Features

- Plays DVD, DVD-R/RW, DVD+R/RW, CD, CD-R/W, MP3, HDCD, JPEG, Kodak[®] Photo CD, VCD, SVCD discs.
- Analog and digital audio outputs.
- Composite, S-Video, and component video outputs.
- Interlace or progressive scan video when using component video.
- Audio Dynamic Range Compression when playing videos recorded with Dolby Digital sound.
- Parental lock feature.
- Multiple angles and zoom.
- Play songs on audio discs in a random order or an order you specify.
- Bookmark your favorite movie scene or song location and start play at that location.
- Start play at a DVD title or chapter number, or DVD or CD elapsed time.



- Use your DVD player in a well-ventilated area and do not cover the ventilation openings.
- Do not modify your DVD player or use an unshielded power cord or video output cable, or you may experience excessive interference.
- Disconnect your DVD player and unplug the power cord when not used for a long period of time.

Progressive indicator	Indicates whether the DVD is being played using interlace TV or progressive scan. For more information, see "Changing the component video output signal" on page 52.	
Play status indicator	Indicates the player is playing a disc faster or slower than normal and whether the disc is being played forward or backward. For more information, see "Speeding up disc playback" on page 36 and "Slowing down DVD playback" on page 36.	



Note: if you press the skip back button after the track, chapter, or file playback has reached the half-way point, the skip back button skips to the beginning of the current track, chapter, or file. Press the button a second time to skip back to the previous track, chapter, or file.

Skip ahead ()). Skips ahead one CD track, DVD chapter, or MP3 file. For more information, see "Skipping a chapter, track, or file" on page 35.

Search back ((). Plays the CD, DVD, or MP3 disc backward quickly or plays the DVD disc backward in slow motion. For more information, see "Speeding up disc playback" on page 36 and "Slowing down DVD playback" on page 36.

Search ahead () →). Plays the CD, DVD, or MP3 disc forward quickly or plays the DVD disc forward in slow motion. For more information, see "Speeding up disc playback" on page 36 and "Slowing down DVD playback" on page 36.


Step/Pause (]]). Pauses play. If you are playing a DVD, you can push this button to advance the video by one frame. For more information, see "Pausing a disc" on page 34 and "Using frame advance" on page 35.

Inserting batteries



To install the batteries:

■ Insert two AAA batteries into the remote control. Make sure that you match the + and – on the batteries with the + and – symbols inside the battery compartment.





Warning

Do not use rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries in this remote control.

Chapter 1: Checking Out Your Gateway DVD Player

Connecting Your DVD Player



Read this chapter to learn how to connect your DVD player to:

- A receiver or A/V amplifier
- A television

Important



Do not plug the power cord into a wall outlet or turn the DVD player on until all connections have been made.



Understanding video connections

Your DVD player has three types of standard video connections. You should use the best connection available to get the best display. For example, if your television supports a component video connection, connect the DVD player to your television using component video instead of composite video or S-Video.

Connection Quality	Cable and Connector	Description
Good		Composite . The video signal is carried through a single "pin." This connection method is the one that is most commonly found on devices.
Better		S-Video. The video signal is split into two signals, black-and-white and color. Text displayed on-screen through this connection will be noticeably sharper then composite.
Best		Component. The video signal is split into three signals, two color, and one black-and-white. Use component video to take advantage of the superior picture provided by progressive scan DVD.

Understanding audio connections

Your DVD player has three types of standard audio connections. You should use the best connection available to get the best sound. For example, if your receiver supports a digital audio connection, connect the DVD player to your receiver using digital audio instead of analog stereo audio.

Connection Quality	Cable and Connector	Description
Good		RCA Analog Stereo
		The audio signal is carried through two cables, one for the right speaker and one for the left. This connection method is the one that is most commonly found on devices.
Best	Q.	Use digital audio for the best sound quality. Your DVD player supports the following digital audio connections. Coaxial Digital
		Coaxial cables are commonly used with digital audio signals. A coaxial cable with RCA terminations has been included with your DVD player.
	-OR-	AC-3 (Toslink) Digital
		Toslink is a connector format for fiber optic digital audio cables. A fiber optic digital audio cable carries audio data in the form of light impulses instead of electrical signals. The Toslink connector is a square plug.

Connecting to a receiver

Using component video

To connect your DVD player to a receiver using component video:



- **1** Connect the green-colored Y jack on the back of your DVD player to the green-colored Y jack on your receiver.
- **2** Connect the red-colored C_R jack on the back of your DVD player to the red-colored P_R or C_R jack on your receiver.
- **3** Connect the blue-colored C_B jack on the back of your DVD player to the blue-colored P_B or C_B jack on your receiver.
- **4** Connect the AC-3 toslink digital audio jack on the back of your DVD player to the AC-3 toslink digital audio in jack on your receiver.

-OR-

Connect the coaxial out jack on the back of your DVD player to the coaxial in jack on your receiver.

- **5** Connect your receiver to the television. For more information, see the user's guides that came with your receiver and television.
- **6** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.



Using S-Video



To connect your DVD player to a receiver using S-Video:



1 Connect the S-Video jack on the back of your DVD player to the S-Video jack on your receiver.

2 Connect the AC-3 toslink digital audio jack on the back of your DVD player to the AC-3 toslink digital audio in jack on your receiver.

-OR-

Connect the coaxial out jack on the back of your DVD player to the coaxial in jack on your receiver.

- **3** Connect your receiver to the television. For more information, see the user's guides that came with your receiver and television.
- **4** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.



Using composite video



To connect your DVD player to a receiver using composite video:



- **1** Connect the yellow video jack on the back of your DVD player to the yellow video jack on your receiver.
- **2** Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to the R and L audio-in jacks on your receiver.
- **3** Connect your receiver to the television. For more information, see the user's guides that came with your receiver and television.
- **4** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.



Connecting to a television

Using component video

To connect your DVD player to a television using component video:



- **1** Connect the green-colored Y jack on the back of your DVD player to the green-colored Y jack on your television.
- **2** Connect the red-colored C_R jack on the back of your DVD player to the red-colored P_R or C_R jack on your television.
- **3** Connect the blue-colored C_B jack on the back of your DVD player to the blue-colored P_B or C_B jack on your television.
- **4** Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to the R and L audio-in jacks on your television.

-OR-

Connect the audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to a receiver. For more information, see "Connecting to a receiver" on page 20.

- **5** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.
- **6** Select Component as the input for your television. For more information, see the user's guide that came with your television.

Using S-Video

To connect your DVD player to a television using S-Video:



- **1** Connect the S-Video jack on the back of your DVD player to the S-Video jack on your television.
- **2** Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to the R and L audio-in jacks on your television.

-OR-

Connect the audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to a receiver. For more information, see "Connecting to a receiver" on page 20.

- **3** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.
- **4** Select Auxiliary or AV as the input for your television. For more information, see the user guide that came with your television.



To connect your DVD player to a television using composite video:



- **1** Connect the yellow video jack on the back of your DVD player to the yellow video jack on your television.
- **2** Connect the red (R) and white (L) audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to the R and L audio-in jacks on your television.

-OR-

Connect the audio jacks on the back of your DVD player to a receiver. For more information, see "Connecting to a receiver" on page 20.

- **3** Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.
- **4** Select Auxiliary or AV as the input for your television. For more information, see the user guide that came with your television.

DVD player basics

Invalid operation symbol

If you press a button on the player and the player does not respond, the $\stackrel{\text{(b)}}{\longrightarrow}$ icon may appear on the television screen to indicate an invalid operation. An invalid operation may occur if:

- The button you pressed cannot be used in the current player mode.
- The region code number of the player is different from that of the DVD disc and playback is not allowed.
- The parental rating level does not allow playback of the video. For more information, see "Ratings Setup" on page 57.
- A disc is not playable.

Supported disc types

This DVD player can play only the discs bearing either the video or marks and CD-R or CD-RW discs recorded with Audio CD or MP3 format.

- This player cannot play discs (such as CD-ROM or DVD-RAM) other than those listed above. Playing them may generate noise and damage speakers.
- This player cannot play CD-Rs and CD-RWs that include unreadable file formats such as data files.
- Depending on the disc characteristics or recording condition, some of MP3 discs may not be played back.
- This player conforms to the NTSC color system for United States and Canada.

Turning the DVD player on and off

To turn the DVD player on:

- **1** Press the power button on the DVD player. The DVD player enters Standby mode. Each subsequent press of the power button on the DVD player switches the DVD player between Standby mode and off.
- **2** Press the power button \bigcirc on the remote control. The DVD player turns on. Each subsequent press of the power button on the remote control switches the DVD player between Standby mode and on.



To turn the DVD player off:

■ Press the power button on the DVD player. The DVD player turns off.



Playing a disc



To play a disc:

- **1** Turn on the DVD player by following the instructions in "Turning the DVD player on and off" on page 31.
- **2** Press \triangleq on the DVD player or remote control. The DVD tray opens.
- **3** Place the CD or DVD in the tray with the label up.
- 4 Press \triangleq on the DVD player or remote control. The DVD tray closes.

5 If you are playing a DVD without a menu or a CD, press ► (play) on the DVD player or remote control.

-OR-

If you are playing a DVD with a menu, see "Using the DVD menu" on page 32.

-OR-

If you are playing an MP3 disc, see "Using the MP3 disc menu" on page 33.



Using the DVD menu

Many DVD videos include additional material along with the program. To access this material, or to start playing the video, you make a selection from the DVD menu.

To play a DVD video using the DVD menu:

- **1** Turn on the DVD player and insert a DVD by following the instructions in "Playing a disc" on page 31.
- 2 Use the remote control cursor buttons ▶, ▲, ◄, and ▼ to highlight the menu item you want to select.
- **3** Press Enter or \blacktriangleright (play).



Important



If the menu items have numbers next to them, you can use the numeric buttons on the remote control.

Example:


• To select the number 3, press 3.

• To select the number 21, press +10, +10, then 1.

After selecting the number, press ENTER or ► (play).

Using the MP3 disc menu

The DVD player provides a navigational menu that lets you browse to a specific folder on an MP3 disc and begin play at a specific MP3 file.



To play an MP3 disc using the menu:

- **1** Turn on the DVD player and insert an MP3 disc by following the instructions in "Playing a disc" on page 31.
- 2 Use the remote control cursor buttons ► and ◄ to select the folder and file menu.
- **3** Use the remote control cursor buttons \blacktriangle and \checkmark to select the folder or file.
- **4** Press ENTER or \blacktriangleright (play).

Stopping a disc

To stop playing a disc:

■ Press ■ (stop) on the DVD player or remote control. The disc stops.



Important



When you stop playing a DVD video in this fashion, the player remembers the point where the stop button was pressed. R-STOP appears on the display.

Press the Play button and the DVD resumes playing from this point.

-OR-

Press the stop button again, and the resume function is cancelled. STOP appears on the display.

Pausing a disc

To pause playback:

■ Press II (pause) on the DVD player or remote control. The disc pauses. If you are playing a DVD, the player is in Still Picture mode. If you are playing a CD or MP3 disc, the player is in Pause mode.

To resume playing the disc, press \blacktriangleright (play) on the DVD player or remote control.



Using frame advance



To frame advance a DVD video:

- **1** Pause the DVD video as described in "To pause playback:" on page 34.
- 2 Press II (pause) on the DVD player or remote control. Each time the II is pressed, the disc advances one frame.

To resume playing the disc, press \blacktriangleright (play) on the DVD player or remote control.



Skipping a chapter, track, or file



To skip ahead or back while playing a disc:

■ Press → (skip ahead) on the DVD player or remote control to skip ahead one DVD chapter or one track or file on a CD or MP3 disc.

-OR-

Press **M** (skip back) on the DVD player or remote control to skip back one DVD chapter or one track or file on a CD or MP3 disc.





When you press the skip back button after reaching midway through a chapter or track, playback returns to the beginning of that chapter or track. When you press it a second time, a chapter or track is skipped.

Speeding up disc playback



To speed up playback of a disc:

- Press ◀ (search back) or ▶ (search ahead) on the remote control while the disc is playing. Each time the button is pressed, the disc is advanced or reversed at up to six step speeds, depending on the type of disc.
 - For CDs, the available speeds are 2X, 4X, 6X, and 8X.
 - For MP3 discs, the available speed is 8X.
 - For DVD videos, the available speeds are 2X, 4X, 8X, 16X, 32X, and 64X.

To resume normal playback, press \blacktriangleright (play) on the DVD player or remote control.



Slowing down DVD playback

To slow down playback of a DVD video:

- **1** Pause the DVD video as described in "Pausing a disc" on page 34.
- 2 Press ◀ (search back) or ▶ (search ahead) on the remote control. Each time the button is pressed, the disc is advanced or reversed slowly at three step speeds (1/2X, 1/4X, 1/8X). Pressing the button a fourth time returns to normal speed.

To resume normal playback, press \blacktriangleright (play) on the DVD player or remote control.




Using the on-screen display

The DVD player features an on-screen display that you can use to view disc information. You can use the remote control to view the on-screen display.

To view disc information:

■ Press **DISPLAY** on the remote control. The information is displayed on the television screen.

Each time the button is pressed, the disc information changes depending on the type of disc being played.

Some discs may not allow some or all of the information to be displayed.

Using search mode

You can specify the section you want the DVD player to start playing from. You can start playback at a particular title, chapter number, or specific elapsed time from the beginning of the current DVD title or the current CD track.

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video and CD discs.



To start play at a particular DVD title or chapter number:

- **1** Press **DISPLAY** on the remote control. The DVD player is in Title/chapter search mode.
- **2** Select a title or chapter number by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

Example:

- To select the number 3, press 3.
- To select the number 11, press +10, 1.

Important

If you enter an incorrect number, press the CLEAR button on the remote control. All numbers will be cleared.





To start play at a particular DVD title or CD track elapsed time:

- **1** Press **DISPLAY** on the remote control. The DVD player is in Title/chapter search mode.
- 2 Press the remote control cursor buttons ► and ◄ to switch between Title/chapter search mode and Title/time search mode.
- **3** Select the elapsed time by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

Example:

- To enter 3 minutes, 15 seconds, press 0, 0, 0, 3, 1, 5.
- To enter 2 hours, 59 minutes, 35 seconds, press 0, 2, 5, 9, 3, 5.
- **4** If you are playing a DVD, press ENTER or ► (play).

-OR-

If you are playing a CD, the CD begins play automatically.

Accessing DVD menus



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs.

Accessing the DVD title menu

You can use the remote control to return to the title menu while a DVD is playing.

To show the title menu while playing a DVD:

- **1** While playing a DVD, press TITLE/PBC on the remote control. The title menu opens.
- 2 Press the remote control cursor buttons ▶, ▲, ◄, and ▼ to highlight the menu item you want to select.
- **3** Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected item.



Accessing additional DVD menus

Some DVD videos have additional menus other than the title menu. You can use the remote control to access these menus while the DVD is playing.





To show a DVD menu while playing a DVD:

- 1 While playing a DVD, press **MENU** on the remote control. The menu opens.
- 2 Press the remote control cursor buttons ▶, ▲, ◄, and ▼ to highlight the menu item you want to select.
- **3** Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected item.



Repeating playback

Repeating a chapter, title, track, or disc



To repeat a chapter, title, track, or disc (DVD Video/CD only):

■ While playing a DVD or CD, press **R**EPEAT on the remote control. **The repeat mode** appears on the television and the display.

Each time this button is pressed, the repeat mode changes depending on the disc type.

- For DVD video: Repeat Chapter, Repeat Title, Repeat Off
- For CD: Repeat Track, Repeat Disc, Repeat Off

To return to normal playback, press **REPEAT** repeatedly until **Repeat Off** appears on the television or Repeat disappears from the display.

Repeating a section of a DVD or CD



To repeat a selected part of a DVD video or CD:

1 While playing a DVD or CD, press A< >B on the remote control at the beginning of the part you want to repeat. A TO B SET A appears on the television screen.

2 At the end of the part, press A < >B on the remote control.

A TO B SET B appears on the television screen, Repeat appears on the display, and the selected part is played back repeatedly. To return to normal playback, press A < >B on the remote control repeatedly until A TO B CANCELLED is displayed on the television or Repeat disappears from the display.





You cannot use the $A\!<\!>\!B$ playback of a part that includes multiple camera angles.

Repeat A<>B playback only works within a title or a track.

Repeating a file or folder



To repeat a file or folder (MP3 disc only):

1 With the disc stopped, press **REPEAT** on the remote control.

Each time this button is pressed, the repeat mode changes:

- File repeat
- Folder repeat
- Normal playback of the disc
- Disc scan playback (the first ten seconds of each file is played back)
- Normal playback of a file
- Normal playback of a folder
- 2 Press the remote control cursor buttons ► and ◄ to select the folder and file menu.
- **3** Press the remote control cursor buttons \blacktriangle and \checkmark to select the folder or file.
- **4** Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected file.

Playing songs in random order



The information in this section only applies to CD and MP3 discs.

Playing CD tracks in random order



To play CD tracks in random order:

1 With the disc stopped or playing, press **R**ANDOM on the remote control. The selected playback mode appears on the display and television.

Each time this button is pressed, the playback mode changes:

- Random on random playback. Tracks on the disc are played back in random order
- Random off normal playback.

2 Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected track.



Playing MP3 files in random order

To play MP3 files in random order:

1 With the disc stopped, press **R**ANDOM on the remote control. The selected playback mode appears on the display and television.

Each time this button is pressed, the playback mode changes:

- Random on random playback. Files in the current folder are played back in random order
- Random off normal playback.
- 2 Press the remote control cursor buttons ► and < to select the folder and file menu.

- **3** Press the remote control cursor buttons \blacktriangle and \checkmark to select the folder or file.
- **4** Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected file.

Playing tracks in a specific order



The information in this section only applies to CD discs. Up to 99 tracks can be programmed to be played in any specified order.

Playing tracks in a specific order



To play tracks in a specific order:

- **1** With the disc stopped, press **P.MODE** on the remote control. The Program mode appears on the display and television.
- **2** Select a track by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

Example:

- To select the number 3, press 3.
- To select the number 21, press +10, +10, 1.
- **3** Repeat Step 2 for all the tracks you want to play.
- **4** Press ENTER or ► (play) to play the selected tracks.

Clearing programmed tracks



Opening the disc tray or turning off the power clears all programmed tracks.

To clear the programmed tracks one by one:

■ During programming, press CLEAR.

Each time this button is pressed, the programmed tracks are cleared one by one in the opposite order. Once you have played the tracks, you cannot clear the programmed tracks one by one.



To clear all programmed tracks:

■ During programming or after pressing ■ (stop), press P.MODE. All programmed tracks are cleared.



Using bookmarks

The bookmark feature lets you mark a point in a movie or song that you can go to quickly. The player stores up to 14 bookmarks.



The information in this section only applies to DVD video and CD discs. Some discs will not allow the bookmark feature to function.



Opening the disc tray or turning off the power clears all stored bookmarks.

Setting a bookmark

To store a bookmark in memory:

- **1** While playing a DVD or CD, press **BOOK MARK** on the remote control. The bookmark menu appears on the television (and not on the display).
- 2 Use the remote control cursor buttons ▶ and ◄ to select the Mark mode. Each time the cursor buttons are pushed, the mode switches from Mark mode to GoTo mode.
- **3** Use the remote control cursor buttons \blacktriangle and \checkmark to select the bookmark number.

4 At the desired place in the DVD or CD, press ENTER on the remote control.

The bookmark is stored in memory. If the Enter button is pressed at a previously used bookmark number, the new bookmark replaces the old bookmark.



Starting play at a bookmark



To start play at a bookmark:

- **1** While playing a DVD or CD, press **BOOK MARK** on the remote control. The bookmark menu appears on the television (and not on the display).
- 2 Use the remote control cursor buttons ▶ and ◄ to select the Mark mode. Each time the cursor buttons are pushed, the mode switches from Mark mode to Recall mode.
- **3** Use the remote control cursor buttons \blacktriangle and \checkmark to select the bookmark number you want to recall.
- **4** Press ENTER on the remote control. Playback resumes from the scene or point corresponding to the selected bookmark.

Changing the audio language

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs with more than one language recorded on them.

To change the audio language:

While playing a DVD, press AUDIO on the remote control. The audio language menu appears on the television. Each time this button is pressed, the audio language changes to the next language available on the DVD.



Important



When the power is turned off and on or the disc is changed, the language played is the one selected in the settings menu. For more information, see "Setup menus and options" on page 55. If this language is not available on the disc, only an available language on the disc is played.

Changing the subtitle language

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs with more than one subtitle language recorded on them.

To change the subtitle language:

While playing a DVD, press SUBTITLE on the remote control. The subtitle language menu appears on the television. Each time this button is pressed, the subtitle language changes to the next language available on the DVD.



Important



When the power is turned off and on or the disc is changed, the language played is the one selected in the settings menu. For more information, see "Setup menus and options" on page 55. If this language is not available on the disc, only an available language on the disc is played.

Important



When a disc supporting closed captioning is played, the subtitle and the closed caption may overlap each other on the television screen. In this case, turn off the subtitle feature.

Changing the camera angle

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs with multiple camera angles recorded on them. To know if a different camera angle is available, turn on the Angle Mark feature. For more information, see "Setup menus and options" on page 55. Any time multiple camera angles are available, the angle symbol appears on the screen.

To change the camera angle:

While playing a DVD, press ANGLE on the remote control. Each time this button is pressed, the angle changes to the next angle available on the DVD.



Zooming in on a scene

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs. Some discs will not allow the zoom feature to function.

To play a scene close-up:

- 1 While playing a DVD, press ZOOM on the remote control. The player zooms to the center of the screen. Each time this button is pressed, the zoom scale changes as follows: 1.5X, 2X, 3X, Zoom off.
- 2 Use the remote control cursor buttons ▶, ▲, ◄, and ▼ to move to a different part of the screen.

To return to playing the video, press **ZOOM** repeatedly until zoom is cancelled.



Changing the video signal format

Depending on the country you use this DVD player in, you may need to change the video signal format to match the television and DVD being played. In the United States and Canada, NTSC is the video signal format used. In Europe, Australia, and Asia, PAL is the video signal format used.

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs.

If the video signal format is not set correctly, you may get a distorted picture on your television or no picture at all.

To change the video signal format:

■ With the disc stopped, press NTSC/PAL on the remote control. Each time this button is pressed, the video signal format changes as follows: MULTI, NTSC, and PAL.

If you select MULTI, both NTSC and PAL encoded discs are played.



Changing the component video output signal

You can use either conventional interlaced video or progressive scan video when your DVD player is connected using component video out. Progressive scanned video reproduces high-density pictures with less flicker. Some televisions or projectors can handle only interlaced or progressive scanned video signals.

Important



The information in this section only applies to DVD video discs.

If you select progressive scan, the S-Video and composite video out jacks on this player cannot output normal video signals. Your picture may break up and shake.

If progressive video signals are input to a non-progressive component video in jacks on your television, the picture may not show normally. Therefore, if you do not use the progressive component video in jacks on your television, you should select interlace television.

To change the component video output signal:

■ With the disc stopped, press **P.S**CAN on the remote control. Each time this button is pressed, the component video output signal format changes as follows: Interlace TV and Progressive TV.

Adjusting the display brightness



To adjust the display brightness:

Press DIMMER on the remote control. The first time the button is pressed, the display dims. The next time the button is pressed, the display turns off. In the Display Off mode, pressing any button will turn the display back on.

Maintaining and Troubleshooting Your DVD Player

5

Read this chapter to learn how to maintain and troubleshoot your DVD player.



Cleaning and maintenance

- Your DVD player is cooled by air circulated through the vents on the bottom of the case. Keep these vents free of dust. With the DVD player turned off and unplugged, brush the dust away from the vents with a damp cloth. Be careful not to drip any water into the vents. Do not attempt to clean dust from the inside of your DVD player.
- Do not use abrasive or solvent cleaners because they can damage the finish.
- Do not allow any excessive water or moisture to come into contact with the surface of the DVD player. If water or moisture gets inside your player, operating problems and electrical and shock hazards may result.
- Do not scratch or hit the case with your fingers or any hard objects.

Care and handling of discs

- When handling a disc, do not touch the sides.
- Do not stick paper to or write anything on the printed surface.
- Fingermarks and dust on the recorded surface should be carefully wiped off with a soft cloth. For more information, see "To clean CDs or DVDs:" on page 63.
- Always keep the discs in their cases after use to protect them from dust and scratches.
- Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and player malfunction.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, or high temperature for an extended period of time.
- When loading or unloading a disc in the disc tray, always place it with the printed side up.

Important



The temperature inside this DVD player can be very high. When you finish playing the disc, remove it from the player to prevent the high temperature from deforming the disc.

Troubleshooting

Use the following information to solve common problems.

The player does not turn on

- Make sure that the power cord is plugged into a powered electrical outlet. To test the outlet, plug a working device, such as a lamp, into the outlet and turn it on.
- If your player is plugged into a surge protector, make sure that the surge protector is connected securely to an electrical outlet, turned on, and working correctly.

The player will not play a disc

- Make sure that the disc label is facing up, then try again.
- Clean the disc.



To clean CDs or DVDs:

■ Wipe from the center to the edge, not around in a circle, using a product made especially for the purpose.







- The disc is scratched and cannot be played.
- The parental control is set to prevent playing a DVD with this rating.

■ DVD discs and players contain *regional codes* that help control DVD title exports and help reduce illegal disc distribution. To be able to play a DVD, the disc's regional code and your DVD player's regional code must match.

The regional code on your DVD player is set when it is manufactured. The regional code for the United States and Canada is 1. The regional code for Mexico is 4.

Make sure the invalid operation symbol is not shown on the display. For more information, see "Invalid operation symbol" on page 30.

The player malfunctions

- Clean the disc.
- The disc is scratched and cannot be played.

Important

If you cannot eject the disc, turn off the DVD player, then turn it on again and press the eject button.



You cannot see a picture

- Make sure that the video cable(s) are connected.
- Make sure that the television has been set for the correct input source.
- Make sure that the DVD is not dirty or scratched.
- If you are using component video output, make sure that the correct component video output type has been selected for your television. For more information, see "Changing the video signal format" on page 51.
- Make sure the correct video format has been selected for your television and DVD disc. For more information, see "Changing the component video output signal" on page 52.

The picture is noisy or distorted

- You are using the rapid advance or reverse playback feature or the frame advance or reverse playback feature.
- Make sure that you have not connected a VCR between the television and the DVD player. Due to the Macrovision copy protection feature, you cannot connect a VCR to your DVD player.
- Make sure that the DVD is not dirty or scratched.

- If you are using component video output, make sure that the correct component video output type has been selected for your television. For more information, see "Changing the video signal format" on page 51.
- Make sure the correct video format has been selected for your television and DVD disc. For more information, see "Changing the component video output signal" on page 52.

The picture looks abnormal or there is no picture

■ If you are using component video output, make sure that it is selected correctly. For more information, see "TV Mode" on page 56.

There is a slight pause in the playback

There is a slight pause that may occur during layer transition when playing a DVD video recorded in dual-layer format. This is not a malfunction.

There is no sound

- Make sure that the audio cable(s) are connected.
- If you are using external speakers, make sure they are connected correctly to your receiver or amplifier.
- If you are using external speakers, make sure the receiver or amplifier is set to receive audio from the DVD player.
- If you are using Digital Out, make sure that it is set correctly. For more information, see "Audio Out" on page 57.

The sound is noisy or distorted

- Make sure that the disc is not dirty or scratched.
- Make sure all cables are connected securely.

The remote control does not operate

- Replace the batteries. For more information, see "Inserting batteries" on page 15.
- Make sure that you are less than 23 feet (7 meters) from the infrared remote sensor on the DVD player.
- Make sure that nothing is blocking the infrared remote sensors on the remote control or the DVD player.
