#### **Electrical Cautions**



**CAUTION:** Use only the power cable provided with your Topspin 360. Inspect the power cord and determine if it provides the proper plug and is appropriately certified for use with your electrical system. Discard the cord if it is inappropriate for your country's electrical system and obtain the proper cord, as required by your national electrical codes or ordinances.



**CAUTION:** Grounding is supplied by the ground-prong on the 3-prong power cable. Do not attach a separate ground cable. Do not use adapter plugs. Do not remove the ground prong from the cable. Ensure the ground connection on the power supply is correct and functioning before applying power to the Topspin 360.



**CAUTION:** Always ground yourself before touching any internal Topspin 360 component to avoid damage from electrostatic discharge (ESD).



**CAUTION:** The Topspin 360 has two power cables. The operator must disconnect all power cables before attempting to remove the Topspin 360 from the rack.



**CAUTION:** Remove power cables by grasping the cable connector and pulling straight out. To replace power-supply cables, grasp the cable connector, align the connector with the power jack, and insert the connector straight into the jack. If the chassis comes equipped with a power-plug retainer, move the bail wire back into place to keep the power plug firmly in place.

# Introduction

The Topspin 360 Server Switch provides data center managers with a high-performance, low-latency interconnect that runs Fibre Channel and Ethernet traffic transparently over an InfiniBand (IB) backplane. Figure 1-1 displays the front of the Topspin 360 Server Switch (with the bezel on).



Figure 1-1: Topspin 360 Chassis - Front View (Bezel End)

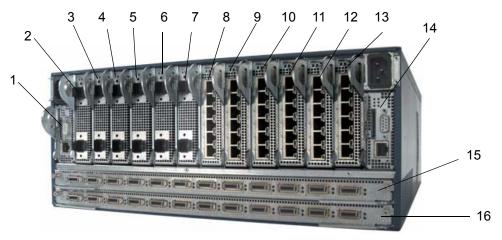


Figure 1-2: Topspin 360 Chassis - Back View (Service End) with Slot Numbers

Figure 1-2 displays the back of the Topspin 360 Server Switch and numbers the slots on the chassis.

The vertical slots at the top of the service end of the Topspin 360 are numbered 1 to 14 from left to right. The horizontal slots at the bottom of the service end of the chassis are numbered 15 to 16 from top to bottom. Field replaceable units (FRUs) with interfaces populate the service side of the chassis. FRUs such as power supplies and blower modules populate the front of the chassis, behind the bezel.

## **Features**

The Topspin 360 provides unprecedented levels of availability, scalability, and manageability for deploying server clusters and on-demand computing. Switch modules provide up to a terabit of internal bandwidth, and Ethernet or Fibre Channel field-replaceable interface cards enable up to 72 ports of Fibre Channel, Ethernet, and InfiniBand interfaces in a single chassis.

#### **Performance**

Expressly designed to apply networking principles to computing problems, the Topspin 360 uses a switched InfiniBand fabric to interconnect server resources at 10 Gbps speeds. The combination of high bandwidth and low latency allows resources to be disaggregated and dynamically reassembled without the limits of the shared PCI bus.

#### **Unified Fabric**

The Topspin 360 integrates storage, server, and networking I/O into one unified fabric. With only one interface card in each host, you can manage all resources on one fabric and eliminate the need to install and manage multiple Ethernet, Fibre Channel, and inter-process communications (IPC) cards. The Topspin 360 aggregates and load balances all types of I/O, significantly reducing the number of managed ports in your environment and increasing availability.

## **Transparent Topology**

Based on the Topspin Transparent Topology architecture, the Topspin 360 creates virtual IP and Fibre Channel interfaces on every server, allowing existing IP and storage area network (SAN) resources to seamlessly extend to server clusters. Using Fibre Channel gateways, SAN management technologies can "see" each individual node, enabling critical storage management and security models, such as Fibre Channel fabric zoning and storage-based LUN zoning. By adding Ethernet gateways, IT managers can also enable full IP connectivity, extending the value of server clusters to the rest of the enterprise.

## **Redundancy and High-Availability**

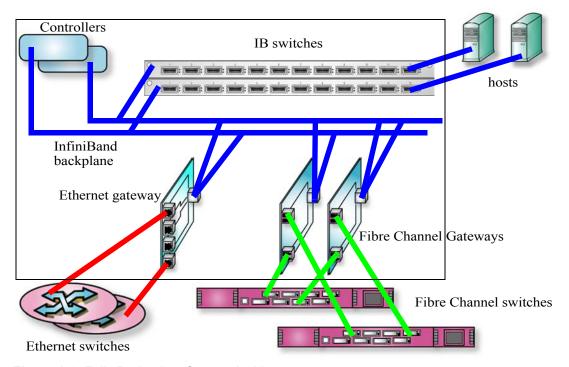


Figure 1-3: Fully Redundant System Architecture

The Topspin 360 is architected for full redundancy within a single box. Every component in the data path can be dual-connected from end to end. For example, a server with a 2-port HCA can be dual-attached to the two switch blades on the Topspin 360. Each gateway is also dual attached to the dual switch blades. In turn, the gateway modules are dual attached to Ethernet or Fibre Channel networks in pairs. With the addition of centralized load balancing and port aggregation, Ethernet and Fibre Channel uplink connections can be trunked and load balanced, allowing the Topspin 360 to reroute around failures. Each independently removable component is hot-swappable. Figure 1-3 depicts the internal Topspin 360 architecture.

The Topspin 360 can be used in a variety of networking environments, including database tiers, application tiers, and Web tiers. The Topspin 360 provides 10 Gbps connectivity to servers, 1 Gbps connectivity to Ethernet networks, and 2 Gbps connectivity to Fibre Channel networks. You can also aggregate uplinks for greater bandwidth and redundancy.

## **Scalability**

You can populate the service end of the Topspin 360 with additional Fibre Channel gateways, Ethernet gateways, and InfiniBand switch cards to increase the port count of your Server Switch. A second IB switch card adds 12 InfiniBand ports. Each additional FC gateway adds 2 Fibre Channel ports, and each additional Ethernet gateway adds 4 or 6 Ethernet ports.

## Introduction

The components of the Topspin 360 support the scalability and high availability of the Server Switch. The sections in this chapter discuss how to use, install, remove, and swap field-replaceable components to maximize the potential of your Topspin 360.

You can install the following components in your chassis:

- controller cards
- I/O gateways (Fibre Channel and Ethernet)
- InfiniBand switch cards
- power supplies
- blower modules



**CAUTION:** Never place your hand inside an empty card or module bay. You should never have cause to place a hand anywhere inside the Topspin 360 chassis. Unused card and module bays should always have a Topspin 360 blanking panel over the bay to ensure proper safety, ventilation, and cooling.

### **Controller Cards**

Controller cards manage the Topspin 360 and provide Ethernet and Serial Console port access to the Server Switch. You can install controller cards in slots 1 and 14 of the Topspin 360. Figure 2-1 displays the Topspin 360 controller card.



Figure 2-1: Topspin 360 Controller Card

The following points apply to the controller cards:

- Each Topspin 360 comes with one active controller and one warm standby controller.
- Upon power-up of the Topspin 360, slot 1 is the master (active). Slot 14 is the standby.
- The startup configuration file can be synchronized between the active and the standby controllers. The CLI prompts users to synchronize the controllers.
- When the master controller fails or reboots, the standby controller automatically takes over as the new master. All I/O cards (Switch cards, Fibre Channel gateways and Ethernet gateways) reboot when a failover occurs.
- Users can force a fail-over with the Element Manager GUI (Maintenance > Reboot) or command-line interface (reload command).
- The software upgrade/install process upgrades both the master controller and the standby controller at the same time. You do not need to upgrade them separately.
- A subnet manager runs on each controller card. The SM can manage a single Topspin 360 or redundant Topspin 360s.

#### **Install a Controller Card**

To install a controller card, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Remove the blanking panel if one resides in the slot.

- 3. Remove the controller card from any packaging.
- 4. Extend the ejector lever on the card completely.
- 5. Insert the controller card module into slot 1 or slot 14 such that the ejector lever sits on the bottom-left-hand side of the module.
- 6. Push the controller card firmly into the slot. The ejector lever begins to close.

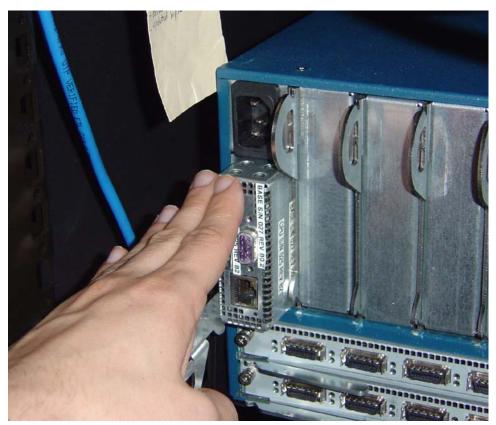


Figure 2-2: Inserting the Controller Card

7. Push the ejector lever up until it clicks into place.

# **Ethernet and Fibre Channel Gateways**

Topspin Ethernet and Fibre Channel gateways connect the Topspin 360, and IB-connected hosts, to IP and FC networks. All gateways are dual-connected to the redundant InfiniBand backplane of the Topspin 360. Figure 2-4 displays an Ethernet gateway. Figure 2-5 displays a Fibre Channel gateway.

#### Replacing and Updating Your Gateways

You can add, remove, and swap I/O gateways while your Topspin 360 runs. However, if the software image on your gateway does not match the software image that runs on your Server Switch, you must install the correct software on your gateway. For details, refer to the **install** command in the *Command Line Interface Reference Guide*.

Instructions on viewing the software image is described in "Viewing and Updating the Software Image on the Chassis" on page 33. To update a single gateway, use the standard installation procedure, but do not reboot the chassis. You can simply enable and disable the individual gateway to activate the new software image.

## Install an Ethernet or Fibre Channel Gateway

To install a gateway, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Remove the blanking panel if one resides in the slot.
- 3. Remove the gateway module from any packaging.
- 4. Extend the ejector lever on the gateway completely.
- 5. Insert the gateway into an expansion module slot such that the ejector lever sits on the bottom-left-hand side of the module.

**NOTE:** You can install gateways in slots 2 - 13. Populate your Topspin 360 from left to right.

- 6. Push the gateway module firmly into the slot. The ejector lever begins to close.
- 7. Push the ejector lever up until it clicks into place.
- 8. Open a telnet session and login to the chassis, if you have not already done so.
- 9. View the primary software image version for all cards in the chassis, use the **show card-inventory** command. Look for the **primary-image-source** field for each slot. (The slots are described in Figure 1-2.)

## InfiniBand Switch Cards

InfiniBand switch cards connect the Topspin 360 to IB-attached hosts and other switches in the IB network. The Topspin 360 supports one or two InfiniBand switch cards. The 12-port InfiniBand switch card expansion module is shown in Figure 2-6. The switch card provides

- 4x IB connections to each of the 12 gateway slots.
- 12 IB ports per switch card.

## **Install InfiniBand Switch Cards**

To install a switch card, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Remove the blanking panel if one resides in the slot with a #1 Phillips-head screwdriver.
- 3. Remove the switch card from any packaging.
- 4. Extend the ejector levers on the left- and right-hand sides of the switch card completely.
- 5. Insert the switch card into slot 15 or slot 16 such that the ejector levers sit on the bottom of the switch card.
- 6. Press the switch card firmly into the slot so the fasteners begin to close.

7. Close both fastener-levers simultaneously and completely.

8. Tighten the screws on either side of the switch card to secure it to the chassis.

#### **Remove InfiniBand Switch Cards**

To remove an InfiniBand switch card from the Topspin 360 chassis, perform the following steps:

- 1. Make sure the Topspin 360 chassis is secure.
- 2. If you are removing the InfiniBand card in slot 16 (the bottom card), you must power down the chassis before removing the card. The InfiniBand card in slot 16 is not hot-swappable.
  - The InfiniBand card in slot 15 is hot-swappable as long as there is a functional card installed in slot 16.
- 3. Properly ground yourself to avoid potential electrostatic discharge and damage to the card.
- 4. Facing the back of the Topspin 360 chassis, unfasten both screws on the InfiniBand switch card.

  Do not attempt to remove the screws from the card. Just unscrew them until you are sure the card is no longer attached to the chassis.
- 5. Open both ejector levers simultaneously and pull the switch card toward you.
- 6. Install blanking panel into the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

# **Power Supply Modules**

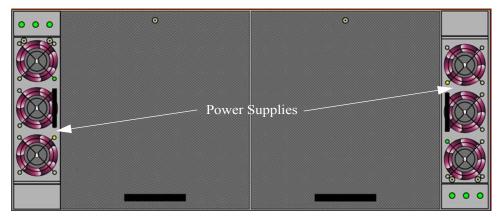


Figure 2-10: Power Supply Modules

Power supply modules reside in slots on the left- and right-hand sides of the front (bezel end) of the Topspin 360. Redundant power supplies support hot swaps. When your Server Switch includes only one

power supply, you can add a second power supply while the chassis runs. If you have two power supplies installed, you can remove one of them without removing power from the chassis. Figure 2-10 displays the location of the power supplies in the Topspin 360.

# **Install Power Supply Modules**

To insert a power supply, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Remove the blanking panel if one resides in the slot.
- 3. Remove the power supply module from any packaging.
- 4. Insert the power supply into an open slot such that the pull handle sits close to the blower module.

**NOTE:** The power supplies should be inserted in opposite directions of each other.

5. Press the power supply firmly into the chassis.



**NOTE:** The power socket on the back (service end) of the Topspin 360 corresponds to the power supply module on the same side of the Server Switch.

## Removing a Power Supply

To remove the power supply, perform the following steps:

- 1. Remove the power cord from the power supply.
- 2. Disengage the power supply by pulling it toward you.
- 3. Slide the power supply out of the chassis.
- 4. Fasten a blanking panel to the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

**NOTE:** The blanking panel is a flat sheet of metal with the same dimensions as the power module faceplate.

# **Blower Trays**

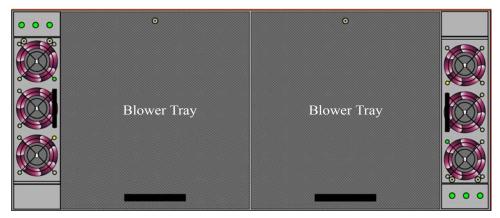


Figure 2-11: Blower Trays

The hot-swappable blower trays (fans) of your Topspin 360 maintain the internal temperature of your Server Switch. You do not need to turn off power to the chassis to replace a blower tray. Access the blower tray from the front (bezel end) of the Topspin 360 chassis. Figure 2-11 displays the blower trays in the chassis.

**NOTE:** Your chassis requires two fully-functioning blower modules at all times.

#### **Install Blower Trays**

To insert a blower tray, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Remove the blower tray from any packaging.

3. Insert the blower tray into an open slot until it is fully seated, such that the captive screw sits at the top of the tray.



4. Tighten the captive screw on the front panel to secure the tray to the chassis.



# **Removing Blower Trays**

To remove a blower tray, perform the following steps:

- 1. Ground yourself appropriately.
- 2. Unfasten the captive screw.
- 3. Pull the fan toward you until it completely disengages from the chassis.

4. Insert a replacement blower tray into the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

**NOTE:** Each blower module contains two fans for a total of four fans. The system can tolerate one out of four blowers failing. When you remove a blower module, you have three minutes to replace it with a fully-functioning blower module.

### Introduction

The sections in this chapter explain how to mount your Topspin 360 in a rack, boot the Topspin 360, and configure basic services. For advanced configuration information, refer to the *Command Line Interface Reference Guide* or the *Element Manager User Guide*.

# Prepare the Site for the Topspin 360

This section provides information that you need to safely and successfully prepare your environment for your Topspin 360. Read this section carefully before you install your device.

### **Read the Cautionary Statements**

Refer to the "FCC Statement" on page vii and the "Safety Information" on page vii before you install your Topspin 360.

# Prepare the Physical Environment for the Topspin 360

- Ground yourself using an approved ground wrist-strap.
- Make sure you have the right cables and sufficient ventilation.
- Unpack the Topspin 360 package.

CAUTION: Do not lift the Topspin 360 by the front and back (bezel end and service end). Lift the unit by the sides to prevent damage.

 Prepare a management workstation, such as a PC running terminal-emulation software, and a straight-through M/F DB-9 serial cable (included).

### **Install Topspin 360 Components**

Install any gateway and switch card modules before you rack the Topspin 360, when possible. However, you may change modules while the Topspin 360 chassis is still in the rack.

For details regarding installing the switch cards, refer to "Installing an InfiniBand Switch Card" on page 42.

## Rack the Topspin 360

To mount the Topspin 360 in a rack, perform the following steps:

- 1. Open the Topspin box.
- 2. Remove the chassis, rack brackets, CD-ROM, parts bag, and documentation.

**CAUTION:** Do not lift the 360 chassis by the front (bezel end) and back (service end). Lift the unit by the sides to prevent damage.

- 3. Place the chassis on a secure, clean surface.
- 4. Open the plastic bag that contains the mounting hardware.
- 5. Verify that the rack provides sufficient clearance for the Topspin 360.
- 6. Loosen the nuts on the sides of the rack brackets, then adjust the length of your brackets to fit your rack. Tighten the bracket screws when the brackets fit the rack. You can extend the brackets to 29 inches or contract them to 24 inches.

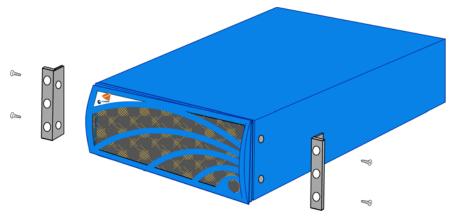


Figure 3-1: Positioning the Side Flanges

7. Attach the side flanges to the sides of the chassis with the screws provided, as shown Figure 3-1 and Figure 3-2.

8. If necessary for your rack, add fasteners with appropriate threads to your rack to prepare your rack for the rails.

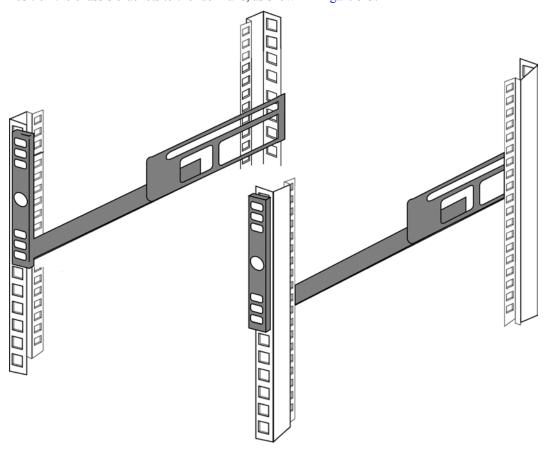


Figure 3-3: Rail Positioning

9. Position the chassis brackets to the rack rails, as shown in Figure 3-3.

10. Screw the top and bottom of the front of the rails to the rack but *do not fully tighten the screws*. Figure 3-4 displays the rail loosely connected to the rack.

**NOTE:** When you connect the rails, do not fully tighten the screws. When you slide the chassis into the rails, you may need to reposition the rails to align the flange screws with the rails.

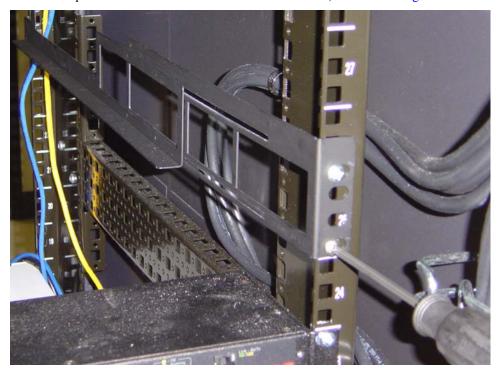


Figure 3-5: Attaching Rails from the Back

11. Screw the top and bottom of the back of the rails to the rack, as shown in Figure 3-5.

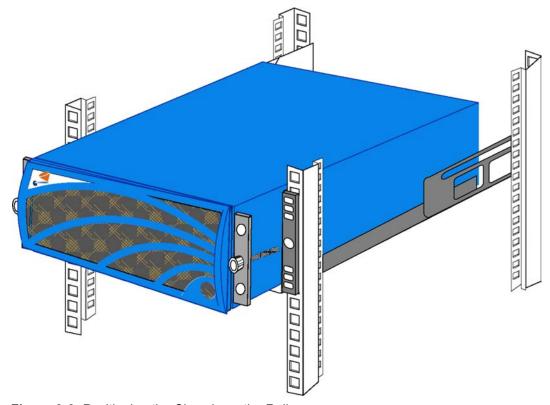


Figure 3-6: Positioning the Chassis on the Rails

12. Slide the Topspin 360 onto the rails as shown in Figure 3-6 and Figure 3-7.

- 13. Adjust the front of the rails (that you left loose in step 10) so that the threaded hole in the center of the front of the rail aligns with the screw in the flange.

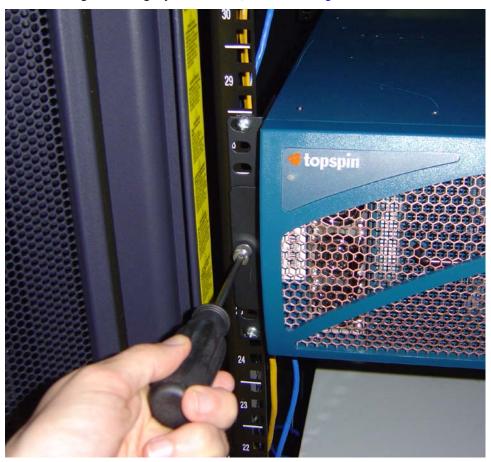


Figure 3-8: Securing the Chassis to the Rails

- 14. Screw the flange screws tightly into the rails, as shown in Figure 3-8.

15. Firmly tighten the front rail screws.

**NOTE:** For detailed information on how to connect the serial console cable, please see the documentation included with the serial cable kit.

- 2. Open a terminal emulation window using a program such as HyperTerminal for Windows. Set your terminal parameters to the following:
  - Baud: 9600 bps
  - Data Bits: 8
  - Parity: None

• Stop Bits: 1

• Flow control: None

# **Boot your Topspin 360 and Configure Basic Connectivity**

To configure basic connectivity, you must power-on the Server Switch and configure it with the Serial Console port and a terminal or workstation. To configure basic Ethernet connectivity, you can apply a static IP address to the Topspin 360, or you can configure the chassis to obtain an IP address from a DHCP server.

To power-on and configure your Topspin 360, perform the following steps:

- 1. Use the serial cable (provided) to connect the serial console port of the Controller Card in slot one of your Topspin 360 to a terminal or to a workstation that runs terminal-emulation software.
- 2. Launch a terminal session with the following parameters:

• Baud: 9600 bps

Data Bits: 8

Parity: None

• Stop Bits: 1

Flow control: None

- 3. Connect a power cord to your Topspin 360, then plug the cord in to an appropriate power source. The Topspin 360 boots.
- 4. After the system boots, press the **Enter** key several times to display the CLI login prompt.

#### **Example**

#### Login:

5. Enter **super** as your user ID and password to log in as a user with administrative privileges.

#### Example

Login: super
Password: super
Topspin-360>

### Assign a Static IP Address

To configure basic Ethernet connectivity, perform the following steps:

1. Enter the **enable** command.

#### **Example**

Topspin-360> **enable**Topspin-360#

2. Enter the **configure** command.

#### **Example**

Topspin-360# configure
Topspin-360(config)#

3. Enter the **interface mgmt-ethernet** command.

#### Example

#### Topspin-360(config)# interface mgmt-ethernet

4. Enter the IP address of the management port followed by the net mask.

#### Example

```
Topspin-360 (config-if-mgmt-ethernet) # ip address 10.10.0.22 255.255.255.0
```

5. Set the default gateway of the management port.

#### Example

```
Topspin-360(config-if-mgmt-ethernet)# gateway 10.10.0.1
```

6. Enable the management port with the **no shutdown** command. You can now telnet to your Topspin 360, or enter the IP address of your Topspin 360 in a Web browser to launch Chassis Manager.

#### Example

```
Topspin-360(config-if-mgmt-ethernet)# no shutdown
```

7. Save the configuration to preserve it between reboots.

#### **Example**

```
Topspin-360(config-if-mgmt-ethernet)# exit
Topspin-360(config)# exit
Topspin-360# copy running-config startup-config
```

8. Attach an Ethernet cable from the management port to the Ethernet router or switch. You are now ready to use the out-of-band Ethernet port to manage the system.

### **Obtain an IP Address with DHCP**

1. Enter the **enable** command.

#### Example

```

```

2. Enter the **configure** command.

#### **Example**

```
Topspin-360# configure
Topspin-360(config)#
```

3. Enter the **interface mgmt-ethernet** command.

#### Example

Topspin-360(config)# interface mgmt-ethernet

4. Enter the IP address of the management port followed by the net mask.

#### Example

```
Topspin-360 (config-if-mgmt-ethernet) # addr-option dhcp
```

5. Enable the management port with the **no shutdown** command. You can now telnet to your Topspin 360, or enter the IP address of your Topspin 360 in a Web browser to launch Chassis Manager.

#### **Example**

```
Topspin-360(config-if-mgmt-ethernet)# no shutdown
```

6. Save the configuration to preserve it between reboots.

#### **Example**

```
Topspin-360(config-if-mgmt-ethernet)# exit
Topspin-360(config)# exit
Topspin-360# copy running-config startup-config
```

### **Connect InfiniBand Hosts**

This section describes a brief overview for connecting your InfiniBand hosts. For more detailed instructions, please see the *Host Channel Adapter Installation Guide*, which is included with your HCA(s).

Use InfiniBand cables to connect the HCA in your host to the InfiniBand switch card of your Topspin 360. To plug in an InfiniBand cable, push the connector into the interface until you hear/feel a click.



Figure 3-9: Fully Installed IB Cable with Pinch Connector

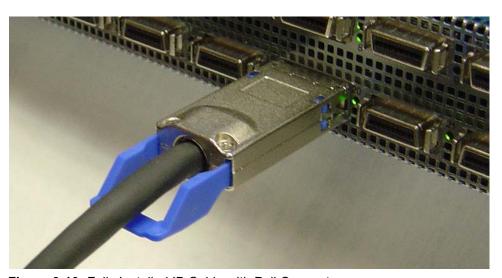


Figure 3-10: Fully Installed IB Cable with Pull Connector

**NOTE:** If your host does not provide an ample amount of free space around a given IB port, double-check that your IB cable connector engages fully. Wiggle your connector back and forth to be sure that both sides of the connector have locked firmly into place.

To remove a cable with a pinch connector, pinch both sides of the back of the connector and pull the connector away from the port.

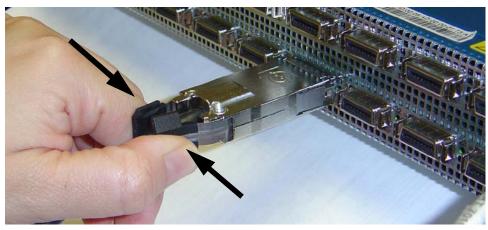


Figure 3-11: Removing a Pinch Connector

To remove a cable with a pull connector, grasp the connector with one hand and push it *toward* the port, then pull the latch away from the port with your other hand and gently wiggle the connector away from the port.

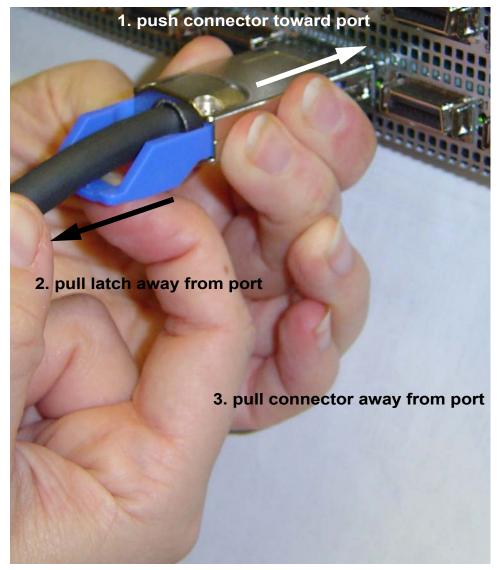


Figure 3-12: Removing a Pull Connector

# Manage the Topspin 360

You can manage the Topspin 360 with the following methods:

- Command Line Interface (CLI) a text-based interface accessible through a direct serial connection, Telnet over IP, or SSH over IP.
- Element Manager (GUI) A graphical interface installed on a workstation, accessible over IP.
- Chassis Manager (GUI) A graphical interface that you access with a Web browser.

Refer to the *Element Manager User Guide*, *Chassis Manager User Guide*, and the *CLI Reference Guide* for more information about managing the Topspin 360.

# Viewing and Updating the Software Image on the Chassis

### View the Software Image Version with the CLI

- 1. To view the primary software image version for all cards in the chassis, use the **show** card-inventory command. Look for the **primary-image-source** field for each slot. (The slots are described in Figure 1-2.)
- 2. Note that it is possible to have different versions of software installed on different slots. To update an individual Fibre Channel or Ethernet Gateway, perform the steps as described here, but you do not need to reboot the chassis. After the copy and installation, you can enable and disable an individual gateway to activate the new image.

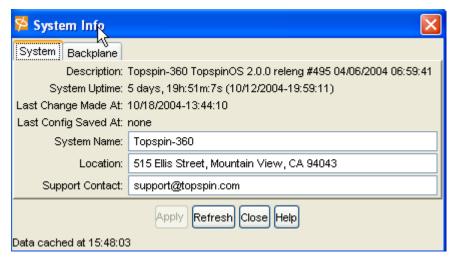


Figure 3-13: Software Image Version of the Controller Card

- 3. View the software version on individual cards in the chassis:
  - a. Double-click on any card in the main GUI.
  - b. Click the **Inventory** tab. The properties window appears for that card.

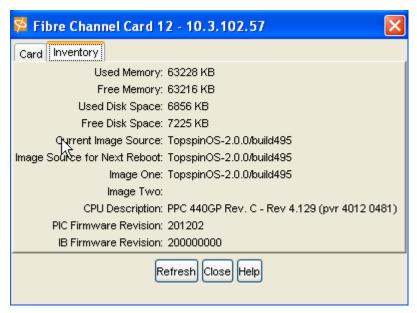


Figure 3-14: View Current Image of an Individual Card

c. View the Current Image Source field. If you find a card that has a different image than the others, you can update a single card by re-installing the image on the chassis, but rebooting only the card that needs to be updated.

### Upgrade the Software Image with the CLI

1. Copy the image to the chassis controller. To upgrade the version of software image for the switch, you need to copy the image to the switch. This can be done through the CLI using FTP and this **copy** command syntax:

**copy ftp:**//<remote-login>:<remote-passwd>@<remote-system>/<filename>.img [<slot-number of the controller>:]image:<filename>.img

- 2. Activate the image. After downloading the image file to the chassis controller, it must be installed to become active. The **install** command installs the specified image file into the system.

  - Image files must have been copied into the image file-system
  - The file name must have the .img extension
  - All cards must have an oper-status of "Up"

**NOTE:** If you do not have enough available memory to install an additional image, delete an old image. "Delete an Image with the CLI" on page 38.

- 3. Specify the new boot image to be used.
  - a. Find the name of your new system image by entering the **dir image** command. Copy the name of the new image.
  - b. Enter **boot-config primary-image-source**, then paste the copied image file name.

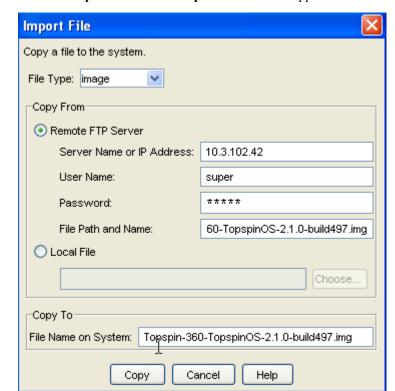

- e. Enter the password for the specified user in the **Password** field.
- f. Enter the path and name of the image file on the FTP server in the **File Path** and **Name** field. Image file names must include the ".img" extension.

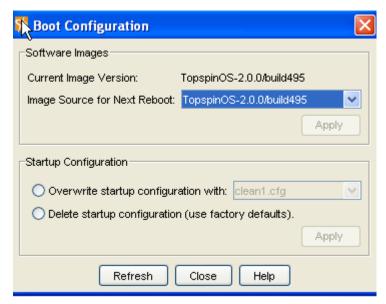


Figure 3-16: Specify the Boot Configuration

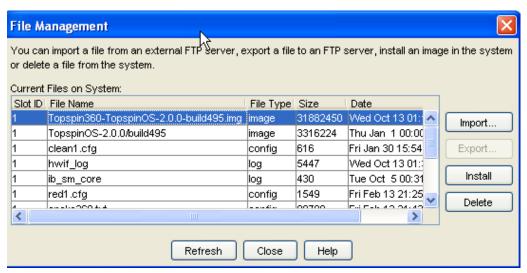


Figure 3-17: Delete an Image File

### **Controller Cards**

The Topspin 360 has two removable controllers, one on each side of the Server Switch.

# **Expansion Modules**

When possible, expansion modules should be added before you rack the Topspin 360. However, expansion modules can also be added after the Server Switch has been racked.

Expansion modules refer to the following:

- Ethernet interface gateways
- Fibre Channel interface gateways

For steps for how to install and remove these FRUs, refer to "Install Topspin 360 Components" on page 20.

### InfiniBand Switch Cards

Each InfiniBand switch card is held in place by two screws, one on the left side and one on the right side of the card.

### Installing an InfiniBand Switch Card

NOTE: Slot 16 must always have an Infiniband switch card inserted in order to maintain connectivity.

To install the InfiniBand switch card in the Topspin 360 chassis:

- 1. Remove the blanking panel from the switch card bay, if it is still in place.
- Insert the switch card into an open slot.
   During insertion, make sure the ejectors are perpendicular to the front panel.
- 3. Insert card until it is fully seated, and close the ejector levers.
- 4. Tighten the two captive panel screws on the front panel to secure the card to the chassis.

### Configuring a New InfiniBand Switch Card

When an InfiniBand switch card is added to the chassis, the system does not dynamically discover the attributes of the new card. Perform the following steps after the initial installation:

- 1. Enter the **show card** command. You can follow the command with
  - An individual slot number (card#).
  - A range of slot numbers (in the form card#-card#).
  - A list of slot numbers in the form card#,card#,...(there are no spaces between elements in the list)

• The keyword all (The CLI defaults to "all" if you enter just "show card").

2. Update the switch card firmware. Enter the **install** command:

#### Example

**NOTE:** Only cards with an oper-status of "up" are updated. If a card is down when you run install, or a card is added after running install, bring up the card and run install again. Specify the same image file. If the image is already installed on a card, that card is skipped. Run boot-config again so that all cards know to boot off the same system image.

3. Reboot the switch card.

### Removing an InfiniBand Switch Card

To remove an InfiniBand switch card from the Topspin 360 chassis:

- 1. Make sure the Topspin 360 chassis is secure.
- Properly ground yourself to avoid potential electrostatic discharge and damage to the card.
- 3. Facing the back of the Topspin 360 chassis, unfasten both screws on the InfiniBand switch card.
  Do not attempt to remove the screws from the card. Just unscrew them until you are sure the card is no longer attached to the chassis.
- 4. Open both ejector levers and pull the switch card toward you.
- 5. Install blanking panel into the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

### **Power Modules**

Topspin 360 power supplies are hot-swappable. You can add a second power supply without powering off the chassis. If you have two power supplies installed, you can remove one of them without removing power from the chassis.

The powers supplies are located on the front of the chassis. When facing the front, the power modules are located on right and center of the Topspin 360 chassis. To determine the power jack for each power module, orient the Topspin 360 chassis as shown in Figure 1-4 below. The power jack on the right supplies power to the module on the right and the power jack on the left supplies power to the module in the center.



**NOTE:** Never place your hand inside an empty card or module bay. You should never have cause to place a hand anywhere inside the Topspin 360 chassis. Unused card and module bays should always have a Topspin 360 blanking panel over the bay to ensure proper safety, ventilation, and cooling.

### Installing a Power Supply

To insert a power supply, perform the following steps:

- 1. Remove the blanking panel, if it is still in place.
- 2. Insert the power supply into an open slot.

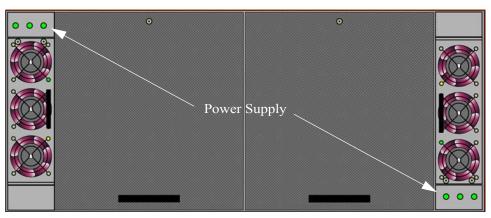


Figure 4-2: Power Supply Module Positioning

**NOTE:** The power supplies should be inserted in opposite directions of each other. See Figure 4-2.

3. Press the power supply firmly into the chassis.



# **Removing a Power Supply**

To remove the power supply, perform the following steps:

- 1. Remove the power cord from the power supply.
- 2. Disengage the power supply by pulling it toward you.
- 3. Slide the power supply out of the chassis.
- 4. Fasten a blanking panel to the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

**NOTE:** The blanking panel is a flat sheet of metal with the same dimensions as the power module faceplate.

# **Replacing Blower Trays**

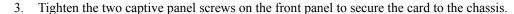
The Topspin 360 fan tray is hot-swappable. You do not need to turn off power to the chassis to replace the fan tray. Access the fan tray from the front of the Topspin 360 chassis.

### **Installing a Blower Tray**

To insert a blower tray, perform the following steps:

- 1. If a blanking panel is already attached to the module bay, remove it.
- 2. Insert the blower tray into an open slot until it is fully seated.





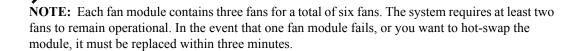


### **Removing a Blower Tray**

To remove a blower tray, perform the following steps:

- 1. Unfasten the fan tray screws.
- 2. Pull the fan toward you until it completely disengages from the chassis.
- 3. Fasten a blanking panel to the empty chassis bay to ensure appropriate cooling.

The blanking panel is a flat sheet of metal with the same dimensions as the fan tray faceplate. It is fastened in the same way as a fan module.

### Introduction

LEDs on your Topspin 360 and installed components indicate hardware status. The sections in this chapter explain the LED indications for the chassis and the components in the chassis.

LED indicators are appear on the following components:

- power supplies
- blowers
- controller cards
- InfiniBand cards
- Fibre Channel cards

- Ethernet cards
- Topspin 360 bezel side

The LEDs have special significance depending on the chassis component. This section describes the LED indicators of each component

# **Topspin 360 System LED**

The Topspin 360 system LED appears on the top-left-hand corner of the front (bezel end) of the Server Switch. You can view the system LED with the bezel on or off. Table 5-1 describes system LED indications.

Table 5-1: System Status LED Indications

Activity	Indication
solid green	Chassis runs with no errors.
solid yellow	A module on the chassis has failed.
off	No system power.

# **Power Supply LEDs**

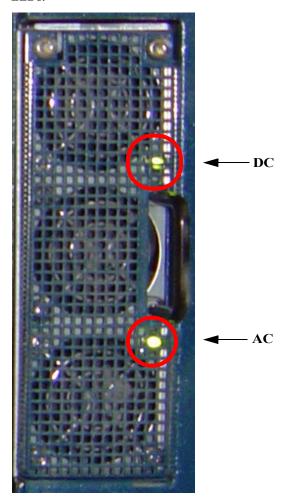


Figure 5-1: Power Supply LEDs

Power supply status LEDs are located on either side of the power supply module pull handle. Controller cards mirror Power Supply LEDs on the service end of the chassis. Figure 5-1 displays power supply LEDs.

Table 5-2 displays AC LED indications.

Activity	Indication
solid green	AC input present.
off	AC input absent.

Table 5-3 displays DC LED indications.

Table 5-3: DC Power Supply LED

solid green	DC outputs from the power supply fall within regulated limits.
off	DC outputs from the power supply exceed limits.

# **Blower Tray LEDs**

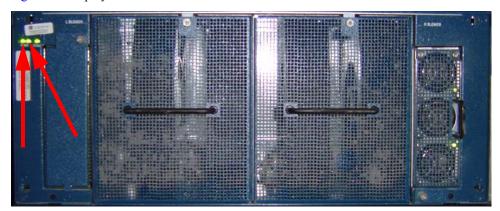


Figure 5-2: Blower Tray LEDs

Blower tray LEDs appear immediately to the left of the System LED on the bezel end of the Topspin 360. Each blower LED is a dual-color green/yellow LED. Controller Cards mirror the blower LEDs. Figure 5-2 displays the blower LEDs.

Table 5-4 explains blower tray LED indications.

Activity	Indication
solid green	Blower runs with no errors.

off	No system power.

### **Controller Card LEDs**

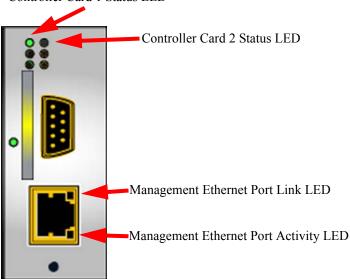


Figure 5-3: Controller Card LEDs

Controller cards include card status LEDs as well as Management Ethernet port LEDs. The top-left-most LED represents the controller card in slot 1, and the top-right-most LED represents the controller card in port 14. Figure 5-3 displays the LEDs on the controller card.

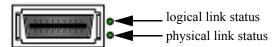


Figure 5-5: The InfiniBand interface LEDs

Both the top and bottom InfiniBand port LEDs are solid green. The top LED indicates a logical link has taken place. (A logical link is established when the subnet manager makes a sweep. A logical link must be established if you are to use the port.) The bottom LED indicates a physical link has occurred. (A physical link requires that the drivers on the attached InfiniBand host have been installed and are running).

### **FC Port LEDs**

Fibre Channel Port LEDs are adjacent to each FC port. They indicate port status and activity. Each port has a one bi-color, green/yellow, LED to indicate port status. When you enable a Fibre Channel interface card, and a Fibre Channel device is already connected, the run light (LED) of the Fibre Channel interface port changes from yellow to green, indicating that a connection has been established between the Fibre Channel device and the port.

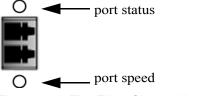


Figure 5-6: The Fibre Channel interface LEDs

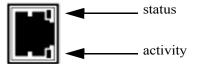


Figure 5-7: Ethernet Interface LEDs
