Notes on clock setting

Be sure to set the date and time of the unit's clock before use. (See "ADJUSTING THE DATE AND TIME" on page 8.)



PRECAUTIONS

- Never remove the MultiMediaCard while operating the unit. This will damage the MultiMediaCard, recorded contents and the unit.
- If the line of rectangles in the battery indicator () disappear during recording, stop the recording immediately and replace the batteries.
- Do not disconnect the AC adaptor or remove the batteries while operating the unit.
- Before erasing, make sure that the battery indicator is full.
- The unit should not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not insert pins, etc., inside the unit.
- Do not drop the unit or subject it to strong shocks.
- Do not use where there are extreme temperatures (below 5°C (40°F) or exceeding 35°C (95°F)).

WHAT TO DO IF... If the operation of the unit or display is not normal, 1. Open the battery compartment lid. 2. Press the RESET switch using a small ball-point pen, etc. 3. Resume operation.






POWER SUPPLY

Battery

- 1. Open the battery compartment lid.
- Install two "AAA" batteries (not supplied). Observe proper polarity.



Battery indicator (IIII)

The line of rectangles is the battery gauge. Black rectangles show the battery condition while the unit is operating.

: Full, good condition

("LOW BATT" appears.): Weak or exhausted batteries, must be replaced.

CAUTION:

Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a month or longer.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

SPENT OR DISCHARGED BATTERIES MUST BE RECYCLED OR DIS-POSED OF PROPERLY IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAWS.

AC adaptor


Connect the AC adaptor (SANYO Model No. 3CV-120US, not supplied) to the EXT DC 3V jack. (The batteries are automatically disconnected and the battery indicator does not light.)

• The center pin of the EXT DC 3V jack is positive (+).

MultiMediaCard™

Inserting the MultiMediaCard

- 1. Open the MultiMediaCard compartment lid.
- 2. Check the edge of the card and insert the card as shown in the illustration.
- 3. Close the lid.



Removing the MultiMediaCard

- 1. Slide the POWER switch (back of the unit) to the OFF position.
- 2. Open the MultiMediaCard compartment lid.
- 3. Push the card slightly into the slot to release.
- 4. Pull it out.

Notes:

- Never remove the card while operating the unit.
- Do not place the card where it is exposed to static electricity or electric noise.
- Recorded data on the card may not work correctly with a different Digital Voice Recorder.
- If the card is not inserted, "NO CARD" appears when the power is turned on.
- When a MultiMediaCard is loaded, the unit automatically creates a VoiceRec folder, etc. Do not erase them.
- Do not use a SD Memory Card.
- Up to 128MB MultiMediaCard can be used.

WARNING!

Keep the MultiMediaCard out of reach of young children who might swallow it. If it is accidentally swallowed, call a doctor immediately.

BEFORE OPERATION

Turning the power on and off

Slide the POWER switch to the ON position to turn on the power. The unit is now in stand-by mode. Example: USER-01 — Author name

Folder name — BU_1/ 1 Current file number — NEW Total file number

To turn off the power, slide the POWER switch to the OFF position in the stop mode.

Auto power off function

The power turns off automatically when 5 minutes have elapsed after entering the stop mode.

Hold function

If the control switch or operating button is pressed while the POWER switch is set to the OFF position, "POWER OFF" appears briefly on the display. It prevents accidental playback or recording.

Earphone

Connect an earphone (8 ohms, cord length less than 2 meters (6 feet 6 inches), not supplied) to the EAR jack. (The speaker is automatically disconnected.)

Note:

Be sure to reduce the volume before connecting or disconnecting the earphone.

External microphone


Connect an external microphone (not supplied) to the MIC jack. (The builtin microphone is automatically disconnected.)

ADJUSTING THE DATE AND TIME

- 1. Press and hold the MENU/FOLDER button down at least **2 seconds** in the stop mode. "AUTHOR" appears.
- 2. Press the MENU/FOLDER button repeatedly until the date and time display appears.

- 3. Press the TIME/SET button. The year display blinks.
- 4. Press the + or VOLUME button repeatedly to select the year.
- 5. Press the TIME/SET button. The month display blinks.
- 6. Set the month, day, hour and minute by following steps $4 \sim 5$ above.
 - The time can be set accurately by pressing the TIME/SET button when a time signal is heard.

Example:

10:35 2002 JUL.08

Note: The example is 24-hour display.

7. Press the INDEX/CANCEL button to return to the original display.

Changing the clock to the 12-hour (or 24-hour) display

- 1. Press and hold the MENU/FOLDER button down at least **2 seconds** in the stop mode.
- 2. Press the MENU/FOLDER button repeatedly until "12/24" appears.
- 3. Press the TIME/SET button. "24 HOUR" (or "12 HOUR") blinks.
- 4. Press the + or VOLUME button once. "12 HOUR" (or "24 HOUR") blinks.
- 5. Press the TIME/SET button again.
- 6. Press the INDEX/CANCEL button to return to the original display.

SELECTING THE FOLDER AND MENU

Selecting the folder

Press the MENU/FOLDER button **briefly** in the stop mode. Each time the button is pressed, the display changes as follows:




Note:

After few seconds, it returns to the stand-by mode on the selected folder display. The abbreviation of the folder name appears (except "ALARM"). Example:



The abbreviation of the folder name



Selecting the menu

1. Press and hold the MENU/FOLDER button down at least **2 seconds** in the stop mode.


MENU/FOLDER

Example:

AUTHOR ID01 ——— ID number

USER-01 — Author name

2. Press the MENU/FOLDER button repeatedly to select the desired menu. Each time the button is pressed, the display changes as follows:



- 3. To change the setting of a submenu in the selected menu, press the TIME/SET button so that the display blinks.
- 4. Press the + or VOLUME button to select a new submenu. (See "Various menu modes" on page 11.)
- 5. Press the TIME/SET button to set it.
- 6. Repeat steps 2 ~ 5 to change other settings.
- 7. Press the INDEX/CANCEL button to return to the original display. Example:

USER-01 BU 1/1 NEW

Various menu modes

AUTHOR (Selecting ID number/Author name) ID01/USER-01 ~ ID99/USER-99

Note:

Author name is automatically created. You may change it by your PC. For more details, see the instruction manual in CD-ROM.

EDIT (Selecting edit mode)

OVER WRITE: Overwirte recording INSERT: Insertion recording ("INSERT" appears on the display.)

Date and time (See "ADJUSTING THE DATE AND TIME" on page 8.)

ALARM (Selecting alarm mode)

OFF: No alarm sound ON: Alarm sound (" **(*)**" appears on the display.) (After setting "ON", the year display blinks. Use the TIME/SET, + and -VOLUME buttons to set the alarm ON time. Refer to "ADJUSTING THE DATE AND TIME" on page 8.)

VAS (Selecting Voice Activated System mode)

- OFF: To start and stop recording manually
- ON: Recording begins when the microphone picks up sound, and stops automatically after the sound stops. "VAS" appears. Press the + or – VOLUME button to set the microphone's sensitivity when recording begins. The VAS sensing level appears on the display ("VAS 0" ~ "VAS 10").

REC TIME (Selecting recording time mode)

SP: For standard recording

LP: For long time recording

HQ: For high-quality recording

Note:

Setting or changing recording time can be used for a new file recording. When overwrite or insertion recording starts on the recorded file, it follows the file's recording time.

BEEP (Selecting beep mode)

ON: Every time the operation buttons are pressed, a beep sound will be heard.

OFF: No beep sound

ERASE GUARD (Selecting erase guard mode (See "ERASE GUARD" on page 24.))

OFF: You may erase the data.

ON: You cannot erase the data. (" δ " appears on the display.)

12/24 (See "Changing the clock to the 12-hour (or 24-hour) display" on page 8.)

LCD LEVEL (Selecting the LCD display brightness) "LEVEL 1" ~ "LEVEL 10" can be selected.






EDITING THE RECORDED DATA

Overwrite recording

Note:

Previous recorded material will be erased.

- Select the "OVER WRITE" edit mode. (See "SELECTING THE FOLDER AND MENU" on page 9.)
- 2. Play back the file. (See "PLAYBACK" on page 16.)
- Slide the operation switch to the STOP position (or press the CRE-ATE FILE button to set the pause mode) where you want to start overwriting.



4. Slide the operation switch to the DICT position. Overwrite recording starts.

Insertion recording

Note:


Previous recorded material will remain.

- 1. Select the "INSERT" edit mode. (See "SELECTING THE FOLDER AND MENU" on page 9.)
- 2. Play back the file. (See "PLAYBACK" on page 16.)
- Slide the operation switch to the STOP position (or press the CREATE FILE button to set the pause mode) where you want to start insertion.
- 4. Slide the operation switch to the DICT position. Insertion recording starts.

Caution:

Overwrite and Insertion recording start from the stop position on the file. In "END" display, the recording starts from the END position.


If the INDEX/CANCEL button is pressed in the stop mode, "OVER WRITE" or "INSERT" edit mode can be changed.



File skip

Press the $\bowtie rightarrow rightarrow rightarrow repeatedly to skip to the desired file in the selected folder.$

- In the stop mode, it skips to the beginning or end of the current, previous or next file.
- During playback mode, it skips to the beginning of the file.



File search

If the K or K or K button is pressed during playback, the unit will search at high speed in the forward or reverse direction while the button is being pressed. When the button is released, playback will continue.

These buttons are also used in the stop mode.

Review

To review the recorded sound while playing back the selected file, slide and hold the operation switch to the REV position. It works within the selected file.

To resume playback, release the switch.

Index search

If an index mark was made in the file, press the INDEX/CANCEL button during playback. The unit will search for the next index point and playback starts from that point.

SELECTING DISPLAY

Press the TIME/SET button repeatedly during recording, playing and stop mode. The display changes as follows:

In the recording mode:

Remaining recording time — Current day/time — Original display returns

Example of remaining recording time:

Author — USER-01 REMAIN 94:39


94:39 — Remaining recording time

In the playback mode:

Recorded date/time — Current day/time — Remaining playing time — Original display returns

In the stop mode:

Remaining recording time — Current day/time — Original display returns



ERASING

Important Note:

Before erasing, make sure that the battery indicator is full.


Preparation

- 1. Slide the operation switch to the STOP position.
- 2. Select the AUTHOR and FOLDER. (See "SELECTING THE FOLDER AND MENU" on page 9.)

Erasing one file

 Press the K or ▷ button to select the file to be erased. Example:

USER-01 LE 3/5 0:09



- 2. Press the ERASE button once.
 - The file number blinks.

Example:

ERASE FILE LECT 3


- 3. While the display is blinking, press the TIME/SET button.
 - "ERASE" appears briefly on the display.

The selected file is erased.

All the file numbers after the erased file are reduced by one.

Note:

If you make a mistake while following steps, press the INDEX/CANCEL button before pressing the TIME/SET button.





Erasing all memories

- 1. Press the ERASE button four times.
 - "ERASE ALL MEMORY" blinks.
- While "ERASE ALL MEMORY" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button.
 - "ERASE" appears briefly.
- ERASE

TIME/

SET

All memories in all folders are erased.

Example:

USER-01 LE 1/ 1 NEW

Notes:

- If you make a mistake while following steps, press the INDEX/CAN-CEL button before pressing the TIME/SET button.
- The ERASE button will not function during recording or playback.

Partial erasing (A-B erasing)

- Press the K or K button to select the file.
- 2. Slide the operation switch to the PLAY position to start playback.
- 3. Press the CREATE FILE button to pause at the starting point you want to erase (Point A).
 - The elapsed playing time blinks. Example:





- 4. Press the ERASE button.
 - "ERASE START" blinks.
- 5. While "ERASE START" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button.
 - "ERASE" blinks.

Playback resumes from Point A automatically.

Example:



Operation switch TIME/SET

- Press the ERASE button at the ending point you want to erase (Point B).
 - "ERASE END" blinks.

- 7. While "ERASE END" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button.
 - "ERASE" appears briefly.

The section between points A and B in the selected file is erased. ${}^{\Downarrow}$

Playback pause is set automatically. (The elapsed playing time blinks.) Press the CREATE FILE button again or stop playback.


Note:

If you make a mistake while following steps, press the INDEX/CANCEL button before pressing the TIME/SET button.

ERASE GUARD

Erase guard functions to prevent accidental erasure.

 Press and hold the MENU/FOLDER button down at least **2 seconds** in the stop mode. (See "Selecting the menu" on page 9.)



- 2. Press the MENÚ/FOLDER button repeatedly to select "ERASE GUARD".
- 3. Press the TIME/SET button.
 - "OFF" blinks.

ERASE GUARD OFF

- 4. Press the + or VOLUME button to select "ERASE GUARD ON".
 - " f " appears on the display.
- 5. Press the TIME/SET button to set it.
 - ・ "よ" remains lit.

Note:

If the ERASE button is pressed after setting Erase Guard, "GUARD" appears briefly on the display.

VOICE ALARM TIMER

- Set the ALARM ON, date, and time. (See "Selecting the menu" and "Various menu modes" in "SELECTING THE FOLDER AND MENU" on pages 9 ~ 12.)
- 2. Press the MENU/FOLDER button repeatedly to select "FOLDER ALARM".
- 3. Slide the operation switch to the DICT position.
- 4. Record your message into the ALARM folder (only one message). Example:

ALARM 0:01

When the alarm ON time arrives, the voice alarm will be activated as shown below:

In the stop or power off mode:

- Voice message (If voice message is recorded.)
- Beep 5 times (If no voice message is recorded.)

During playback mode:

The operation is the same as "At the stop or power off mode" as above. And it goes back to the previous point and resumes playback.

During recording mode:

No sound (" () " blinks on the display.)

BEFORE INSTALLING THE APPLICATION SOFTWARE

- Your PC must run Microsoft Windows98(SE)/Millennium Edition/2000 Professional/XP Professional/XP Home Edition operating system with USB port.
- You must install Microsoft Windows Media Player Ver. 6.4 or later.
- Do not connect the unit to your PC yet.
- If accidentally connect it to your PC, the "Found New Hardware Wizard" appears on the screen. Click [Cancel], and disconnect the unit.
- You must disable any anti-virus software before you install the PC Memo Scriber software.

PLAYING BACK/EDITING A DATA FILE RE-CORDED WITH YOUR PC

Digital voice recordings can be transferred to the PC for playback or editing.

Before you start, install the "PC Memo Scriber" program on the PC as follows:

1. Load the PC Memo Scriber CD-ROM in the CD-ROM drive of the PC. The setup program starts automatically.

Note:

If the setup program doesn't start...

- 1) Choose [Run] on the Start menu.
- 2) Type the following line: D:\PCMEMO\setup.exe
 "D" (the drive letter) should be replaced by the CD-ROM drive letter on your PC.
 2) Click IOK1
- 3) Click [OK].

- 2. Follow the instructions on the screen.
- 3. After the installation is complete, you must restart Windows.

Note:

If the screen below appears, click [Continue Anyway].

- 4. Operate your PC. (Follow the instructions on the CD-ROM. Refer to "D:\Manual\manual-E.pdf".)

When the "PC Memo Scriber" program is properly started on the PC, "PC CONNECT" appears on the display of the unit, and the control buttons on the unit will not function.

How to format the MultiMediaCard in the unit

Windows 98(SE) / Millennium Edition:

Use the format menu in your PC.

Windows 2000 Professional / XP Professional / XP Home Edition:

Use the software in the supplied CD-ROM.


- 1) Choose [Run] on the Start menu.
- Type: D:\Tools\FMT.exe
 "D" (the drive letter) should be replaced by the CD-ROM drive letter on your PC.
- 3) Click [OK]. The format screen appears.
- 4) Follow the instructions on the screen.

ENROLLING/TRANSCRIBING A DATA FILE (USING VIAVOICE)

ViaVoice is not supplied and must be purchased separately.

Enrolling

- 1. Disconnect the USB cable.
- 2. Connect one end of the audio cable (supplied) to the EAR jack and the other end to the LINE-IN jack on the PC.
- 3. Slide the POWER switch to the ON position.
- 4. Slide the operation switch to the STOP position.
- Press the TIME/SET and INDEX/CANCEL buttons at the same time until "ENROLL" appears on the display.
- 6. Operate the PC and start "ViaVoice". (Follow the instruction manual for ViaVoice.)



Note: To cancel enrolling, press the INDEX/CANCEL button.

Notes on operating ViaVoice

For ViaVoice Release 8 or 9:

 On the Windows desktop, select [Start] > [Settings] > [Control Panel]. (For Windows XP, select [Start] > [Control Panel] > [Switch to Classic View].)

Double-click [IBM ViaVoice Options] icon. The "IBM ViaVoice Options" screen appears.

- 2) Select [Sanyo ICR-B150 Wavefile] in the [Input Device] field.
- Click [Add/Modify] or [Add User]. The "ViaVoice User Wizard" screen appears.
- 4) Set the new user's name in the "User Name" field.
- Select "First Voice Model [Sanyo ICR-B150 Wavefile]" in the "Voice Model" field. Select "[Sanyo ICR-B150 Wavefile]" in the "Device" field.
- 6) Click [Next]. The Setting Up and the Enrollment will go on.

If the voice from the ICR-B150 cannot be recognized using the Audio Setup Wizard, follow the steps below.

- On the desktop of Windows, select [Start] > [Programs] > [Accessories] > [Entertainment] > [Volume Control].
 (For Windows XP, select [Start] > [All Programs] > [Accessories] > [Entertainment] > [Volume Control].)
- 2) On the Menu bar, click [Options] > [Properties].
- 3) Click [Recording] in [Adjust volume for].
- 4) Click the [Line-In] check box in [Show the following volume controls].
- 5) Click [OK].
- 6) In the [Recording control], click the [Select] check box under [Line-In].





Important Note:

When you attempt to transcribe a data file from the unit, be sure to enroll by using the unit. If you enroll data by using the headset supplied with ViaVoice, an extremely low recognition rate results.

Note:

IBM ViaVoice Release 8 or 9 must be used.

IBM and ViaVoice are registered trademarks of International Business Machines Corporation.

Creating a data file for transcription

- 1. Slide the POWER switch to the ON position.
- 2. Slide the REC MODE switch to the DICT position.
- Select the REC TIME "HQ" or "SP" recording time mode. (See "Selecting the menu" and "Various menu modes" in "SELECTING FOLDER AND MENU" on pages 9 ~ 12.)
- 4. Slide the operation switch to the DICT (Recording) position, then start dictating (when dictating, pay attention to "Notes on enrolling").

Transcribing a data file

Note:

Only data files recorded under the "DICT" position and the REC TIME "HQ" or "SP" recording time mode can be used for transcription.

- 1. Connect the unit to the PC using the USB cable.
- 2. Operate the PC and select a file to be transcribed. (Follow the instructions on the CD-ROM.)
- Click [] [. "ViaVoice" starts automatically and the selected file will be transcribed.

In Regard to the Display with Windows Explorer

When the Digital Voice Recorder is connected to a PC by the USB connection cable, the data recorded on the MultiMediaCard can be displayed by Windows Explorer as data on a removable device.

The Digital Voice Recorder records the data into the folder "Voicerec" on the MultiMediaCard. Do not use Explorer to edit the folder "Voicerec".

CLEANING THE CABINET

Clean the outside of the unit with a clean soft cloth, moistened with lukewarm water. Do not use benzene, thinner or alcohol since they will mar the finish of the surfaces.

The unit does not operate.

The batteries are discharged or not installed.

Insert two new "AAA" batteries.

" " and "LOW BATT" appear. The batteries are discharged. Insert two new "AAA" batteries.

"POWER OFF" appears when the operation button is pressed.

Hold function is set.

Slide the POWER switch to ON.

No sound.

The earphone is plugged in.

Unplug the earphone.

The volume is turned down completely.

Press the + VOLUME button to adjust the sound level.

Cannot erase.

The erase guard is set. (" f " appears.)

Cancel the erase guard. Refer to "ERASE GUARD" on page 24.

"MEMORY FULL" appears.

The memory capacity is full.

Erase unnecessary files. Refer to "ERASING" on page 19.

SYMPTOM POSSIBLE CAUSE CORRECTIVE ACTION
