

THE MANUAL


Before operation of unit, carefully and completely read this Manual and the unit's Owner/Operator Manual. The contents will provide you with an understanding of safety instructions and controls during normal operation and maintenance.

All reference to left, right, front, or rear are given from operator sitting in operation position and facing the direction of forward travel.



REQUIRED OPERATOR TRAINING

Original purchaser of this unit was instructed by the seller on safe and proper operation. If unit is to be used by someone other than original purchaser; loaned, rented or sold, ALWAYS provide this manual and any needed safety training before operation.

SAFETY DECALS AND LOCATIONS

ALWAYS replace missing or damaged safety decals. Refer to figure 1 for safety decal locations.

Do not operate mower unless bagger is attached or guards are in operating position.

SAFETY RULES

Read, understand and follow all safety practices in Owner/Operator Manual before beginning assembly. Failure to follow instructions could result in personal injury and/or damage to unit.

ALWAYS remove key (if equipped) and disconnect wire from spark plug before assembly. Unintentional engine start up can cause death or serious injury.

Complete a walk around inspection of unit and work area to understand:

- Work area
- Your unit
- All safety decals

ALWAYS check overhead and side clearances carefully before operation.

ALWAYS be aware of traffic when operating along streets or curbs.

Keep children and people away.

Keep children out of work area and under watchful care of a responsible adult.

Keep area of operation clear of all toys, pets, and debris. Thrown objects can cause injury.

Check for weak spots on docks, ramps or floors. Avoid uneven work areas and rough terrain.

ALWAYS be sure of your footing. Keep a firm hold on handlebar. Walk, NEVER run.

DO NOT operate on wet grass.

Dust, smoke, fog, etc. can reduce vision and cause an accident. Operate unit only when there is good visibility and light.

Read the entire Owner/Operator manual and other training material. If the operator or the mechanic cannot read the manual, it is the owner's responsibility to explain it to them. Only the user can prevent and is responsible for accidents or injuries occurring to themselves, other people or property.

NEVER allow children to operate or play on or near unit. Be alert and shut off unit if children enter area.

Never carry passengers.

NEVER operate unit after or during the use of medication, drugs or alcohol. Safe operation requires your complete and unimpaired attention at all times.

NEVER allow anyone to operate this unit when their alertness or coordination is impaired.

Wear adequate safety gear, protective gloves and footwear.

NEVER wear open sandals or canvas shoes during operation.

Protect eyes, face and head from objects that may be thrown from unit. Wear appropriate hearing protection.

Sharp edges can cut. Moving parts can cut off fingers or a hand. Wrap mower blade(s), wear sturdy gloves and use extreme caution when servicing. On multi-blade mowers, rotation of one mower blade will cause all mower blades to rotate.

ALWAYS keep hands and feet away from all rotating parts during operation. Rotating parts can cut off body parts.

ALWAYS keep hands away from all pinch points.

DO NOT touch unit parts which might be hot from operation. Allow parts to cool before attempting to maintain, adjust or service.

NEVER place your hands or any part of your body or clothing inside or near any moving part while unit is running.

DO NOT wear loose clothing or jewelry. Tie back hair that may get caught in rotating parts.

Keep children and people away from unit during operation.

Fumes from engine exhaust can cause injury or death.

DO NOT run engine in an enclosed area. Always provide good ventilation.

Thrown objects can cause injury and property damage. DO NOT point discharge at anyone or discharge directly onto paved or gravel surfaces.

Always stand clear of the discharge area when operating this unit.

Read, understand, and follow all instructions in the manual and on the machine before starting. Understand:

- How to operate all controls
- The functions of all controls
- How to STOP in an Emergency
- Braking and steering characteristics
- Turning radius and clearance

ALWAYS keep protective structures, guards, and panels in good repair, in place and securely fastened.

NEVER modify or remove safety devices.

ALWAYS keep discharge cover or complete grass catcher in place and in proper working condition.

Check steering control operation frequently. Adjust and service as required.

Safety Interlock System must function properly. DO NOT operate unit if operator presence control is damaged or disabled.

If you strike an object, or if equipment vibrates abnormally, stop engine at once, disengage PTO, wait for all moving parts to stop, and remove key. Check for any damage or loose parts. Repair before restart.

Before starting engine: disengage PTO, engage parking brake and place unit in neutral.

Before starting engine: disengage PTO and place unit in neutral.

DO NOT operate at too fast a rate. DO NOT change engine governor settings or over-speed engine. Slow down and turn corners slowly.

Disengage PTO when attachment is not in use. DO NOT raise deck with mower blades running. ALWAYS turn off power to attachment when travelling, crossing driveways, etc.

Avoid uneven and rough terrain. DO NOT operate near drop-offs, ditches, or embankments. Unit can suddenly turn over if a wheel is over the edge of a cliff or ditch, or if an edge caves in.

DO NOT try to stabilize unit by putting foot on ground when operating with applicable riding attachments.

When engine is running and speed control lever is forward, holding only one steering lever will cause unit to circle around one drive wheel.

Use care when approaching blind corners, shrubs, trees or other objects that may obscure view.

ALWAYS disengage PTO, stop unit and engine, set parking brake, remove key and allow moving parts to stop before clearing clogs or cleaning unit. ALWAYS disengage PTO, stop unit and engine, remove key and allow moving parts to stop before clearing clogs or cleaning unit.

Never leave a running unit unattended. ALWAYS shut off engine before leaving unit.

ALWAYS remove key to prevent unauthorized use.

DO NOT operate in reverse unless absolutely necessary. ALWAYS backup slowly. ALWAYS look down and behind, before and while backing.

DO NOT operate on steep slopes. DO NOT operate on slopes of more than 10°. Operate across the face of slopes, not up and down.

Turf conditions can affect the unit's stability.

Keep all movement on slopes slow and gradual. DO NOT make sudden changes in speed or direction. Use a slow speed to avoid stopping or shifting on slopes. Avoid starting or stopping on a slope.

DO NOT park unit on a slope unless absolutely necessary. When parking on a slope always engage parking brake and block wheels.

DO NOT park unit on a slope unless absolutely necessary. When parking on a slope always chock or block wheels.

Use extra care when loading or unloading unit onto trailer or truck.

Secure unit chassis to transport vehicle. NEVER secure from rods or linkages that could be damaged.

DO NOT transport machine while engine is running.

Keep unit free of grass, leaves, or other debris. Clean up oil or fuel spills.

This product is equipped with an internal combustion engine. DO NOT use on or near any unimproved, forest covered or brush covered land unless the exhaust system is equipped with a spark arrester meeting applicable local, state or federal laws. A spark arrester, if used, must be maintained in effective working order by the operator.

Fuel is highly flammable and its vapors are explosive. Handle with care. Use an approved fuel container.

No smoking, No sparks, No flames. ALWAYS allow engine to cool before servicing.

NEVER fill fuel tank when engine is running or hot from operation.

NEVER fill or drain fuel tank indoors.

Replace fuel cap securely and clean up spilled fuel.

Never fill containers inside a vehicle or on a truck or trailer bed with a plastic liner. Always place containers on the ground away from your vehicle before filling.

When practical, remove gas-powered equipment from the truck or trailer and refuel it on the ground. If this is not possible, then refuel such equipment on a trailer with a portable container, rather than from a gasoline dispenser nozzle. Keep the nozzle in contact with the rim of the fuel tank or container opening at all times until fueling is complete. Do not use a nozzle lock-open device.

If fuel is spilled on clothing, change clothing immediately.

NEVER store fuel inside where there is an open flame, such as a water heater.

Avoid Electric Shock. Objects contacting both battery terminals at the same time may result in injury and unit damage. DO NOT reverse battery connections.

Reverse connections may result in sparks which can cause serious injury. Always connect positive (+) lead of charger to positive (+) terminal, and negative (-) lead to negative (-) terminal.

ALWAYS disconnect negative (-) cable FIRST and positive (+) cable SECOND. ALWAYS connect positive (+) cable FIRST, and negative (-) cable SECOND.

Explosive Gases from battery can cause death or serious injury. Poisonous battery fluid contains sulfuric acid and its contact with skin, eyes or clothing can cause severe chemical burns.

No flames, No sparks, No smoking near battery.

ALWAYS keep body and hands away from pin holes or nozzles which eject hydraulic fluid under pressure.

Allow hot parts to cool.

ALWAYS block wheels, engage parking brake and know all jack stands are strong, secure and will hold weight of unit during maintenance.

An extension spring, when extended, stores energy and can be dangerous. Always use tools specifically designed for installing or removing an extension spring. Always compress or extend springs slowly.

ALWAYS maintain unit in safe operating condition. Damaged or worn out muffler can cause fire or explosion.

Keep hardware, especially mower blade attachment bolts, tight.

Maintain or replace safety and instruction labels, as necessary.

For unit storage or extended storage:

- NEVER store with fuel in fuel tank, inside a building where any ignition sources are present.
- Allow engine to cool completely.

Use only attachments or accessories designed for your unit and that can be used safely on your terrain.

Check attachment components frequently for wear, damage or deterioration. Replace with manufacturer's recommended parts for safety.

To reduce fire hazard and overheating, keep equipment free of grass, leaves, debris or excessive lubricants.

Use extra care with grass catchers and other attachments. These can change the stability of the unit. Use only approved hitch points.

ALWAYS be aware of attachments when turning. ALWAYS allow adequate clearance between attachments, personnel, and other objects.

ASSEMBLY


INSTALLING THE DRIVE UNIT TO THE MOWER DECK FOR RAPID UNITS

NOTE: The long mower drive kit (78500700) must be installed onto the mower deck before the mower is connected to Rapid Units.

IMPORTANT: Only use the long mower drive kit (78500700) to attach the 30-inch mower to Rapid units.

Install Long Mower Drive Kit (78500700) (Figure 3)

- 1. Place the drive kit down through the circular opening in the top of the mower deck.
- Install drive kit (78500700) on mower deck and seven counterweights (p/n 08691200) with five 1/2" x 3-1/4" hex bolts (p/n 05960000), flat washers (p/n 06442000), and 1/2" locknuts (p/n 06540600).



WARNING: Mower blades are sharp and can cut. Wrap mower blade(s) or wear gloves to service.

NOTE: See the *Mower Height Adjustment* on page 11 for additional information about adjusting mower height using additional spacers.



WARNING: A minimum of one 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacer must always be located between the mower blades and the locknut.

The locknut to the mower shaft must be tightened to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).

- 3. Install mower blade(s) onto shaft. If two mower blades are used, they should be installed at right angles to each other with one 1/8" spacer located between mower blades. See figure 9 on page 11 for an illustration on how to install the mower blade.
- 4. Install the locknut to the mower shaft and tighten it to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).

INSTALLING THE DRIVE UNIT TO THE MOWER DECK FOR GEAR TWO-WHEEL TRACTORS

NOTE: Depending on the type of gear two-wheel tractor, the long mower drive Kit (78500700) or the short mower drive kit (78500600) must be installed onto the mower deck before the mower is connected to the gear two-wheel tractor.

Install Drive Kit (Figure 4)

- 1. Place the drive unit down through the circular opening in the top of the mower deck.
- Install drive kit on mower deck and one counterweight (p/n 08691200) with five 1/2" x 1-3/4" hex bolts (p/n 05970600), flat washers (p/n 06442000), and 1/2" locknuts (p/n 06540600).


NOTE: See the *Mower Height Adjustment* on page 11 for additional information about adjusting mower height using additional spacers.



WARNING: A minimum of one 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacer must always be located between the mower blades and the locknut.

The locknut to the mower shaft must be tightened to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).

3. Install mower blade(s) onto shaft. If two mower blades are used, they should be installed at right angles to each other with one 1/8" spacer located between mower blades. See figure 9 on page 11 for an illustration on how to install the mower blade. 4. Install the locknut to the mower shaft and tighten it to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).




INSTALLING AND REMOVING THE MOWER DECK ON RAPID UNITS

WARNING: ROTATING PARTS can cut off body parts. Keep hands and feet away. Loose clothing, long hair or scarves can get caught in rotating parts and cause death or serious injury.

Installation

- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 2. Install 1/4" x 1/2" hex bolt (p/n 05947900) and 1/4" locknut (p/n 06529700) as shown in figure 5.

NOTE: The Rapid two-wheel tractor adapter (kit 78510700) is required to attach the 30-inch mower deck to Rapid units.

IMPORTANT: Remove coupler sleeve (p/n 035035) from drive kit. Rapid units must use coupler leave, part number 08691300, from kit 78510700.

- 3. Install Rapid two-wheel tractor adapter to drive kit with four quick-hitch studs (p/n 08531300), coupler sleeve (p/n 08691300), and eight 1/2" center locknuts (figure 6).
- 4. Install 30-inch mower deck to the Rapid unit.

IMPORTANT: MAKE SURE the attachment locking pin is completely seated prior to engaging the PTO (see rapid owner's manual).



Removal

- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 2. Remove 30-Inch mower deck from the Rapid unit.
- 3. Remove Rapid two-wheel tractor adapter from 30-inch mower deck.

INSTALLING AND REMOVING THE MOWER DECK ON GEAR TWO-WHEEL TRACTORS




WARNING: ROTATING PARTS can cut off body parts. Keep hands and feet away. Loose

clothing, long hair or scarves can get caught in rotating parts and cause death or serious injury.

Installation

- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 2. Put the splined coupling onto the splined shaft of the mower deck drive unit (figure 7).
- 3. Fasten the mower deck drive housing to the tractor PTO unit using two locknuts (upper) and two bolts (lower).



Removal

- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 2. Lower the tractor stand and tighten the adjusting handle.
- 3. Remove the two locknuts and two bolts that fasten the mower deck to the tractor (figure 7).
- 4. Pull the mower from the tractor.
- 5. Put the coupling on the splined shaft of the mower.

OPERATION

WARNING: AVOID INJURY. Read and understand the entire *Safety* section before proceeding.

Read this owner's manual and the power unit's owner's manual before operating the mower.



WARNING: Use a slow tractor speed until you know how to operate the mower.

- 1. Start the engine. Wait until the engine is running smoothly before operating.
- 2. Engage the PTO.
- 3. Move the throttle lever to fast.
- 4. Select a slow ground speed
- 5. Mow approximately ten feet (3m). Turn off the PTO and shut off the engine.

- 6. See if the mower is cutting at the correct height. If height requires adjustment, see *Mower Height Adjustment* on page 11.
- 7. If the mower does not follow the ground correctly, see *Swivel Adjustment* on page 11.
- 8. When the mower is properly adjusted, resume mowing. Select a slow speed at first, and then select a speed that is best for your experience and mowing conditions.

MAINTENANCE



WARNING: AVOID INJURY. Read and understand the entire *Safety* section before proceeding.

Gravely Dealers will provide any service or adjustments which may be required to keep your unit operating at peak efficiency.

The chart below shows the recommended maintenance schedule that should be performed on a regular basis. More frequent service may be required due to working conditions (heavy loads, high ambient temperatures, dusty conditions, or airborne debris).

See engine and power unit owner's manuals for further maintenance and trouble shooting information.

WARNING: Stop engine, wait for moving parts to stop, remove key, and remove wire from spark plug before attempting any lubrication or maintenance procedures.



CAUTION: DO NOT touch engine parts which are hot from operation. Allow such parts to cool before servicing.

SHARPENING MOWER BLADE

CAUTION: DO NOT sharpen mower blade while on unit. An unbalanced mower blade will cause excessive vibration and eventual damage to unit. Check mower blade balance prior to reinstalling mower blades. NEVER weld or straighten mower blades.

1. Remove mower blade.


IMPORTANT: Gravely recommends having mower blades sharpened by a professional. Contact your Gravely dealer.

Discard mower blade if (figure 8):

- more than 1/2 in. (1.27 cm) of metal is removed.
- the air lift erosion area is eroded.
- the mower blade is bent or broken.

Do not change angle of cutting edge or round the corner at the end of mower blade.

- 2. Sharpen mower blade by removing an equal amount of material from each end of mower blade.
- 3. Check mower blade balance by sliding mower blade on an unthreaded bolt. If blade is balanced, it should remain in a horizontal position. If either end of mower blade moves downward, sharpen the heavy end until mower blade is balanced.
- 4. Install mower blade and spacers, tighten the locknut to 100 lbf-ft. (135 N•m) torque.




LUBRICATION

NOTE: The 30-inch mower does not require any lubrication.

IMPORTANT: Prior to apply grease thoroughly clean all components.

Apply grease to the lube fittings on the drive kit until it shows at the mower shaft under the mower deck and at the swivel adjustment (figure 9).



ADJUSTMENTS

Mower Height Adjustment



DANGER: To avoid inadvertent blade contact, NEVER attempt to make any cutting height adjustment while engine is running.

All adjustments to the mower height are made by moving 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacers from one side of the mower blade to the other to raise or lower the mowing height by 1/4" (6.4 mm). There are a total of six 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacers included for a single mower blade. There are a total of five 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacers and one 1/8" (3.2 mm) spacer for a twin mower blade. All the spacers must be used either above or below the mower blade(s).




WARNING: A minimum of one 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacer must always be located between the mower blades and the locknut.

To adjust mower height:

- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 2. Turn the mower deck over and block the mower blade so it cannot move.

WARNING: Mower blades are sharp and can cut. Wrap mower blade(s) or wear gloves to service.

- Turn the locknut on the mower shaft counterclockwise to remove. Retain all hardware (figure 9).
- 1. Stop engine, remove ignition key, and wait for all




- To lower mowing height, add required number of 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacers above mower blades.
- To raise mowing height, remove required number of 1/4" (6.4 mm) spacers from above mower blades.
- 3. Reinstall the lock nut to the mower shaft and tighten it to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).



WARNING: The lock nut to mower shaft must be tightened to a torque of 100 lbf-ft (135 N•m).

Swivel Adjustment

The swivel adjustment allows mower deck to follow ground during mowing. The swivel is properly adjusted when mower deck will not swivel when raised by pushing down on the handlebars, but will follow ground during mowing.



To adjust swivel:

moving parts to stop.

- 2. Turn nut on swivel adjustment clockwise to tighten adjustment, and counterclockwise to loosen swivel (figure 10).
- 3. Retest swivel adjustment and repeat as necessary.

STORAGE



WARNING: AVOID INJURY. Read and understand the entire *Safety* section before proceeding.

IMPORTANT: Take steps to prevent rust and corrosion. Never spray unit with water or store unit outdoors. Water can seep into sealed bearings, which are sealed against dirt and debris only, causing reduced component life. Keep all nuts, bolts and screws tight and know unit is in safe working condition. Check all hardware at regular intervals

Inspection

Inspect mower for visible signs of wear, breakage or damage. Order any parts required and make necessary repairs to avoid delays when beginning use again.



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


