

# ■ BUILT-IN RECHARGEABLE BATTERY

The Built-In Rechargeable Battery provides approximately 6 hours of audio playback and 2 hours of video playback on a single full charge.

The built-in battery can be charged by connecting the unit to a powered computer using the Mini-USB Connection



## VIDEO CONVERSION

#### VIDEO CONVERSION SOFTWARE

Video conversion software is included with the unit.

Install the software onto a computer to convert video files to a playable format.

After conversion, the files can be loaded directly onto the unit.

## LOADING FILES ONTO THE UNIT

## MSC MODE (PREFERRED METHOD)

- Connect the unit to a computer (Windows, Apple, or Linux) using the Mini-USB Connection and the included USB Cable.
- 2. Once connected, the unit will show up on the connected computer as if it were a connected USB thumb drive, external hard drive, or memory card.
- 3. Drag and drop the desired audio, video, photo, or ebook files into the unit's drive location on the connected computer.

File Compatibility: MP3, WMA, WMV, MTV, WAV, JPEG, BMP, and TXT

4. After the files are loaded onto the unit, it can be disconnected from the computer.

## MAIN MENU

## FILE

Highlight the *File* tab and press the **Play/Pause Button** to access the file menu. The file menu provides direct access to all of the files that have been loaded onto the unit.

- While playing an audio file, press the Menu Button to access the music player settings.

- 5. Press the **Arrow Buttons** to highlight the *Video* tab and press the **Play/Pause Button** to access the video player.
- 6. Press the **Play/Pause Button** to begin playing video from the player.
- 7. Press the **Arrow Buttons** to skip to the next or previous video file.
  - Press and hold the **Arrow Buttons** to search through an individual video file.
- While playing a video file, press the Menu Button to access the video player settings.

- 4. Press the **Arrow Buttons** to highlight the *Photo* tab and press the **Play/Pause Button** to access the photo player.
- 5. Press the **Volume Buttons** to highlight the desired photo.
- 6. Press the **Play/Pause Button** to view the highlighted photo.
- 7. Press the **Volume Buttons** to skip to the next or previous photo file.
- 8. Press and hold the Menu Button to return main menu

- 1. Load the desired ebook files onto the unit.
  - File Compatibility: TXT
- 2. Disconnect the unit from the computer.
- 3. Press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- 4. Press the **Arrow Buttons** to highlight the *Ebook* tab and press the **Play/Pause Button** to access the ebook reader.
- 5. Press the **Volume Buttons** to highlight the desired ebook file.
- 6. Press the **Play/Pause Button** to view the highlighted ebook file.
- 7. Press the **Volume Buttons** to skip to the next or previous ebook page.
- 8. Press and hold the Menu Button to return main menu

## RECORDING

- 1. Press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- 2. Press and hold the **Menu Button** to access the unit's main menu.
- 3. Press the **Arrow Buttons** to highlight the *Voice* tab and press the **Play/Pause Button** to access the voice recorder/player.



Press the Volume Buttons to skip between photos in the photo player.
