




Front Panel Overview

Inserting Remote Control Batteries

Use to directly select chapters/tracks numbered 10 or higher; e.g., to select chapter 25, press 10+, 10+, 5.

Press to select among various preset EQ settings during audio playback.

A-B

Press to repeat an audio or video segment between two points (A and B) during disc playback.

Press to view the same scene from different angles during DVD playback (not available on all DVDs).

Press to navigate in the on-screen menus.

AUDIO

Press to select among all available audio tracks/formats during DVD playback.

Press to program a custom playback order.

REPEAT

Press to repeat a Title, Chapter, or Track.

RETURN

Press to return to the last menu viewed or to exit the menu system.

Press repeatedly to scan backward at 2x, 4x, 8x and 20x normal speed.

SEARCH

Press to jump to a specific title, chapter, track, or time during disc playback.

SETUP

Press to display the player's Setup menu.

SLOW

Press repeatedly for slow motion playback at 1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 1/5, 1/6, or 1/7 normal speed.

STEP

Press once to pause playback. Press repeatedly to step forward one frame at a time.

STOP ■

Press to stop and hold playback. Press twice to reset playback to the beginning of the disc.

SUBTITLE

Press to select among all available subtitle languages during DVD playback.

TITLE

Press to display the DVD title menu (if available).

VIDEO

Press to adjust the picture quality setting to Standard, Mild, Dynamic, or Memory. Note: Memory uses the settings from the player's Video Setup menu.

VOLUME +/-

Press to adjust the player's volume. Note: This will not change the settings on your TV or stereo.

ZOOM


Press to enlarge or reduce the size of the onscreen image.

2 - Connections

Basic TV Connections

You can connect the DVD player to a standard television using the player's Audio and Video iacks.

- 1 Connect the supplied audio cable (red and white) from the Audio jacks on the rear of the player to the Audio Inputs on your television.
- 2 Connect the supplied video cable (yellow) from the Video jack on the rear of the player to the Video Input on your television.
- **3** Set your TV to its appropriate Video input to view the player.




Enhanced Video Connections

For improved picture quality, you can connect the DVD player to a TV equipped with S-Video, Component Video, or Progressive Scan inputs. These connections require special S-Video or Component Video cables (not included). For audio, choose one of the Enhanced Audio Connections shown on page 10.

S-Video Connections

- 1 Connect an S-Video cable (not included) from the S-Video jack on the rear of the player to the S-Video input on your television.
- **2** Set the Video Output to S-Video in the player's System Setup menu.
- **3** Set your TV to its S-Video input to view the player.



Progressive Scan/Component Video Connections

- 1 Connect a Component Video cable (not included) from the Component jacks (Y, Pb, Pr) on the rear of the player to the Progressive Scan or Component Video inputs on your television.
- 2 Set the Video Output to Progressive Scan (P-SCAN) or Component Video (INTERLACE) in the player's System Setup menu.
 - Note: You can also press the PROG.SCAN button as a shortcut to switch between Progressive Scan, Interlace Scan and S-Video modes.
- 3 Set your TV to its Progressive Scan or Component Video input to view the player.



Enhanced Audio Connections

For enhanced audio quality, you can connect the DVD player to a stereo system or digital amplifier/receiver.


Stereo/Receiver Connections

- 1 Connect the supplied audio cable (red and white) from the Audio L/R jacks on the rear of the player to the left and right Audio Inputs on your stereo or 2-channel analog receiver.
- **2** Set your stereo/receiver to its appropriate input to hear the player.



Digital Receiver Connections

- 1 Connect a digital optical cable (not included) from the Optical jack on the rear of the player to the optical digital audio input on your digital receiver. OR
 - Connect a digital coaxial cable (not included) from the Coaxial jack on the rear of the player to the coaxial digital audio input on your digital receiver.
- 2 Set the Audio Out to SPDIF/RAW (Digital) or SPDIF/PCM (Stereo) in the player's Audio Setup menu, depending on the capabilities of your receiver.
- **3** Set your receiver to its appropriate input to hear the player.



3 - Operations

Basic Disc Playback


Before You Begin...

- Turn on your TV and select the appropriate video input.
- If you connected the player to your stereo or audio receiver, turn it on and select the appropriate audio input.

Playing a Disc

- 1 Press POWER on.
- **3** Hold the edge of the disc and place it in the tray with the label side up.
- - The player starts playback or opens the DVD disc menu automatically.
 - Proceed with steps 5 and 6 if a menu is available on the DVD.
- 5 Press ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ or use the number buttons to select the desired chapter/title.
- 6 Press PLAY ▶ or ENTER.
 - The player starts playback of the selected chapter.

Options During Playback



Mute

- Press MUTE during playback to mute the volume on the DVD player.
- To resume normal sound, press MUTE again or press the VOLUME +/- buttons.

Pause

- Press PAUSE II once to pause playback.
- Press PAUSE II or PLAY > to resume normal playback.

Stop

- Press STOP
 once to stop and hold playback at the current position.
- Press STOP

 twice to stop and reset the disc to the beginning.

Forward/Reverse Scan

- Press REWIND (4) or FF (5) during playback to scan backward and forward at variable speeds.
- Press PLAY ▶ to resume normal playback.

Skip Next/Previous

- Press PREVIM or NEXT >>> during playback to skip to the previous or next chapter.
- If you press the PREVI4 button midway through a chapter, the DVD player returns to the beginning of the chapter.

When not in use...


When the DVD player is not in use, remove the disc and press **POWER** to turn off the player.

 The disc continues to spin when the menu is displayed even after the player has stopped playing. When no further selections are to be played, be sure to press the STOP button to clear the menu screen.

For your reference:

 If "INVALID KEY" appears on-screen when a button is pressed, the corresponding function is not available. The function may not be available on the disc, or the player may need to be in Stop mode to access the function.

Special Playback Features



Display

- Press DISPLAY repeatedly during playback to display the title number, chapter/track number, and other disc information.
- Continue pressing DISPLAY to clear the on-screen information

Subtitles


- Press SUBTITLE repeatedly during playback to display any subtitle languages available on the disc.
- · Select "OFF" to clear the subtitles.

Angle

- Some DVDs contain scenes which were shot simultaneously from multiple angles. Use the ANGLE button to view these alternative scenes.
- Press ANGLE repeatedly during playback until the preferred viewing angle is selected.

Audio

 Press AUDIO repeatedly during playback to change the audio soundtrack to any language or audio format available on the disc.



L/R

 Press L/R to select the desired audio format (Stereo, Mono Left, or Mono Right) during audio playback.

NTSC/PAL

 Press to change the player's TV system for use in different countries. NTSC is used in the United States.


Video

 Press to select one of four preset picture settings (Standard, Mild, Dynamic, or Memory). Note: Memory uses the settings from the player's Video Setup menu; see page 21.

Progressive Scan

 Press to set the player's Video Output to Progressive Scan, Component Video, or S-Video (only applicable when using the Component Video or S-Video connections to your TV).


 Use the number keys to directly select chapter/track numbers; e.g., to select chapter 8, press 8.

10+

 Press 10+ to directly select chapters/tracks numbered 10 or higher; e.g., to select chapter 25, press 10+, 10+, 5.

Search

- Press SEARCH to jump to a specific title, chapter, track, or time during disc playback.
- Use the arrow keys to select the placeholders, then use the number keys to enter the desired Title/Chapter (DVD), Track (CD), or time counter position.



Step

 Press STEP once to pause playback. Press repeatedly to step forward one frame at a time.

Slow

 Press SLOW repeatedly for slow motion playback at 1/2, 1/3, 1/4, 1/5, 1/6, or 1/7 normal speed.

PBC

 Press PBC to toggle Playback Control on and off when playing a Video CD.

Program

- Press PROGRAM to create a custom playlist of up to 16 chapters/tracks.
- Use the arrow keys to highlight the placeholders, then use the number keys to enter the desired Title/Chapter (DVD) or Track (CD).
- Press PLAY > (or select PLAY and press ENTER) to start playback of your custom program.
- Select CLEAR and press ENTER to clear the program.




DVD Program Menu

Repeat

- Press REPEAT during playback to repeat the current Chapter, Track, Title, or Disc.
- Select REP: OFF to cancel Repeat mode.

A-B Repeat

- While playing a DVD or CD, press the A-B button at the start of the segment you want to repeat. "Repeat A-" will appear on screen.
- Press A-B again at the end of the segment.
 The marked segment will repeat in a continuous loop.
- Press A-B again to resume normal playback.

Volume

 Adjust the player's volume. Note: This will not change the settings on your TV or stereo.

Zoom

- Press to enlarge or reduce the size of the on-screen image.
- Use the ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons to move around the zoomed image.



Title

Some DVDs have title menus, which allow you to choose among multiple titles (usually separate movies).

- Press TITLE in stop mode. The title menu appears, if available.
- Press ◀ / ▶ / ▲ / ▼ to select the desired title, then press ENTER.

Disc Menu

Most DVDs have disc menus, which include special disc features, including audio languages, subtitle languages and more.

- Press DISC MENU. The disc menu appears, if available.
- Press ◀ / ▶ / ▲ / ▼ or use the number button(s) to select the desired chapter, then press ENTER.

Return

 Press RETURN to return to the last viewed menu or to exit the menu system.

3D Sound

 Press 3D SOUND to select among various preset and custom EQ settings; see page 15.

3D Sound Options

When playing an audio CD or MP3/WMA CD you can enhance the audio experience with a variety of virtual surround and EQ options. You can even change the key of the song if you want to sing along.

Graphic Equalizer

- 1 Press 3D SOUND during audio playback.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "BAND".
 - A graphic representation of the currently playing track is displayed.


Adjusting the Key

- Press 3D SOUND during audio playback.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "KEY".
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to adjust the key to the desired pitch.
- 4 Press ENTER.
- 5 Press 3D SOUND to exit.



MP3/WMA/JPEG Playback

Insert a CD-R or CD-RW disc with any combination of MP3, WMA, and JPEG files and the following interface appears:



- 1 File Name Displays current track/image name.
- 2 Directory Window -Displays all folders on disc.
- 3 File Window Displays all tracks/images in selected folder.
- 4 Music Button Highlight and press ENTER to view all MP3/WMA files.
- 5 Photo Button Highlight and press ENTER to view all JPEG files.
- Use the ◀ / ▶ keys to move between the Directory Window and the File Window.
- Use the ▲/▼ keys to browse folders and tracks within the Directory and File Windows.
- · Use the 0-9 and 10+ keys to directly select tracks/images.

Tips on JPEG Playback

- To view a single image, highlight it and press ENTER.
- To skip to the next image, press NEXT ▶
- To skip to the previous image, press PREV ₩.
- To view a slideshow of images, press PLAY • .
- To rotate the selected image, press ◀ and ▶.
- To flip the image vertically, press ▲.
- To flip the image horizontally, press ▼.

- To change the magnification of the image, press **ZOOM**.
- To enable transitions between images in the slideshow, press PROGRAM repeatedly. There are 17 transitions to choose from, including wipes, fades, shutters, etc.
- To view a helpful list of all JPEG options, press DISC MENU.
- To return to the main menu, press
 STOP ■.

4 - Settings

System Setup

TV System

When connecting the DVD player to a TV, you can specify the broadcast system of your television.

- 1 Press SETUP.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "SYSTEM SETUP".
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "TV SYSTEM", then press ▶.



- 4 Press ▲/▼ to select NTSC (the standard used in the United States) or AUTO (to have the player automatically adjust to match the capabilities of your TV).
- 5 Press ENTER.
- **6** Press **SETUP** or select "EXIT SETUP" to exit the menu system.

Screensaver

The player has a built-in screen saver to protect your TV screen if it is left idle for 60 seconds.

- 1 Press SETUP.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "SYSTEM SETUP".
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "SCREEN SAVER", then press ▶.



- 4 Press ▲/▼ to turn the screen saver on or off.
- 5 Press ENTER.
- **6** Press **SETUP** or select "EXIT SETUP" to exit the menu system.

Video Output

If you connected the DVD player to your TV using the S-Video or Component Video output, you must specify in the menu system which of these connection types you are using.

- Before you select "P-SCAN YPBPR", make sure your TV supports Progressive Scan and that the Y, Pb, and Pr cables are properly connected.
- 1 Press SETUP.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "SYSTEM SETUP".
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "VIDEO", then press ▶.

- If your screen turns black after adjusting this setting, press the PROG.SCAN button on the remote control to switch back to Interlace mode.
- **6** Press **SETUP** or select "EXIT SETUP" to exit the menu system.

The TV Type feature allows you to set your preferred aspect ratio for DVD movies.

To adjust the brightness of the picture during DVD playback:

Hue

To adjust the hue (color) of the picture during DVD playback:

- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "HUE", then press ▶.



- 4 Press ▲/▼ to select the desired Hue setting.
- 5 Press ENTER.
- **6** Press **SETUP** or select "EXIT SETUP" to exit the menu system.

Saturation

To adjust the color saturation of the picture during DVD playback:

- 1 Press SETUP.
- 2 Press ◀ / ▶ to select "VIDEO SETUP".
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select "SATURATION", then press ▶.



- 4 Press ▲/▼ to select the desired Saturation setting.
- 5 Press ENTER.

Troubleshooting

SYMPTOM	REMEDY
No power.	Insert plug securely into power outlet. Push the front panel POWER button off and back on. Check power at AC outlet by testing another appliance.
Player does not start playback when PLAY ▶ is pressed.	Condensation has formed. Wait ~1-2 hours to allow player to dry out. Player cannot play discs other than DVDs, Audio CDs, MP3 CDs, and Photo CDs. Try another disc to check if the unplayable disc is defective. Check region code.
Player starts playback but stops immediately.	Disc may be dirty and may require cleaning. Ensure that disc is installed with label side up.
No picture.	 Ensure that equipment is connected properly. Ensure that video input setting for TV is set correctly. Check if external equipment is on. Select same channel and source on TV as on player. Push the front panel POWER button off and back on.
No sound.	Ensure that equipment is connected properly. If using a HiFi amplifier, try another audio source. Check Volume adjustment on the player and the external equipment. Check the MUTE button on the player and the TV. No sound will be heard during pause, fast forward or reverse.
Distorted sound.	Ensure that the audio input settings for your TV and stereo system are correct.

Disc Handling & Maintenance

Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints.
- Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensil.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids, or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than one disc on the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly.
- Be sure to store the disc in its original case when not in use.



If the surface is soiled

- · Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth.
- When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge. (If you wipe the disc using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc

 Wipe moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

Disc which cannot be played with this player

- CD-ROM (Application Program)
- CVD
- DVD with a Region Code other than that shown on the DVD unit's Region Code Label on the rear panel

Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintenancing the unit.
- Wipe this unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, and then wipe again with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. And do not use compressed air to remove dust.

Power cord protection

To avoid any malfunctions of the unit, and to protect against electric shock, fire or personal injury, please observe the following:

- Hold the plug firmly when connecting or disconnecting the AC power cord.
- Keep the AC power cord away from heating appliances.
- Never put any heavy object on the AC power cord.
- Do not attempt to repair or reconstruct the AC power cord in any way.

Placement

Avoid placing the unit in areas of:

- direct sunlight or heating radiators, or closed automobiles
- high temperature (over 95°F) or high humidity (over 90%)
- significant dust as the internal parts may be seriously damaged.

Non-use periods

When the unit is not being used, turn it off. When left unused for a long period of time, the unit should be unplugged from the household AC outlet.

No fingers or other objects inside

- Touching internal parts of this unit is dangerous, and may cause serious damage to the unit. Do not attempt to disassemble the unit.
- Do not put any foreign object in the disc tray.

Keep away from water

 Keep the unit away from flower vases, tubs, sinks, etc. If liquids are spilled into the unit, serious damage could occur.

Keep away from magnets

Never bring a magnet or magnetized object near the unit.

Stacking

 Place the unit in a horizontal position, and do not place anything heavy on it.

Condensation

Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions:

- · immediately after a heater has been turned on
- · in a steamy or very humid room
- when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one

If moisture forms inside this unit, it may not operate properly. In this case, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

If there is noise interference on the TV while a broadcast is being received

Depending on the reception condition of the TV, interference may appear on the TV monitor while you watch a TV broadcast and the unit is left on. This is not a malfunction of the unit or the TV. To watch a TV broadcast, turn off the unit.
