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Warnings and Precautions

TO PREVENT FIRE OR SHOCK HAZARDS, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS UNIT TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.




- 13. Lightning: Unplug this apparatus and disconnect the antenna or cable system during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 14. Servicing: Do not attempt to service this product yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.
- 15. Power Sources: Only connect to the type of house-hold power supply as indicated in the operating instructions and rating label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instruction.
- **16. Overloading:** Do not overload wall outlets or extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- 17. Object and Liquid Entry: Never push objects of any kind or spill liquid into this product through openings as this could result in a risk of fire or electric shock.


- **20.** Wall or Ceiling Mounting: The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.
- 21. Where the AC plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.
- 22. Protective Attachment Plug: The product is equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See Instruction Manual for replacement or resetting of protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug.
- 23. Power Lines: An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

Changing the Remote Battery




- 1. Push to remove the Battery Compartment cover.
- 2. Replace the old battery with an equivalent new battery (CR2025).
- The positive side of the battery, as indicated by a plus symbol, must be facing up when inserted into the remote.

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
Powering the Unit

To power the unit, simply connect it to an AC outlet using the included AC adapter.



Compatible Storage Devices

The following types of digital storage devices can be connected to the unit to play photos and music on the unit.



Viewing Photos

 Connect a XD, MS, MMC, or SD memory card, or a USB Thumb Drive, to the unit.

The memory card or thumb drive that is connected to the unit must have jpeg images loaded onto it.

- 2. Press the **Power/Snooze Button** to turn the unit on.
- 3. Press the Menu/AL Off Button twice to access the unit's main menu.
- 4. Press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to navigate and highlight the options on the main menu (Card, USB, Favorite, Clock, Calendar, and Setup)
- 5. To access photos from a loaded memory card, select the Card option. To access photos from a connected USB thumb drive, select the USB option. To view preloaded photos on the digital photo frame, select the Favorite option.
- 6. Press the Enter/Mode Button to select Card, USB, or Favorite.
- 7. Highlight *Photo* and press the **Enter/Mode Button** to select the photo option.
- 8. Photos from the connected memory source (XD card, MS card, MMC card, SD card, or USB Thumb Drive) will now play as a slideshow on the unit.

Playing Music

 Connect a XD, MS, MMC, or SD memory card, or a USB Thumb Drive, to the unit.

The memory card or thumb drive that is connected to the unit must have jpeg images loaded onto it.

- 2. Press the **Power/Snooze Button** to turn the unit on.
- 3. Press the Menu/AL Off Button twice to access the unit's main menu.
- 4. Press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to navigate and highlight the options on the main menu (Card, USB, Favorite, Clock, Calendar, and Setup)
- 5. To access music from a loaded memory card, select the Card option. To access music from a connected USB thumb drive, select the USB option.
- 6. Press the Enter/Mode Button to select Card, or USB.
- 7. Highlight *Music* and press the **Enter/Mode Button** to select the music option.
- 8. Music from the connected memory source (XD card, MS card, MMC card, SD card, or USB Thumb Drive) will now play from the unit.

Viewing Photos & Playing Music

 Connect a XD, MS, MMC, or SD memory card, or a USB Thumb Drive, to the unit.

The memory card or thumb drive that is connected to the unit must have jpeg images loaded onto it.

- 2. Press the **Power/Snooze Button** to turn the unit on.
- 3. Press the Menu/AL Off Button twice to access the unit's main menu.
- 4. Press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to navigate and highlight the options on the main menu (Card, USB, Favorite, Clock, Calendar, and Setup)
- To access music and photos from a loaded memory card, select the Card option.To access music and photos from a connected USB thumb drive, select the USB option.
- 6. Press the Enter/Mode Button to select Card, or USB.
- 7. Highlight *Photo*+ and press the **Enter/Mode Button** to select the photo and music option.
- 8. Photos and music from the connected memory source (XD card, MS card, MMC card, SD card, or USB Thumb Drive) will now play on the unit.

Setting the Time and Date

- 1. Press the **Power/Snooze Button** to turn the unit on.
- 2. Press the Menu/AL Off Button twice to access the unit's main menu.
- 3. Press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to navigate and highlight the options on the main menu (Card, USB, Favorite, Clock, Calendar, and Setup)
- 4. Highlight the *Setup* option and press the **Enter/Mode Button**.
- 5. Press the **Volume Buttons** to move down through the setup menu.
- 6. Highlight *Time Set*, then press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to highlight the date and time. Once highlighted, press the **Volume Buttons** to edit the date and time.
- 7. After the correct date and time are entered, press the **Menu/AL Off Button** to return to the main menu.


Setting the Alarm

- 1. Press the **Power/Snooze Button** to turn the unit on.
- 2. Press the Menu/AL Off Button twice to access the unit's main menu.
- 3. Press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to navigate and highlight the options on the main menu (Card, USB, Favorite, Clock, Calendar, and Setup)
- 4. Highlight the *Setup* option and press the **Enter/Mode Button**.
- 5. Press the **Volume Buttons** to move down through the setup menu.
- 6. Highlight *Alarm Set*, then press the **Left** and **Right Buttons** to highlight the alarm time. Once highlighted, press the **Volume Buttons** to edit the alarm time.
- 7. Highlight and adjust between Ring1 and Ring2, and turn the alarm On or Off.
- 8. After the correct alarm time is set, press the **Menu/AL Off Button** to return to the main menu.

Taking a Frame Off

- 1. Lay the unit down on a flat surface, with the display facing upward.
- 2. Place a soft cotton cloth over the display. This will keep the display clean of finger prints while changing the frame.
- 3. Put your thumbs just inside the frame, over the cloth covered display.
- 4. Gently apply upward pressure on the outside lip of the frame using your fingers.


 Do not apply pressure to the display to keep from damaging the unit.




Putting a Frame On

- 5. Remove the soft cotton cloth that was used in step 2 so that it does not get in the way.
- 6. Match the engraved up arrow on the inside of the frame with the top of the unit.

 Match the small clear window on the frame with the infrared receiver on the unit.
 - If the small clear window on the frame is not matched up with the infrared receiver on the unit, the unit will not respond to the remote control.
- 7. Gently push the frame onto the unit, matching the small pegs on the frame with the holes on the unit without touching the display.

Control Definitions

1 TFT Display

The TFT Display displays the unit's menus and photos.

2 Infrared Receiver

The Infrared Receiver receives signals from the remote control.

3 DC Input

Connect the DC Input to power the unit.

4 Left/Right Buttons

Use the Left/Right Buttons to navigate the unit's menus.

5 Menu/AL Off Button

Press the Menu Button to go back to the Main Menu. Press the AL Off Button to turn the alarm off after it sounds.

6 Power/Snooze Button

Press the Power Button to turn the unit off and on. Press the Snooze Button to delay the alarm for 6 minutes after it sounds.

7 SD/XD/MS/MMC Card Slot

Insert a compatible memory card into the SD/XD/MS/MMC Card Slot to play photos, videos and audio files from the memory card. You can also transfer photos from a memory expansion card to the photo frame's internal memory by selecting the Copy option in the main menu.

8 USB Port

Connect a USB Mass Storage Device to play photos, videos and audio files from the digital storage device.

9 Headphone Output

Plug headphones into the Headphone Output to listen to audio through the headphones.

10 Easel


Adjust and use the Easel to place the unit in landscape or portrait orientation.

11 Volume Buttons

Press the Volume Buttons to adjust the volume of the unit, or to navigate the unit's menus.

12 Enter/Mode Button

Press the Enter/Mode Button to make selections in the unit's menus, or to switch between the clock and calendar when in clock or calendar mode.



Control Definitions

13 Standby Button

Press the Standby Button to turn the unit off and on.

14 Photo Speed Button

Press the Photo Speed Button to adjust the speed of the photo slideshow during play.

15 Menu/AL Off Button

Press the Menu Button to go back to the Main Menu.

Press the AL Off Button to turn the alarm off after it sounds.

16 Directional & Enter Buttons

Press the Directional & Enter Buttons to navigate through the unit's menus and make selections.

17 Repeat Button

Press the Repeat Button to repeat tracks when listening to music.

18 PREV/NEXT Buttons

Press the PREV/NEXT Buttons to skip to the previous and next JPEG photo or MP3 audio file.

19 Photo + Button

Press the Photo + Button to access the Photo + mode and listen to music while viewing photos.

20 Photo Button

Press the Photo Button to access the Photo mode.

21 16:9/4:3 Button

Press the 16:9/4:3 Button to change the display ratio of the TFT Display.

22 Snooze Button

After the alarm sounds, press the Snooze Button to delay the alarm for an additional 6 minutes. Press the Mute button to mute the audio sound.

23 Rotate Button

Press the Rotate Button to rotate selected photos.

24 Volume Buttons

Press the Volume Buttons to adjust the unit's volume.

25 TFT Off Button

Press the TFT Off Button to turn the TFT Display off.

26 Play/Pause Button

Press the Play/Pause Button to play or pause the unit while viewing a slide show or listening to music.

27 Clk Mode Button

Press the Clk Mode Button to switch between clock and calender viewing.
