Precautions

General precautions

- Do not use or store the product in dusty, dirty, or sandy areas, as its components may be damaged.

1 Introduction

1.1 System requirements

The video camera requires a PC with the following specifications:

- Windows® XP, 2000, and ME operating system
- Intel® Pentium III 500MHz CPU or higher
- At least 256 MB of RAM or higher
- Standard USB 1.1 port or higher
- 4x speed CD-ROM drive or higher
- At least 200MB of available disk space

Note: A USB 1.1 port will enable you to transfer files to and from your host PC, but transfer speed will be much faster with a USB 2.0 port.



Additionally, the camera features 4X advance zoom, 4X digital zoom, USB mass storage, and an SD card reader.




2 Getting started

Read this section to learn how to start using the video camera. This section covers basic functions such as switching on, inserting the battery and memory cards, and configuring preliminary settings. See later chapters for advanced functions.

2.1 Inserting an SD card

An SD card can be installed in the video camera to provide additional storage space for still images, video clips, or other files.


1. Open battery compartment cover.



2. Insert an SD card as shown. Make sure the gold contacts are facing away from the battery.



3. Close the battery compartment cover.




2.2 Inserting the batteries

This video camera is designed to use a rechargeable Li-ion battery. Only use the battery supplied or similar battery recommended by the manufacturer or your dealer.

Note: Install the batteries exactly as described here. Ensure that the polarity of the batteries is correct. Installing the batteries incorrectly could cause damage to the camera and possibly start a fire.


1. Open the battery compartment cover.



2. Insert the battery as shown.



2.3 Charging the battery/Using the power adapter

You can charge the battery with the charging unit provided or use the camera by connecting the power adapter to the DC IN jack on the camera.



2.4 Turning on for the first time

Slide the power switch "down"" to turn the video camera on/off.

2.5 Changing modes

The video camera can operate in six modes: **Camcorder** (**DV**), **Camera**, **Music**, **Game**, and **Voice**. Slide the mode switch or press the **MODE** button to toggle different modes.

2.6 Before you start

Before you start using the video camera, some basic settings such as date and time and languages are needed to be configured.

2.6.1 Setting the date and time

 Turn on the video camera, and press the MENU button to display the menu screen. Move the joystick left/right to view the Setup menu.

2.6.2 Setting the language



2.7 Capture/Playback video

2.7.1 Shooting a video clip:

1. Turn on the video camera and switch to **DV** mode.




- 2. Use the LCD screen to frame the subject.
- 3. Press the **Shutter** button to start recording.
- 4. Press the **Shutter** button again to stop recording.
- 5. The video clip is automatically saved with a unique file name.

Note: The recorded file is saved in mp4 AVI format. To view AVI files on your computer, please install XviD 1.03 codec (included on the Software CD).

2.7.2 Playing the video clip


1. In **DV** mode, press the **Playback** button and the most recent file displays on the LCD screen.



2.8 Taking/viewing pictures

2.8.1 Taking a still picture:

1. Turn on the camera and switch to **Camera** mode.



- 2. Use the LCD screen to frame the subject.
- 3. Press the **Shutter** button to capture the image.
- 4. The picture is automatically saved with a unique file name.

2.8.2 Viewing images:

1. In **Camera** mode, press the **Playback** button and the most recent image displays on the LCD screen.



- 2. Move the joystick **left** or **right** to scroll through the images.
- 3. Use the **zoom** switch to scale the image. Use the joystick to move the zoomed image up and down, left and right.
- 4. Move the joystick or the directional pad **up** to display the **Delete** option. Use the joystick to choose **OK** to delete the current picture.
- Move the joystick or the directional pad down to protect the current picture. A cicon displays on the screen when the file is protected. Move the joystick down again to unlock the picture.
- 6. Press the **Playback** button again to return to **Camera** mode.

2.9 Playing music files

1. Turn on the video camera and switch to **Music mode**.

- 2. Move the joystick **left** or **right** to select the file to playback.
- 3. Press the center joystick button or the () button to playback the selected music file.
- 4. When playing back a voice file, use the **zoom** switch to adjust the volume.
- 5. Move the joystick or the directional pad **up** to delete the selected music file. Use the joystick to highlight **OK** and press the center joystick button to confirm.
- 6. Move the joystick or the directional pad **down** to toggle the repeat options. You can choose to repeat the selected music file or all files.
- 7. Press the center joystick button or the again to stop.

Note: When adding music files to the camera memory or memory card, you need to create a folder called **Music** and save the music files in it.

2.10 Playing video games

1. Turn on the video camera and switch to **Game** mode.



- 2. Press the ⁽⁽⁾ button to display the **Game** menu.
- 3. Use the joystick or the directional pad to select the game you want to play.
- 4. Press the ^(a) button to start playing the game.
- 5. Press the **PAUSE** button to pause while playing a game. Press the **PAUSE** button again to resume.
- 6. See "Playing video games" on 3.7.1 for a brief introduction and instructions on how to play the games.

2.11 Voice recording

To make a voice recording:

1. Turn on the video camera and switch to **Voice mode**.




- 2. Press the **Shutter** button to start recording.
- 3. Press the **Shutter** button again to stop.
- 4. The voice file will automatically be saved with a unique file name.

2.11.1 To playback a voice file:

1. In Voice mode, press the **Playback** button and the most recent file is displayed on the LCD screen.




- Move the joystick left or right to select the voice file you want to play. Press the center joystick button or the button to playback the voice file.







3.1 Video mode

Use **DV** mode to capture video clips and store them in internal memory or on an SD card.



3.1.2 Quick access menu

You can make adjustments to the current settings by pressing the scroll wheel/joystick.

In **DV** mode, use the **joystick** to display the quick access menu. You can adjust settings such as file size, image quality, EV compensation, and white balance.



To make adjustments, do the following:


- 1. Move the joystick or the directional pad **up** to toggle file size options.
- 2. Move the joystick or the directional pad **down** to toggle image quality options.
- 3. Move the joystick or the directional pad **right** to toggle the white balance options.
- 4. Press the **center j**oystick or the **square** button to display the EV compensation. Move the joystick **down** to adjust the EV value and press the **center joystick button** to confirm.

3.2 Camera mode

Use **Camera** mode to capture still pictures and store them in the internal memory or on an SD card.

3.2.1 Camera mode icons

Use the following picture to familiarize yourself with the **Camera** mode icons and symbols.

3.2.2 Using the macro function

This function can capture subjects up close. In macro mode, subjects can be as close as 21-23 cm.

While in **Camera** mode, make sure that the **macro switch** is in the Macro mode, as indicated by the \bigotimes icon, same \bigotimes icon appears on the LCD screen.

Move the macro switch down to cancel the macro function.

3.2.3 Using the zoom function

The camera is equipped with 4x advance zoom and 4x digital zoom.

Move the zoom switch **up** to get closer to a subject.

Move the zoom switch **down** to move away from a subject.


The zoom ratio is displayed on the screen.

Note: Video recording: supports 4x advance zoom and 4x digital zoom. Still images: supports 1-5m 16x digital zoom; 10m 12x digital zoom. Advance zoom is not available in Camera mode.

3.2.4 Using the LED flash light

Use the LED flash light to illuminate subjects in dark environments.

In **DV** and **Camera** mode, move the joystick left to turn the focus assist lamp on/off. An icon displays on the screen when activated.



3.2.5 Quick access menu

You can also make adjustments of the current setting by pressing the scroll wheel.

In **Camera** mode, pressing the center joystick button to display the quick access menu. You can adjust the settings such as file size, EV compensation, white balance, image quality and self-timer.



To make adjustments, do the following:

- 1. Move the joystick or the directional pad **up** to toggle file size options.
- 2. Move the joystick or the directional pad **down** to toggle image quality options.
- 3. Move the joystick or the directional pad **right** to toggle the self-timer options.
- 4. **Press** the center joystick or the square button to display the EV compensation. Move the joystick up/down to adjust the EV value and press the center joystick button to confirm.

3.3 Playback mode

Use **Playback** mode to review all the files stored in the video camera.

3.3.1 Playback mode icons

Refer to the following picture to familiarize yourself with the **Playback** mode icons and symbols.

3.3.2 Thumbnail mode

When in **Camera Playback** mode, press the **Shutter** button to show image as thumbnails.

- 1. Turn on the video camera and make sure it is in **Playback** mode.
- 2. The most recent image displays on the screen. Press the **Shutter** button to view **four** thumbnail images on the LCD screen.



- 3. Use the joystick to highlight an image, press the **Shutter** button to view the image in full screen mode.
- 4. Press the **Shutter** button again to return to thumbnail view.

Note: Only image files are shown in thumbnail mode.





3.6 USB mode

You can use **USB mode** to connect to a printer or a host PC. Before connecting to a printer or PC, refer to "Installing software and drivers" on page 80.

When the video camera is connected to a computer or printer using the USB cable, the following menu appears:



Use the joystick to highlight an option and press the center joystick button to confirm.

3.6.1 Using the PC cam feature

When set as a **PC cam**, the video camera can be used as a webcam for video conferencing.

3.6.2 Using the mass storage feature

When used as a **USB mass storage device**, the video camera displays as two removable drives in Windows Explorer. One drive is the camera internal memory, and the other is the SD card. Drag and drop files to and from the removable drives just like any other storage device.

3.6.3 Using DPS feature

Connect to a printer using the USB cable exactly in the same way as you would connect a PC.

3.7 Game mode

5 Installing software and drivers

Read this section to learn how to install drivers and software for the camera.

5.1 Drivers

You can use the "Mass Storage" functions of the camera on the PC.

5.1.1 Mass Storage

The digital camera offers Mass Storage function via the built-in card reader. You can treat this digital camera as a USB device.

You will only need to install a driver for the camera if your operating system is Windows 98SE. Windows XP/ME/2000 are plug and play operating systems and do not require a driver to be manually loaded.

When the driver has been installed and the camera is connected, the camera memory and any inserted SD card displays as Mass Storage in Windows Explorer. Files can be dragged and dropped in the same way as with an ordinary disk.

To install the driver, do the following:

- 1. Insert the supplied CD-ROM in the CD-ROM drive.
- 2. If the CD-ROM doesn't automatically boot, use Windows Explorer to execute the **InstallMgr.exe** file in the root directory.




