paper, paper towels, or similar materials for cleaning; they can stick to the components or generate static charges.
- Do not use volatile liquids such as thinner, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner to clean the interior of the machine; these can damage the machine's components.

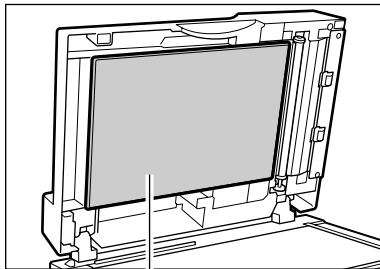
Cleaning the Exterior

Wipe the machine's exterior with a clean, soft, lint free cloth moistened with water or diluted dishwashing detergent solution.

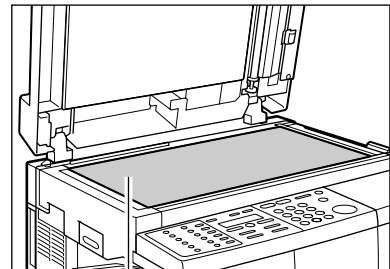


Cleaning the Scanning Area

Wipe the scanning area (shaded area) with a clean, soft, lint free cloth moistened with water. Then wipe the area with a clean, soft, dry, lint free cloth.



Rear Side of the ADF

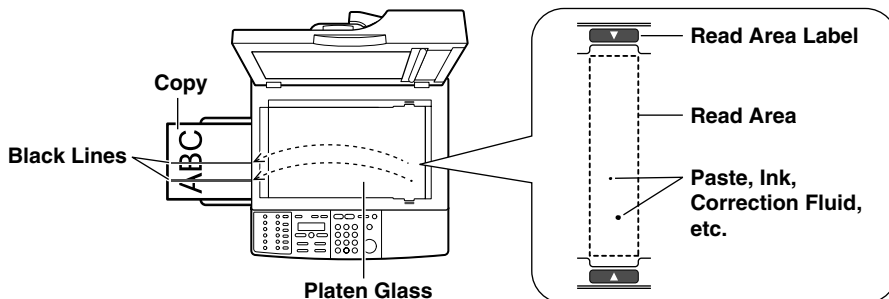


Platen Glass

Cleaning the Read Area of the Platen Glass

Black lines may appear in copies (as shown in the illustration below) when the ADF is used to feed documents. This is caused by paste, ink, correction fluid, or other foreign matter in the read area (between ▼ and ▲) of the platen glass. Use a clean soft cloth to wipe the read area clean. Take particular care to clean at the locations where the black lines are appearing on copies.

If you have trouble getting the glass clean, wipe the area with a cloth moistened with water or a mild neutral detergent, and then wipe the glass dry with another cloth.



IMPORTANT

Paste, ink, correction fluid, and other foreign matter can soil the platen glass when you send a document through the ADF while the paste, ink, or correction fluid on the original is still wet. This is what causes black lines on copies. Whenever you load a document in the ADF, always check to make sure that any paste, ink, or correction fluid on the document is completely dry.

Cleaning the Rollers Inside the Main Unit

If the rollers inside the main unit are dirty, the copy quality will deteriorate. In this case, you can clean the rollers using the <ADJUST/CLEAN> setting from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu.



NOTE

While the In Use/Memory indicator is lit, the machine does not clean the roller even if you perform the procedure below (imageRUNNER 1670F model only).

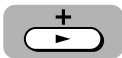

If a paper jam occurs in the ADF, remove jammed paper from the ADF (see "Removing Jammed Paper from the ADF," on p. 6-6), then perform the procedure below.



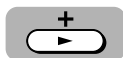

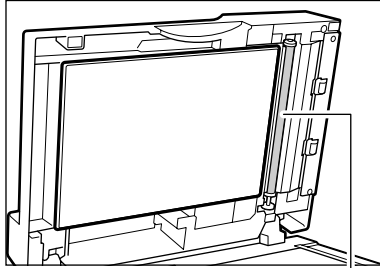

Replacing the Toner Cartridge

This section describes how to remove the used toner cartridge and replace it with a new one.

When the message <TONER LEVEL LOW> or <TONER EMPTY> appears in the LCD, replace the toner cartridge.

⚠ WARNING

Do not throw the toner cartridge into open flames, as this may cause the toner inside the toner cartridge to ignite and result in burns or a fire.

⚠ CAUTION

When you remove the toner cartridge from the machine or the sealing tape from the toner cartridge, handle it carefully. Otherwise, the toner may scatter and get into your eyes or mouth. In this case, rinse out your eyes or mouth thoroughly with water immediately and consult a doctor.

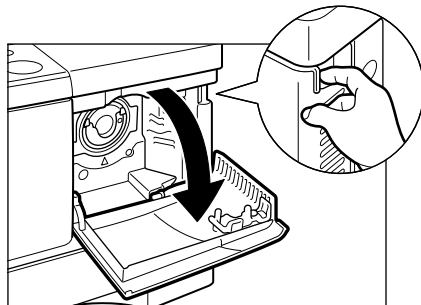

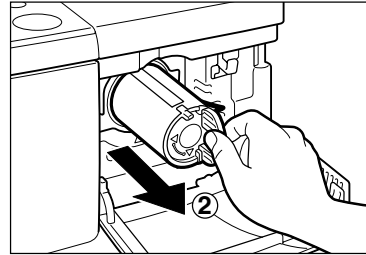
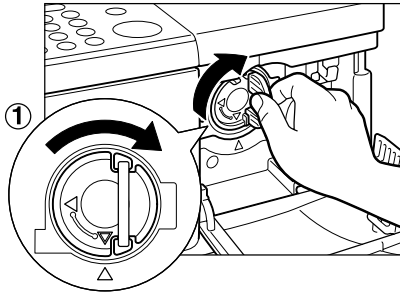
When removing the toner cartridge, take care not to allow the toner to come into contact with your hands or clothing. If they become dirty, wash them immediately with cold water. Washing with warm water will set the toner and make it impossible to remove the toner stains.

Repacking and Transporting the Machine

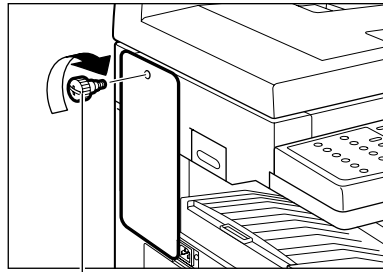
Be sure to disconnect the power cord before transporting the machine. If the machine is likely to be subjected to vibration (for example, when transporting over long distances), be sure to take the precautions described below. If you do not follow these precautions, the machine may be damaged or the quality of your copy images may be adversely affected.

- 1** Disconnect the power cord.
- 2** If the machine is connected to a telephone or PC, remove the telephone line or cable.
- 3** Lift the platen unit lever, slide the platen unit and open the drum cartridge cover.
- 4** Pull out the shipping attachment inserted in the holder when installing the machine. (The removed shipping attachment is needed in step 6.)



- 5** Close the drum cartridge cover and slide the platen unit to the original position.

- 6 Attach the shipping attachment on the left side of the machine using a coin.**

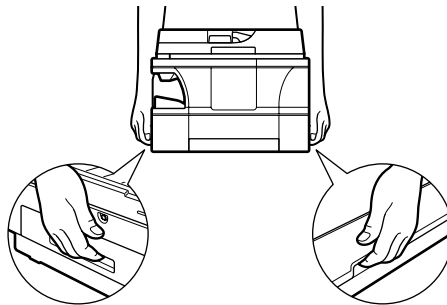

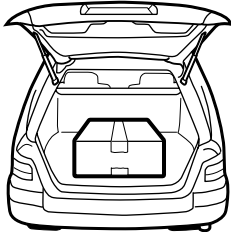

When carrying this machine, be sure to hold it in the designated places as shown in the illustration. Dropping the machine may cause personal injury.

Transporting the Machine by Car

- 1** Pack the machine, using the original packing material and box.
- 2** Place the machine on a level, stable surface.



IMPORTANT

- Do not leave the machine inside a car for a long period of time; the temperature can become very high or low.
- Avoid rough roads; excessive vibration may damage the machine or adversely affect the quality of your copy images.
- Place a cover over the machine. Do not leave the machine in direct sunlight.
- When moving the machine, use the original shipping box that it was packed in when you purchased it.
- When using the original shipping box, do not place the power cord or other objects on the ADF; this may damage the ADF.

Clearing Paper Jams

This section describes how to remove jammed paper from the main unit, paper drawer, ADF, and stack bypass.

Removing Jammed Paper from Inside the Main Unit

When print media jams inside the main unit, the LCD displays the messages <REC. PAPER JAM> and <SLIDE PLATEN LEFT>.

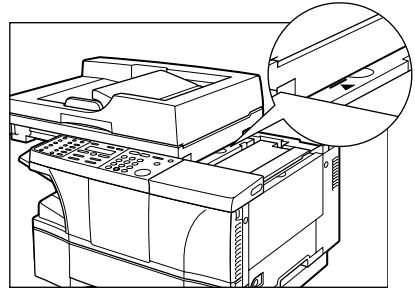
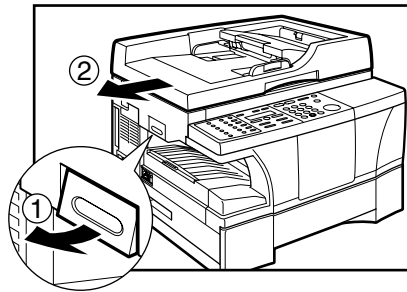
CAUTION

There are some areas inside the machine and drum cartridge that are subject to high-voltages and high-temperatures. Take adequate precaution when performing internal inspections to avoid burns or electrical shock.

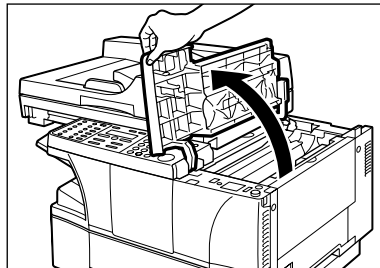
NOTE

When removing copy paper that has become jammed inside the machine, take care not to allow the toner on the jammed copy paper to come into contact with your hands or clothing, as this will dirty your hands or clothing. If they become dirty, wash them immediately with cold water. Washing with warm water will set the toner and make it impossible to remove the toner stains.

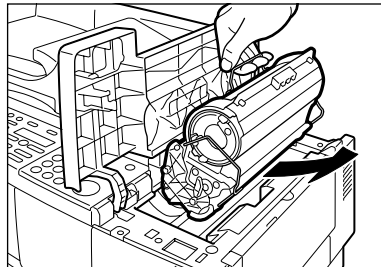
- 1** Lift the platen unit lever ① and slide the platen unit ② until the  mark appears.



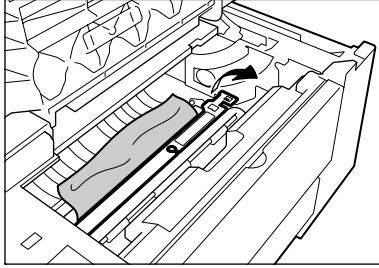
- 2** Open the drum cartridge cover.



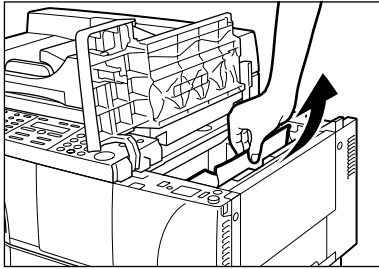
- 3** Remove the drum cartridge from the machine.



4 Flip the transfer guide.



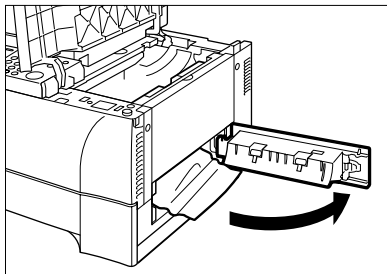
5 Gently remove any jammed paper from inside the main unit.



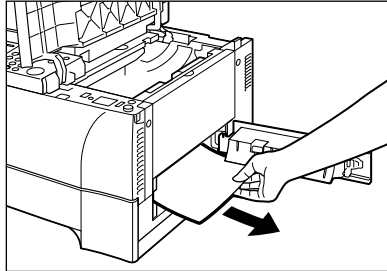
NOTE

Be sure to remove jammed paper from inside the main unit even when the jammed paper has been partially output.

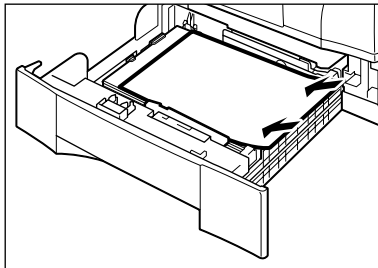
6 Open the right cover.



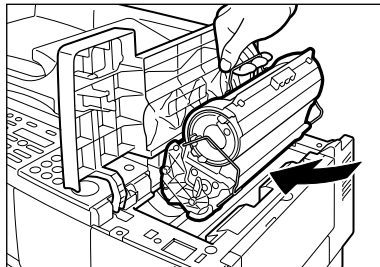
- 7** Gently remove any jammed paper from inside the main unit, then close the right cover.



- 8** Pull out the cassette and reset any paper stuck out of the cassette. Then, push the cassette back into the main unit.



- 9** Return the transfer guide to the original position. Then re-install the cartridge back into the machine and close the cartridge cover.



10 Slide the platen unit to the original position.



NOTE

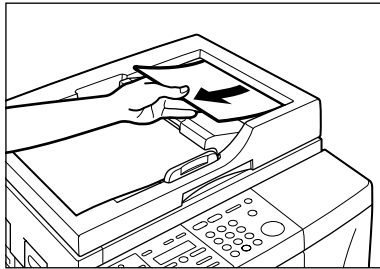
The printout will start again.

Removing Jammed Paper from the ADF

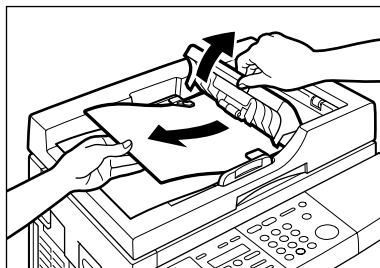
The imageRUNNER 1670F/1630 models have an ADF.

When print media jams in the ADF, the LCD displays the messages <CHECK DOCUMENT> and <OPEN THE ADF>.

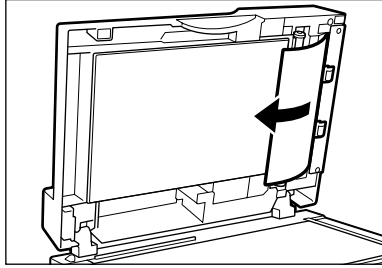
- 1 Gently remove the jammed paper from the document output slot of the ADF.



- 2 Open the feeder cover and gently remove the jammed paper from the ADF.



3 Open the ADF, then pull the paper out straight.



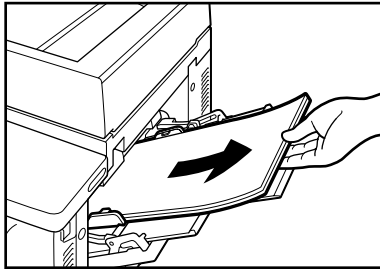
NOTE

- Open the ADF and make sure there is no document left.
- After removing jammed paper, even the edges of the document and reload it in the ADF.

Removing Jammed Paper from the Stack Bypass

When print media jams in the stack bypass, the LCD displays the messages <REC. PAPER JAM> and <SLIDE PLATEN LEFT>.

- 1 Gently remove the jammed paper from the stack bypass.**



NOTE

- Be sure to check for any jammed paper inside the machine. (See “Removing Jammed Paper from Inside the Main Unit,” starting on p. 6-2.)
- If the LCD continues displaying the error message, slide the platen unit to the left and then slide it back to the original position, or open and close the toner supply cover.

List of LCD Display Messages

The following messages are displayed in the LCD when the machine performs a function or if it encounters an error. This section describes the general messages and those related to copy functions. For the messages related to fax functions, see Chapter 8, "Troubleshooting," in the *Facsimile Guide*.

CHANGE DOCUMENT

Cause When collating copies or making a 2 on 1 copy of documents using the platen glass, you pressed [Start] before replacing a document.

Remedy Replace the document → press [Start].

CHECK DOCUMENT OPEN THE ADF

Cause There is a paper jam in the ADF.

Remedy Remove the document you are trying to copy or send from the ADF. (See "Removing Jammed Paper from the ADF," on p. 6-6.)
Make sure that the document is not too long or too short. (See "Acceptable Originals," on p. 2-2.)

CHECK PRINTER

Cause An abnormality has occurred in the printer.

Remedy Disconnect the machine from the power supply and wait for 10 minutes, then reconnect it. If the message remains, disconnect the machine and call your local authorized Canon dealer.

CHECK TONER/DRUM CRG

Cause The toner or drum cartridge is not installed.

Remedy Install the toner or drum cartridge correctly.

DOCUMENT TOO LONG

Cause 1 The document is longer than 14" (356 mm).

Remedy Reduce the length of the document to within 14" (356 mm), and copy it again.

Cause 2 The ADF roller rotates without feeding documents.

Remedy Fan the edge of the paper stack that will feed into the machine first, then tap the edge of multiple page documents on a flat surface to even the stack.

INCORRECT PAPER SIZE

Cause The size of the paper in the paper drawer and that specified in the <DRAWER PAPER SIZE> setting (from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu) are different. This message is displayed when the report is output.

Remedy Load the correct paper size or change the <DRAWER PAPER SIZE> setting in the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu. (See "Common Settings," on p. 4-4.) Then reset the machine by sliding the platen unit to the left and then back to the original position.

LOAD LTR SIZE PAPER

Cause <PAPER SIZE GROUP> is set to <INCH>, 2 on 1 copy is set, and paper other than letter size paper is set in the paper drawer/stack bypass.

Remedy Load letter size paper in the paper drawer/stack bypass. (See "Loading Paper in the Paper Drawer," on p. 5-5.)

MEMORY FULL

Cause The machine's memory is full because collate copy or 2 on 1 copy was set when a large document was loaded.

Remedy Divide the document and copy each part separately.
If the messages <MEMORY FULL> and <PRESS SET KEY> appear while scanning documents using the ADF, the document being scanned stops in the ADF. In this case, press [Set] to make the document come out automatically.

PLATEN/COVER IS OPEN
CLOSE PLATEN/COVER

Cause The platen unit or toner supply cover is not closed correctly.

Remedy Slide the platen unit or toner supply cover to the original position.

**REC. PAPER JAM
SLIDE PLATEN LEFT**

Cause There is a paper jam.

Remedy Clear the paper jam and reload paper in the paper drawer or stack bypass. (See "Clearing Paper Jams," on p. 6-2.)

REMOVE DOC. ON GLASS

Cause A document has been left on the platen glass.

Remedy Remove or change the document from the platen glass.

SCANNING ↔ MAKING SPACE IN MEM ↔ PLEASE WAIT

Cause Memory is getting low during scanning because the document has many graphics or photos.

Remedy When memory space becomes available as printing continues, scanning resumes automatically.

START AGAIN

Cause The paper in the paper drawer has run out, the toner has run out, paper jams have occurred, or the paper size setting is wrong while the report is printing.

Remedy After loading paper in the paper drawer, replacing the toner cartridge, clearing jams, or specifying the correct paper size, print the report again.

**STOP KEY PRESSED
PRESS SET KEY**

Cause The document has stopped in the ADF because you pressed [Stop/Reset] while scanning.

Remedy Press [Set] to make the document come out automatically.

SUPPLY REC. PAPER

Cause No paper is loaded in the paper drawer or stack bypass.

Remedy Load paper in the paper drawer or stack bypass. Make sure the paper stack in the paper drawer or stack bypass does not exceed the paper limit guides. If you run out of paper while making copies, do not load a different paper size. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

SYSTEM ERRORExxx

Cause An error of some kind has occurred in the machine. (xxx stands for a number.)

Remedy Disconnect the machine from the power supply and wait for 10 minutes, then reconnect it. If this does not solve the problem, disconnect the machine and call your local authorized Canon dealer.

TONER EMPTY

Cause The toner cartridge is empty.

Remedy Replace the toner cartridge with a new one. (See "Replacing the Toner Cartridge," on p. 5-19.)

TONER LEVEL LOW

Cause The toner inside the toner cartridge is running low.

Remedy Prepare a new toner cartridge, or replace the toner cartridge with a new one. (See "Replacing the Toner Cartridge," on p. 5-19.)

WASTE TONER FULL

Cause The waste toner in the drum unit is full.

Remedy Replace the drum unit. (For details, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.)

If Trouble Occurs

If an error occurs during copying, or there is an abnormality in the machine, check the following points.

Paper Feeding Problems

Paper does not feed correctly.

Cause 1 The paper drawer or stack bypass may contain too many sheets.

Remedy Make sure the paper stack in the paper drawer or stack bypass does not exceed the paper limit guides. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

Cause 2 Paper may not be loaded correctly.

Remedy Make sure the paper stack is loaded properly in the paper drawer or stack bypass, and that the length guide of the paper drawer and the slide guides of the stack bypass are adjusted correctly. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

Paper feeds skewed. (Printing is skewed.)

Cause Paper may not be loaded correctly.

Remedy 1 Make sure the paper stack is loaded properly in the paper drawer or stack bypass, and that the length guide of the paper drawer and the slide guides of the stack bypass are adjusted correctly. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

Remedy 2 Make sure the paper exit path is clear.

Multiple sheets feed into the machine at the same time.

Cause 1 Paper may not be loaded correctly.

Remedy Make sure the paper stack is loaded properly in the paper drawer or stack bypass, and that the length guide of the paper drawer and the slide guides of the stack bypass are adjusted correctly. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

Cause 2 Sheets of paper may be sticking together.

Remedy Be sure to fan the paper stack before loading it in the paper drawer or stack bypass. This keeps the sheets of paper from sticking together.

Cause 3 The paper drawer or stack bypass may contain too many sheets.

Remedy 1 Make sure the paper stack in the paper drawer or stack bypass does not exceed the paper limit guides. (See "Loading Paper," on p. 5-5.)

Remedy 2 Do not force the paper stack into the paper drawer or stack bypass.

Cause 4 Different types of paper may be loaded in the paper drawer or stack bypass.

Remedy 1 Load only one type of paper.

Remedy 2 Make sure you load paper that meets the paper requirements for the machine. (See "Paper Handling," on p. 5-2.)

Transparencies do not feed correctly.

Cause 1 Transparencies are loaded in the paper drawer.

Remedy Do not load transparencies in the paper drawer. Load them in the stack bypass.

Cause 2 Transparencies may not be loaded in the stack bypass correctly.

Remedy Make sure they are loaded properly. The transparencies should be loaded one by one in the stack bypass. (See "Loading Paper in the Stack Bypass," on p. 5-9.)

Cause 3 Transparencies for color copiers may be loaded in the stack bypass.

Remedy Do not use any transparencies for color copiers. They will cause a paper jam. Please use transparencies recommended by Canon.

Repeated paper jams occur.

Cause 1 The paper you are using may be causing the jams.

Remedy 1 Be sure to fan the paper stack before loading it in the paper drawer or stack bypass. This keeps the sheets of paper from sticking together.

Remedy 2 Check that the size, thickness, and type of the paper you are using and your printing environment are within the specifications of the machine. (See "Paper Handling," on p. 5-2.)

Envelopes do not feed correctly.

Cause 1 Envelopes are loaded in the paper drawer.

Remedy Do not load the envelopes in the paper drawer. Load them in the stack bypass.

Cause 2 Envelopes may not be loaded correctly.

Remedy Make sure the envelopes are loaded properly. Do not load more than 10 envelopes in the stack bypass. (See “Loading Envelopes in the Stack Bypass,” on p. 5-11.)

Cause 3 The envelopes you are using may not meet the requirements for the machine.

Remedy Envelopes must be COM10, MONARCH, DL, ISO-B5, ISO-C5, YOGATA #4, or YOGATA #2 envelopes.

Copying Problems

The machine will not make a copy.

Cause 1 The toner cartridge may not be installed properly.

Remedy Make sure the toner cartridge is installed properly.

Cause 2 The sealing tape may not be removed from the toner cartridge.

Remedy Remove the sealing tape from the toner cartridge.

Cause 3 The paper drawer may not be inserted completely into the main unit.

Remedy Insert the paper drawer as far as it will go. (See “Loading Paper in the Paper Drawer,” on p. 5-5.)

Cause 4 The document may not have been loaded correctly.

Remedy 1 Remove the document, even the stack it if necessary, and load it in the ADF correctly. (See “ADF (Automatic Document Feeder),” on p. 2-7.)

Remedy 2 Make sure the ADF is closed.

Cause 5 The document may be left on the platen glass.

Remedy Remove the document from the platen glass, and load it in the ADF again.

Cause 6 <TONER EMPTY> is displayed.

Remedy Replace the toner cartridge. (See “Replacing the Toner Cartridge,” on p. 5-19.)

Cause 7 <WASTE TONER FULL> is displayed.

Remedy Replace the drum unit. (For details, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.)

The message <MEMORY FULL> or <MAKING SPACE IN MEM> appears in the LCD when making copies of a multiple page document.

Cause 1 Paper in the paper drawer or stack bypass may have run out.

Remedy If there is no paper and the machine's memory becomes full during copying, the messages <MAKING SPACE IN MEM> and <SUPPLY REC. PAPER> are displayed alternately. If paper is loaded, the copying resumes automatically.

Cause 2 The document you are copying may have too many graphics or photos.

Remedy When making copies of such documents, separate the documents into smaller stacks or feed them one by one.

Cause 3 The machine's memory is full.

Remedy Print or delete any documents stored in memory to free up space in the machine's memory, then start again. (See Chapter 5, "Special Sending and Receiving Features," in the *Facsimile Guide*).

Documents have black streaks or appear dirty after you feed them in the ADF.

Cause The ADF roller is dirty.

Remedy Clean the ADF roller. (See "Cleaning the ADF Roller," on p. 5-17.)

Print Quality Problems

The print quality is not what you expect; print is not clear, has missing dots, or white streaks.

Cause 1 The size, thickness, and type of the paper you are using are not within the specifications of the machine.

Remedy Check that the paper you are using is supported by the specifications of the machine. (See "Paper Handling," on p. 5-2.)

Cause 2 The toner cartridge may not be installed properly.

Remedy Make sure the toner cartridge is installed properly.

Cause 3 The toner in the toner cartridge may be low.

Remedy Replace the toner cartridge if necessary. (See "Replacing the Toner Cartridge," on p. 5-19.)

Cause 4 The copy exposure may not be adjusted correctly.

Remedy Adjust the exposure correctly. (See "Copy Exposure Adjustments," on p. 3-12.)

Copies are dirty.

- Cause 1** The platen glass or rear side of the ADF/platen glass cover may be dirty.
- Remedy** Clean the platen glass or rear side of the ADF/platen glass cover. (See “Cleaning the Read Area of the Platen Glass,” on p. 5-15.)
- Cause 2** The rollers inside the machine are dirty.
- Remedy** Clean the rollers. (See “Cleaning the Rollers Inside the Main Unit,” on p. 5-16.)
- Cause 3** There may be a scratch on the drum unit.
- Remedy** Replace the drum unit. (For details, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.)
- Cause 4** Condensation has built up inside the machine.
- Remedy** Allow at least two hours for the machine to adjust to room temperature before attempting to use it.
- Cause 5** The machine may be installed in a location where the floor or foundation is unstable.
- Remedy** Install the machine in a proper location.

Black lines are on the copy.

- Cause** The read area of the platen glass is dirty.
- Remedy** Clean the read area of the platen glass. (See “Cleaning the Read Area of the Platen Glass,” on p. 5-15.)

Copies are too dark or too light.

- Cause 1** The copy exposure may not be adjusted correctly.
- Remedy** Adjust the copy exposure correctly using the <PRINT EXPOSURE> setting in <COMMON SETTINGS> from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)
- Cause 2** <TONER SAVER MODE> may be set to <ON> in <COMMON SETTINGS> from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu.
- Remedy** Set <TONER SAVER MODE> to <OFF>. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)

The copy images are partly missing or shaded when you make copies on thick paper.

- Cause** The <BYPASS PAPERTYPE> or <COPY POWER LEVEL> settings in <COMMON SETTINGS> (from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu) may not be set correctly.
- Remedy 1** Select <SPECIAL PAPER 1> in <BYPASS PAPERTYPE>. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)
- Remedy 2** Set <COPY POWER LEVEL> to <HIGH>. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)

The copy images are missing when you make copies on envelopes.

Cause The <BYPASS PAPERTYPE> setting in <COMMON SETTINGS> (from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu) may not be set correctly.

Remedy Select <SPECIAL PAPER 2> in <BYPASS PAPERTYPE>. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)

The copy images are missing when you make copies using the 2 on 1 function.

Cause The documents may not be letter size.

Remedy Be sure to use two sheets of letter size documents when you make copies using the 2 on 1 function.

The copy images are missing when you make copies.

Cause <330 mm> may be selected in <MAX. SCAN LENGTH> in <COPY SETTINGS> from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu. (Only for the imageRUNNER 1670F/1630 models.)

Remedy Select <356 mm> in <MAX. SCAN LENGTH>. (See “Copy Settings,” on p. 4-6.)

The edges of copies are dirty when you make copies using the stack bypass.

Cause The <STACK BYPASS SIZE> setting in <COMMON SETTINGS> (from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu) may not be set correctly.

Remedy Set <STACK BYPASS SIZE> to <ON> and specify the size. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)

The copies are dirty only when you use thin paper or tracing paper.

Cause A mode other than <TRACING PAPER> may be set for <BYPASS PAPERTYPE> in <COMMON SETTINGS> from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu.

Remedy Select <TRACING PAPER>. (See “Common Settings,” on p. 4-4.)

There are shaded parts on the bottoms of copies.

Cause You made copies of a letter size document on legal size paper using the platen glass. (Only for the imageRUNNER 1670F/1630 models.)

Remedy Select <330 mm> in <MAX. SCAN LENGTH>. (See “Copy Settings,” on p. 4-6.)

A copy of a large size document cannot be made using the platen glass.

Cause <330 mm> may be selected in <MAX. SCAN LENGTH> in <COPY SETTINGS> from the <ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS> menu. (Only for the imageRUNNER 1670F/1630 models.)

Remedy Select <356 mm> in <MAX. SCAN LENGTH>. (See “Copy Settings,” on p. 4-6.)

Printing Problems

The Alarm indicator flashes.

Cause The machine may have a paper jam.

Remedy 1 Clear the paper jam. (See “Clearing Paper Jams,” on p. 6-2.)

Remedy 2 If the machine has no paper jam, disconnect the machine from the power supply and wait 10 minutes, then reconnect it. If the problem is fixed, the Alarm indicator will turn off, and the LCD will return to the Standby mode. If the Alarm indicator remains lit, disconnect the machine, and call your local authorized Canon dealer.

Printout does not match paper size.

Cause Paper may not be loaded and aligned correctly in the paper drawer or in the stack bypass.

Remedy Make sure the paper is loaded and aligned correctly. (See “Loading Paper,” on p. 5-5.)

General Problems

The machine has no power.

Cause The power cord may not be connected securely.

Remedy Check that the power cord is connected securely into the machine and into the wall outlet. Insert the power cord straight into the power cord connector on the left side of the machine. Do not insert it at an angle. Otherwise, the machine may not be properly connected to the power supply and may not turn on. If this happens, disconnect the power cord, and reconnect it correctly after a minute or more.

Nothing appears in the LCD.

Cause 1 The power cord may not be connected securely.

Remedy Check that the power cord is connected securely into the machine and into the wall outlet. Insert the power cord straight into the power cord connector on the left side of the machine. Do not insert it at an angle. Otherwise, the machine may not be properly connected to the power supply and may not turn on. If this happens, disconnect the power cord, and reconnect it correctly after a minute or more. If the LCD remains blank, disconnect the machine and wait more than 10 minutes until the temperature inside the machine lowers, then reconnect it. If the LCD remains blank, disconnect the machine, and call your local authorized Canon dealer.

Cause 2 The [Energy Saver] key lights up.

Remedy The Energy Saver mode is activated. To restore the machine from the Energy Saver mode, press [Energy Saver].

The letter "E" and numbers appear in the LCD.

Cause An abnormality has occurred in the machine.

Remedy Disconnect the machine from the power supply and wait more than 10 minutes, then reconnect it. If the message is still displayed, disconnect the machine and call your local authorized Canon dealer.

If You Cannot Solve the Problem

If you have a problem with your machine and you cannot solve it by referring to the information in this chapter, call your local authorized Canon dealer.

⚠ CAUTION

If the machine makes strange noises, emits smoke or strange smells, unplug the power cord immediately, and then call your local authorized Canon dealer. Do not attempt to disassemble or repair the machine yourself.

🔑 IMPORTANT

Attempting to repair the machine yourself may void the limited warranty.

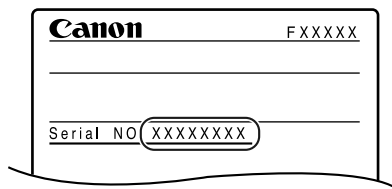
