The **DOLD** bars in the upper left corner represent the satellite signals being received by your nüvi. When you see green bars, you have a strong signal. See page 58 for more information


Following Your Route

Follow the route to your destination using the Map page. As you travel, your nüvi guides you to your destination with vocal prompts, turn arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the Map page. If you depart from the original route, your nüvi recalculates the route and provides new route directions.

Read the driving instructions at the top of the page.



Your route is marked with a magenta line.



Follow the arrows as you make turns.




A checkered flag marks your destination.

Adjusting the Volume and Brightness

Press and quickly release the **Power** button or touch *(Dec)* on the Menu page to access the Quick Settings. Move the sliders to adjust the volume and brightness. Touch **Mute** to turn the volume off.



Locking the Screen

To prevent accidental screen taps, touch **Lock**. To unlock the screen, press the **Power** button.

nüvi Tips and Shortcuts


- To quickly return to the Menu page, press and hold **Back**.
- Touch **Help** to learn more about the nüvi's Travel Kit.
- When you are listening to music or an audible book, quickly press the **Power** button twice to jump from any page back to the player page. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (such as the map).
- To extend the battery life, close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals. If the antenna is closed, GPS is turned off.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name

From the Menu page, touch **Where to?** > **Provide Spell Name**.



Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters contained in the name. Then touch **Done**.



TIP: In any search results list, if you do not see the place you want visit or you want to narrow your search results list, touch **Spell** and enter the name or part of the name.



Finding an Address

To find an address, touch **Where to?** from the Menu page. Touch **Address**.



Finding an intersection is very similar to finding an address. Fouch Intersection and enter the two street names.

Finding a Place Using the Map

Touch and drag anywhere on the Map page to browse the map and view different parts of the map. You can also touch **Q** Where to? > **Solution** Browse Map.



Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Use the + and icons to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object you selected.
- Touch **Go** to navigate to the selected location.
- Touch **Save** to save this location to your **Favorites**.
- If the GPS if turned off, touch **Set Loc.** to set your location to the selected location.
- Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen.

Viewing Places on the Map

You can view a place you have found on the Map page.





Drag the map and zoom in or out as necessary. Touch **Back** when you are done.

Where I Am Now—searches for places near your current location.

A Different City—searches for places near the city you enter.

My Current Route—searches for places along the route you are currently navigating.

My Destination—searches for places near your route destination.

NOTE: Your nüvi automatically searches for places near your current location.

Adding a Stop to Your Route

You can add a stop (via point) to your route. The nüvi gives you directions to the via point and then to your final destination.






Editing Saved Places

After you save a place, you can change the name of the place and its symbol on the map. From the Menu page, touch **Q** Where to? > **My Locations**.



Changing the Name

To change the name, touch **Change Name**. Enter the new name using the on-screen keyboard. Touch **Done**.

Changing the Map Symbol


To change the symbol used on the map, touch **Change Map Symbol** and select a symbol from the list.

Deleting Saved Places

To delete this saved place, touch **Delete**. Then touch **Yes**.

Setting a Home Location

You can set a Home location for the place you return to most often. After you have set your Home, you can easily **Go Home**.



Going Home

Once your Home location is set, you can route to it at any time by touching **My Locations** and then **Go Home**.


Changing Your Home Location

Change your Home location by repeating the steps above.

Finding Recently Found Places

Your nüvi stores the last 50 of your recent finds in Recent Selections. The most recently viewed places appear at the top of the list. From the Menu page, touch **Where to?** > **Wy Locations** to view your recently found items.

To remove all places from the Recent Selections list, touch **Clear**. Then touch **Yes**.




NOTE: When you touch **Clear**, all items from the list are removed. It does not delete the actual place from your unit.

VIEWING THE MAP AND OTHER PAGES

Viewing the Map Page 🎉

From the Menu page, touch **View map** to open the Map page. The position icon **A** shows your current location. Touch and drag the map to view other areas of the map. Touch areas of the page to see additional information, as described below.




When you are following a route, your **Arrival** time is displayed in the lower left corner. The distance to the next turn (**Turn In**) is shown in the lower right corner.

When you are simply driving while viewing the Map page (not following a route), your **Speed** is shown in the lower left corner. The direction you are heading (**Driving**) is shown in the lower right corner.

Trip Information Page

The Trip Information page displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, select **Speed** or **Arrival** on the Map page.




Resetting Trip Information

If you want accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. If you make frequent stops, leave the nüvi turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Select **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Select **Reset Max** to reset the Maximum Speed.

Current Route Page

The Current Route page displays turn-by-turn instructions for your entire route. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Current Route page. This page displays all turns in the route and the distance between turns. Select a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Map** to view the entire route on the map.



Next Turn Page

The Next Turn page shows the turn on the map and the distance and time left before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, select **Turn In** on the Map page, or select any turn from the Current Route page.

Use the up and down arrows to view other turns in the route. When you are finished viewing the Next Turn page, select **Back**.

Adding a Detour to a Route

If you need to take a detour from your current route, select **Detour** from the Menu page of the nüvi. The unit calculates a new route and provides you with new instructions. The nüvi attempts to get you back on your original route as soon as possible.

On some routes, the route you are currently taking might be the only reasonable option. In this case, you cannot take a detour.

Stopping Your Route

If you want to stop your current route, return to the Menu page and select **Stop**.



Select **Stop** to end navigation. Select **Detour** and your unit creates a new route if possible.

MANAGING FILES ON YOUR NÜVI

Your nüvi is able to store files, such as JPEG images and MP3 music files. You can store files in the nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD Card.


After you connect your nüvi to your computer, you can copy and paste files to the memory or an optional SD Card. Follow the four steps described below and on the next page.

Step 1: Insert an SD Card (Optional)


The SD card slot is located on the side of the nüvi. To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks.

Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

- 1. Plug the small end of the USB cable into the connector located on the side of your nüvi.
- 2. Connect the larger end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.

Step 3: Transfer Files to Your nüvi

- 1. Connect the nüvi to your computer as described on the previous page.
- 2. Double-click the **My Computer** icon **[**] on your computer's desktop.
- 3. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
- 4. Highlight the file and select **Edit** > **Copy**.
- 5. Open the "nuvi" or "nuvi sd" drive (see the next page for information).
- 6. Select **Edit** > **Paste**. The file then appears in the list of files on the nüvi memory or SD card.

Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, double-click the **Unplug or Eject** icon in your system tray. Select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click **Stop**. Select the nüvi drives and click **OK**. You can disconnect your nüvi from your computer now. MANAGING FILES ON YOUR NÜVI

Information about Your nüvi Drives

After you connect your nüvi to your computer, one or two additional drives appear in your computer's list of drives: "nuvi" and possibly "nuvi sd."

"nuvi" is the available storage in the nüvi's internal memory. "nuvi sd" is the SD card inserted in your nüvi. If you do not have an SD card inserted in your nüvi, the "nuvi sd" drive does not appear in the list.

Deleting Files from Your nüvi

You can delete files from your nüvi just as you would delete files from your computer.

With the nüvi connected to your computer, open My Computer. Open your "nuvi" or "nuvi sd" drive. Highlight the file that you want to delete from your nüvi and press the **Delete** key on your computer's keyboard.

Supported File Types

- MP3 music files
- JPG image files
- AA audible book files
- GPI custom POI files from Garmin's POI Loader (see page 51)
- GPX waypoint files from MapSource (see page 54)
- Maps from MapSource

NOTE: The nüvi does not support iTunes M4A/M4P files.

CAUTION: If you are not sure about a file's purpose, do NOT delete it. Your nüvi memory contains important map data files that should NOT be deleted. Be especially cautious of files located in folders entitled "Garmin."

USING THE TRAVEL KIT

The travel kit provides many features that are helpful when you are traveling across town or across the globe.

Using the Language Guide 📔

The Garmin Language Guide puts data from Oxford's multilingual resources and five bilingual dictionaries in the palm of your hand. A sample version of the Garmin Language Guide is provided. To purchase the Garmin Language Guide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi/ and click the Accessories link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories.

NOTE: Only nüvi 350 models can verbally translate words and phrases in the Language Guide.

Loading the Language Guide

After you have received your Garmin Language Guide SD Card, you must load the data on your nüvi. Follow the directions on the package or in the nüvi help file to learn how to load the data into your unit.

TIP: After you load the Garmin Language Guide onto your nüvi, you can use the SD card for other data, such as MP3s or Audible Books. Garmin © 2005 21

Much like a paper travel guide, the Garmin Travel Guide provides detailed information about places, such as restaurants and hotels. Your nüvi comes with a few sample travel guide points; to purchase the Travel Guide accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi/ and click the Accessories link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories. From the Menu page, touch in Travel Kit > Touch III Travel Guide.




Listening to Audible Books @

Your nüvi provides several sample Audible books for you to listen to. These sample books are only portions of the book: to hear an entire book, purchase it from Audible.com. See pages 27–29.



Moving around the Book

Touch 🕑 to skip a section and 🕢 to jump back.



Touch the book cover art to view information about the book.

Using Bookmarks

To create a bookmark, touch and then touch the **Bookmark** button. To view your bookmarks, touch and then touch a bookmark. Touch Play to listen to the book from the bookmark.

SHORTCUT: When you are playing an audible book, quickly press the **Power** button twice to jump from any page (such as the map) back to the audible book player page. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (for example, the map).

Loading Audible Books to Your nüvi

To purchase a book, go to http://garmin.audible.com and create an Audible.com account. After you create an account, download AudibleManager to your personal computer. Then you can purchase a book and download it to your nüvi.

Before you can listen to an audible book, you must activate your nüvi. The first time you open AudibleManager, you are led through the activation process. See page 29 for more information.

After activating your nüvi, follow these three steps to load an audible book to your nüvi: connect your nüvi to your computer, download the book to your computer, and transfer the book to your nüvi.

Step 1: Connect your nüvi to the computer

- 1. Connect the mini-USB connector to the side of the nüvi.
- 2. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- 3. If you want to load the book on your SD card, insert the SD card in the slot in your nüvi.

Step 2: Download the book to your computer

Refer to AudibleManager's Help file for detailed instructions about downloading books to your computer and loading them on your nüvi.


- 1. From your computer's desktop, double-click the AudibleManager icon to open AudibleManager.
- 2. Click the **Go to My Library Online** button on the top center of the window. Your Audible.com library opens, displaying the books you have purchased.
- 3. Click **Get it Now** to download the book to your computer.
- 4. Select a format and click **Download**.

Step 3: Transfer the book to your nüvi

Refer to AudibleManager's Help file for detailed instructions about downloading books to your computer and loading them on your nüvi. You must first activate your nüvi before transferring books: see page 29.

- 1. Open AudibleManager.
- 2. Select the Internal Drive or External Drive (SD card) in the lower portion of the window.
- 3. Select the book title. Click the **Add to Garmin nüvi** button in the top left corner.
- 4. Select how much of the book you want to load. You can load small sections at a time to save memory. Click **OK**. AudibleManager transfers the book to your nüvi.
- 5. When you are finished, double-click the **Unplug or Eject Hardware** icon **S**. Click **Stop** and then **OK**.



Activating Your nüvi with AudibleManager

Before you can listen to a book you have downloaded from Audible.com, you must activate your nüvi. This is a one time process.

- Disconnect your n\u00fcvi from your computer: double-click the Unplug or Eject Sicon in your system tray. Select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click Stop. Select the n\u00fcvi drives and click OK. Unplug the USB cable from your n\u00fcvi.
- 2. From your computer's desktop, double-click the AudibleManager icon to open AudibleManager.
- 3. In the "Choose your device" window, click the box next to "Garmin nüvi" to place a check mark in the box. Click **Next**.
- 4. Enter your Audible user name and password. Click **Next**.
- 5. Connect your nüvi to your computer using the USB cable. Wait a few moments for AudbleManager to detect your nüvi.
- 6. Select **Activate my player(s)** and click **Next**.
- 7. Please wait while AudibleManager attempts to activate your nüvi. Upon completion, you will receive a message saying the process has been successful. Click **Finish**.



NOTE: If you are unable to connect to the Internet or have any other problems activating your nüvi, refer to the Audible Manager Help File. Select **Help** from the menu and then click **Help**.

Viewing Pictures 🥽

You can view pictures that you have stored in your nüvi using the Picture Viewer.



Restoring Settings

To restore all settings you have changed, press the **Restore Settings** button, as shown below.



To restore settings for an individual category, such as Map, touch the Restore Settings button on that particular page.

Changing the Map Settings

Map Detail—adjust the amount of detail shown on the map. Displaying more detail causes the map to redraw slowly.

Map View—change the perspective of the Map page.

- **Track Up**—display the map in 2 dimensions (2D) with your direction of travel at the top.
- North Up—display the map in 2D with North at the top.
- **3D View**—display the map in 3 dimensions (3D), Track Up orientation. This is the default map view.

Map Info-view the maps loaded on your nüvi and their version.

Restore—restore the original map settings.



Changing the System Settings

WAAS/EGNOS—enable and disable WAAS/EGNOS. For information about WAAS, go to http://www.garmin.com/aboutGPS/waas.html.

Units—change units of measure to kilometers (Metric) or miles (Statute).


Safe Mode—disable or enable the Safe Mode feature to improve driver safety. When your vehicle is moving, Safe Mode disables all unit functions that require significant operator attention and could become a distraction while driving.

Touch Tones—disable or enable the tone that sounds each time you touch the screen.

Proximity Alarms—disable or enable the alerts when you approach Custom POIs. This option is only visible if you have loaded Custom POIs. See page 51 for more information about Custom POIs.

About—display your nüvi's software version number, unit ID number, and audio version number. This information is needed when you update the system software (see page 53) or purchase additional map data (see page 54).

Restore—restore the original system settings.




Changing the Time Settings

Time Format—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving-set to On, Off, or Auto if it is available.

Restore Settings—restore the original time settings.



Changing the Display Settings

Color Mode—select Daytime for a light background, Nighttime for a black background, or Auto to automatically switch between the two.

Backlight Timeout—select the length of time the backlight stays on after external power is removed. Reducing the time the backlight stays on increases your battery life.

Touch Screen—recalibrates (or realigns) the touch screen to respond properly. Touch **Recalibrate** and then follow the directions.


PictureIt—enables you to take a screen shot when you quickly press and release the **Power** button. The screen shots are saved in the "PictureIt" folder on your "nuvi" drive.

Changing the Navigation Settings

Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route. Select Faster Time to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance. Select Shorter Distance to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.

Vehicle—specify your vehicle type to optimize routes.

Avoidances—touch the Enabled button to access the road types. Select the road types you want to avoid on your routes. The nüvi uses these road types only if alternative routes take you too far out of your way or if no other roads are available. If you have an



FM TMC Traffic Receiver, you can also avoid traffic incidents.

Attention Tone—turn on or off the attention tone.

Voice Prompts—select when you want to nüvi to announce route navigation and system status.

Changing the Language Settings

Text Language—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the Text Language does not change the language of map data, such as street names and places or userentered data.

Voice Language—change the language for all voice prompts and messages. Your nüvi contains two different types of voice languages: text-to-speech and pre-recorded.

Languages noted with a person's name are text-to-speech (TTS) voices: for example, American English-Jill is a text-tospeech voice. The text-to-speech voices "read" and "speak" the same words that are displayed on the nüvi. The voices have an extensive vocabulary, and they pronounce the street names as you approach turns.

The pre-recorded voices have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.

Restore Settings—restore the original language settings.



FM TMC TRAFFIC **I**NFORMATION


Using an optional Garmin FM TMC Traffic Receiver, your nüvi can receive and use traffic information broadcast over the FM Radio Data System (RDS). When a traffic message is received, your unit displays the event on the map and can change your route to avoid the traffic incident. For more information about the FM TMC Traffic Receiver, visit the Garmin Web site (www.garmin.com). For participating subscription providers, refer to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/fmtraffic.

Connecting the FM TMC Traffic Receiver to Your nüvi

Place your nüvi in the auto mount and plug into the 12-volt adapter. Plug the Traffic Receiver's mini-USB cable into the mini-USB connector located on the side of the nüvi.



NOTE: You can only access the traffic information and settings if the nüvi is connected to external power and an FM TMC Traffic Receiver, such as a GTM 10.




APPENDIX

Mounting Your nüvi

For a tight grip, clean and dry your windshield before mounting the suction cup.

To mount the suction cup mount:

- 1. Place the suction cup on the windshield.
- 2. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
- 3. Open the antenna. Fit the bottom of your nüvi into the cradle.
- 4. Tilt your nüvi back until it snaps in place. If necessary, rotate the cradle.
- 5. Plug the small end of the cable into the back of the mount; plug the other end into a 12/24-Volt receptacle in your vehicle.



Mounting the nüvi on Your Dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your unit to the dashboard. California drivers, use the enclosed disk to comply with California regulations: see the *nüvi Product Information Sheet* that came in the box for more information.

Important: The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed.


To install the mounting disk:

- 1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you will place the disk.
- 2. Remove the backing from the permanent mounting adhesive on the bottom of the disk and place the disk on the dashboard.
- 3. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk
- 4. Flip the suction lever down to secure the suction cup mount to the disk.



Removing the Unit and the Mount

- 1. To remove the unit from the mount, press the tab on the bottom of the cradle up.
- 2. Lift the unit off of the mount.
- 3. To remove the suction cup from the windshield, flip the lever toward you.
- 4. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.



Removing the Cradle from the Mount

To remove the cradle from the mount arm, turn the cradle to one side. The cradle will snap off the ball socket.

To replace the cradle, snap the cradle on the ball socket.




Resetting Your nüvi

If your unit locks up (freezes up), press the **Power** button to turn off the unit, then press again to turn the unit back on. If this does not help, reset your nüvi.

To reset the nüvi:

- 1. Raise the antenna.
- 2. Press the **Reset** button.



Clearing User Data

Hold your finger on the upper right corner of the nüvi's screen while turning on the nüvi. Keep your finger pressed until the popup window appears. Touch **Yes** to clear all user data.

All original settings are restored. Your Recent Selections and audible bookmarks are also deleted.

Custom POIs (Points of Interest)

Your nüvi accepts custom points of interest (POI) databases, available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom POI databases contain alert information for points such as safety cameras and school zones. Your nüvi can notify you with a proximity alarm when you approach one of these points.

After downloading your POI database, use the Garmin POI Loader to install the POIs into your unit. The POI Loader is available at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi. Select **Updates and Downloads**.


Using the POI Loader program, you can store the Custom POIs on your "nuvi" drive or your SD card. You can also customize the proximity alert settings for each POI using the POI Loader. Refer to the POI Loader Help File for more information; press F1 to open the Help File.

To view your Custom POIs, touch **My Locations** > **Custom POIs**.

To delete the Custom POIs from your nüvi, touch **Where To?** from the Menu page. Touch **My Locations** > **Delete All**. Touch **Yes** to delete all of your Favorites and your Custom POIs.

Adjusting the Proximity Alarms

To turn on or off the proximity alarms, from the Menu page, touch $\langle \rangle >$ **System** > **Proximity Alarms**.



When the Proximity Alarms are on, your nüvi chimes when you approach a Custom POI.

CAUTION: Garmin is not responsible for the consequences of using a custom POI database or the accuracy of the safety camera or other custom POI database.

Caring for Your nüvi

Your nüvi contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your nüvi, avoid dropping your unit and operating it in high shock/vibration environments.

Cleaning the Unit

The nüvi is constructed of high quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the unit's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your nüvi

Follow the cautions below to protect your nüvi from damage:

- Do not store the nüvi where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur (such as in the trunk of a car), as permanent damage may result.
- Do not expose the nüvi to water. Contact with water can cause this unit to malfunction.
- Do not leave your nüvi in plain sight when you leave your vehicle. Take your unit with you or remove it from view to avoid theft.
- Though a PDA stylus can also be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen or damage may result.

Using the nüvi Indoors

Close the antenna to turn off GPS and use your nüvi indoors. Use this setting when you are practicing using the unit or using the Travel Kit features, such as using the MP3 player.

Using a Remote Antenna

You can use an optional external remote antenna (Garmin GA 27C). This is very helpful when operating the unit in a vehicle with a coated windshield or an in-screen (in the window) heating system, which can block GPS signals. Connect the antenna to the connector located on the back of the nüvi. To purchase, go to the Garmin Web site at http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi and select the Accessories link.

Changing the Fuse

An AGC/3AG 2 Amp, high-breaking capacity, 1500 A-rated fuse is located at the tip of the vehicle adapter. Periodically, you may need to change the fuse. **Unscrew** the black, round end piece and replace the fuse.

Charging the nüvi

You can charge the nüvi using the USB cable (see page 17) or the 12/24-Volt car adapter connected to the suction mount.

Updating the nüvi Software

Garmin periodically updates its software and map data. If you register your unit, you will receive notification of software and map updates. To see if an update to the nüvi's system software is available, go to http://www.garmin.com/products/nuvi and select **Software Updates**. To see if an update for your map software is available, go to http://www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp.

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Purchasing Additional MapSource Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card. Follow the instructions that came with the new map data to properly install the maps to your computer and nüvi. In order to enable additional maps, you need your unit ID (see page 38) and serial number (see page i). To load maps to your nüvi memory or SD card, select the name for your "nuvi" drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource help file for more information about using MapSource and loading maps on your Garmin GPS.

Loading MapSource Waypoints on Your nüvi

Using MapSource, you can save locations (also called waypoints) and transfer them to your nüvi. For more information about creating waypoints in MapSource, see the help file (press F1 to open the help file).

After you have created the waypoints, select **File** > **Save**. Select **GPS eXchange Format** (*.gpx) for the **Save as Type**. Click the **Save** button.

With your nüvi connected to your computer, copy the *.gpx file into in the **Garmin\Waypoints** folder in the "nuvi" drive. The waypoints you created in MapSource are now in **My Locations** > **Favorites**.

Viewing Your Saved Locations in MapSource

You can also view the locations you have saved in your nüvi using the MapSource program.

In MapSource, select **File > Open**. Select **GPS eXchange Format** (*.gpx) for **Files of Type**. Browse to find the **Garmin\Waypoints** folder on your "nuvi" drive. Select **Waypoints.gpx** and click **Open**.

Battery Information


Your unit contains an internal (non-removable) lithium-ion battery. Contact your local waste disposal department for information on properly disposing of the unit.

Battery Tips

- Your nüvi's battery should last 4 to 8 hours depending on usage. The battery gauge indicates the status of the battery.
- To extend the battery life, reduce the time the backlight stays on. From the Menu page, select Settings > Display > Backlight Timeout to change the setting. See page 40.
- To extend the battery life, close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals.
- To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it. You should not need to do this very often. See "Battery Gauge" in the side bar for more information.
- To maximize the life of the lithium-ion battery, do not leave your nüvi direct sunlight and avoid prolonged exposure to excessive heat.

Battery Gauge

The battery icon in the upper right corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the internal battery.




Periodically, you might notice that the battery gauge is not completely accurate. To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it without interrupting the charging. For best results, do not unplug the nüvi until it is totally charged.

About Satellite Signals

Your nüvi must acquire satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the nüvi cannot acquire satellites. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions to use your nüvi, or close the antenna to turn off GPS and use it indoors.

When the nüvi has acquired satellite signals, the signal strength bars on the Menu page are green when it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or disappear and the signal.

Touch the signals strength bars in the upper left corner of the Menu page to view GPS information. Touch any where on the screen to return to the Menu page.



The sky view shows the satellites you are receiving. The satellite signal strength bars indicate the strength of each satellite you are receiving.
