Warnings and Precautions



This symbol, located on back or bottom of the unit, is intended to alert the user to the presence of uninsulated "dangerous voltage" within the product's enclosure that may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute a risk of electric shock to persons.



- 10. Ventilation Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This product should not be placed in a bull-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacture's instruction have been adhered to.
- 11. Power Sources This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instruction.
- 12. Grounding or Polarization This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarizes plug.
 - Alternate Warnings This product is equipped with a three-wire grounding-type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin. This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace

- your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.
- 13. Power-Cord Protection Power supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and point where they exit from the product.
- 14. Protective Attachment Plug The product is equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See Instruction Manual for replacement or resetting of protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug.
- 15. Outdoor Antenna Grounding If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna-discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

- 16. Lightning For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 17. Power Lines An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.
- Overloading Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or integral convenience receptacles as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- 19. Object and Liquid Entry Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the product.
- 20. Servicing Do not attempt to service this product yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

- e) If the product has been dropped or damaged in any way, and
- f) When the product exhibits a distinct change in performance - this indicates a need for service.
- 22. Replacement Parts When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.
- Safety Check Upon completion of any service or repairs to this product, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine that the product is in proper operating condition.
- Wall or Ceiling Mounting The product should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.
- 25. Heat The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat. Battery shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or the like.





Powering the Unit

To power the unit, plug the included AC cord into a standard AC outlet (120V~60Hz)





The unit can also be powered by batteries. (Requires 8 C size batteries, not included).

Do not mix old and new batteries.

Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nicad, ni-mh, etc) batteries.

Docking an iPod

- Step 1: Turn the Adjustable Dial for iPod until the arrow on the dial is pointing to the listed iPod model to be docked.
 - iPod models and memory sizes that are not listed on the Dock Adjustment Dial can be docked by manually adjusting the dial to the depth that fits the iPod best.
- **Step 2:** Locate the numbered *Bracket* that fits the iPod that will be docked.
 - Each included Bracket has a number on it, indicating which iPod model that bracket is compatible with. See the separate bracket chart page to identify which bracket is needed.
- **Step 3:** Snap the *Bracket* into place over the iPod connector in the dock.
- **Step 4:** Connect the iPod to the iPod connector inside the dock for iPod.
 - When the unit is plugged in, using AC power, the docked iPod will charge. If the unit is running on batteries, DC power, the docked iPod will not charge.

Playing an iPod

- **Step 1:** After docking an iPod, press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- **Step 2:** Press the **Source Button** to switch to *iPod Mode*.
- **Step 3:** Press the **Play/Pause Button** to begin playing the docked iPod.


Tuning the Radio

- **Step 1:** Press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- **Step 2:** Press the **Source Button** to switch to *Radio Mode*.
- **Step 3:** Press the **AM/FM Button** to switch to AM or FM radio mode.
- **Step 4:** Turn the **Tuning Dial** to the desired station.
- **Step 5:** Extend the FM Antenna to improve FM radio reception.
 - An AM antenna is built into the unit. Adjust the unit to improve AM radio reception.

Using the Auxiliary Input

- **Step 1:** Connect an MP3 player or other audio source to the **Auxiliary Input**.
 - This requires a 3.5mm auxiliary input cable, not included.
- **Step 2:** Press the **Power Button** to turn the unit on.
- **Step 3:** Press the **Source Button** to switch to *Aux Mode*.
- **Step 4:** Audio played from the connected MP3 player or other audio source will now be heard through the unit's speakers.

Locations of Controls



Control Definitions

1. Power Button

Adjust the Power Button to turn the unit off and on.

2. Source Switch

Adjust the Source Switch to change between Radio, iPod, and Auxiliary Mode.

3. AM/FM Button

Press the AM/FM Button to switch between AM and FM radio modes.

4. LCD Display

The LCD Displays unit information.

5. Volume Dial

Turn the Volume Dial to adjust the volume of the unit.

6. DBBS (Dynamic Bass Boost System) Switch

Adjust the DBBS Switch to turn the DBBS off or on.

7. Auxiliary Input

Use the Auxiliary Input to connect an external audio source, like an MP3 player, to the unit.

8. Headphone Jack

Use the Headphone Jack to connect a set of headphones or earbuds to the unit.

9. Adjustable Dial for iPod

Use the Adjustable Dial for iPod to provide adequate back support for the iPod to be docked.

10. Play/Pause Button

Press the Play/Pause Button to play or pause a docked iPod.

11. REW/FWD Buttons

Press the REW/FWD Buttons to skip between tracks on a docked iPod.

Press and hold the REW/FWD Buttons to search through an individual song on a docked iPod.

12. FM Antenna

Extend the FM Antenna to improve FM radio reception.

An AM antenna is built into the unit. Adjust the unit to improve AM radio reception.

13. Tuning Dial

Turn the Tuning Dial to adjust the unit's current AM or FM radio station.

14. AC Power Input

Use the AC Power Input to connect the unit to a standard AC power outlet.

15. Battery Compartment (Requires 8 C batteries, not included)
