

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

#### Before using

Pay attention to the following before using this unit:

#### Moving the unit.

First eject the disc and turn off the power, wait 3 minutes after turning off the power, then unplug the power cord from the power outlet.

Disconnect the connection cables between the different components before doing this.

#### · Cautions on using mobile phones.

Using a mobile phone near this unit may result in noise. If so, move the mobile phone away from this unit when it is in use.

#### · Condensation (dew).

Water droplets may condense on internal operation parts if the set is brought into a heated room from the cold outdoors or when the room is heated rapidly. If this happens, the set may not operate properly.

#### · Should condensation occur.

The condensation will evaporate in one hour or less, at which time the system will function normally.

#### · Before turning the power operation switch on.

Check once again that all connections are correct and that there are not problems with the connection cables. Always set the power operation switch to the standby position before connecting and disconnecting connection cables.

#### · Sufficiently ventilate the place of installation.

If the unit is left in a room full of the smoke from cigarettes, etc., for long periods of time, the surface of the optical pickup could get dirty, in which case it will not be able to read the signals properly.

#### Store the operating instructions in a safe place.

After reading the operating instructions, store them in a safe place as they could come in handy in the future.

- Power is supplied to some of the circuitry even when the power is set to the standby mode using the power operation switch.

 This CD/HDD music system uses a semiconductor laser. To ensure stable operation, it is recommended to use the set indoors at a temperature of 5°C (41°F) ~ 35°C (95°F).

# Cautions on handling the hard disk (also referred to as hard disk drive or "HDD")

The HDD is a recording medium with many fragile elements. Be careful of the following when handling it.

#### ☐ Cautions on the installation environment

- Do not obstruct the cooling fan's ventilation holes on the rear panel.
- Set on a flat surface that is not subject to vibrations or shocks.
- Do not place on receivers (amplifiers) or other components that get hot during operation.
- Place in a room that does not fill with smoke. (Cigarette smoke, the smoke from the food smoking process, insecticides and the like can damage the HDD.)

#### ☐ Cautions during operation

To avoid partial damage to the HDD's recording surface or malfunction of the HDD, heed the following during operation:

- Do not subject to vibrations or shocks.
- Do not unplug the power cord. (Note that the sound being recorded or played could be lost if there is a power failure during operation.)

#### ☐ Backing up the HDD

By way of precaution against HDD breakdown, it is recommended that you periodically back up the recorded data onto a computer (@page 34).



- Non-finalized discs cannot be played.

#### **\* Finalization:**

Finalization is the process that makes recorded CD-R/CD-RW discs playable on compatible players.


#### **Holding discs**




Do not touch the signal surface.

#### **Loading discs**

- Set the disc with the labeled side facing up.
- Make sure the disc tray is fully open when inserting the disc.
- Place the discs flatly, 12 cm discs in the outer tray guide (Figure 1), 8 cm discs in the inner tray guide (Figure 2).





• Place 8 cm discs in the inner tray guide without using an adapter.



- In the following cases, "No Disc" is shown on the display:
- When no disc is loaded
- When the disc is loaded upside-down
- When the disc's information could not be read properly

#### **Cautions on loading discs**

- Only load one disc at a time. Loading two or more discs can damage the set or scratch the discs.
- Do not use cracked or warped discs or discs that have been repaired with adhesive, etc.
- Do not use discs on which the sticky part of cellophane tape or labels is exposed or on which there are traces of where labels have been removed. Such discs could get caught inside the player and damage it.

#### **Cautions on handling**

- Do not get fingerprints, oil or dirt on discs.
- Take special care not to scratch discs when removing them from their cases
- Do not bend or heat discs.
- Do not enlarge the hole at the center.
- Do not write on the labeled (printed) surface with ball-point pens, pencils, etc., or stick new labels on discs.
- Water droplets may form on discs if they are moved suddenly from a cold place (outdoors for example) to a warm place, but do not try to dry them off using a hairdryer, etc.


#### **Cautions on storing discs**

- Be sure to remove discs after using them.
- Be sure to store discs in their cases to protect them from dust, scratches, warping, etc.
- Do not store discs in the following places:
- 1. Places exposed to direct sunlight for long periods of time
- 2. Dusty or humid places
- 3. Places exposed to heat from heating appliances, etc.

#### Cleaning discs

- If there are fingerprints or dirt on discs, wipe them off before using the disc. If not the sound quality could be reduced and the sound may be broken.
- Use a commercially available disc cleaning set or a soft cloth to clean discs.







Do not wipe with a circular motion.

#### NOTE:

 Do not use record spray, antistatic agents, or benzene, thinner or other solvents.

#### About the remote control unit


The included remote control unit (RC-1042) can be used to operate not only the CHR-F103 but also other components in the F102 series (F) page 32).

#### NOTE:

• The system remote control unit included with the receiver (DRA-F102/F102DAB) cannot be used to operate the CHR-F103. Use the remote control unit included with the CHR-F103.



#### Notes on batteries:

- Replace the batteries with new ones if the set does not operate even when the remote control unit is operated nearby the unit. (The attached batteries are only for verifying operation.)
- When inserting the batteries, be sure to do so in the proper direction, following the "⊕" and "⊖" marks in the battery compartment.
- To prevent damage or leakage of battery fluid:
- Do not use a new battery together with an old one.
- Do not use two different types of batteries.
- Do not short-circuit, disassemble, heat or dispose of batteries in flames.
- If the battery fluid should leak, carefully wipe the fluid off the inside of the battery compartment and insert new batteries.
- Remove the batteries from the remote if it will not be in use for long periods.

#### Operating range of the remote control unit

- Point the remote control unit at the remote sensor when operating it
- When used connected to other components in the F102 series, point the remote control unit at the remote control sensor of the receiver (DRA-F102/F102DAB) when operating it.
- The remote control unit can be used from a distance of up to about 7 meters, at a horizontal angle of up to 30° with respect to the sensor.





#### **Recommended system layout**

To ensure performance and safety, it is recommended to arrange the components as shown below when connecting to models in the F102 series.



#### NOTE:

- Arrange in such a way that the receiver's ventilation holes are not obstructed so that the heat can dissipate.
- Do not place other components directly on top of the receiver.
- To ensure safety, do not make stacks of more than three components.

#### **Connections**

#### NOTE:

- Do not plug in the power supply cord until all connections have been completed.
- When making connections, also refer to the operating instructions of the other components.
- Be sure to connect the left and right channels properly (left with left, right with right).
- Do not bundle power supply cords together with speaker cables. Doing so could result in humming or noise.
- Making connections with the power turned on could result in noise or damage the speakers.
- Bunching the power supply cords and connection cables together could result in humming or noise.
- Connect all the connection cables between the different components firmly. The system may not operate properly if the connections are incomplete.
- Be sure to disconnect the power supply cords when changing the connections. Changing the connections while the system is operating could result in malfunction.



The "Gracenote® music recognition service" is the name of a service provided by Gracenote® and generally known as "CDDB".

Text information on CD titles, artist names, track names, etc., can be obtained automatically and displayed on the CHR-F103's display by accessing the Gracenote® server over the Internet.

# ☐ If you do not have the environment for connecting to the Internet

The CHR-F103 has part of the Gracenote® database stored in it\*, so some title information can be obtained without connecting to the Internet.

Note, however, that the internal database may not contain title information for recently released CDs.

\*: Information for approximately 350,000 titles selected from the Gracenote® database in April 2006 is stored in the CHR-F103.

# ☐ Using the "Gracenote® music recognition service"

You do not have to perform any operation in particular.

When a CD is inserted or when recording or playback of a CD begins, the CD's text information is acquired automatically and displayed on the CHR-F103.

#### Internet radio function

Internet radio refers to radio programs broadcast over the Internet. With this function you can listen to Internet radio broadcasts from all over the world.

- Stations can be selected by genre or region.
- Up to 60 stations can be preset.
- MP3 format Internet radio programs can be played.
- Your favorite radio stations can be registered by accessing an exclusive DENON Internet radio URL from a Web browser on a computer. (A setting must be made for automatic download (Propage 28).) #### □ vTuner

The CHR-F103's Internet radio station list uses "vTuner", a radio station database service. This database service is edited and prepared for the CHR-F103.



   To connect multiple devices, it is recommended to have a built-in switching hub with a speed of 100 Mbps or greater.

#### ☐ Ethernet cable (CAT-5 or greater recommended)

No Ethernet cable is included with the CHR-F103. Procure a cable with the necessary length.

#### NOTE:

 Be sure to use a shielded type cable for USB/Ethernet connections.

Depending on the connected computer/router, there may be much noise generated from the cable.


- When the contract with your provider is of the type by which the network settings are made manually, you must make the "Network-related settings".
- The CHR-F103 is not compatible with PPPoE. If your contract is of the PPPoE setting type, you need a PPPoE-compatible router.
- For some ISPs (Internet Service Providers), you may have to make proxy server settings in order to use the Internet radio function. If proxy server settings for connecting to the Internet have been made on the computer, make the same settings on the CHR-F103
- The CHR-F103 is designed to make the network settings automatically using the DHCP and Auto IP functions.



- When burning MP3 or WMA files onto CD-R/CD-RW discs, avoid using a folder hierarchy with more than 8 levels. Files and folders from folder level 9 or lower cannot be played.
- The maximum number of files and folders that can be played is 1,000 (total for the number of files and folders). The maximum number of folders is 255.
- The CHR-F103 is not compatible with packet write software or playlists.
- Also read the operating instructions of the software used to create the MP3 or WMA files.
- Be sure to give the extension ".MP3" or ".WMA" to MP3 or WMA files. The files cannot be played if they have any other extensions. (For Macintosh computers, MP3 files can be played by giving the files the extension ".MP3" after a file name consisting of no more than 8 capital letters or numbers before storing them on the CD-B/CD-BW disc.)
