

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

POWERING YOUR PLAYER

Charging the Battery


Your player has an integrated rechargeable battery that will provide up to 20 hours of music play time.



The battery should be charged fully (minimum 4 hours) before its initial use to ensure optimum lifetime performance.

To charge your player:

- USB Charge: Your player can be charged through a PC USB connection.
 Plug one end of the USB cable into the player's USB port and plug the other end into the USB port of a powered-on computer.
 - When connected to a USB hub, the hub must be self-powered to charge the player's battery.



· File transfers will extend the charging time.



The battery used in this device may present a fire or chemical burn if mistreated. Do not disassemble, incinerate, or heat the battery.

- To turn the player off, press and hold the POWER button until you see "Good Bye!".


Locking/Unlocking Your Player's Keys (Hold)


When engaged, the Key Lock feature disables your player's controls to prevent accidental key presses when it is in your pocket or bag.

- To unlock the player, slide the HOLD switch to the left from the Lock position.


Resetting Your Player

LOCATION OF CONTROLS



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

BASIC OPERATIONS

Using the Touchpad Controls

Your player comes equipped with a touch-sensitive control pad. To use the controls, touch the arrow keys on the front of the player lightly just as you would a button and the controls will light up. If you touch and hold a key, it will register as a continuous button press.

Using the Controls to Navigate


To navigate through the different menu options and files on your player:

- Touch the Arrow keys to move the selection in the direction of the arrow.
 - Moves the selection up.
 - Moves the selection down.
 - Select the next selection.
 - Select the previous selection.
- Touch **OPT** to view the Smart Menu.
- Touch and hold **M** to return to the Main Menu at any time.

Main Menu Overview

The Main Menu gives you access to the different function modes of your player. To access the Main Menu at any time, touch and hold M.

Touch or to select a mode and then touch to confirm.



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MUSIC MODE

Enter Music mode to play your MP3, WMA, or WAV audio files.

To enter MUSIC mode, select and confirm from the Main Menu.

Upon entering Music mode, you will see a list of all available musics that located on your player.

Music Playback Controls

Select a track and touch **D** to start playback.

While the track is playing:

- Touch **>** to play the next track.
- Touch **I** to play the previous track.
- Touch and hold b to fast forward through the track.
- Touch and hold **I** to reverse through the track.
- Touch 🚺 to pause playback. Touch 🚺 again to resume playback
- Touch or voice to adjust the volume level.

Smart Menu Options

The Smart Menu gives you quick access to your player's option settings. To access the Smart Menu, touch OPT.

The Smart Menu options are Repeat, Equalizer, Speed and Browsing.

- Touch or to select an option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch **OPT** to return to the Music mode without saving.

Repeat

Adjust the Repeat settings to change the order in which tracks are played. The Repeat options are: No Repeat, One, All, Random All, DirRepOne, DirRep and DirRanAll.

No Repeat	Play tracks once in sequential order.
One	Play the current track repeatedly.
All	Play all tracks repeatedly.
Random All	Play all tracks in random order.
DirRepOne	Repeat all tracks in the current folder.
DirRep	Repeat all tracks in all folder.
DirRanAll	Play folders in random order.

MUSIC MODE

Equalizer

The Equalizer option optimizes the way your player processes audio signals. Select the option which best suits the music you are listening to. The options are Normal, Pop, Rock, Classic, Jazz and Bass.

Speed

Use the Speed function to adjust playback tempo. The Play options are: 70% (Slowest), 80%, 100% (Normal), 120% and 130% (Fastest).

Browsing

This option allows you to browse your music library to select another track during music playback.

- Touch to move the selection up;
- Touch v to move the selection down;
- Touch D to play a selection;
- Touch **OPT** to return to the Music mode.

PHOTO MODE

Enter Photo mode to display your JPEG photo files.

To enter Photo mode, select and confirm PHOTO in the Main menu.

Photo Controls

Upon entering Photo mode, you will see a list of all photos that located on your player.

- Touch or to move the selection up or down.
- Touch **I** to confirm and display a selection.
- While a photo is displayed:
 - Touch ≥ to display the next photo in the list.
 - Touch **I** to display the previous photo in the list.
 - Touch **OPT** to return to the photo list.

VIDEO MODE

Enter Video mode to play your MTV video files.

To enter Video mode, select and confirm VIDEO in the Main menu.



The MP-C7085 supports playback of MTV files. Please see the <u>Video Conver</u>-<u>sion</u> section for details on how to create video files that are compatible with your player.

Video Controls

Upon entering Video mode, you will see a list of all videos that located on your player.

- Touch or v to move the selection up or down.
- Touch **I** to confirm or play a selection.

While a video is playing:

- Touch I to pause playback and display the elapsed time, total time, current track and total tracks. Press I again to resume playback.
- Touch void to play the next track.
- Touch **I** to play the previous track.
- Touch and hold **v** to fast forward through the track.
- Touch and hold **I** to reverse through the track.
- Touch **I** to decrease the volume level.
- Touch ≥ to increase the volume level.
- To return to the video list, press OPT.

FM RADIO MODE

Enter FM Radio Mode to listen the FM Radio broadcasts.



You must have a pair of headphones connected to the headphone jack to receive *FM* broadcasts; your player will utilize the headphone cord as an antenna.

To enter FM Radio Mode, select and confirm FM Radio from the Main Menu.

Upon entering FM Radio mode, you can tune into stations manually (Normal) or by using preset stations (Preset).

- Touch 🚺 to toggle between these Normal and Preset tuning modes.
- Touch or voice to decrease or increase volume level.

Normal (Manual Tuning)

The Normal mode allows you to manually scan and tune to all radio frequencies.

- Touch to increase the station frequency.
- Touch **I** to decrease the station frequency.

Preset (Preset Tuning)

Preset mode allows you to tune to your preset stations.

- Touch local to tune to the next preset station.
- Touch **C** to tune to the previous preset station.

Auto-Save Preset Stations

Scan for all stations in broadcast reception range and automatically save them as Preset stations. This will overwrite all previously saved Preset stations.

- Set the tuning mode to Normal.
- Touch and hold **I**. The player will automatically scan and store available Preset stations.

Smart Menu Option (Preset Actions)

The Smart Menu gives you quick access to your player's option settings. To access the Smart Menu, touch **OPT**.

The Smart Menu options are: Del/Add Preset and Start Record.

Add Preset (Manual)

Manually save the current station as a Preset station.

Make sure the player is in Normal tuning mode.

- 1. Tune to the station you want to store and then touch **OPT** to access the Smart Menu.
- 2. Touch 🚺 or 🔽 to select "Add Preset", and touch 🚺 to confirm.
 - "Preset confirm 🗹 Save" will appear on screen.
- 3. Touch **I** to confirm and save.

FM RADIO MODE

Del Preset

Delete a Preset station.

Make sure the player is in Preset tuning mode.

- 1. Tune to a Preset station that you want to delete and then touch **OPT** to access the Smart Menu.
- 2. Touch 🚺 or 💟 to select "Del Preset", and touch 🚺 to confirm.
 - "Preset confirm X Delete" will appear on screen.
- 3. Touch **I** to confirm and delete.

Start Record

Make digital recordings of FM radio broadcasts.

- 1. Tune to the broadcast you wish to record and then touch OPT to access the Smart Menu.
- 2. Touch or to select "Start Record" and touch to confirm. FM Recording will start immediately.
- 3. During recording:
 - Touch I to pause recording; touch I again to resume recording.
 - Touch OPT to stop and save the recording. The recorded file will be named "FMXXXX. WAV" where XXXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 0001).

E-BOOK MODE

Enter E-BOOK mode to read TXT E-book files.

To enter E-BOOK mode, select and confirm E-BOOK from the Main Menu.

Upon entering E-BOOK mode, you will see a list of all text files that located on your player.

- Touch \Lambda or 🔽 to move the selection up or down.
- Touch **I** to confirm and play a selection.
- While a text file is displayed:
 - Touch 🚺 to skip backward one page; touch ≥ to skip forward one page.
 - Touch **OPT** to return to the E-BOOK file list.

RECORD MODE

Enter Record mode to make voice recordings through the integrated Microphone or play Recordings.

To enter Record mode, select and confirm RECORD in the Main menu.

Playing Recorded Files

Upon entering RECORD mode, touch **I** to play recently recorded files.

While a track is playing:

- Touch **>** to play the next track.
- Touch **C** to play the previous track.
- Touch and hold **>** to fast forward through the track.
- Touch and hold **I** to reverse through the track.
- Touch D pause playback. Touch D again to resume playback
- Touch or to adjust the volume level.

Smart Menu Options

The Smart Menu gives you quick access to your player's option settings. To access the Smart Menu, touch OPT.

The Smart Menu options are Repeat, Speed, and Start Record.

Repeat

Adjust the Repeat settings to change the order in which tracks are played. The Repeat options are: No Repeat, One, All, Random All, DirRepOne, DirRep and DirRanAll.

No Repeat	Play tracks once in sequential order.
One	Play the current track repeatedly.
All	Play all tracks repeatedly.
Random All	Play all tracks in random order.
DirRepOne	Repeat all tracks in the current folder.
DirRep	Repeat all tracks in all folder.
DirRanAll	Play folders in random order.

- Touch 🔼 or 💟 to select a Repeat option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch **OPT** to return to the Music mode without saving.

RECORD MODE

Speed

Use the Speed function to adjust playback tempo. The Play options are: 70%, 80%, 100%, 120% and 130%.

- Touch 🚺 or 🔽 to select a Speed option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch **OPT** to return to the Music mode without saving.

Start Record

Select to making recordings through the integrated microphone.

During the recording:

- Touch **I** to pause recording; touch **I** again to resume recording.
- Touch **OPT** to stop and save the recording. The player will return to Recording Playback mode.
 - The recorded file will be named "MICXXXX.WAV" where XXXX corresponds to the numerical sequence in which the recording was made (numbering starts from 0001).

BROWSER MODE

Enter Browser mode to manage (Delete) the files on your player.

To enter Browser mode, select and confirm BROWSER from the Main Menu. Upon entering Browser mode, you will see a "tree view" which will display all of the folders on your player.

- Touch or to select a folder and press to view its contents.
- Touch OPT to access the Smart Menu Options.



If there are no files in a selected folder, the player will not enter the folder.

Smart Menu Options

The Smart Menu gives you quick access to your player's option settings. To access the Smart Menu, touch OPT.

Access the Smart Menu to delete files from the browser list.

Delete Controls

Delete the file(s) from your player.

- 1. Highlight and select a file that you wish to delete.
- 2. Touch OPT.
- 3. Touch \Lambda or 🔽 to select "Yes" or "No" and touch 🚺 to confirm.
 - If you select "Yes" and touch **D**, the file will be deleted.

SETTING MODE

Enter the Setting mode to set your player's system options.

To enter Setting mode, select and confirm SETTING in the Main menu.

Upon entering Setting mode, you will have the following options: Power, Language, Display, Record, Sys Tools, Time, and USB Mode.

Touch or to select a setting and then press D to confirm. Press to return to a previous menu screen.

Power

This setting contains two options: Power Off and Sleep.

Power Off

Set the duration of time (in minutes) until the player turns off automatically. A setting of "Off" will disable this power-saving feature.

- Touch or to adjust the Power Off option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Setting menu without saving.

Sleep

Set the duration of time (in minutes) that your player will shut off after the preset time is due. A setting of "off" will disable this power-saving feature.

- Touch or to adjust the Sleep option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Setting menu without saving.

Language

Set the language that the menus appear in. The language options are: CHI (Trad), CHI(Simp), English, German, Spanish, Portuguese and French.

- Touch or to select a Language option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Setting menu without saving.

<u>Display</u>

Set the Brightness and Backlight.

Brightness

Set the Brightness (Contrast) level of the display.

- Touch or to adjust the Brightness level.
- Touch **D** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Display menu without saving.

SETTING MODE

Backlight

Set the duration of time until the LCD screen turns off when your player is idle. The options are: 1s, 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s and On. A setting of "On" will disable this power-saving feature.

- Touch or to adjust the Screen option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Display menu without saving.

Record

Set the Recording quality level for Voice and FM recordings. The options are: Low, Normal and High. Lower quality recordings will take up less memory than higher quality recordings.

- Touch 🚺 or 💟 to select a Record option.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Setting menu without saving.

Sys Tools

There are 3 options in Sys Tools setting: Format, Reset and Sys Info.

Format

It may become necessary to format your player if data or files become corrupt. You have two types to format your player: Quick and Complete. Quick formatting will take up less time than Complete formatting.

- Touch 🚺 or 💟 to select a Format option and touch 🚺 to confirm.
- Touch \Lambda or 🔽 to select "Yes" or "No" and touch 🚺 to confirm and format your player.
- Touch M to return to the Sys Tools menu without formatting.



Formatting will destroy all the data on your player permanently! Make sure to back up your data before formatting the player.

Reset

Return all of your player's internal options to their factory-default settings.

- Touch \Lambda or 💟 to select "Yes" or "No" and then touch 🔳 to confirm.
- Touch M to return to the Sys Tools menu without saving.

Sys Info

View the Firmware, date, and memory information of your player.

SETTING MODE

<u>Time</u>

Set the internal clock of your player.

- Touch or to select field to adjust.
 - The clock fields (from left to right) are Hour, Minutes, Seconds, and AM/PM.
- Touch or voice to adjust the value of the selected field.
- Touch D or when you are finished to save.

USB Mode

Set the USB Mode to MSC or MTP that when you connect your player to a computer.

- MSC. The player will connect as a USB-MSC device. This setting enables the widest compatibility with all systems, and allows the player to be used as a removable storage device.
- MTP: The player will connect as a USB-MTP device. This setting enables advanced synchronization features if you are using Windows Media Player 10 (WMP10) or newer.

To set the USB mode of your player:

- Touch \Lambda or 💟 to select MSC mode or MTP mode.
- Touch **I** when you are finished to save.
- Touch M to return to the Setting menu without saving.

USB Driver Installation (Required for Windows 98 SE Only)

It is not necessary to install the USB driver if your computer is running Microsoft Windows ME/2000/ XP or newer, or Macintosh OS X. Computers running these operating systems will recognize your player automatically when connected.

If your computer is running Windows 98 SE:

- 1. Insert the Installation CD into your computer's CD or DVD drive. Make sure to place the mini-CD in the center, recessed well of the drive tray.
- 2. Navigate to MY COMPUTER and double-click on the CD/DVD drive icon (usually "D:").
- 3. Double-click on the folder "Win98 USB Drivers" to open it.
- 4. Find out and double-click on the SETUP icon (Win98Driver.EXE) to start the USB driver installation program.
- 5. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation and then restart your computer.



Transferring Files

The USB 2.0 Hi-Speed connection makes it easy to transfer music, video, photo, and text files (or any other data) quickly between the player and your computer. Simply use the player as you would a floppy disk using basic operating system commands.

- 1. Double-click the "My Computer" icon on your desktop and then double-click the MP-C7085 icon (MTP Multimedia Player).
- 2. Your player contains two folders: Data and Media.
 - Drag your media files to the Media folder (e.g., MP3, WMA files).
 - Drag all other types of files to the Data folder for storage. Data files are only visible from a computer; these files will not be available from within the player itself.



Macintosh OS X

- 1. Open a finder window. Located the files you would like to transfer from your computer. Select the files/folders with the mouse and press APPLE-C (copy) on the keyboard.
- 2. Click on the Removable Disk icon located on the left side of the finder window. The computer will display all files and folders currently stored in the player.


Converting Video






WINDOWS MEDIA PLAYER

The player does not turn on.

- The battery level may be too low. Try charging the player or operate the player on AC power.

The player does not turn charge when connected to a computer (USB charge).

There is no sound during playback.

- Check the volume level.
- Ensure that the headphones are attached securely to the player.

The sound quality of the music is poor.

- Try playing the file on your computer. If the sound quality is still poor, try downloading the file again or re-encoding the file yourself.
- Ensure that the bit rate of the file is not too low. The higher the bit rate of the file, the better it will sound. The minimum recommended bitrate is 128kbps for MP3s and 96kbps for WMAs.
- Ensure that the headphones are attached securely to the player.

The buttons do not work.

- Ensure that battery is charged or that the player is operating on AC power.
- Ensure that the Lock switch is disengaged.

The player will not play my music file.

- Ensure that the file is in a compatible format (MP3, WMA, or WAV).
- The file may be copy-protected. Use Windows Media Player to transfer the file.
- The file may be copy-protected. Ensure that the license has not expired.

TROUBLESHOOTING

The LCD characters are corrupted.

• Ensure that the correct language has been selected. Try transferring some songs and restart the player to automatically rebuild the Music Library.

The player will not play my video file.

• Ensure that the video file will play on your computer using Windows Media Player 10. If the file works on the computer, use the same computer to convert the video.

I cannot transfer files to the player.

- Ensure that your computer is running a supported operating system.

- Ensure that the supplied USB cable is securely attached to the player and the PC, or try using another USB cable.
- If you have connected the player through a USB hub, try connecting the player directly to your computer.
- Ensure that the player's memory capacity is not full.
- Ensure that there are less than 2500 items loaded on the player.

I transferred files to my player but they are missing from the Music Library

- Ensure that the file in a supported format (MP3, MTV, JPG, WAV, WMA).
- Ensure that there are less than 2500 items loaded on the player.
- If the player is in MTP mode, ensure that there are less than 2500 items loaded on the player.

I cannot see some files on my computer.

• Ensure that the correct USB mode is in use (MSC or MTP). Files transferred in one mode will not be seen when connected in another mode.

The player has malfunctioned.

again.
