#### AM/FM/CD Receiver with Detach Face





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### Preparation


Please read entire manual before installation.

#### **Before You Start**

- Disconnect negative battery terminal. Consult a qualified technician for instructions.
- Avoid installing the unit where it would be subject to high temperatures, such as from direct sunlight, or where it would be subject to dust, dirt or excessive vibration.

#### **Getting Started**


- Remove 2 transit screws located on top of the unit.
- Insert the supplied keys into the slots as shown, and slide the unit out of the mounting sleeve.
- Install mounting sleeve into opening, bending tabs to secure.
- Connect wiring harness and antenna. Consult a qualified technician if you are unsure.
- Certain vehicles may require an installation kit and/or wiring harness adapter (sold separately).
- Test for correct operation and slide into mounting sleeve to secure.
- Snap trim ring into place.

### Wiring Diagram




\* CAUTION - Do not attach any speaker leads to ground as severe damage will occur.

# **General Operation**

Faceplate Removal	Press <b>RELEASE</b> and pull away from the left side to remove. To re-install, insert right side of faceplate first then push left side to secure.
Semi-permanent Faceplate Installation	Remove trim ring and install supplied #1 x $7/32$ " Phillips head screw through left side of mounting frame into faceplate.
Power On/Off	Press <b>PWR</b> or any other button (except eject) to turn the unit on. Inserting a disc will turn the unit on automatically. Press <b>PWR</b> to turn the unit off.
CD Mode	Insert a CD or press ►/ II to begin or resume playback.
Tuner Mode	Press <b>PWR</b> or <b>BAND</b> to begin or resume tuner operation.
Bass Boost	Press <b>BASS</b> to activate and deactivate bass boost curve. Activating this feature will enhance the bass frequencies when listening to music at all volumes.
Volume	Adjust volume using VOL ▼ / VOL ▲ (00-46).
Mute	Press <b>MUTE</b> to silence the audio. "MUTE" will appear in the display. Press <b>MUTE</b> again to cancel.
Display	Press <b>DISP</b> to display the clock. The radio frequency (tuner mode) or CD track/elapsed time (CD player mode) show by default.
Set the Clock	Press <b>DISP</b> to display the clock, then release. Press and hold <b>DISP</b> for 2 seconds, the clock will begin to flash. Press <b>TUNE</b> << to adjust the hours and <b>TUNE</b> >> to adjust the minutes. Clock settings will be saved after 5 seconds.
12/24-hour Clock	The clock will display 12-hour AM/PM time in U.S. frequency spacing mode (PM 10:00). In European frequency spacing mode, the clock will display 24-hour time (22:00).



# **General Operation**

Reset	Press and hold for more than 2 seconds to <b>RESET</b> the unit upon initial installation. The <b>RESET</b> button is located behind the faceplate. Refer to page 2 for details.
Audio	Press AUD to select between Volume (default), Bass, Treble, Balance & Fader. →VOLUME → BASS→TREBLE→BALANCE → FADER
Bass	Press AUD until BA appears Press VOL ▼ or ▲ to adjust ( -7 minimum / 7 maximum)
Treble	Press AUD until TR appears Press VOL ▼ or ▲ to adjust ( -7 minimum / 7 maximum)
Balance	Press AUD until B appears Press VOL ▼ (LEFT) or ▲ (RIGHT) to adjust (BL 15/BR 15) BAL 00 represents equal balance.
Fader	Press <b>AUD</b> until <b>F</b> appears Press <b>VOL</b> ▼ (FRONT) or ▲ (REAR) to adjust (FF 15/FR 15) F 00 represents equal balance.

# **Tuner Operation**

Seek Tuning	Press <b>TUNE</b> << or >> momentarily to seek the next strong station.
Manual Tuning	Press <b>TUNE</b> << or >> for more than 2 seconds, then release. "MANU" will momentarily appear in the display. Press <b>TUNE</b> << or >> momentarily to move radio frequency up or down one step at a time. Press and hold to advance quickly. If tuning is not adjusted for 5 seconds, the unit will return to seek tuning mode (default). "AUTO" will momentarily appear in the display.
Scan Tuning	Press <b>SCAN</b> to preview strong stations on the current band, pausing for 5 seconds at each. Press <b>SCAN</b> again to cancel.
FM Local/Distance	Press <b>LOC</b> to activate local tuning for strong FM station reception only. Press <b>LOC</b> again to cancel and resume distance tuning (default).
FM Mono/Stereo	Press <b>MO/ST</b> for more than 2 seconds during FM tuner operation to select mono or stereo (default) reception of the broadcast signal.
Band	Press <b>BAND</b> to select between FM1, FM2, FM3 and AM1, AM2 bands.
Frequency Spacing	Press and hold <b>BAND</b> then press <b>TUNE</b> << to select European frequency spacing. Press and hold <b>BAND</b> then press <b>TUNE</b> >> to select U.S. frequency spacing (default). Anytime frequency spacing is changed, all station presets are erased.
Storing and Recalling Station Presets	Up to 18 FM stations and 12 AM stations can be stored. To store a station, select the desired band and station. Press and hold the desired preset button for more than 2 seconds. When stored, the preset number will appear in the display. The station can be recalled anytime by pressing the corresponding preset button.
Automatically Store Stations	Press <b>AS/PS</b> for more than 2 seconds to automatically store the six strongest stations in the current band.
Preset Scan	Press <b>AS/PS</b> for less than 2 seconds to scan presets 1-6 on the current band, pausing for 5 seconds at each. Press <b>AS/PS</b> again to cancel.

# **CD Player Operation**

Dual

Insert CD	With the label facing up, insert a standard size CD into the CD slot. The CD will automatically begin playback.
Eject CD	Press <b>EJECT</b> to eject the CD. The unit will change to tuner mode. If the disc is not removed within 10 seconds, the unit will reload the disc. The unit does not have to be turned on to eject CD.
Track Select	Press <b>TRACK</b> >> to skip to the beginning of the next track. Press <b>TRACK</b> << to return to the beginning of the current track. Pressing <b>TRACK</b> << again skips to the beginning of the previous track.
Fast Forward and Reverse	Press and hold <b>TRACK</b> >> or <b>TRACK</b> << to fast forward or reverse a track.
Pause	Press ►/ II to temporarily stop CD playback. Press ►/ III again to resume playback.
Intro	Press <b>INT</b> to play the first 10 seconds of each track. Press <b>INT</b> to cancel.
Repeat	Press <b>RPT</b> to continuously repeat selected track. Press <b>RPT</b> to cancel.
Random	Press <b>RDM</b> to play all tracks in random order. Press <b>RDM</b> again to cancel. Random mode is retained in memory when selecting between tuner, CD player and auxiliary input modes and when the unit is turned on/off.
CD-R/CD-RW Compatibility	Some CD-Rs and CD-RWs may be incompatible with this unit, depending on media type and recording method.

# Troubleshooting

Problem	Cause	Action
Unit will not turn on (no power)	Yellow wire not connected or incorrect voltage Red wire not connected or incorrect voltage	Check connections for proper voltage (11~16VDC)
	Black wire not connected	Check connection to ground
	Fuse blown	Replace fuse
Unit has power (but no sound)	Speaker wires not connected	Check connections at speakers
	One or more speaker wires touching each other or touching chassis ground	Insulate all bare speaker wires from each other and chassis ground
Unit blows fuses	Yellow or red wire touching chassis ground	Check for pinched wire
	Speaker wires touching chassis ground	Check for pinched wire
	Incorrect fuse rating	Use fuse with correct rating
Excessive skipping	Unit is not mounted correctly or backstrap is not secure	Check mounting sleeve and backstrap support
	Physical defect in media (CD, CD-R or CD-RW)	Check media for scratches
Unit will not accept a disc	CD mechanism position out of alignment	Press EJECT for 3 seconds to reset CD mechanism position
	CD transit screws still in place	Remove 2 transit screws located on top of the unit.
