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Important Information:

Notes on clock setting

Be sure to set the date and time of the unit's clock before you start using it. (See "Adjusting the date and time" in "BEFORE OPERATION" section.)

Backup recommendation

To avoid potential risk of data loss caused by accidental operation or malfunction of the unit, we recommend that you save a backup copy of your recorded massages on a tape recorder, etc.


PRECAUTIONS

- If the line of rectangles in the battery indicator () disappear during recording, stop the recording immediately and replace the batteries.
- Do not disconnect the AC adaptor or remove the batteries while operating the unit.
- Before erasing, make sure that the battery indicator is full.
- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not insert pins, etc., inside the unit.
- Do not drop the unit or subject it to strong shocks.
- Do not use where there are extremes of temperature (below 5°C (35°F) or exceeding 35°C (95°F)).


WHAT TO DO IF ...

If the operation of the unit or display is not normal,

1. Open the battery compartment lid.



- 2. Remove the batteries. Wait 2 minutes, then reinstall the batteries.
- 3. Press the reset switch (back of the unit) using a small ball-point pen, etc.
- 4. Resume operation.





POWER SUPPLY

Batteries

- 1. Open the battery compartment lid.
- 2. Install two "AAA" batteries (not supplied). Observe proper polarity.



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Battery indicator (IIII))

The line of rectangles is the battery gauge. Black rectangles show the battery condition.

: Full, good condition

AC adaptor

Connect the AC adaptor (SANYO Model No. 3CV-120US, not supplied) to the EXT DC 3V jack. (The batteries are automatically disconnected.)

 The center pin of the EXT DC 3V jack is positive (+).

BEFORE OPERATION

Earphone

Connect an earphone (8 ohms, cord length less than 2 meters (6 feet 6 inches), not supplied) to the EAR jack. (The speaker is automatically disconnected.)

Note: Be sure to reduce the volume before connecting or disconnecting the earphone.

External microphone

Connect an external microphone (not supplied) to the MIC jack. (The built-in microphone is automatically disconnected.)

Turning the power on and off

Press the **■** button to turn on the power. The display appears as shown right for example and the unit is in the standby mode. To turn off the power, press the **■** button for at least 1 second in

button for at least 1 second in the stop mode.

Auto power off function

The power turns off automatically when 5 minutes have elapsed after entering the stop, playback pause or recording pause mode.

Hold function

The HOLD switch (back of the unit) disables the buttons $(\bullet, \blacksquare, \blacktriangleright, \blacktriangleright \flat)$ or $\blacktriangleleft \blacklozenge$) from operating, to prevent playback or recording due to accidental operation.



Set the HOLD switch to ON. "HOLD ON" appears briefly on the display.

For normal use, set the switch to OFF. "HOLD OFF" appears briefly on the display.

Adjusting the date and time

- Press the MENU button re- TIME/SET 1. peatedly until the date and time display appears.
- 2. Press the TIME/SET button The year display blinks.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button 3. repeatedly to select the year.

Changing the clock to the 12-hour (or 24-hour) display

- Press the MENU button repeatedly until "12/ 1. 24" appears.
- Press the TIME/SET button. "24H" (or "12H") 2. blinks.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button once. "12H" (or 3. "24H") blinks.
- Press the TIME/SET button. 4



MENU

SELECTING THE MENU MODE

 Press the MENU button repeatedly to select the desired menu mode. Each time the button is pressed, the display changes as follows:



FOLDE (Folder) \rightarrow EDIT \rightarrow AUTO PAUSE \rightarrow Date and time \rightarrow VAS \rightarrow REC \rightarrow BEEP \rightarrow ERASE GUARD \rightarrow 12/24 \rightarrow Original display returns

- 2. To change the setting of a sub-menu in the selected menu mode, press the TIME/SET button so that the display blinks.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select a new sub-menu. (See "Various menu modes" below.)



- 4. Press the TIME/SET button to set it.
- 5. Repeat steps above to change other settings.
- Press the button to return to the original display.

Various menu modes

FOLDE (Folder): Selecting folder mode

PERS \longleftrightarrow BUSI \longleftrightarrow LECT \longleftrightarrow OTHER \longleftrightarrow ALARM

PERS: Personal BUSI: Business LECT: Lecture OTHER: Others ALARM: Voice alarm EDIT: Selecting edit mode OVER WRITE ↔ INSER (Insert)

OVER WRITE: Overwrite recording INSER: Insertion recording ("INSERT" appears on the display.)

AUTO PAUSE: Selecting auto pause time mode PAUSE 03SEC ↔ PAUSE 04SEC ↔ ... → PAUSE 10SEC ↔ PAUSE 0FF ↔ PAUSE 01SEC ↔ PAUSE 02SEC ↔ ...

Note: The initial setting of the auto pause function is ON (3 seconds).

Date and time (See "Adjusting the date and time".)

VAS (Voice activated system): Selecting VAS mode

VAS OFF ←→ VAS ON

VAS OFF: To manually start and stop recording

VAS ON: Recording begins when the unit picks up sound, and stops after the sound stops. Press the + or – VOLUME button to set the microphone's sensitivity when recording begins. The VAS sensing level appears on the display ("VAS 01" ~ "VAS 10"). "VAS" appears. REC: Selecting recording time mode REC STAND (Standard) ←→ REC LONG

REC STAND: For better sound quality (The unit can record for up to approx. 33 minutes.) REC LONG: For longer recording (The unit can record for up to approx. 197 minutes.)

BEEP: Selecting beep mode BEEP ON ←→ BEEP OFF

> BEEP ON: Every time the operation buttons are pressed, a beep sound will be heard. BEEP OFF: No beep sound

ERASE GUARD: Selecting erasing guard mode (See "Erasing guard".) GUARD OFF ↔→ GUARD ON

GUARD OFF: You may erase the data. GUARD ON: You cannot erase the data. " On " appears on the display.

12/24: (See "Changing the clock to the 12-hour (or 24-hour) display".)

Original display returns

RECORDING

- 1. Press the button to turn the power on.
- 2. Set the REC MODE switch (back of the unit) to select the desired recording mode.

DIC (Dictating): " " appears.

CONF (Conference): " * appears.

LECT (Lecture): " ? appears.


Note:

If an external microphone (not supplied) is connected, the recording mode cannot be changed. " **†** " appears.

- Select the desired folder name, VAS and recording time modes. (See "SELECTING THE MENU MODE".)
- Press the button (red). Recording starts with new file number.



Example: The display appears as shown below.



Elapsed recording time

 Press the ■ button to stop the recording at any time. Note:

- The unit can record up to file number 99 for each folder (except ALARM folder).
- When the recording time is full, "MEMOR FULL" appears briefly. In this case, erase the unnecessary file.
- If the CUE INDEX button is pressed during recording, an index mark is made (INDEX number appears briefly) and recording continues. (Up to 10 index marks, for each file, can be made. But, Index marks cannot be deleted individually.)



File number

Each time a recording is made, a file number is automatically placed in the memory at the beginning of the recording.

Temporarily stopping recording (Recording pause)

Press the ● button. The elapsed recording time blinks on the display. To resume recording, press the button again.

EDIT THE RECORDED DATA Overwrite recording

To overwrite recorded material (Previous recorded material will be erased.)

- 1. Select the "OVER WRITE" edit mode. (See "SELECTING THE MENU MODE".)
- Locate the desired point during playback, then press the ► button to pause.
 - Elapsed playing time blinks.
- Press the button. Over writing recording starts from the paused position. (The CUE INDEX button will not function during over writing recording.)
- 4. Press the button to stop the recording.

Insertion recording

To insert into a file (Previous recorded material will remain.)

- Select the "INSER (Insert)" edit mode. "INSERT" appears on the display. (See "SELECTING THE MENU MODE".)
- 2. Locate the desired point during playback, then press the ► button to pause.
- Press the button. Insertion recording starts from the paused position. (The CUE INDEX button will not function during insertion recording.)
- 4. Press the button to stop the recording.

Notes:

- The edit mode (OVER WRITE ↔ INSER) can be changed by pressing the CUE INDEX button during play back paused.
- In case of paused recording, the mode can be changed to play back. Press the ► button.



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Auto pause

When the end of the file is reached during playback, "AUTO" and "PAUSE" appear in turn. The unit pauses automatically for the preset auto pause time. After the set time elapses, the next file playback begins.

Press the \blacktriangleright button during auto pause to return to the normal pause mode.

File skip

Press the \blacktriangleright or \blacktriangleleft button to skip to the desired file.

In case the auto pause is set, if the $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ button is pressed during playback, the unit enters the auto pause mode at the end of the file. Press the $\blacktriangleright \triangleright$ button again to play back the next file.

File search

If the ►► or ◄< button is pressed during playback, the unit will search at high speed in the forward or reverse direction while the button is being pressed. When the button is released, normal playback will continue.

Index search

If an index mark was made in the file, press the CUE INDEX button during playback. The unit will search for the next index point and playback starts from this point.

ss the REPEAT button during back. " 🖵 " appears.

unit plays back repeatedly the last 5 secs of recorded content in the selected file. e recorded times are shorter than 5 secrepeat playback starts from the beginof the current file.)

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To secure the unit

In case the unit is used by unauthorised persons, you can set the security mode.

To switch security mode on/off during power off, press the TIME/SET and MENU buttons simultaneously. The buttons must be pressed for 4 seconds long. The display shows "SECUR ON"/ "SECUR OFF".

ERASING

Important Note:

Before erasing, make sure that the battery indicator is full.

Preparations

- 1. Press the MENU button to select "FOLDE".
- Press the TIME/SET button. The folder name blinks.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select the folder to be erased, then press the TIME/SET button.
- Press the button to return to the original display.

Erasing one file in memory

- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select the file number to be erased.
- Press the ERASE button once. The file number and "ERASE" blink.



 While the display is blinking, press the TIME/ SET button. "ERASE" appears briefly. The file memory in the selected folder is erased. All the file numbers after the file that was erased are reduced by one.

Erasing one folder memory

- 1. Press the ERASE button twice. The folder name, file numbers and "ERASE" blink.
- While the display is blinking, press the TIME/ SET button. "ERASE" appears briefly. All memories in the selected folder are erased.

Erasing all memories

- 1. Press the ERASE button three times. "MEMOR ALL ERASE" blinks.
- While "MEMOR ALL ERASE" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button. "ERASE" appears briefly. All memories in all folders are erased.

Partial erasing (A-B erasing)

- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select the file number.
- 2. Press the ► button to start playback.
- 3. Press the ► button again to pause at the starting point you want to erase (point A).
- Press the ERASE button. "ERASE START" blinks.
- While "ERASE START" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button. "ERASE" remains. Playback starts.
- Press the ERASE button at the ending point you want to erase (point B). "ERASE END" blinks.
- While "ERASE END" is blinking, press the TIME/SET button. "ERASE" appears briefly. The section between points A and B in the selected file is erased. Playback pause is issued.

Notes:

- The ERASE button will not function during recording and playback.
- Erase all function can only be operated if in the actual selected folder there is at least one file.

Erasing guard

Erasing guard functions to prevent accidental erasure.

- Press the MENU button repeatedly to select "ERASE GUARD".
- 2. Press the TIME/SET button.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select "GUARD ON". " On " appears.
- Press the TIME/SET button. In the erasing guard mode, the ERASE button will not function.

VOICE ALARM TIMER

- 1. Press the button to turn the power on.
- Select the sub-menu "ALARM" of "FOLDE". (See "SELECTING THE MENU MODE".) "FOLDE ALARM" appears.
- Press the button to return to the original display mode.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select the file number (01/02 or 02/02).
- 5. Press the button to record your alarm message.
- Press the button to stop.
- 7. Press the TIME/SET button. "OFF" or "ON" blinks.
- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select "ON".
 "(101)" or "(101)" appears.
- 9. Press the TIME/SET button. The year display blinks.
- Set the timer ON time by using the TIME/SET,
 ► or ◄◄ button. (Refer to "Adjusting the date and time".)
- Press the MENU button to select the other folder as desired. (See "SELECTING THE MENU MODE".)

When the alarm ON time arrives, the voice alarm will be activated as shown below:

At stop mode:

- Beep 1 time & Voice message (If voice message is recorded.)
- Beep 10 times (If no voice message is recorded.)

During playback mode:

The operation is the same as "At stop mode" as above. And, it goes back to the previous point and pauses.

During recording mode:

Beep 1 time (Recording will not be interrupted.)

At power off mode:

- Beep 1 time & Voice message (If voice message is recorded.)
- Beep 10 times (If no voice message is recorded.)

CLEANING THE CABINET

Clean the outside of the unit with a clean soft cloth, moistened with lukewarm water. Do not use benzene, thinner or alcohol since they will mar the finish of the surfaces.

TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

SYMPTOM POSSIBLE CAUSE CORRECTIVE ACCTION

The unit does not operate.

The batteries are discharged or not installed. Insert two new "AAA" batteries.

Cannot erase.

The erasing guard is set. ("On " appears.)

Cancel the erasing guard. Refer to "Erasing guard".

Playback speed is too fast or too slow.

The sound was recorded with the REC LONG mode. Set the PLAY SPEED switch (back of the unit) to STD.

Operation or display is not normal. The unit must be reset. See "WHAT TO DO IF..." on page 2.
