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# Important safety instructions

- To prevent from fire or electric shock, do not expose the TV to rain or moisture.
- Do not place the TV on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table to prevent it from falling.
- Keep the TV away from strong magnets, heat sources, direct sunlight, and excessive dust.
- If you move the TV from a cold to a warm location, wait for about one hour before operating it, or leave the TV turned on until the moisture evaporates to prevent moisture from condensing inside it.
- Make sure that the TV is installed in accordance with the instructions and illustrations provided in this manual.
- Do not push objects of any kind into the TV through openings. Do not spill or spray liquid of any kind on or in the TV (this may result in a fire or electric shock).
- Do not place anything heavy on the TV.
- To ensure proper ventilation and proper operation, never cover or block the slots and openings with a cloth or other material.
- Keep the TV away from an open flame such as a fire, or candle.
- Do not attempt to take apart the cabinet. There is a risk of electric shock or exposure to laser radiation. Contact qualified service personnel if the TV needs repair.
- When cleaning, make sure the TV is unplugged from the power source. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a cloth lightly dampened with water for cleaning the exterior of the TV only.

# **TV** components

### **Front view**



Number	Component	Description
1	IR Sensor	Recieves information from remote control.
2	POWER	Press to turn the TV on and off.
3	MENU	Press to open and close the TV menu.
4	► ◀ ▲ ▼ CH +/-	Press to highlight menu options. Press to select the previous or next channel.
5	ENTER	Press to confirm a menu selection.
6	INPUT	Press to switch between <b>TV</b> and <b>AV IN</b> modes.
7	WIDE	Press to select <b>Widescreen</b> or <b>Auto</b> formats.

## Left side view



Number	Component	Description
1	Headphone	Insert headphones into this jack for private listening. The external speaker is muted.
2	Vol.	Press to adjust volume up or down.
3	Brightness	Press to adjust the brightenss up or down.

# **Right side view**



Number	Component	Description
1	RF IN	Connect an antenna to this jack.
2	AV IN	Connect an AV device such as a VCR or DVD player to this jack.
3	Power/Charge LED	LED status: Green=TV on Red=Built-in battery is recharging OFF= built-in battery is fully charged
4	DC 9V	Connect the provided power adapter to this jack.

### **Remote control**



Number	<b>Button Description</b>	Function
1	AUTO	Press to search for channels automatically.
2	DISPLAY	Press to display channel information.
3	MENU	Press to access the TV menu.
4	► ◄ ▲ ▼ ENTER	Press to navigate the on-screen menu and to confirm your selection.
5	Number keys	Press to select channels.
6	GUIDE	Press to display program information for digital stations.
7	INPUT	Press to switch between <b>TV</b> and <b>AV IN</b> .
8	MUTE	Press once to mute. Press again to restore the sound
9	AUDIO	Press to select from available audio soundtracks.
10	CH+	Press to select the next channel.
11	CH-	Press to select the previous channel.

# **OSD** menu

To access the OSD menu:

- 1 Press **MENU** on the remote control.
- 3 Press MENU to exit.

### Clock menu

OSD Duration	Set the duration of the on-screen display: 5, 10, 15, or 20 seconds
Sleep Timer	Set to turn the TV off automatically: 5, 10, 15, 30, 45, 60, 90, 120, 180, 240 minutes, or OFF
Time zone (DTV only)	Select your time zone
Daylight savings time (DTV only)	Turn Daylight Savings On or Off

### Setup menu

Language	Select <b>English, Spanish</b> , or <b>French</b>
Transparent	Make the menu transparent
Closed Caption (DTV only)	Select a closed caption option
Zoom Mode	Select Auto, Wide, Zoom, or Cinema
Restore Setting	Reset settings to factory default

## Channel setup menu (TV only)

Antenna	Select a reception method: <b>Air</b> or <b>CATV</b> (cable)
Auto Scan	Perform a channel scan to save to memory. Erases previously saved channel information.
Auto Scan Add CH	Perform a channel scan to save to memory without erasing previously saved channel information.
Channel Skip	Set the TV to skip specific channels found during auto scan.
Channel NO	Changes the channel, while in Menu mode.
Channel Label	Lets you edit the program label that appears when a channel is selected. DTV automatically adds this information. You can manually edit it for ATV.

WARNING: The TV will not work when it is moving.

# Setting up the TV

### **Connecting power**

To connect power:

- 1 Plug into one end of the power adapter into the **DC Input** jack on the right side of the TV.
- **2** Connect the other end into a power outlet.
- 3 Troubleshooting

### **Charging the battery**

The TV has a built-in rechargeable battery (Lithium-Polymer). The TV can operate up to 100 minutes with the built-in battery. Charge the battery prior to first use. Recharge the battery when the built-in battery fails to power the TV and when the sound level lowers or the picture becomes unstable.

**NOTE**: The battery will not charge when using the car power adapter.

#### To charge the battery:

- 1 Connect one end of the AC to the DC Input jack on the right side of the TV.
- **2** Connect the other end to a power outlet.
- 3 Press **POWER** on the TV to turn the TV off. The charge indicator turns red.
- 4 Disconnect the AC when the charge indicator turns off.

### Scanning for channels

Scan for available analog and digital channels to create the channel list using the **CH**+ and **CH**- buttons.

#### To scan for channels:

- 1 Press **POWER** on the TV to turn on your TV.
- 2 Press INPUT to set the input mode to TV.
- 3 Press MENU. The MENU screen opens.
- **4** Press ► twice to access the *Channel Setup* menu.
- 5 Press ▲ ▼ to select *AutoScan*. The TV beings to scan for available channels. Pause the **scan** by pressing and holding **MENU**.
- 6 Press MENU to exit the menu when the scan is complete.

### Selecting analog or digital channels

You can select specific analog or digital TV stations using your remote control.

#### To select an analog station:

 Enter the channel number followed by -0 (for example 11-0 for analog channel 11). If available, the analog channel is displayed.

#### To select a digital station:

• Enter the channel number followed by -1 (for example 11-1 for digital channel 11). If available, the digital channel is displayed. **NOTE:** Some digital stations provide multiple broadcasts on a single channel. To access these channels directly enter higher numbers after the channel number (for example 11-2 or 11-3. for digital channel 11). If available, the digital channels appear.

### Connecting an A/V device

You can connect your TV to an A/V device such as a VCR or DVD player to enjoy high quality stereo sound and picture.

#### To connect an A/V device:

- 1 Connect the black end of the supplied audio/video cable to the **AV In** jack on the right side of the TV.
- 2 Connect the other end of the cable to the **AV OUTPUT** jacks on the A/V device, making sure to match the color coding.
- 3 Press INPUT and choose AV IN.

### Using headphones (not supplied)

For private listening, you can connect headphones with a 1/8" plug to the headphone jack on the left side of the TV. Connecting headphones automatically mutes the built-in speakers.

To protect your hearing, follow these guidelines when you use headphones:

- Set the volume to the lowest setting before you begin listening.
- After you begin listening, adjust the volume to a comfortable level.
- Do not listen at extremely high volume levels. Extended high-volume listening can lead to permanent hearing loss.
- After you set the volume, do not increase it. Over time, your ears adapt to the volume level. A volume level that does not cause discomfort may still damage your hearing.

### Using an external antenna (not supplied)

If you are in an area with weak TV signals or inside a concrete building, you may need an external antenna to improve reception.

#### To connect an external antenna:

 Connect the external antenna to the **RF IN** jack on the right side of the TV. Use the supplied L-shaped F-connector adapter if necessary.

# Troubleshooting

Problem	Resolution
There is no sound or power.	<ul> <li>Increase the volume level.</li> <li>If using the built-in battery, connect the AC power adapter.</li> </ul>
The picture quality is poor.	<ul> <li>If the picture is not clear with the built-in rod antenna, try placing your TV near a window or connecting an external antenna to the TV to improve reception.</li> </ul>
There is no sound when using headphones.	<ul> <li>Reinsert the headphone plug into the jack.</li> <li>Increase the volume level.</li> </ul>

# 90-Day Limited Warranty

Dynex Products ("Dynex") warrants to you, the original purchaser of this new **DX-7HTV-09** ("Product"), that the Product shall be free of defects in the original manufacture of the material or workmanship for a period of 90 days from the date of your purchase of the Product ("Warranty Period"). This Product must be purchased from an authorized dealer of Dynex brand products and packaged with this warranty statement. This warranty does not cover refurbished Product. If you notify Dynex during the Warranty Period of a defect covered by this warranty that requires service, terms of this warranty apply.

#### How long does the coverage last?

The Warranty Period lasts for 90 days from the date you purchased the Product. The purchase date is printed on the receipt you received with the product.

#### What does this warranty cover?

During the Warranty Period, if the original manufacture of the material or workmanship of the Product is determined to be defective by an authorized Dynex repair center or store personnel, Dynex will (at its sole option): (1) repair the Product with new or rebuilt parts; or (2) replace the Product at no charge with new or rebuilt comparable products or parts. Products and parts replaced under this warranty become the property of Dynex and are not returned to you. If service of Products and parts are required after the Warranty Period expires, you must pay all labor and parts charges. This warranty lasts as long as you own your Dynex Product during the Warranty Period. Warranty coverage terminates if you sell or otherwise transfer the Product.

#### How to obtain warranty service?

If you purchased the Product at a retail store location, take your original receipt and the Product to the store you purchased it from. Make sure that you place the Product in its original packaging or packaging that provides the same amount of protection as the original packaging.
