



## set up cooling pad


#### 1. insert knobs (optional)

To increase the angle at which your netbook will sit on the pad, insert the two knobs into the pre-drilled holes that provide best support for your netbook.



3. position your netbook on the cooling pad




4. connect USB cable to cooling pad



5. connect USB cables to netbook




6. turn fan on and adjust the fan speed as desired




### connect mouse

2. insert batteries




3. replace cover


4. connect USB nano receiver



5. turn mouse on




#### bottom view of mouse



## product operating tips

## cooling pad

- When the cooling pad is connected and on, the power indicator light glows blue.
- Turning the fan speed control to the far right will stop the fan without turning off the cooling pad.
- The USB power cord and angle position knobs can be stored in the cooling pad when not in use. To open the storage slot, press the right side button:



#### mouse

- Store the USB nano receiver in the storage slot in the bottom of the mouse.
- Switch off your mouse when traveling or to conserve battery life.
- The scroll wheel is also a button. Press the scroll wheel (without rolling it) to automatically scroll a document or web page, then move your mouse up or down to set the automatic scroll speed.
- Your mouse has two sensitivity settings, standard mode and high-performance mode. High-performance mode allows the cursor to move very quickly, and is useful for activities such as gaming. Press the DPI button (behind the scroll wheel) to switch from standard mode to high-performance mode and back.

## troubleshooting

situation	try this
cooling pad fans do not work	<ul> <li>Ensure the USB power cable is properly connected.</li> <li>Ensure your netbook is turned on.</li> <li>Ensure the cooling pad power switch is turned to the on position.</li> <li>Ensure the fan speed control is not turned all the way to the right.</li> </ul>
mouse does not work	<ul> <li>Ensure the USB nano receiver is connected.</li> <li>Connect the USB nano receiver to a different USB port.</li> <li>Check that the batteries are inserted correctly.</li> <li>Install fresh batteries.</li> <li>Move the mouse closer to the USB nano receiver.</li> <li>Ensure the optical sensor on the bottom of the mouse is clean.</li> </ul>


