The front passenger seatback can be folded to a horizontal position to make room for a long load. To fold the seatback, move the seat as far back as possible. Push the head restraint release button and move the head restraint fully down. Pull up on the recliner handle A located on the outboard side of the seat to fold the front passenger seatback. Without releasing the handle, push the seatback forward. Move the seat as far forward as possible.

To adjust the second row seatback to the desired position, while seated, pull the release lever bup and push the seatback rearward.

To fold down the rear seat, pull up on the lever B on the outboard side of the seat cushion and let the seatback rotate downward into the load floor position. To return to the upright position, rotate the seatback upward until the seatback latches. The seatback will click when it is locked into position.

The control buttons are located on the left-hand rear quarter trim panel (accessible from the liftgate area). Press and hold the control to lower the seat. The top portion lowers the RIGHT (40%) seatback, and the bottom portion lowers the LEFT (60%) seatback.




