



Basic Operation

This section describes the operation to navigate menus with the Easy-Scroll Wheel, \, \, \, and **OK** buttons, taking the **HOME** screen as an example.

Press the **HOME** button.

The **HOME** screen will be displayed.




Turn the Easy-Scroll Wheel to select the mode, then press the **OK** button.

You can turn the Easy-Scroll Wheel left or right. You can also use the ◀ or ▶ button to select setting items.

Move the icon of the desired mode to position (A).

The selected mode screen will be displayed.

Scan: You can save the scanned data to a connected computer using the

■ Operation of Other Buttons


Function Buttons

Two Function buttons enable you to select menus displayed at the bottom of the LCD.

The screen that appears when you press a Function button depends on the screen that is displayed and which Function button you press.

- Left Function button
 When you press the left Function button on the HOME screen, the remaining ink volume screen is displayed.
- (2) Right Function button When you press the right Function button on the HOME screen, the introductions for the selected mode functions are displayed.

When you press them on screens other than the **HOME** screen, an operation procedure or menus are displayed.



Back Button

You can return the LCD to the previous screen.


Display the Print Instruction Using the Navigation Menu

When you do not know how to use the print function for the frequent use or how to refill paper, you can easily get the explanation from the navigation menu.

- 1 Press the NAVI button.
 The NAVI screen is displayed.
- 2 Select a menu you would like to use, then press the **OK** button.

The explanation about the work flow is displayed. Operate as the explanation.

You can select various menus on the NAVI screen.



Turning the Machine On and Off

Turn on the machine before printing.

Turning on the Machine

Before turning on the machine, confirm the following.

• The Print Head and ink tanks are installed into place.

If you are using the machine connected to a computer, confirm also the following.

- The machine is connected to your computer (or a compatible device).
- The MP Drivers are installed.

■ Note

If preparatory operations above are not complete, follow your setup sheet and/or the Network Setup Guide to complete them.

Open the Operation Panel and press the ON/ **OFF** button to turn on the machine.

The Power lamp flashes and then remains lit blue.

Important

If the Alarm lamp lights up or flashes orange and an error message is displayed on the LCD, see "An Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 74.

If you are using the machine connected to a computer, turn on your computer.



Turning off the Machine

To turn off the machine, press the ON/OFF

When the **Power** lamp stops flashing, the machine is turned off.

Important

About the Power Plug

When removing the power plug after turing off the machine, be sure to confirm that the Power lamp is not lit. If the power plug is removed from the wall outlet with the Power lamp still lit or flashing blue, the machine may become unable to print.

■ To Save Energy

This machine has the following two modes that allow you to save energy.

Screen-saver Mode

The LCD goes out if the machine is not operated for about five minutes*.

* You cannot change the wait time before the LCD goes out.



When you want to restore the display, perform a print operation or press any button except for the **ON/OFF** button. When you press the **ON/OFF** button while the machine is in Screen-saver mode, the machine turns off.

Power Save Mode

The machine enters the Power save mode if not operated for a certain time interval*. In the Power save mode, the FAU lamp is turned off to reduce the power consumption of the machine.

* You can set the wait time before the FAU lamp is turned off. Select from **5 minutes**, **15 minutes**, **1 hour**, and **4 hours**. The default setting is **15 minutes**. For details, refer to "Other Settings" in "Changing the Machine Settings" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

The FAU lamp is turned off, if no operation is performed for the time interval set in the Power save mode while the FAU lamp is on. If you scan films frequently, it is recommended to set the longer time interval (1 hour or 4 hours).



Press any button except for the **ON/OFF** button or perform a copy or scan operation to restore the machine.

Handling the Original Document

This section describes how to load the original document on the Platen Glass.

Loading Original Documents


Load originals to copy or scan on the Platen Glass.

- For details on how to load photographs, see "Scanning a Photo" on page 35.
- For details on how to load positive and negative 35 mm film strips and 35 mm slides, see "Scanning a Film" on page 35.

■ Note

Make sure any glue, ink, correction fluid, or the like on the original document is completely dry before loading it on the Platen Glass.

- 1 Load the original document on the Platen Glass.
 - (1) Lift the Document Cover.
 - (2) Load the original with the side to be copied/scanned facing down on the Platen Glass. Align the upper left corner of your original with the alignment mark as shown in the figure on the right.




Important

- Do not place any objects weighing more than 4.4 lb / 2.0 kg on the Platen Glass.
- Do not press or put weight on the original with pressure exceeding 4.4 lb / 2.0 kg.
 Doing so may cause the scanner to malfunction or the Platen Glass to break.

■ Note

The machine cannot scan the shaded area in the figure below.



2 Gently close the Document Cover.

Loading Printing Paper

This section describes how to load printing paper in the Rear Tray and the Cassette.

₱ Note

- At purchase, the machine is set to feed from the Rear Tray. If you are printing without changing paper source settings, load paper in the Rear Tray. For details on loading paper, see "Loading Paper" on page 16.
- Do not place any objects in front of the machine.

■ Using Specialty Media

Canon recommends that you use Canon genuine media to ensure optimal print quality.

- *1 Paper with a Model Number is Canon specialty media. Refer to the instruction manual supplied with the paper for detailed information on the printable side and notes on handling paper. For information on the paper sizes available for each Canon genuine paper, visit our website. You may not be able to purchase some Canon genuine papers depending on the country or region of purchase. Paper is not sold in the US by Model Number. Purchase paper by name.
- *2 Proper feeding of paper may not be possible at the maximum capacity depending on the type of paper or environmental conditions (either very high or low temperature and humidity). In such cases, reduce the sheets of paper you load at a time to around half.
- *3 Available only when printing from your computer.
- *4 When loading paper in stacks, the print side may be marked as it is fed in or sheets may be stuck to one another causing them not to be fed properly. In this case, load one sheet at a time
- *5 Feeding this paper from the Cassette can damage the machine. Load in the Rear Tray.
- *6 We recommend that you remove the previously printed sheet from the Paper Output Tray before continuously printing to avoid blurs and discoloration.
- *7 Canon genuine media is produced and stored to get optimum printing quality. We recommend using Canon genuine media.
- *8 For details on using art paper, refer to "Before Printing on Art Paper" in "Compatible Media Types" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.
- *9 If you are using this paper, you cannot print in the 1.38 inches / 35 mm margin on the top and bottom edges.
 - If you choose a special page size for Fine Art Paper in the printer driver, a limit is set to prevent printing in the 1.38 inches / 35 mm margin on the top and bottom edges of the paper. We recommend checking the area being printed in the preview screen before printing. Refer to the *PC Printing Guide* on-screen manual.
- *10 When printing photos saved on a memory card to sticker paper, be sure to select **Sticker print** in the memory card mode. Refer to "Printing on Stickers (Sticker Print)" in "Printing from a Memory Card" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

When copying printed photos onto sticker paper, be sure to select **Sticker print** in the easy photo reprint mode. Refer to "Printing on Stickers (Sticker Print)" in "Photo Printing from Printed Photo or Film" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

When copying photos onto sticker paper from a film, be sure to select **Sticker print** in the film print mode. Refer to "Printing on Stickers (Sticker Print)" in "Photo Printing from Printed Photo or Film" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

When printing photos saved on your mobile phone to sticker paper, select **Stickers** for paper size in **Wireless print settings**. Refer to "Setting Items" in "Setting the Page Size, Media Type, and Layout When Printing from a Mobile Phone" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

Important

- Put unused paper back into the package, and store them avoiding heat, humidity, and direct sunlight
- Do not touch the printed surface nor stack the printed sheets until the ink is fixed.

■ Note

- To specify the page size and media type when printing photos saved on mobile phones, refer to "Setting the Page Size, Media Type, and Layout When Printing from a Mobile Phone" in "Printing Photographs from a Wireless Communication Device" of the User's Guide on-screen manual
- For a detailed description of printing media types, refer to "Printing Media" in the User's Guide on-screen manual.


Media Types You Cannot Use

Do not use the following types of paper. Using such paper will not only produce unsatisfactory results, but can also cause the machine to jam or malfunction. Additionally, when printing on A5 or smaller sized paper, do not use paper thinner than a postcard, including plain paper or notepad paper cut to a small size.

- Folded, curled, or wrinkled paper
- Damp paper
- Paper that is too thin (weighing less than 17 lb / 64 gsm)
- Paper that is too thick (plain paper, except for Canon genuine paper, weighing more than 28 lb / 105 gsm)
- Picture postcards
- Postcards affixed with photos or stickers
- Envelopes with a double flap (or sticker flaps)
- Envelopes with an embossed or treated surface
- Envelopes with pressure stickers
- Envelopes whose gummed flaps are already moistened and adhesive
- Any type of paper with holes
- Paper that is not rectangular
- Paper bound with staples or glue
- Paper with adhesives
- Paper decorated with glitter, etc.

Hints for Handling the Paper Sources

This machine offers two paper sources to load printing paper; the Rear Tray (A) and the Cassette (B).



Here are some hints for handling these paper sources according to how you are using them.


■ Note

- Some types and sizes of paper are not loadable in the Cassette and require the use of the Rear Tray. See "Paper Handling" on page 10. For details on loading paper, see "Loading Paper" on page 16. Printer driver settings may be required depending on the usage. For details on printer driver settings,
- refer to the PC Printing Guide on-screen manual.

If You Print Regularly on Photo Paper as well as on Plain Paper

If you use photo paper as much as plain paper, you can load photo paper in the Rear Tray and plain paper in the Cassette. This way, you can switch the paper source according to the type of paper just by pressing the Paper Feed Switch.


You can also specify the type and size of paper to be fed from the Cassette using the printer driver. You can print more efficiently by specifying the type of paper you use regularly this way, since the paper source will be switched automatically to the Cassette for this paper.



- (A) Rear Tray: Load paper of various types and sizes, including photo paper
- (B) Cassette: Load paper you use most regularly, such as plain paper

■ If You Print Mainly on Plain Paper


You can load plain paper of the same size in both paper sources, and set the printer driver to automatically switch the paper source when either paper source runs out of paper during printing.



(A) Rear Tray: Load plain paper(B) Cassette: Load plain paper

Changing the Paper Source

Each time you press the Paper Feed Switch, the paper source to be used switches between the Rear Tray and the Cassette. The paper feeds from the paper source whose lamp is lit.



- (A) Rear Tray lamp
- (B) Cassette lamp
- (C) Paper Feed Switch



Important

When Printing from Your Computer


If a setting other than Paper Feed Switch is selected for Paper Source in the printer driver, the Paper Feed Switch on the machine will be disabled and the printer driver settings take precedence when printing. Confirm the setting in the printer driver. See "Printing with Windows" on page 40 or "Printing with Macintosh" on page 41.

For details on paper source selection using the printer driver, refer to the PC Printing Guide on-screen manual.

Loading Paper

Important

- If you cut plain paper to 4" x 6" / 101.6 x 152.4 mm, 5" x 7" / 127.0 x 177.8 mm, or 2.13" x 3.39" / 54.0 x 86.0 mm (credit card-size) for a trial print, it can cause paper jams.
- You cannot print on postcards affixed with photos or stickers.
- Always load paper in portrait orientation (A). Loading paper in landscape orientation (B) can cause the paper to be jammed.



■ Note

 We recommend using genuine Canon photo media when printing photographs. For details on the specialty media Canon provides for use with its various printers, refer to "Using Specialty Media" on page 9.


When Printing on Plain Paper

- You can use general copy paper or Canon's Super White Paper. When printing on both sides, we recommend Canon's Super White Paper Double-Sided.
 Paper size:
 - Standard sizes: A4, B5, A5, Letter, and Legal (Rear Tray only)
 - Non-standard sizes for the Rear Tray: 2.13 x 3.39 inches to 8.5 x 23 inches / 54.0 x 86.0 mm to 215.9 x 584.2 mm
 - Non-standard sizes for the Cassette: 3.5 x 5 inches to 8.5 x 11.69 inches / 89.0 x 127.0 mm to 215.9 x 297.0 mm

Paper weight: 17 to 28 lb / 64 to 105 gsm (plain paper, except for Canon genuine paper)

■ Loading Paper in the Rear Tray

1 Flatten the four corners of the paper before loading it.



■ Note

- Align the edges of paper neatly before loading. Loading paper without aligning the edges may cause paper jams.
- If paper is curled, hold the opposing curled corners and gently bend them in the opposite direction until the paper becomes completely flat. See "Paper is curled." on page 81.
- To avoid curling, handle paper as follows.
 - When you do not print, remove unused paper from the Rear Tray, put them back into the package, and keep it on a level surface.
- Take out only the necessary number of sheets from the package, just before printing.

Prepare to load paper.

- (1) Open the Sheet Feeder Cover and pull out the Paper Support.
 - Put your finger in the rounded indent of the Paper Support and pull it out until it stops.
- (2) Open the Paper Output Tray. Put your finger in the center of the top of the Paper Output Tray and open it gently.
- (3) Open the Output Tray Extension.
- (4) Press the Paper Feed Switch so that the Rear Tray lamp (A) lights.

■ Note

You can also select the paper source with the printer driver.

For details, refer to the *PC Printing Guide* on-screen manual.

3 Load the paper.

- (1) Load the paper in the Rear Tray with the print side facing UP.
- (2) Align the paper stack against the Cover Guide on the right side of the Paper Support.


■ Note


Make sure that the Cover Guide is set upright when you load paper in the Rear Tray.

(3) Pinch the Paper Guide and slide it against the left side of the paper stack.

Important

Do not slide the Paper Guide too hard. The paper may not be fed properly.





Do not load higher than the Load Limit Mark (B).

4 Specify the page size and media type settings according to the loaded paper.

■ Note

- When performing copy direct printing without using a computer, select the size and type of the loaded paper in Page size and Media type in each mode. For details on settings in each mode, see "Setting Items" on page 25 and page 30.
 When using the machine connected to a computer, select the size and type of the loaded paper





Scanning Images

You can scan images from the machine to a computer without printing them and save them in popular image types, such as JPEG, TIFF, bitmaps, or PDF. The scanned data can be sent to one of the computers connected over a network as well as to a computer connected via USB. If you are scanning printed text, you can use the OCR (Optical Character Recognition) software to convert it to text data

Scanning Methods

You can select from the various scanning methods.

• If You Want to Scan Originals Easily From the Machine

You can scan originals by using the Operation Panel of the machine. See "Scanning Using the Operation Panel of the Machine" on page 42.

If You Want to Edit or Print the Scanned Images

MP Navigator EX enables you to edit the scanned images, such as optimizing or trimming. You can also start application software from MP Navigator EX to edit or print the scanned images.

For detailed operations of MP Navigator EX, refer to the Scanning Guide on-screen manual.

If You Want to Scan Originals with Advanced Settings

ScanGear enables you to scan originals with advanced settings such as the resolution. For detailed operations of ScanGear, refer to the *Scanning Guide* on-screen manual.

Besides the above-mentioned methods, you can use a TWAIN- or WIA- (Windows Vista and Windows XP only) compliant application software and the Control Panel (Windows Vista and Windows XP only) to scan originals with this machine. For detailed operations, refer to the *Scanning Guide* on-screen manual

Important

Make sure that the document has been loaded correctly according to the document type that you have selected.

- 8 Press the Color or Black button.

Important

Do not stare at the light directly for an extended period of time when scanning originals.

Printing Photographs Directly from a **PictBridge Compliant Device**

You can connect a PictBridge compliant device such as a digital camera, camcorder, or mobile phone using a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer, and print recorded images directly without using a computer.

Connectable Devices

PictBridge is an industry standard enabling a range of digital photo solutions, including the direct printing of photos from a digital still camera, camcorder or mobile phone* without the need to use a computer. A device can be connected to this machine for direct printing regardless of the manufacturer or the model as long as it complies with the PictBridge standard.

PictBridge compliant digital still cameras, digital camcorders, and camera-equipped mobile phones are hereafter collectively referred to as "PictBridge compliant device".



A device with this mark is PictBridge compliant.

Printable Image Data Format

This machine prints images taken with a DCF (Design rule for Camera File system) ver. 1.0/2.0compatible digital camera (Exif ver. 2.2/2.21 compliant), as well as PNG files.

Printing Photographs Directly from a PictBridge **Compliant Device**

To connect a PictBridge compliant device to this machine, use a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer.

Warning

Do not connect any equipment other than PictBridge compliant devices or the optional Bluetooth Unit BU-20 to the Direct Print Port of the machine. If you do so, electric shock, fire, or damage to the machine could result.

Important

Never disconnect the USB cable during printing unless when explicitly allowed to by the PictBridge compliant device. When disconnecting the USB cable between the PictBridge compliant device and machine, follow the instructions given in the device's instruction manual.

■ Note

When printing photos with the PictBridge compliant device connected to the machine, we recommend the use of the AC adapter supplied with the device. If you are using the device battery, be sure to charge it



Layout Setting

Various layout options are available.

 The following two options are available.

When you select On, photos are optimized for printing using the Photo opt. pro function.

If you are using a Canon-brand PictBridge compliant device, the following additional options may be available, depending on the model.

- VIVID makes green and blue more lively.
- NR (Noise Reduction) reduces the noise on blue areas like the sky as well as on black areas.
- Face brightens a darkened face on the photo taken against the light.
- **Red-Eye** corrects red eyes in portraits caused by flash photography.

Trimming Setting

Set the print settings to **Default** on the PictBridge compliant device when you want to print according to the settings on the machine.

Displaying the PictBridge Settings Screen and Specifying the Settings

- (1) Turn on the machine.
- (2) Select Settings on the HOME screen, then press the OK button.

It also analyzes a scene such as scenery, night scene, person, etc. and corrects each scene with the most suitable color, brightness, or contrasts automatically to print.

When **Manual correction** is selected, repeat steps (5) and (6), and then specify each item. After finishing all settings you need, select **OK** and then press the **OK** button. You can print from the PictBridge compliant device with specified settings.

When ink runs out or other errors occur, an error message is displayed on the LCD to inform you of the error. See "An Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 74 and confirm how to handle it. When printing from your computer, error messages appear on your computer screen as well.

■ Note

- Be sure to install the ink tanks in the correct order indicated by the label on the Print Head Holder.
 The machine will not print if an ink tank is installed in the incorrect position.
- For information on the compatible ink tanks, refer to the back cover of this guide.
- If printing becomes faint or white streaks appear despite sufficient ink levels, see "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 56.



With the LCD of this Machine

You can confirm the status of each ink tank in the remaining ink volume screen on the LCD.

- (1) Make sure that the machine is turned on, then press the HOME button. The HOME screen will be displayed.
- (2) Press the left Function button. The below screen will be displayed.



(A) Confirm whether any symbols are displayed here.



Ink is low. You can continue printing for a while, but we recommend you to have a new ink tank available.



With the lnk Lamps

You can confirm the status of each ink tank by the ink lamps. Open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) of the machine to confirm how the ink lamps light or flash.

Ink lamp is on

The ink tank is correctly set and there is enough ink remaining to print.

Ink lamp is flashing

Flashing slowly (at around 3-second intervals)





Ink is low. You can continue printing for a while, but we recommend you to have a new ink tank available

Flashing quickly (at around 1-second intervals)









The ink tank is inserted in the wrong position or it is empty. Ensure that the ink tank is in the correct position as directed by the label on the Print Head Holder. If the position is correct and its lamp flashes, it is empty. Replace it with a new one.

Ink lamp is off

The tank is not set properly. Press the mark on the ink tank until the tank clicks into place. If it does not click into place, make sure that the orange protective cap has been removed from the bottom of the ink tank. See "Prepare the replacement tank." on page 53. If the lamps are still off after reinserting the ink tanks, there has been an error and the machine cannot print. Check the error message displayed on the LCD. See "An Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 74.

■ Replacing Ink Tanks

When ink tanks run out of ink, replace them using the following steps.

Important

Handling Ink

- To maintain optimal printing quality, we recommend the use of specified Canon brand ink tanks. Refilling ink is not recommended.
- Once you remove an ink tank, replace it immediately. Do not leave the machine with ink tanks removed.
- Replace empty tanks with new ones. Inserting partially used ink tanks may cause the nozzles to clog. Furthermore, with such tanks, the machine will not be able to inform you when to replace the tanks properly.
- Once an ink tank has been installed, do not remove it from the machine and leave it out in the open. This will cause the ink tank to dry out, and the machine may not operate properly when it is reinstalled. To maintain optimal printing quality, use an ink tank within six months of first use.
- Color ink may be consumed even when printing a black-and-white document or when blackand-white printing is specified.
 - Color ink is also consumed in Print Head Cleaning and Print Head Deep Cleaning, which may be necessary to maintain the machine's performance. When an ink tank is out of ink, replace it immediately with a new one.
- **1** Open the Paper Output Tray.
 - (1) Put your finger in the center of the top of the Paper Output Tray and open it gently.
- Make sure that the machine is turned on, and lift the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) until it stops.


The Print Head Holder moves to the center.

▲ Caution

- If the Document Cover is opened, you cannot open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover). Be sure to open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) with the Document Cover closed.
- Do not hold the LCD or the Operation Panel.
- Do not hold the Print Head Holder to stop or move
- Do not touch the metallic parts inside the machine.

Important

If the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) is left open for more than 10 minutes, the Print Head Holder moves to the right side. Close and reopen the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) to return the holder to the center.



3 Remove the ink tank whose lamp is flashing fast


(1) Push the tab and remove the ink tank.

Important

- Handle ink tanks carefully to avoid staining clothing or the surrounding area.
- Discard empty ink tanks according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.

■ Note

- Do not remove more than one ink tank at a time. Be sure to replace ink tanks one by one when replacing more than one ink tank.
- For details on ink lamp flashing speeds, see "Getting the Ink Status Information" on page 50.



(A) Do NOT touch the Print Head Lock Lever; remove only the ink tank.

4 Prepare the replacement tank.

- (1) Remove the new ink tank from its packaging.
- (2) Pull the orange tape (B) in the direction of the arrow to peel off the protective film.
- (3) Remove the film (C) completely.


Important

Make sure that the protective film does not remain on the air hole (D). If the air hole is blocked with the remaining film, ink may leak out or may not eject properly.

(4) Remove the orange protective cap from the bottom of the ink tank. Discard the cap once it is removed.

Important

- Do not touch the electrical contacts (F) on the ink tank. Doing so can cause the machine to malfunction or become unable to print.
- Be sure to remove the clear film from the ink tank in the exact order shown above, as failure to follow this step may cause the ink to leak and stain your clothes and hands.
- Do not squeeze the side of ink tanks as this may cause the ink to leak out and stain your clothes and hands.
- Do not reattach the protective cap once you have removed it. Discard it according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.
- Do not touch the open ink port once the protective cap is removed, as this may prevent the ink from being ejected properly.
- Be careful not to stain your clothes and hands with ink on the removed protective cap.




(E) Carefully hold the protective cap when removing it to prevent the ink from staining your fingers.


5 Install the ink tank.

- (1) Insert the front end of the ink tank into the Print
 - (G) Make sure the position of the tank matches the label
- (2) Press on the mark on the ink tank until the ink tank snaps firmly into place.
- (3) Make sure that the ink lamp lights up red.

Important

Install all the ink tanks to print. The machine cannot be used unless all the ink tanks are installed.





Gently close the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover).

Caution

- Be sure to hold the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) firmly using both hands, and be careful not to get your fingers caught.
 Do not hold the LCD or the Operation Panel.

Note

- If the error message is still displayed after the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) is closed, see "An Error Message Is Displayed on the LCD" on page 74.

 When you start printing after replacing the ink tank, Print Head Cleaning is performed
- automatically. Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Cleaning finishes. Wait until you cannot hear the operation noise.

Keeping the Best Printing Results

To avoid drying of the Print Head and clogging of the nozzles, note the following.

■ Note

- Ink may blur depending on the paper in the following cases;
 - Printed area is traced with a highlight pen or paint-stick
 - Printed area is stained with water or sweat
- If the print head nozzles get clogged, printouts will become faint or particular colors will not be printed properly. For details, see "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 56.

■ When You Turn Off the Machine

Follow the procedure below to turn off the machine.

- (1) Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn off the machine.
- (2) Confirm that the Power lamp has gone out. This takes a few seconds or as long as around 30 seconds.
- (3) Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.
 If you are using a power outlet strip, you can switch it off instead.

When you press the **ON/OFF** button to turn off the machine, the machine automatically puts a protective cap on the Print Head to prevent the ink from drying. If you remove the power cord or switch off the power outlet strip before the **Power** lamp goes out, this capping will not be done properly, causing the Print Head to dry and clog.

■ When You Are Not Using the Machine for a Long Time

When you are not using the machine for a long time, print or copy in both black & white and in color, or perform Print Head Cleaning, about once a month to prevent degradation of the Print Head.

Numerous nozzles are installed in the Print Head for high-precision printing. Just as the uncapped tip of a ballpoint pen or marker becomes dry and unusable if it is not used for a long period of time, the print head nozzles become blocked by dried ink. Periodically printing or cleaning the Print Head can prevent this blockage.

When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect

When printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect even if ink remains in the ink tanks, the print head nozzles are probably clogged. Print the nozzle check pattern to confirm the condition of the nozzles and then perform Print Head Cleaning.

If print results are not satisfactory, performing Print Head Alignment may improve print quality.

■ Note

Before performing maintenance

- Open the Scanning Unit (Printer Cover) and make sure that all lamps for the ink tanks are lit red. If not, see "Getting the Ink Status Information" on page 50 and take the appropriate action.
- Increase the Print Quality setting in the printer driver settings.
 For details, refer to the PC Printing Guide on-screen manual.









- **2** Open the Paper Output Tray, and then open the Output Tray Extension.

- 3 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Start Print Head Cleaning.
 - Press the HOME button.

 - (2) Select **Settings**, then press the **OK** button. The **Settings** screen is displayed.
 - (3) Select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
 - (4) Select **Cleaning**, then press the **OK** button. The confirmation screen is displayed.

Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Cleaning finishes. This takes about 1 minute.

Print Head Deep Cleaning consumes more ink than standard Print Head Cleaning, so perform this procedure only when necessary.

- **2** Open the Paper Output Tray, and then open the Output Tray Extension.

- 3 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the paper source where you have loaded paper.
- 4 Start Print Head Deep Cleaning.
 - Press the HOME button.
 The HOME screen is displayed.
 - (2) Select **Settings**, then press the **OK** button. The **Settings** screen is displayed.
 - (3) Select Maintenance, then press the OK button. The Maintenance screen is displayed.
 - (4) Select Deep cleaning, then press the OK button.

The confirmation screen is displayed.

(5) Select Yes, then press the OK button. Print Head Deep Cleaning starts. Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Deep Cleaning finishes. This takes about 2 minutes.



- **5** Check the condition of the Print Head.
 - (1) Print the nozzle check pattern to check the print head condition. See "Printing the Nozzle Check Pattern" on page 57. If a particular color is not printed properly, replace the ink tank of that color. See "Replacing an Ink Tank" on page 50.







Cleaning Your Machine

This section describes the cleaning procedure that is needed to maintain your machine.

▲ Caution

- Do not use tissue paper, paper towels, or similar materials for cleaning. Paper tissue powders or fine
 threads may remain inside the machine and cause problems such as a blocked Print Head and poor
 printing results. Use a soft cloth to avoid scratching the components.
- Never use volatile liquids such as thinners, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner to clean
 the machine, as this may cause a malfunction or damage the machine's surface.

Cleaning the Exterior of the Machine

▲ Caution

Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.

Important

- When cleaning the exterior of the machine, do not use tissue paper, rough-textured cloth, or similar materials, as this may scratch the surface.
- Never use neutral detergent or volatile liquids such as thinners, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner, as this may damage the surface.

Be sure to use a soft cloth such as eyeglasses cleaning cloth and wipe off dirt on the surface with it gently. Smooth out wrinkles on the cloth if necessary before cleaning.

■ Cleaning the Platen Glass and Document Cover


▲ Caution

Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.

Important

The inner side of the Document Cover (white sheet) (A) is easily damaged, so wipe it gently.

With a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, wipe the Platen Glass (B), the inner side of the Document Cover (white sheet) (A), and the FAU lamp (C) gently. Make sure not to leave any residue, especially on the Platen Glass.



■ Cleaning the Paper Feed Roller (Roller Cleaning)

Clean the paper feed roller if paper is not fed properly. Cleaning the paper feed roller will wear the roller, so perform this only when necessary.


Make sure that the Inner Cover is closed.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, and then remove any paper from the Rear Tray and Cassette.
- 2 Press the Paper Feed Switch to select the paper source to clean.
- 3 Clean the paper feed roller.
 - (1) Press the **HOME** button. The **HOME** screen is displayed.
 - (2) Select **Settings**, then press the **OK** button. The **Settings** screen is displayed.
 - (3) Select Maintenance, then press the **OK** button. The **Maintenance** screen is displayed.
 - (4) Select Roller cleaning, then press the **OK** button. The confirmation screen is displayed.
 - (5) Select Yes, then press the OK button. The Paper Feed Roller will rotate as it is cleaned.
- 4 Repeat (4) and (5) in step 3 twice.
- **5** Open the Paper Output Tray, and then open the Output Tray Extension.
 - (1) Put your finger in the center of the top of the Paper Output Tray and open it gently.
 - (2) Open the Output Tray Extension.
- Make sure that the paper feed roller stops rotating, then load three or more sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in portrait orientation in the paper source you selected in step 2.

7 Repeat (4) and (5) in step 3 three times.

The paper cleans the paper feed roller as it feeds through the machine.

If the problem is not resolved, wipe the paper feed roller (A) located on the right side inside the Rear Tray with a moistened cotton swab or the like. Rotate the roller (A) manually as you clean it. Do not touch the roller with your fingers; rotate it with the cotton swab. If this does not solve the problem, contact your Canon service representative.



■ Cleaning the Inside of the Machine (Bottom Plate Cleaning)

This section describes how to clean the inside of the machine. If the inside of the machine becomes dirty, printed paper may get dirty, so we recommend performing cleaning regularly.

Important


Do not perform any other operation while the bottom plate is being cleaned.

Make sure that the Inner Cover is closed.

- 1 Make sure that the machine is turned on, and then remove any paper from the Rear Tray.
- **2** Open the Paper Output Tray, and then open the Output Tray Extension.
 - (1) Put your finger in the center of the top of the Paper Output Tray and open it gently.
 - (2) Open the Output Tray Extension.
- **3** Fold a single sheet of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in half widthwise, and then unfold the paper.

4 Load only this sheet of paper in the Rear Tray with the open side to the front.



(A) Load the paper after unfolding it.

5 Perform bottom plate cleaning.

Important

Even if the Cassette is selected as the paper source, paper will be fed from the Rear Tray.

- (1) Press the HOME button. The HOME screen is displayed.
- (2) Select Settings, then press the OK button. The Settings screen is displayed.
- (3) Select Maintenance, then press the **OK** button. The **Maintenance** screen is displayed.
- (4) Select Bottom plate cleaning, then press the OK button. The confirmation screen is displayed.
- (5) Select Yes, then press the OK button. The paper cleans the inside of the machine as it feeds through the machine. Check the folded part of the ejected paper. If it is smudged with ink, perform Bottom Plate Cleaning again.

If the problem is not resolved after performing Bottom Plate Cleaning twice, the protrusions inside the machine may be stained. Clean them according to instructions. See "Cleaning the Protrusions Inside the Machine" on page 71.

■ Note


When performing Bottom Plate Cleaning again, make sure to use a new piece of paper.

■ Cleaning the Protrusions Inside the Machine

If protrusions inside the machine are stained, wipe off any ink from the protrusions using a cotton swab or the like.

Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power cord before cleaning the machine.

When an error occurs in printing such as the machine is out of paper or paper is jammed, a troubleshooting message is displayed automatically. Take the appropriate action described in the message.

The message may vary depending on the version of your Windows operating system.

Print Results Not Satisfactory

If the print result is not satisfactory such as white streaks, misaligned lines, and uneven colors, confirm the paper and print quality settings first.

• Check 1: Do the page size and media type settings match the size and type of the loaded paper?

When these settings are incorrect, you cannot obtain a proper print result. If you are printing a photograph or an illustration, incorrect paper type setting may reduce the quality of printout color. Also, if you print with an incorrect paper type setting, the printed surface may be scratched. In borderless printing, uneven coloring may occur depending on the combination of the paper type setting and the loaded paper.

Check 2: Did you set the print quality setting appropriately?

Select a print quality option suitable to the paper and image for printing. If you notice blurs or uneven colors, increase the print quality setting and try printing again.

- * When printing from a PictBridge compliant device, set the print quality setting by using the Operation Panel on the machine. You cannot make this setting from a PictBridge compliant device.
- * You cannot change the print quality setting when printing from a wireless communication device.






