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Safety Information

To ensure reliable and safe operation of this equipment, please read carefully all the instructions in this user guide, especially the safety information below.

Electrical safety

- •The TV set should only be connected to a mains supply which matches that stated on the label on the mains adaptor
- •To prevent overload, don't share the same mains supply socket with too many other items of equipment.

Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over.

Do not place heavy items, which may damage the leads, on them.

Hold the Mains plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket.

During a thunderstorm or while leaving the TV for long periods, disconnect the aerial (if outdoor) and mains adaptor from the supply.

Do not allow water or moisture to enter the TV or mains adaptor. Do NOT use in wet or moist areas such as Bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools.

•Pull the plug out immediately, and seek professional help if:

the mains plug or cable is damaged

liquid is spilt onto the set, or if it is accidentally exposed to water or moisture anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots

the set doesn't work normally.

Do NOT remove the safety covers. There are no user serviceable parts inside. You may invalidate the warranty. Qualified personnel must only service this apparatus.


To avoid battery leakage, remove exhausted batteries from the remote control handset, or when not using for a long period.

Physical safety


- •Do NOT block ventilation slots in the back cover. You may place the TV in a cabinet, but ensure at least 5cm (2") clearance all around.



Getting Started



1.(IR)Infrared Receiver: Receives IR signal from the remote control. (Power on/Standby)LED Indicator: Press POWER to turn on and off.

Indicator on(Red) Standby mode
Indicator on(Green) Power on mode

The effective receiving scope for the signal is 5-8 meters from the front of the remote control window, and 30° to the left or right side and 20° above or below the control window.

2. The functions of the buttons are described as bellows:

TV/AV: Press to select the input source.

MENU: Press to display the OSD menu, Press again to exit the menu.

CH+/-: Press to scan through channels. **VOL**+/-: Press to adjust the volume. **Power**: Turn on/standby the TV set.





Rear view




- 1. AC POWER IN: Connect to an earth 100-240V, 50/60Hz AC outlet with the Power Cable.
- 2. HDMI3: Connect it to the HDMI of DVD or other equipment.
- 3. HDMI2: Connect it to the HDMI of DVD or other equipment.
- 4. HDMI1: Connect it to the HDMI of DVD or other equipment.
- 5. PC AUDIO IN: Connect it to the audio output terminal of PC.
- 6. VGA: For PC display. Connect it to the D-Sub 15 pins analog output connector of the PC.
- 7. YPbPr 1: (component1): Connect them to the video output terminal of DVD.(used in HDTV1 mode).
 - L/R in 1: Connect them to the audio output terminal of DVD(with YPbPr 1).
- 8. YPbPr 2: Connect them to the video output terminal of DVD.(used in HDTV2 mode).
 - L/R in 2: Connect them to the audio output terminal of DVD(with YPbPr 2).
- 9. VIDEO/S-VIDEO L/R in: Connect them to audio output terminal of DVD(with VIDEO/S-VIDEO).
- **10. VIDEO:** Connect it to video output terminal of DVD.
- 11. S-VIDEO: Connect it to S-Video output terminal of DVD.
- 12. Coax out : Digital coaxial output.
- **13. RF:** Connect antenna or cable 75 Ohm coaxial to receive TV signal.

Menu Operation

Basic operation

Turning on and off the TV

TURN ON LCD TV

- 1. Connecting to the AC input cable then press the main power switch to switch ON LCD TV. At this time the TV will enter standby mode and indicator show red.
- 2. Use POWER button can turn ON LCD TV from standby mode.

TURN OFF LCD TV

- 1. Press POWER button or POWER button on the remote control to enter standby mode. The indicator is red.
- 2. Using main power switch turns off LCD TV completely.

Select on screen language

NOTE: If this is the first time you run the LCD TV, the Initial Setup Menu will appear in the picture, and the items of this menu also exist in other menus, so you are able to change the values after you set them up.



Menu Language

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select this item, then press OK / ▶ button to select the OSD language.

Tuning Band

Press OK / ▶ to select Tuning Band mode. (Available tuning band mode: Air, Cable STD, Cable HRC, Cable IRC, Cable Auto.)

Auto Ch Search

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select this item, then press OK /▶ button to enter the Auto Channel Search Program.

Volume adjustment

1. Press VOL+/- to adjust the volume.




- 2. If you want to switch the sound OFF, press the MUTE X.
- 3. You can cancel this function by pressing MUTE or VOL+/-.



The OSD (On Screen Display) in this document may be different from your TV's, because this is just an reference for your product.

How to adjust the OSD screen

- Press the **MENU** button to display the main menu.
- Use **▲**/▼/ **◄**/ **▶** buttons to select and adjust the available menus.



The OSD (On Screen Display) function enables you to adjust the screen status conveniently since it provides graphical presentation.

Choosing a TV channel

- 1. Using the CH+/CH- on the front panel or on the remote control.
- Press CH+ to increase channel number.
- Press CH to decrease channel number.

2. Using 0-9 digital buttons and - button

You can select the channel number by pressing 0 to 9 or - , and press **OK** to confirm.

3. Example:

- To select 1-digit channel (e.g. Channel 5): Press the 5 button.
- To select 2-digit channel (e.g. Channel 20): Press the button repeatedly to display -- then press 2, follow by 0.
- To select 3-digit channel (e.g. Channel 103): Press the button repeatedly to display -- then press 1, follow by 0, follow by 3.

Note: After select the digit button, the digit will be memorized.

Selecting input source

You can select the input source by pressing the TV/AV on the remote control or on the front panel.



Picture menu options

In this manual, the OSD (On Screen Display) may be different from your TV's because it is just example to help the TV operation.

Press the MENU on the front panel or on the remote control and then use ▲ / ▼ to select the Picture menu.



- Use ▲ / ▼ to select what you want to adjust in the Picture menu.
- 2. Press **OK** button to adjust.
- 3. Once you adjusted to your preference, press MENU for exit

Picture Mode

Select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements by selecting Picture Mode in PICTURE menu. You may select the picture mode directly by pressing the PMODE button on the remote control.

Contrast

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◀ / ▶ to adjust the contrast of the picture.

Brightness

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◀ / ► to adjust the brightness of the picture.

Sharpness

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◄ / ► to adjust the sharpness level of the picture.

Color

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◀ / ▶ to adjust the color saturation.

Tint

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◀ / ▶ to adjust the tint of picture. (In NTSC system)

Aspect Ratio

Press **OK** to select the ratio of picture display such as Normal/ Zoom/ Wide and Cinema.

AUDIO menu options

Press MENU on the front panel or on the remote control and then use ▲ / ▼ to select the AUDIO menu.



- Press MENU button on the front panel or the remote control to display the main menu.
- Press ▼ / ▲ button to select the AUDIO menu, then press
 button for the submenu.
- Press ▼ / ▲ button to select the item you want to adjust.
- Press OK / ▶ button repeatedly to adjust the value.

Audio Mode

Select Audio Mode in AUDIO menu.

You should set the Audio Mode to "User" first if you want to change the value of Bass/Treble.

TIPS: you can select the sound mode directly by pressing SMODE button repeatedly.

Audio Language

Press \bigvee / \blacktriangle button to select this item, then press \bigcirc **OK** / \blacktriangleright button to adjust the aspect the audio language. **NOTE**: This item will be unavailable if the program system does not provide several audio languages.

Rass

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄/▶ to adjust the bass value.

Treble

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄/▶ to adjust the Treble value.

Balance

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄/▶ to adjust the sound balance.

Digital Audio Output

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select this item, then press OK / ▶ button to select the digital audio output mode.

TV Speakers

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select this item, then press **OK** / ▶ button to select whether to shut down the TV speaker. (COAX and OPTICAL output are not under control of this function.)

Setup menu options



- Press MENU button on the front panel or the remote control to display the main menu.
- Press ▼ / ▲ button to select the SETUP menu, then press
 OK / ▶ button for the submenu.
- Press ▼ / ▲ button to select the item you want to adjust.
- Press **ok** / ▶ button repeatedly to adjust the value.

Tuning Band

Select Tuning Band mode. (Available tuning band mode: Air, Cable STD, Cable HRC, Cable IRC, Cable Auto.) If sets Air, the range of channel is 2-69, and if sets Cable, the range of channel is 1-135.

Signal Level

In DTV mode, you can refer the strength of the current channel ,and you can tune manually and adjust the angle, orientation of the antenna etc.



Auto Channel Search

Press ▲ / ▼ key to move the cursor to the item to be selected (item selected is highlighted in yellow). Press **OK** key to enter your selection and scan. After the scan is finished, the following menu will display. The channels found are automatically saved as below:



Add on Channel Search

When the channels are found, use **OK** to add it to the channel list.

Manual Channel Set

Channel labels

Allows you to name the channel that is selected. Use \blacktriangleleft / \blacktriangleright to move the cursor and use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown to input the name and then press Menu or $\bigcirc K$ to return or exit as following:



Manual Language

To select language of the OSD such as English/ French and Spanish.

Reset

Press to return to the default set.

Feature menu options

Press MENU on the front panel or on the remote control and then use ◀ / ▶ to select the Feature menu.



Press **MENU** button on the front panel or the remote control to display the main menu.

Press \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **FEATURE** menu, then press

▶ button for the submenu.

Press ▲ / ▼ button to select the item you want to adjust.

Press **OK** / ▶ button repeatedly to adjust the value.

When you are satisfied with your choice, press ◀ button to go to the previous menu, or press MENU/EXIT button to exit.

Time Set

Press ▼ / ▲ button and then press OK / ▶ to the time set menu as below that allows you to set the time the TV will display.



Time Set Mode

Press **OK** / ▶ button to select the time set mode from **AUTO** and **MANUAL**.

You should set the Time Set Mode to "Manual" first if you want to change the value of Time Zone/Year/Date/Time.

Time Zone


Press ▲/▼ button to select this item, then press **OK**/▶ button to select the time zone for your TV.

Sleep Timer

Press **OK** / ▶ to select the number of minutes to set your TV sleeps automatically.

Advance Video Menu

Press \mathbf{OK} to enter the advance video menu as below:



Noise Reduction

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to select the level of noise reduction from Off/Low/Medium/High.

Color Temperature

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to select the color temperature from Cool/Normal/Warm.

3D/YC

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the 3D/YC on or off.

Adaptive Contrast

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the Adaptive Contrast on or off.

Gradient Enable

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the Gradient Enable on or off.

Blue Screen

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the Blue Screen on or off.

Audio only

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the video on or off. Press OK video will hide, hold down power 3 sec. to restore.




120Hz Mode

Press **OK** / **◄**/▶ button to set the 120Hz mode from ON/OFF/DEMO.

Parental Control

You need to enter the password for the submenu. And the original password is 0000.





Password Set

You need to enter the correct old password before setting a new password, and after set the new password, you need to enter it again to confirm it.



Master Lock

Press **OK** / ▶ button to set the Master Lock on/off if,you set this function on all the parental control lock will be unavailable and it can play all kinds of programs.

Unrated Lock


Press **OK** / ▶ button to set the Unrated Lock on/off, if you set this function on, all the programs will be locked even they are unrated program.



Press **OK** / ▶ button to select CC Mode from CC Off / CC On / CC Mute.

Analog CC

Press **OK** / ▶ button to select Analog CC Mode.

Digital CC

Press **OK** / ▶ button to select Digital CC Mode.

Advance CC Settings

Press **OK** / ▶ button for **Advance CC Settings Menu**.



- Style: Press OK / ▶ button to select CC Style between Automatic and Custom, you need to set it to Custom first if you want to change the value of items below.
- Size: Normal/Large and Small.
- Font: From Font1 to Font7.
- Text Color: Red/Green/Blue/Yellow/Magenta/Cyan/Black/White.

- Text Opacity: Solid/Flashing/Transparent/Translucent.
- Background Color: Black/White/Red/Green/Blue/Yellow/Magenta/Cyan.
- Background Opacity: Solid/Flashing/Transparent/Translucent.
- Edge Effect: None/Raised/Depressed/Uniform/Left Shadow/Right Shadow.
- Edge Color: Black/White/Red/Green/Blue/Yellow/Magenta/Cyan.

Feature menu options in VGA

Press Input button to select the input source to VGA.



VGA Set

Press ▲/▼ button to select VGA Set, then press OK / ▶ button for VGA Setting Menu.



H-Position

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◄ / ► to adjust the horizontal position of the picture.

V-Position

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◄ / ► to adjust the vertical position of the picture.

Clock

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄ / ▶ to adjust the clock of the picture.

Phase

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◄ / ► to adjust the phase of the picture.

Auto Adjust

Press **OK** / ▶ button to auto adjust the VGA setting.

Setting

Press **OK** / ▶ button to reset the VGA setting to factory default.



H-Position

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄ / ▶ to adjust the horizontal position of the picture.

V-Position

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ► to enter, then press ◄ / ► to adjust the vertical position of the picture.

Clock

This function is unavailable in component mode.

Phase

Press ▼ / ▲ button to select and press Enter / ▶ to enter, then press ◄ / ▶ to adjust the phase of the picture.

Auto Adjust

This function is unavailable in component mode.

Setting

Press **OK** / ▶ button to reset the **Component Setting** to factory default.

Parental Control (page 14)

Press Enter to enter the sub-menu and then uses the 0-9 to enter the correct password: 0,0,0,0.

If used, this optional feature can "block" undesirable programming from appearing on the TV. Parental Control offers the user a wide variety of options and settings that restrict or "block" the programming that can appear on the TV. Parental control allows the user the capability of defining which program rating they consider accept-able, to the younger or more sensitive viewer. It can be preset and turned either on or off by the user who specifies the secret 4-number code, the password. The number of hours blocked are specified. General audience and children viewer blocks should both be programs into the TV's memory. Viewer ratings are specified for both TV and the motion picture industry; both rating systems should be used, for complete coverage.

The ratings are based on the ages of children.

Overview

To insure complete coverage for all TV programs, (movies and regular TV shows) choose a rating for MPAA, from the selections below. And choose ratings from the TV Parental Guidelines Rating System below, using the Age Block option for General Audiences, and for Children. In addition to those, you may wish to add additional restrictions from the Content Block menu. See the Parental Control menu, and submenus example below.

Things to Consider before Setting Up Parental Control

Determine which rating you consider acceptable to the viewer. (For example, if you choose TV-PG, all more restrictive ratings will be automatically blocked; the viewer will not be able to see: TV-PG, TV-14, or TV-MA rated programming.)

Do you want to block the auxiliary video source entirely? (Blocks the signal sent by the equipment, such as a VCR, connected to the TV Audio/Video input jacks) Or leave unblocked, then choose allowable ratings. Block program "Content" based on individual parameters such as: Strong Dialog, Bad Language, Sex Scenes, Violence Scenes, or Fantasy Violence Scenes; in the Content Blk option.

Select a secret password; in the Set Password option. Use the number keys on the remote. Don't forget the password, it is the only way you can access the Parental Control menu and change rating selections, or turn Parental Control off.

Do you want Parental Control to be active all the time? If not, you can turn it on or off with the Lock On/Off option.

- * You can set different Parental Control viewing restrictions for general audiences and for children both can be active at the same time.
- * Simply specifying one content block such as Sex Scenes, will not automatically block another content in the programs from appearing.
- * Even if you choose to leave the Aux inputs unblocked, the ratings you specify will automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources.
- * You can not disable Parental Control by disconnecting the TV from power. Block hours will automatically reset to the original block time setting specified if power is disconnected.

Note

The V-Chip will automatically block certain categories that are 'more restrictive'. If you block TV-Y category, then TV-Y7 will be automatically blocked. Similarly, if you block TV-G category, then all the categories in the 'young adult' will be blocked(TV-G, TV-PG, TV-14 and TV-MA).

Simple Troubleshooting

If the display fails or the performance dramatically, check the Display in accordance with the following instructions. Performs to check the peripherals to pinpoint the source of the failure. If the Display still fails to perform as expected, contact the dealer for assistance.

SYMPTOM	DEALING METHOD
NO POWER	Check the power connection. Pull the plug out, wait for 60 seconds, then reconnect the power and run the set
NO PICTURE	Check the antenna connection. Try other TV channel due to the TV station problem. Modify the brightness or contrast setting.
NO SOUND	Increase the volume. Check that if the set is on the mute state or not. Check the voice setting condition. Check the voice mode setting condition.
ABNORMAL COLOR	Check the antenna connection
NO RESPONSE OF THE REMOTE CONTROL	Check the effect of the batteries, if needed, please replace the batteries or clean the remote sensor window. The distance between the set and the remote control should be less than 6 meters.
The SCREEN FLASH IN VGA MODE	The parameter is too big. Please use safety mode when restart the PC, and set the parameter of the monitor according to the instruction.
SOME INTERFERE IN THE VGA MODE	Please modify parameter of the monitor according to the instruction.
