- 2 The speaker jacks for external speakers are located on the back of the radio. Along with the speaker jacks is a switch labeled int./ ext. When using external speakers, this switch must be switched to the ext. position. Doing this turns off the internal speakers in the radio and redirects the power to the external speakers.
- 3 If you decide not to use the external speakers, be sure the switch is on int. or the internal speakers will not work.

CD Player & Connecting Optional Equipment

Program

Track programming

- A While CD is stopped, press "PROG" to enter PROGRAM mode.
- **B** Press "FF" or "FB" to select a desired track number.
- C Press "PROG" to save that track.
- D Repeat above procedures to program additional tracks.
- E After end of program, press "PLAY" to start playback.


Notes:

- 1) To program, the CD must be stopped.
- 2) The same track can be programmed more than once.



Programmed track revision

- A While CD is stopped, press "PROG" button to check the sequence of programmed tracks.
- **B** After checking, just press "PLAY" to start play.
- Notes: 1) Clear programming process by using of "STOP".



Add or Change program track

- **A** While CD is stopped, press "PROG" repeatedly to reach the program number that you want to change.
- **B** Press "FF" or "FB" to desire track.
- C Press "PROG" to save.
- D Repeat above procedures to add or change program track.

Notes:

- It can work with "INTRO", "REPEAT" during play.
- The programmed contents will not clear except press "STOP" twice or press "RANDOM".

Clock Operation


Timer-Off Operation

Example: "set Timer - off for 8:15am"

- A Press "MODE" to timer-off display mode.
- **B** Press "CLK-ADJ" to enter to timer-off houradjustment mode.
- C Press "FF / FB" to set desired hour. (e.g. 12:00am → 8:00am).
- Press "CLK-ADJ" to enter to timer-off minuteadjustment mode.
- E Press "FF / FB" to set desired minute. (e.g. 8:00am → 8:15am).
- **F** Press "CLK-ADJ" to return to timer-off display mode with activation of Timer-off function.



A Press "TIMER" to deactivate (both icons flash) or activate (only "Timer" flash) Timer-off function.



Snooze Operation

If using the Timer-On function, you can also use the Snooze function. Using the Snooze function will allow you to temporarily turn off the Timer-On function for 5 minutes.

A Press "SNOOZE" to turn off the system. After 5 minutes, the system will ON again automatically

Notes:

 The function mode (CD/TUNER/AUX/TAPE) will not be changed for above operation.



To Load A CD


- A Press "CD" on control panel or on remote control to enter "CD" mode.
- **B** Press the "OPEN/CLOSE" button to open the CD drawer.
- C Load the CD with CD label facing up.
- Press the "OPEN/CLOSE" button to close the CD drawer.
- E To remove CD, press the CD "STOP" button to stop CD from spinning. Press the "OPEN/CLOSE" button to open drawer. Remove CD and press the "OPEN/CLOSE" button to close the CD drawer.





Play

A Press "PLAY" to start play



Remain time display

- A During playback, press "REMAIN" until Remain icon appear.
- **B** To cancel remain time display, press "REMAIN" until relative time show out.

This function will show you how much time is remaining on the CD.

Note: 1) It can work with 'INTRO' or 'REPEAT'.



Pause

- A During playback, press "PLAY" to pause.
- **B** To resume play, press this key again.

Notes: 1) Pause function will be kept after "FF/FS" or "FB/BS".




Stop

A During CD playback, press "STOP" to stop play and then total time and total tracks will show on the display.

Notes: "STOP" is a multi-function key.

- Cancel programmed play, press "STOP" after CD stopped
- Cancel repeat, intro, remain, random and / or programming mode.
- 3. Cancel selected track number (not yet play).
- 4. Stop tape during CD-Sync-Rec.




FF/FB and FS/BS

Track Skip

A select a particular track by using "FF" or "FB" (release key within 2 sec).

Track Scan

A Hold "FS" or "BS" more than 2 sec to perform scan.
