Front Panel Overview

Turns the DVD Recorder+VCR on and off. Press and hold for five seconds to lock/unlock front panel keys.

Insert your videotape here.







Stops and holds playback or recording. Press again to reset playback to the beginning of the disc.

SUBTITLE

Selects among all available subtitle languages during DVD playback.

TIMER

Displays the Timer Recording menu.

TITLE

Displays a disc's Title Menu (if available).

TRACKING +/-

Manually adjusts tracking during VCR playback.

TV VIEW

Switches the view on your TV to the DVD Recorder+VCR.

TV/VCR

Switches between the DVD Recorder+VCR's tuner and your TV's tuner.


VCR

Selects VCR mode.

ZOOM

Magnifies the size of the on-screen image. Use the arrow keys to move around the magnified image.



Connecting an Antenna/Basic Cable


Connect the RF coaxial cable from your antenna or cable wall outlet to the ANT. IN jack as shown.



DVD Recorder+VCR

Connecting a Cable Box/Satellite Receiver

Connect the RF coaxial cable from your cable box/satellite receiver to the ANT. IN jack as shown.

To view or record from the cable box/satellite receiver:


- Set your TV to the correct video input (channel 3 or 4 if using the RF connection).
- Set the DVD Recorder+VCR to the output channel of your cable box/satellite receiver using the CH ▲ / ▼ or 0-9 keys (e.g., channel 3).
- Select the desired channel on the cable box.

Basic TV Connections

You can choose one of four ways to connect the DVD Recorder+VCR to your TV (in order of increasing picture quality): 1) RF, 2) Audio/Video, 3) S-Video, 4) Component Video/Progressive Scan. Choose only one of these connection methods.


RF Coaxial Connections

- 1 Connect the supplied RF coaxial cable from the RF OUT jack to the ANT. IN jack on your TV as shown.
- 2 Tune your TV to channel 3 or 4.
 - To change the RF out channel to 3 or 4, see Modulator Out on page 31.
- 3 Continue with Initial Setup on page 17.



Standard Audio/Video Connections

- 1 Connect the supplied audio (red/white) and video (yellow) cable from the Audio/Video Out jacks to the Audio/Video Inputs on your TV as shown.
- 2 Tune your TV to its video input.
- 3 Continue with Intial Setup on page 17.




Enhanced Video Connections

S-Video Connections

- 1 Connect an S-Video cable (not included) from the S-Video Out jack to the S-Video input on your TV as shown.
- 2 Set your TV to its S-Video input.
- 3 Choose one of the enhanced audio connections on page 15.

Component Video/Progressive Scan Connections

- 1 Connect a Component Video cable (not included) from the Component Out jacks (Y, Pb, Pr) to the Progressive Scan or Component Video inputs on your TV as shown.
- 2 Set Scan Mode to Interlace (for Component) or Progressive (for Progressive Scan) in the Setup menu.
 - You can also press and hold P.SCAN for 3 seconds as a shortcut to switch between Progressive and Interlace Scan.
- 3 Set your TV to its Progressive Scan or Component Video input.
- 4 Choose one of the enhanced audio connections on page 15.



Enhanced Audio Connections


For enhanced audio quality, you can connect the DVD Recorder+VCR to a stereo system or digital amplifier/receiver.

Stereo/Receiver Connections

- 1 Connect the supplied audio cable (red and white) from the Audio Out jacks to the Audio inputs on your stereo or 2-channel analog receiver as shown.
- 2 Set your stereo/receiver to its appropriate input to hear the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- 3 Continue with Intial Setup on page 17.

Digital Receiver Connections

- 1 Connect a digital coaxial cable (not included) from the Coaxial jack to the coaxial digital audio input on your digital receiver.
- 2 Set the Digital Output to Bitstream (Digital) or LPCM (Stereo) in the Setup menu, depending on the capabilities of your receiver.
- 3 Set your receiver to its appropriate input to hear the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- 4 Continue with Intial Setup on page 17.



Optional Equipment Connections


You can connect optional devices, such as a VCR, camcorder, or video game, to the Line 1 (front panel) or Line 2 (rear panel) audio/video jacks. You can also connect a MiniDV camcorder to the front DV IN jack.

External Device Connections

- 1 Connect an audio (red/white) and video (yellow) cable from the Audio/Video outputs on your device to the Audio/Video inputs on the DVD Recorder+VCR as shown.
- 2 Press INPUT repeatedly to view the Line 1 (front panel) or Line 2 (rear panel) input.

Digital Camcorder Connections

- 1 Connect a DV cable (not included) from the DV output on your device to the DV input on the front panel of the DVD Recorder+VCR as shown.
- 2 Press INPUT repeatedly to view the DV input.



Initial Setup

After successfully connecting your DVD Recorder+VCR to your TV and other devices, you are ready to complete the Initial Setup.

- 1 The Welcome screen is displayed. Press ENTER to continue.
- 2 Use ▲/▼ to select the desired language for the Initial Setup, then press ENTER.
- 3 Use ▲/▼ to select your preferred language for DVD Disc Menus, then press ENTER.
- 4 Use ▲/▼ to select your preferred language for DVD audio soundtracks, then press ENTER.
 - Choose "Default" to always select the disc's default audio language.
- 5 Use ▲/▼ to select your preferred language for DVD subtitles, then press **ENTER**.
 - Choose "Default" to always select the disc's default subtitle language.
 - Choose "Off" to always turn off subtitles.
- 6 Use ▲/▼ to select the type of signal you are using to watch TV, then press ENTER.
 - · CATV if using a Cable TV hookup
 - Antenna if using an Antenna
 - Detect Automatically if you are not sure
- 7 Wait for the DVD Recorder+VCR to search for available TV stations.
 - This may take a few minutes to complete.
- 8 Set the clock.
 - Use ◀ / ▶ to highlight each setting (hour, minute, etc.).
 - Use ▲/▼ to adjust each setting.
 - · When finished, press ENTER.
- 9 An information screen appears introducing the YesDVD feature. Press ENTER to continue.
- 10 Initial Setup is complete!
 - The DVD Recorder+VCR tunes to the lowest channel found.





3 - Playback

Playing DVDs

Before you begin:

- Press the **DVD** button to set the remote control to operate the DVD deck.
- Turn the TV on and select the video input source connected to the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- Turn your audio system on and select the input source connected to the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- 1 Press DVD EJECT to open the disc tray.
- 2 Load your disc in the tray with the playback side down (label side up).



- 3 Press DVD EJECT to close the tray.
- 4 Playback starts automatically. If playback does not start, press PLAY/PAUSE ►II.
- 5 In some cases, the Disc Menu might appear. Use the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons to select the title/chapter you want to view, then press ENTER to start playback.



NOTE: When you insert a
DVD+RW or unfinalized DVD+R,
the current TV channel displays on
the screen. Press MENU to display
the Disc Menu. Use the

buttons to select the title you want to view, then press **ENTER**.

Special DVD Playback Features

Still Picture and Frame-by-Frame Playback

- Press PLAY/PAUSE ►II during playback.
 The DVD Recorder+VCR will go into Pause mode
- While in Pause mode, press FF >> repeatedly to advance the picture frame-byframe.

Fast Forward/Backward

Skip Previous/Next

 Press PREVIM or NEXTIM during playback to select the next or previous chapter.

Slow Motion

- Press SLOW+ during playback to play in slow motion at variable speeds (1/2, 1/4, 1/8)
- Pressing SLOW- changes the forward slow motion speed. There is no reverse slow motion

Audio

 Press AUDIO repeatedly during playback to select among all available audio languages or audio tracks.

Subtitle

 Press SUBTITLE repeatedly during playback to select among all available subtitle languages.

Angle

- If a DVD contains scenes recorded at different angles, the angle icon displays onscreen
- Press ANGLE repeatedly during playback to select the desired angle.

Zoom

- Press ZOOM repeatedly during playback to magnify the video image at variable sizes (x1, x2, x4).
- Use the arrow keys to scroll around the enlarged image.
- Zoom does not work in Pause mode.

3 - Playback (cont.)

Disc Menus

Many DVDs have Disc Menus that allow you to access chapters and/or special features.

- Press MENU to open a Disc Menu.
- Use the 0-9 buttons to directly select the desired options, or use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ to highlight your desired selection and press ENTER.
- To exit the Disc Menu, press STOP or TV VIEW.

Title Menus

Some DVDs have Title Menus that allow you to access titles and/or special features.

 Press TITLE to display the disc's Title Menu (if available). If there is no Title Menu, the Disc Menu may appear.

Display

The On-Screen Display provides feedback on the status of the DVD Recorder+VCR and/or the currently loaded disc or tape.

- Press DISPLAY once to display information about the current disc.
- Use the ▲ ▼ keys to select Title, Chapter, Angle, Audio, Subtitle, or Elapsed, then press ENTER.
- Use the ▲ ▼ keys to select the desired option, then press ENTER.
- Press DISPLAY again to show the disc remaining time.
- Press DISPLAY again to remove the On-Screen Display.

Repeat

- Press REPEAT to repeat the current chapter, title, disc.
- Continue pressing REPEAT to enter Shuffle mode (random playback of chapters/tracks) or Scan (plays the first few seconds of every chapter/track).

A-B

You can repeat a scene between two points (A and B):

- 1 Press A-B to mark the start point.
- 2 Press A-B to mark the end point.
- 3 The marked scene is repeated continuously.
- 4 Press A-B again to cancel.

Search

- 1 Press **SEARCH** to display the Search menu.
- 2 Use ◀ ▶ to move to T (Title) or C (Chapter).
- 3 Use ▲ ▼ to select the desired title or chapter number.




3 - Playback (cont.)

Playing VHS Tapes

Before you begin:

- Press the VCR button to set the remote control to operate the VCR deck.
- Turn the TV on and select the video input source connected to the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- Turn your audio system on and select the input source connected to the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- 1 Insert a videotape in the VCR deck.
 - The DVD Recorder+VCR will power on automatically.
 - If a tape without a record safety tab is inserted, the DVD Recorder+VCR will start playback automatically.



- 2 Press PLAY/PAUSE ►II.
- 3 Press STOP to stop playback.
 - If the tape reaches the end before STOP ■ is pressed, the DVD Recorder+VCR will automatically stop, rewind, and eject the tape.

Special VCR Playback Features

Auto Tracking

The automatic tracking function adjusts the picture to remove snow or streaks. It works in the following cases:

- When a tape is played for the first time.
- When the tape speed (SP, SLP) changes.
- When streaks or snow appear because of scratches on the tape.

Manual Tracking

If noise appears on the screen during playback, press the **TRACKING** +/- buttons on the remote control until the noise on the screen is reduced.

Visual Search Forward/Backward

 Press REW (or FF >> during playback. to scan forward and backward at variable speeds.

Still Picture

- Press PLAY/PAUSE ►II during playback to pause the on-screen image.
- If the picture vibrates, stabilize it by using the TRACKING +/- buttons.

Slow Motion

- · Press SLOW+ for slow motion playback.
- Press SLOW+ and SLOW- repeatedly to adjust the slow motion playback speed.

Counter Memory Function

- Press CLEAR to reset the real-time counter to 0:00:00.
- To automatically search for a specific tape counter position, use the Go-To Search function; see page 36.

3 - Playback (cont.)

Playing Audio/MP3 CDs

You can play audio CDs and MP3 files on CD-R/RW.

- 1 Insert your CD and close the disc tray.
- 2 The disc loads and the Audio CD or MP3 CD menu appears.



3 Use ▲ ▼ to select a track or a file, then press PLAY/PAUSE ►II or ENTER to start playback.

Options During Audio Playback

- Press FF or REW for double-speed playback.
- Press PLAY/PAUSE ►II to pause playback.
- Press STOP to stop playback.
- Press REPEAT to repeat a track or a file.
 Press REPEAT again to repeat the entire disc.
- If the disc contains JPEG files as well as MP3 files, press TITLE to change the Play mode to display JPEG image files.

Playing Picture CDs

You can display Kodak Picture CDs and JPEG files on CD-R/RW.

- 1 Insert your CD and close the disc tray.
- 2 The disc loads and the Kodak Picture CD or JPEG CD menu appears.



- 3 Use ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ to select the desired folder or image thumbnail, then press ENTER.
- 4 The full size image is displayed and a slide show starts automatically with an interval of 10 seconds between pictures.

Options During a Slideshow

- Press NEXT >> or PREV >
 to manually skip to the next or previous image.
- Press ◆ ▶ to rotate the image in 90 degrees increments.
- Press STOP to exit the slideshow.
- If the disc contains MP3 files as well as MP3 files, press TITLE to change the Play mode to play MP3 files.

Playing MP3 Files During a Slide Show

You can enjoy a slide show while listening to MP3 music files.

- Prepare a CD which includes both MP3 and JPEG files.
- 2 Insert the CD and play an MP3 file.
- 3 Press TITLE while playing the MP3 file to change the Play mode. The music playback will not stop.
- 4 Select an image file and press ENTER to start the slide show.
- 5 The MP3 file you selected continues to play during the JPEG slide show.

4 - Recording

About YesDVD™

YesDVD allows you to transfer your videotapes or other video content to a DVD+R/RW with the professional quality features found in Hollywood movies.

Whenever you record or copy to DVD, you can enable YesDVD to automatically:



- Analyze your video, creating chapters at natural scene breaks
- Generate an interactive Disc Menu with thumbnails of each chapter for easy scene selection
- Produce three Music Videos using the best footage from your video, timed to the tempo of the music
- Allow you to print a full-color DVD case coversheet using images from your video.

YesDVD Requirements

- Creation of a YesDVD is only possible on the first recording from a blank DVD+R/RW disc.
- The recording can be made from the VCR deck or one of the external input sources (Line1, Line2, or DV).
- No further footage can be added to a YesDVD once recording is stopped (by selecting STOP ■).
- In order to print DVD case coversheets, you must have a Microsoft™ Windows™-based PC with a DVD-ROM drive and a printer.
- There is no limit to the number of YesDVD discs you can create with this DVD Recorder+VCR.
- To erase a finalized YesDVD on a DVD+RW disc, start a new recording and select "Yes" when prompted to erase the disc.
- The recommended minimum length of a YesDVD recording is 5 minutes. If the total recording time is less than 5 minutes, the three Music Videos will not be created.

Creating a YesDVD

- 1 Enable YesDVD in the Setup menu; see page 32.
- 2 Set up any kind of recording (Basic, One Touch Recording, One Touch Copy, etc.).
 - For best results, make sure you set the Record Mode as closely as possible to the actual length of your recording; e.g, if you plan to record for 1 hour, use HQ mode. If you plan to record for 2 hours, use SP mode, etc.
- 3 Record your DVD+R/RW.
- 4 Stop recording.
 - Remember, once recording is stopped, no further content can be added to the YesDVD (even if you are using a DVD+RW disc).
 - At the end of your recording, a dialog box will appear asking if you want to create a YesDVD.
 - Press ▲ ▼ to select "Yes" in the menu and press ENTER to confirm.
- 5 The YesDVD is created.
 - This may take several minutes to complete; e.g., for a 2 hour recording, allow approximately 15 minutes to create your YesDVD.
 - A graphical display shows the progress of your YesDVD.
- 6 When finished, you will be prompted to eject the disc to print a DVD case coversheet. Press ENTER to continue.
 - The YesDVD disc menu appears.
 - Use the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ buttons and press ENTER to view the desired Chapter or Music Video.
- 7 Print a YesDVD case coversheet (optional).
 - Insert your finished YesDVD in a Windows-based PC with a DVD-ROM drive.
 - Follow the on-screen instructions to print the DVD case coversheet.
 - The 7" x 5" coversheet can be printed in color or black and white and includes thumbnail images from your video.
 - Cut out your case cover and insert it in a standard DVD case.

Basic Recording

Recording from TV

Follow the instructions below to record a TV program.

- 1 Turn on the DVD Recorder+VCR and load a recordable disc or tape.
 - Make sure your TV input is set to view the DVD Recorder+VCR.
- 2 Set the desired Recording mode by pressing REC SPEED repeatedly.

DVD Record Speeds:

- HQ Best quality (1 hour/disc).
- SP Good quality (2 hours/disc).
- EP Average quality (4 hours/disc).
- SLP Low quality (6 hours/disc).

VCR Record Speeds:

- SP Good qualitySLP Low quality (3 times the recording length of SP mode).
- 3 Use CH ▲ ▼ to select the TV channel you wish to record.
 - If your DVD Recorder+VCR does not show a TV program, press TV VIEW on the remote control.
- 4 Press AUDIO to select the audio channel to record (Stereo, SAP, or Mono).
- 5 Press REC once to start recording.
 - If you are recording on a DVD+R or DVD+RW disc for the first time, it will be initialized to prepare for recording. This may take a few minutes to complete.
 - To record for a fixed length of time, see One Touch Recording at right.
- 6 Press STOP to stop recording.
 - The disc is updated with the new recording. This may take several minutes to complete.
- 7 (Optional) If YesDVD is enabled and this is your first recording on the disc, press to select:
 - · Yes Create a YesDVD from your recording. The unit will make a YesDVD with a Disc Menu and three one-minute videos. You will not be able to add any more recordings to the disc. See page 22 for more details.

No - Do not create a YesDVD. You can continue to make recordings on the disc, but you will no longer have the option of creating a YesDVD on this disc (unless the disc is a DVD+RW and you completely erase it; see page 27).

Options During Recording

- To pause the disc or tape during recording, press PLAY/PAUSE ►II.
- To resume recording, press PLAY/PAUSE ►II or REC • .
- To check the recording time (total and elapsed), press DISPLAY twice. The recorded time is also shown on the front panel display.

Recording Tips

- Always use PLAY/PAUSE ►II for best results when making changes during recording. For example, to change channels during recording, first press PLAY/PAUSE ►II to put the unit in Pause mode. Then select the desired channel on the DVD Recorder+VCR, and press PLAY/PAUSE ►II again to resume recording.
- You cannot record on the VCR deck and DVD deck at the same time.
- While the VCR is recording, DVD playback is possible. However, while the DVD is recording, all VCR functions are disabled.

One Touch Recording (OTR)

One Touch Recording allows you add recording time in fixed increments at the touch of a button

- 1 Follow steps 1-4 under "Recording from TV."
- 2 Press REC repeatedly to add recording time in 15 minute increments (DVD, to a maximum of 360 minutes) or 30 minutes (VCR, to a maximum of 240 minutes) within the available space. The recording time is displayed on screen and on the front panel display.
- 3 To quit One Touch Recording, press and hold STOP ■ for 3 seconds.
- 4 If YesDVD is enabled and this is your first recording on the disc, you will have the option of creating a YesDVD (see page 22 for more details).

One Touch Copy

Copying from DVD to VHS

You can copy the contents of a DVD to a VHS tape using the front panel **DVD** ▶ **VCR** button.

- Insert the disc you wish to copy in the DVD deck and close the disc tray.
- 2 Insert a blank VHS videotape into the VCR deck.
- 3 Select DVD mode by pressing DVD on the remote control or DVD•VCR on the front panel.
- 4 Find the place on the DVD from which you want to start recording using the PLAY/PAUSE ►II, REW ← and FF ➤ functions.
 - For best results, pause playback at the point from which you want to record.
- 5 Press **DVD** ▶ **VCR** on the front panel.
 - The Copy to VCR menu appears.
- 6 Press REC SPEED to select the desired Record Mode:
 - SP Good quality
 - SLP Low quality (3 times the recording length of SP mode).
- 7 Press **DVD** ▶ **VCR** again to start copying.
- 8 To stop copying at any time, press STOP ■.
 - You must stop the copy process manually when the DVD ends, or the unit may replay and record over and over again.



NOTE: if the DVD you are attempting to copy is copy-protected, you will not be able to copy the disc. It is not permitted to copy Macrovision encoded DVDs.

Copy to VCR does not work in Progressive Scan Mode

During one touch copy you can reposition the DVD and/or change the Record Speed by pressing PLAY/PAUSE ►II. When finished, press DVD ➤ VCR again to resume copying.

Copying from VHS to DVD

You can copy the contents of a VHS tape to a DVD+R/RW using the front panel VCR ▶ DVD button. This allows you to archive your old VHS tapes to DVD.

- Insert the VHS videotape you wish to copy into the VCR deck.
- 2 Insert a blank DVD+R or DVD+RW disc in the DVD deck and close the disc tray.
- 3 Select VCR mode by pressing VCR on the remote control or DVD-VCR on the front panel.
- 4 Find the place on the VHS tape from which you want to start recording using the PLAY/PAUSE ►II, REW ← and FF → functions.
 - For best results, pause playback at the point from which you want to record.
- 5 Press VCR ▶ DVD on the front panel.
 - The Copy to DVD menu appears.
 - If the YesDVD logo appears on this menu, a YesDVD will automatically be created when recording is complete. To enable/disable the YesDVD feature, see page 32.
- **6** Press **REC SPEED** to select the desired Record Mode:
 - HQ Best quality (1 hour/disc).
 - SP Good quality (2 hours/disc).
 - EP Average quality (4 hours/disc).
 - SLP Low quality (6 hours/disc).
- 7 Press VCR ▶ DVD again to start copying.
- 8 To stop copying at any time, press STOP .
 Copying will stop automatically when the VHS tape ends.



NOTE: If the VHS videotape you are attempting to copy is copy-protected, you will not be able to copy the tape. It is not permitted to copy Macrovision encoded tapes.

During one touch copy you can reposition the tape by pressing PLAY/PAUSE ▶II. When finished, press VCR ▶ DVD again to resume copying.

Timer Recording

Setting a Timer Recording

You can set up to 8 programs to record within any one-month period.

- 1 Insert recordable media such as a DVD+R/ RW disc or a blank VHS tape.
- 2 Press TIMER.
 - The Timer Recording menu appears.



- 3 Use ▲ ▼ to move to a timer recording slot, and press ENTER to modify it.
 - If you did not set the clock on the DVD Recorder+VCR, you must do so before programming a timer recording.
- 4 Use the ◀ ▶ ▲ ▼ keys to set the following:
 - · Media Choose DVD or VHS.
 - Ch. Choose the desired channel, or one of the external inputs from which to record
 - Date Choose a date up to one month in advance, or select a daily or weekly program.
 - Start Time Set the recording start time.
 - End Time Set the recording end time.
 - Mode Choose a Record mode. DVD: HQ, SP, SLP or EP VCR: SP, SLP
- 5 When finished, press ENTER to save your settings.
 - · The Timer Record List will appear.
- 6 Press **SETUP** to exit the Timer Record List.
- 7 The Timer indicator on the front panel display will light or blink.
- 8 Power Off the DVD Recorder+VCR to start the Timer Recording.

Timer Recording Notes

- The Timer indicator lights on the front panel display when the DVD Recorder+VCR is ready for the Timer Recording and powered off.
- The disc and tape indicator blink under the following conditions:
 - The DVD Recorder+VCR is not powered off.
 - No recordable tape is inserted.
 - Tape and disc timer recordings are overlapped.
- The DVD Recorder+VCR will record the audio according to the current TV tuner setting (Stereo, Mono or SAP). Use the AUDIO button to set the audio before switching the DVD Recorder+VCR to Standby mode.
- The DVD Recorder+VCR will automatically power off when the Timer Recording ends.
- There is a short delay when a timer recording finishes to confirm the recorded program. If two timer recordings are set to record sequentially (one right after the other), the very beginning of the later program may not be recorded.

Canceling a Timer Recording

You can clear a Timer Recording any time before the recording actually starts.

- Use ▲ ▼ to select the program you want to erase on the Timer Recorder List, then press ENTER to modify it.
- Use ▲ ▼ to select Delete then press ENTER.

Stopping a Timer Recording in Progress

After a Timer Recording has started, you can still cancel the program by pressing and holding **STOP** ■ for 3 seconds.

Timer Recording Troubleshooting

Even if a Timer Recording is set, the DVD Recorder+VCR will not record if:

- No disc is loaded.
- · A non-recordable disc is loaded.
- The disc is locked; see page 27.
- There are already 49 titles recorded on the disc.

You cannot enter a Timer Recording if:

- A recording is already in progress.
- The start time has already passed.
- Eight Timer Recordings have already been set.

If two or more Timer Recordings overlap:

- · The earlier program takes priority.
- When the earlier program finishes, the later program starts.
- If two programs are set to start at exactly the same time, the program entered first takes priority.

Confirmation is not possible when:

- The disc is locked; see page 27.
- There are already 49 titles recorded on the disc.



NOTE: If the disc is damaged, the recording may not complete successfully, even if the Check field shows "Rec. OK."

Recording Priority

 Timer Recordings and One Touch Recordings have the same priority but they have lower priority than manual recording. During manual recording, Timer Recordings and One Touch Recordings will be ignored.

Recording from an External Input

You can record from an external component, such as an analog or digital camcorder or VCR, connected to any of the DVD Recorder+VCR's external inputs.

- Make sure the component you want to record from is connected properly to the DVD Recorder+VCR; see page 16.
- 2 Press INPUT or CH ➤ ▼ to select the external input to record from.
 - Tuner Built-in tuner
 - LINE1 Audio/Video Input on front panel
 - LINE2 Audio/Video Input on back panel
 - DV DV input on front panel.
- 3 Load a recordable disc or tape.
- 4 Set the desired Recording mode by pressing [REC SPEED] repeatedly.

DVD Record Speeds:

- HQ Best quality (1 hour/disc).
- SP Good quality (2 hours/disc).
- EP Average quality (4 hours/disc).
- SLP Low quality (6 hours/disc).

VCR Record Speeds:

- · SP Good quality
- SLP Low quality (3 times the recording length of SP mode).
- 5 Press REC once to start recording.
 - Recording continues until you press STOP ■ or the disc is full.
 - To record for a fixed length of time, see One Touch Record on page 23.
- 6 Press STOP to stop recording.
- 7 (Optional) If YesDVD is enabled and this is your first recording on the disc, press ▲ ▼ to select:
 - Yes Create a YesDVD from your recording. The unit will make a YesDVD with a Disc Menu and three one-minute videos. You will not be able to add any more recordings to the disc. See page 22 for more details.



NOTE: If your source is copyprotected, you will not be able to record it using the DVD Recorder+VCR.

5 - Editing

Disc Menu Options

Once you've made some recordings, you can use the Disc Menu to make your DVD+R or DVD+RW disc compatible with other players. You can also access these special disc level features:

- DVD+R Allows you to rename your disc or finalize it so it will be compatible with most other DVD players.
- DVD+RW Allows you to rename, erase, lock, or unlock your disc. You can also make it compatible with most other DVD players.

Viewing Disc Information (DVD+RW)

To view information about the status of your DVD+RW disc, including disc type, number of recordings, total titles, free space, etc.:

- 1 Press MENU to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Press to move to the top menu.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Disc Menu.
- 4 View your disc information.
- 5 Press SETUP to return to the top menu, or press TV VIEW to exit and return to TV.

Erasing a Disc (DVD+RW)

To erase a DVD+RW disc (DVD+R discs cannot be erased):

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Press to move to the top menu.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Disc Menu.
- 4 Use ◀ ▶ to select "Erase the disc," then press ENTER.
- 5 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Yes" or "No" and press ENTER. If you select "Yes", all contents on the disc will be erased.

Locking/Unlocking a Disc (DVD+RW)

To protect a DVD+RW from accidental recording, editing, or erasing, you can lock the disc. If you change your mind, you can unlock the disc (DVD+R discs cannot be locked or unlocked).

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Press to move to the top menu.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Disc Menu.
- 4 Use ◀ ▶ to select "Lock/Unlock Disc," then press ENTER.
- 5 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Yes" or "No" and press ENTER to confirm.
- 6 The status of the disc will be changed to locked or unlocked. This may take a few moments to complete.

Finalizing/Making a Disc Compatible

In order to play your recorded discs on other DVD players, they must be "Finalized" (DVD+R) or "Made Compatible" (DVD+RW).

- Finalizing a DVD+R locks its recordings in place so the disc can be played on most standard DVD players or computers equipped with DVD-ROM drives.
- Making a DVD+RW compatible automatically creates a menu screen for navigating the disc. This menu screen is accessible by pressing MENU or TITLE.
- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Press ▲ to move to the top menu.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Disc Menu.
- 4 Use ◆ ▶ to select the "Finalize" (DVD+R) or "Make Compatible" (DVD+RW), then press ENTER.
- 5 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Yes" or "No" and press ENTER. If you select "Yes", the disc will be finalized/made compatible.
- 6 Press SETUP to return to the top menu, or press TV VIEW to exit and return to TV.



NOTE: Once you have finalized a DVD+R disc, you cannot edit or record anything else on that disc.

The finalization process can take up to 3-4 minutes depending on

the type of disc, how much is recorded on the disc, and the number of titles on the disc.

If you do not make your DVD+RW disc compatible, your edits will not be recognized by other DVD players.

Changing the Disc Name

To rename your disc to any name you choose:

- 1 Press MENU to display the Disc Menu.
- **2** Press ▲ to move to the top menu.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Disc Menu.
- 4 Use ◀ ▶ to select "Change Disc Name," then press ENTER. The Keyboard Menu appears.
- 5 Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ and press ENTER to select each character, or choose from these special functions:
 - **CLR** Clears the entire disc name.
 - SP Inserts a space.
 - **DEL** Deletes the last character.
- **6** Select "SAVE" and press **ENTER** to save your new disc name.

5 - Editing (cont.)

Title Menu Options

The Title Menu provides options to play, erase, name, and overwrite your recorded titles (erase and overwrite features are for DVD+RW discs only).

Playing a Title

To play a title:

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use ▲ ▼ to select the desired title.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Title Menu.
- 4 Use ◆ ▶ to select "Play Title," then press ENTER.
- The DVD

 Recorder+VCR plays
 the selected title.



Erasing a Title (DVD+RW)

To erase a title on a DVD+RW disc (DVD+R titles cannot be erased):

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use ▲ ▼ to select the desired title.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Title Menu.
- 4 Use ◀ ▶ to select "Erase Title," then press ENTER.
- 5 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Yes" or "No" and press ENTER. If you select "Yes", the title will be erased. This may take a few moments to complete.

Changing a Title Name

To rename a title:

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use ▲ ▼ to select the desired title.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Title Menu.
- 4 Use ◆ ▶ to select "Change Name," then press ENTER. The Keyboard Menu appears.
- 5 Use ◆ ▶ ▲ ▼ and press ENTER to select each character, or choose from these special functions:
 - **CLR** Clears the entire disc name.
 - SP Inserts a space.
 - **DEL** Deletes the last character.
- 6 Select "SAVE" and press ENTER to save your new title name.

Setting Title Record Options

To set DVD+R and DVD+RW record options, including overwriting of existing titles:

- 1 Press MENU to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use ▲ ▼ to select the desired title.
- 3 Press ▶ to display the Title Menu.
- 4 Use ◆ to select "Record Options," then press ENTER.
- 5 Select your preferred record options for each disc type (DVD+R and DVD+RW):

DVD+R

- Make new recording appended to last - Immediately begins recording by adding to the end of the currently selected title and continues recording until the end of the disc is reached (or until you press STOP .
- Make new recording as new title

 Immediately starts recording a new title, and continues recording until the end of the disc is reached (or until you press

 STOP).

DVD+RW

- Overwrite then stop Immediately begins recording over the currently selected title and stops when the end of the title is reached.
- Overwrite and continue Immediately begins recording over the currently selected title and continues recording until the end of the disc is reached (or until you press STOP ■).
- Append to existing Immediately begins recording by adding to the end of the currently selected title and continues recording until the end of the disc is reached (or until you press STOP ■).
- Record new title to the end of the disc

 Immediately starts recording a new title, and continues recording until the end of the disc is reached (or until you press
 STOP ■).

5 - Editing (cont.)

DVD Edit Menu Options

The DVD Edit Menu provides options to add, delete, hide and unhide chapters on your recorded discs. You can also change the thumbnail image that represents the title in the Disc Menu. You can even split a title on a DVD-RW disc.

Selecting a Title/Chapter to Edit

To select the title/chapter you wish to edit:

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use A v to select the desired title and press EDIT (not ENTER). The DVD Edit Menu is displayed and the selected title begins playing automatically.
- 3 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Title" or "Chapter," then press ENTER.
- 4 Use ▲ ▼ to select the title or chapter number you wish to edit, then press ENTER.
 - If the selected title has multiple chapters, you can also skip to the next or previous chapter.
 - or previous chapter by pressing **NEXT→**I or **PREV**I◀.

 If the DVD Edit Menu times out, you can press **DISPLAY** to bring it up again.

Adding/Deleting Chapters

You can manually add or delete chapter markers in your titles during playback. Once a chapter is marked, you can use the chapter search feature as described above. You can also hide or unhide chapters as described at right.

- 1 Press MENU to display the Disc Menu.
- 2 Use A v to select the desired title and press EDIT (not ENTER). The DVD Edit Menu is displayed.
- 3 Use ▲ ▼ to select "Edit Chapters" then press ENTER.
- 4 Use ▲ ▼ to select one of the following options then press ENTER.
 - Add Inserts a chapter marker at the current position.
 - Delete Deletes the currently selected chapter marker.
 - Delete All Deletes all chapter markers.

 After additing is complete, a DVD DW disc.
- 5 After editing is complete, a DVD+RW disc will not be compatible with other DVD players until you make the disc compatible; see page 27.

Hiding/Unhiding Chapters

You can hide or unhide chapters on your DVD recordings. After hiding a chapter, the chapter is not deleted but only hidden during playback. This is useful for hiding commercials during playback of your TV recordings.



Installation Settings

The Installation menu allows you to adjust all channel and clock settings.



TV/CATV

Specifies whether you are using an antenna or cable TV to receive channels.



If you receive channels from a cable box or satellite receiver connected to the Line Inputs, you do not need to adjust this setting.

- 1 Press SETUP.
- 2 Use 4 / ▶ to select "Installation "
- 3 Use ▲/▼ to select "TV/CATV," then press ENTER.
- 4 Use ▲/▼ to select the desired signal type, then press ENTER.
 - TV If you are using an Antenna.

Auto Channel Search

Searches for all available TV stations in the selected tuner band.

Add/Remove Channels







Disc Handling & Maintenance

Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints.
- Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensil.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids, or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not insert more than one disc in the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly.
- Be sure to store the disc in its original case when not in use.





If the surface is soiled

- Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth.
- When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge. (If you wipe the disc using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc

 Wipe moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- · Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- · Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintenancing the unit.
