Antenna Connection

Generally speaking, to enjoy a clearer picture, we recommend that you use a CATV system or an outdoor antenna. In different places, the suitable antenna type and position are different.





To improve the picture quality in a poor signal area, please purchase a signal amplifier and install properly.
 If the antenna needs to be split for two TV's, install a "2-Way Signal Splitter" in the connections.
 If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

NOTE: All cables shown are not included with the TV.

Choose Your Connection

There are several ways to connect your television, depending on the components you want to connect and the quality of the signal you want to achieve. The following are examples of some ways to connect your TV. Choose the connection which is best for you.

VCR connection

- To avoid picture noise (interference), leave an adequate distance between the VCR and TV

Connection Option 1

Set VCR output switch to channel3 or 4 and then tune the TV to the same channel number.


Connection Option 2

1. Connect the audio and video cables from the VCR's output jacks to the TV input jacks, as shown in the figure. When connecting the TV to VCR, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red). If you connectan S-VIDEO output from VCR to

the S-VIDEO input, the picture quality is improved; compared to connecting a regular VCR to the Video input.

2. Insert a video tape into the VCR and press PLAY on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual.)

3. Select the input source with using the INPUT button on the remote control to select the source.



External A/V Source Setup


How to connect

Connect the audio and video cables from the external equipment's output jacks to the TV input jacks, as shown in the figure. When connecting the TV to external equipment, match the jack colors (Video = yellow, Audio Left = white, and Audio Right = red).

How to use

1. Select the input source with using the INPUT button on the remote control.

2. Operate the corresponding external equipment.



DVD connection

How to connect

 Connect the DVD video outputs (Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr) to the Y, Pb, Pr jacks on the TV and connect the DVD audio outputs to the YPbPr Audio IN jacks on the TV, as shown in the figure.
 If your DVD only has an S-VIDEO output jack, connect this to the S-VIDEO input on the TV. as shown in the figure.

NOTE: If your DVD player does not have component video output, use S-Video.

How to use

1. Turn on the DVD player, inserta DVD.

2. Use the INPUT button on the remote control to select YPbPr mode.


3. Press Playbutton on external equipment for programplay.

4. Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

- This TV can receive Digital Over-the-Air/Cable signals without an external digital set-top box. However, if you do receive Digital signals from a digital set-top box or other digital external device, refer to the figure as shown below.

- This TV supports HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Contents Protection) protocol for Digital Contents (480p,720p,1080i).


How to connect

Use the TV's (Y, PB, PR), VGAor HDMI jack for video connections, depending on your set-top box connector. Then, make the corresponding audio connections.

How to use

Turnon the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
 Use INPUT on the remote control to select **YPbPr**, **VGA**, or **HDMI** source.

How ToConnect

1. Connect the source device to HDMI port of this TV with an HDMI cable (not supplied with this product).

2. No separated audio connection is necessary.

How ToUse

- If the source device supports Auto HDMI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.

- If the source device does not support Auto HDMI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.
- Toget the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1280x720p.
- Select HDMI input source in input source option of Select Main source menu.

<When the source device(DVD player or Set Top Box) supports DVI>

How ToConnect

1. Connect the source device to HDMI port of this TV with a HDMI-to-DVI cable (not supplied with this product).

2. Aseparated audio connection is necessary.

3. If the source device has an analog audiooutput connector, connect the source device audio output to DVI Audio In portlocated on the left side of HDMI port.

How ToUse

- If the source device supports Auto DVI function, the output resolution of the source device will be automatically set to 1280x720p.

- If the source device does not support Auto DVI, you need to set the output resolution appropriately.

To get the best picture quality, adjust the output resolution of the source device to 1280x720p.

PC connection

How to connect

1 . To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics card to 1024x768 .

2. Use the TV's PCor DVI (Digital Visual Interface) port for videoconnections, depending onyour PC connector.

■ If the graphiccard on the PC does not output analog and digital RGB simultaneously, connect only one of either VGAIN or DVIIN to display the PC on the TV.

■ If the graphic card on the PC doesoutput analog and digital RGB simultaneously, set the TV to either VGA or DVI; (the other mode is set to Plugand Play automatically by the TV.)

3. Then, make the corresponding audio connection. If using a soundcard, adjust the PC sound as required.

How to use

1. Turnon the PCand the TV.

2. Turnon the displayby pressing the POWER button on the TV's remote control.

3. Use INPUTor VGAor HDMI on the remote control to select VGAor HDMI source.

4. Check theimage on yourTV. There maybe noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrastor brightness inPC mode. If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.



Connecting Headphones

You can connect a set of headphones to your set if you wish to watch a TV programme without disturbing the other people in the room.




Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5mm mini-jack socket on the rear panel of the set.

Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.
 You will not receive sound from the speakers when you connect headphones to the system.

Power Source



TO USE AC POWER SOURCE

Use the AC polarized line cord provided for operation on AC. Insert the AC cord plug into a standard polarized AC outlet.

NOTES:

■ Never connect the AC line cord plug to other than the specified voltage. Use the attached power cord only.

If the polarized AC cord does not fit into a non-polarized AC outlet, do not attempt to file or cut the blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.
 If you cause a static discharge when touching the unit and the unit fails to function, simply unplug the unitfrom the AC outlet and plug it back in. The unit should return to normal operation.

Operation

- -In the manual, the OSD (on screen display) may be different from your TV`s, because it is just an example to help you with the TV operation.
- -There are several options you might need to set up in order for your TV to work properly. Read the instructions that follow.

Switching On/Off the TV set

- 1. First, connect power cord correctly.
- 2. Select the viewing source by using INPUT button on the remote control.
- 3. When finished using the TV, press the **POWER** button on the remote control. The TV reverts to standby mode.
- 4. If you intend to be away on vacation, disconnect the power plug from the wall power outlet.

Note:

If the TV in power on , the screen show information according the type of input signal . the information will disappear. If there is no signal, the No signal will display on the left bottom of the screen.

Choose the Menu Language

When you start using your set for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.



1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **Settings** menu.

2 Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Menu Language.

3 Press the button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to enter the list of available language. (English, Spanish or French)

4 Select your language with the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button and press the OK button to confirm you selection.

5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press the **EXIT** button to return to normal viewing or press **◄ / MENU** button to return to the previous menu.

Choose the Input Source

- Change the picture source so you can watch your TV, cable TV, VCR, DVD, or any other devices that are connected to your TV.
- 1. Press **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **Video** menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select Select Source option.
- 3 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the available Source. (TV, CVBS,S-Video, YPbPr, HDMI, VGA, VGA-YPbPr)
- 4. Press the OK button to confirm.

5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press the **EXIT** button to return to normal viewing or press **◄ / MENU** button to return to the previous menu.

You can also press the INPUT button repeatedly to select the desired source.



Channel menu

This TV set has two methods to set channels, which are respectively Scan Channel, Add Channel.

■ In this section, how to use the remote control to set channel is explained. You can also use buttons on the TV set to set channel.

Note

Make sure you are in an open environment where there is a good signal while scanning so that it is able to find all channels more easily.

Scan Channel

- Automatically finds all channels available through antenna or cable inputs, and stores them in memory on the All Channel List.

Note : the Channel menu will be only operated in normal TV mode.

1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Channels** menu.

2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select Scan Channel.

3 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to Select **Cable** or **Antenna** mode.

4 Press the OK button to start searching channel.

While it is scanning for channels, at any point, you can interrupt the scanning process by pressing the **Stop Scan** button. Those channels have been scanned would be stored in the available channel table.

5 After you finish scanning for available channels, you may select **DONE** to return the display window.

When **Antenna** is selected, the TV will detect antenna signals and will search for antenna TV (NTSC and ATSC) channels available in your local area.

When **Cable** is selected, the TV will detect cable company supplied signals and will search for cable TV (NTSC, ATSC, QAM modulated) channels available in your area.

Add Channel

If excessive channel signals of unwanted programs are received in local area, manual search function is recommended.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Channels** menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / ∇ button to select Add Channel.

3 Press the ► button and then use digital buttons to input channel number you want to add channel.

4 Press the OK button to confirm.

 ${\bf 5}\,$ When you are satisfied with your choice, $\, {\rm press}\, {\bf MENU}\, {\rm button}\, {\rm to}\, {\rm return}\,$

to the previous menu.

6 Press EXIT button to return to TV viewing or press ◀/ MENU button to return to the previous menu.

Note

Make sure your TV is placed in an open environment where is a good signal while scanning so that it is able to find all channels more easily.

If user does not proceed **scan channel** in advance, it will take Antenna as the default source.

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Channel menu

Favorites

- You can create your own Favorite List. when a channel is highlighted and then you can add or delete the channel to/from the Favorite List.
- You can skip some channel;
- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channels menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select Favorites.
- 3 Press the ► button to call up favorites list menu.
- 4 Use $\blacktriangle/ \bigtriangledown/ \lt/ \lor$ button to select option, and then use the **OK** button to confirm.

5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press **◄/ MENU** button to return to the previous menu or Press **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.



- 1 Press the MENU button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channels menu.
- 2 Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / \lor button to select Channel list.
- 3 Press the ▶ button to call up Channel list menu.
- 4 Use ▲/▼/◀/▶ button to select option, and then use the OK button to confirm.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press ◀/ MENU button to return to the previous menu or Press EXIT button to return to TV viewing.










Video menu

The TV menu gives you an overview of the menus you can select.

Note: Depending on the input signal, one or more menu items may not be selectable.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Video** menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired items.
- **3** Press the **b** button and then use \blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown button to adjust the setting.
- **4** Press the OK button to confirm.
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.
 - Select Source: Select the video input source.
 - Picture Settings: Adjust the picture setting.
 - Aspect Ratio: Select the displayaspect ratio.
 - Color temperature
 - This will increase or decrease **Warm** (red) and **Cool** (blue) colors to suit personal preferences.
 - Back Light: Adjust the backlightvalue.
 - Screen Adjustment: Adjust the picture position.



Picture Settings

- 1 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **Picture Settings**.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown button to select the desired item.
- 3 Press the OK button to confirm.
- 4 Press the button and then use $\blacktriangle / \triangledown$ button to adjust the setting.
- 5 Press the OK button to confirm.
- **6** When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.

Preset

This provides the pre-defined images settings, There are standard, vivid, movie, Pro and custom modes provided for usage.

- Standard: normal mode.
- Vivid: mode of watching the movement of picture.
- Mild: the effect of the picture is soft.
- Custom: picture effect which you favorite.
- Pro: Professional mode, it's can be used in VGA source.

Contrast

This will adjust the intensity of bright parts in the picture but keep the dark parts unchanged.

Brightness

This will adjust the light output of the complete picture, which will mainly affect the darker areas of the picture.

Hue

Allows you to select the color mix (Hue) of the picture.

Saturation

This will adjust the saturation level of the colors to suit your personal preference.

Sharpness

This will adjust the sharpness of fine details in the picture.

Noise Reduction

Automatically filters out and reduces the image noise and improves picture quality when receiving weak video signals.





Note:

Only when the item of mode is custom , the Contrast、Brightness、Hue、 Saturation、Sharpness can be set by user . In other mode the value of them are preset by program .

Video menu

Aspect Ratio Control

- Lets you choose the way an analog picture with a 4:3 aspect ratio is displayed on your TV with a 16:9 ratio picture format.

- Note: If a fixed image is displayed on the screen for a long time, it image may become imprinted on the screen and remain visible.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select the **Video** menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select the Aspect Ratio.
- 3 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select the desired item.
- 4 Press the **OK** button to confirm.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.



■ 1:1 Mode

Select to display the picture at the center with the same resolution as the input source.

Normal

Select to display the picture to fit the screen **without** distorting the aspect ratio.

Full

Select to display the picture to fill the screen.

Panoramic

Select to display the picture on the screen by linear scaling the center 50 % area and increase the scaling factor at 25% left and right sides.


Zoom

Select to display the enlarged picture.

You can also press the ARC button to select Aspect Ratio.

Notes

■ In VGA mode, only 1:1 Mode, Full, Normal can be selected.



Video menu

Screen adjustment

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Video** menu.
- **2** Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select the Screen Adjustment.
- 3 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$ button to select option.
- 4 Press ◀/▶ button to adjust the setting and press OK button.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press ◀ or MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the EXIT button to return to TV viewing.
 - Horizontal: Adjust the position of the picture left and right.
 - Vertical: Adjust the position of the picture up and down.
 - Phase: Adjust the distortion effects of horizontal wavy lines or ripples.
 - Auto Sync: Adjust the display position and phase of the picture automatically.

Color Temperature

This will increase or decrease **Warm** (red) and **Cool**(blue) colors to suit personal preferences.

Select **Cool** to give the white colors a blue tint, **Native** to give the white colors a neutral tint, **Warm** to give the white colors a red tint.

- Cool: Select to give the white colors a bluish tint.
- Native: Select to give the white colors a native tint.
- Warm: Select to give the white colors a reddish tint.
- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Video** menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Color Temperature.
- 3 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \triangle / ∇ button to select option.
- 4 press OK button.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press ◀ or **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.


Back Light

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select the **Video** menu.
- 2 Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / ∇ button to select the Back Light.
- 3 Press the button and then use $\blacktriangle / \checkmark$ button to select option.
- 4 press OK button.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press ◀ or MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the EXIT button to return to TV viewing.
 - Bright Room: Select the bright backlight setting.
 - Dark Room: Select the dark backlight setting.
 - Medium Room: Select the native backlight setting.









Audio menu

Bass, Treble and Balance Setup

- **1** Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **Audio** menu.
- 2 Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Bass, Treble & Balance.
- 3 Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / ∇ button to select desired item.
- 4 Press the button and then use $\blacktriangle / \triangledown$ button to adjust the setting.
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.

Bass

This will adjust the bass output level.

Treble

This will adjust the treble output level.

Balance

This will adjust the output of the right and left speakers to obtain the best stereo reproduction for your listening position.

MTS

- This TV can receive MTS stereo programs and SAP (Secondary Audio Program) that accompanies the stereo program; if the station transmits an additional sound signal as well as the original one.

- When having selected SAP button on the remote control, this TV can only receive the signal when the TV station transmits the proper signals.
- Mono sound is automatically received if the broadcast is only in Mono; even though Stereo or SAP has been selected.
- Select Monoif you want to listen to mono sound during stereo/SAP broadcasting.
- Stereo or SAP can be received in a Analog channel.
- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Audio** menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select MTS.
- 3 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select desired item.
- 4 Press OK button to confirm.
- **5** When you are satisfied with your choice, press MENU button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.

You can also use the **SAP** button to select your desired MTS mode in a analog signal. Each time you press the **SAP** button, **Mono**, **Stereo**, or **SAP** appear.

If other languages are available on the digital signal, select them with the **SAP** button.







Audio menu

Mute

When you need to pay attention to surrounded sounds, or there is a telephone calling you or there are some guests visiting you, the sound elimination (mute) function is very convenient.

1 Press the MUTE button on the remote control and "◄ " type face will display on the screen. At this time, the sound of the TV set is turned off.

2 If you want to recover the sound, press the MUTE button again or directly press VOL+/- button.

Timer setting

The timer setting will only work if the TV set is turned on or in standby. Switch on/off automatically at the time you presetting.

2.Please kindly be aware of the Timer Setting will take effective only after you finish setting and shut off the TV. Then the system will start to final countdown. Otherwise, the function will be ineffective.

Sleep Timer Setting

The sleep timerautomatically shuts off the TVafter a presettime (from 30 to 120 minutes).

- 1 Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select the **Time** menu.
- 2 Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the SleepTimer.

When the number of minutes you want is displayed on the screen, press the **OK** button. The time begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.

- 5 To cancel the setsleep timer: Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select OFF.

You can use the SLEEP button also to select quickly the sleep timer.

Daylight Saving setting

Daylight saving time is automatically set by specially broadcasted signals. This menu item allows you to disable the automatic setting of daylight saving time. This is useful if you live in an area or state where daylight saving is not applied, but you receive channels from other areas where daylight saving signals are broadcasted.

1. Press \blacktriangle / \blacksquare button to select Adjust for Daylight Saving item.

2、Press the ▶ button to select **On** for automatic clock correction for daylight saving time, based on specially broadcasted signals. Select **Off** to disable automatic clock correction based on the specially broadcasted signals.





Settings Menu

Closed Captions

Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words which then appear as subtitles on the television screen. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

Using Closed Captions

Captions are the subtitles of the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. Its possible to caption a live program by using a process called real-time captioning, which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system and computer for translation into English. Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also aid in teaching language skills.

CC Activation

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown button to select the **Settings** menu.
- 2. Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select Closed Caption.
- 2. Press the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the CC Activation.
- 3. Press the OK button to select On or Off mode.

4. When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.

Caption Service

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view the digital captioning.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Settings** menu.
- 2. Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / \lor button to select Closed Caption.
- 2. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / ∇ button to select **Caption Service**.
- 3. Press the ► button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select caption: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text1, Text2, Text3, or Text4.

4. When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.

The term for the words that scroll across the bottom of the TV screen; usually the audio portion of the program provided for the hearing impaired.

TEXT

The term for the words that appear in a large black frame and almost cover the entire screen; usually messages provided by the broadcaster.

Digital Caption Service (In DTV mode)

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view the digital captioning. Select one of the digital service channels made available by the captionprovider. There are 6 standard services. Caption Service 1 is designated as the Primary Caption Service. This service contains the verbatim, or near-verbatim captions for the primary language being spoken in the accompanying program audio.

Caption Service 2 is designated as the Secondary Language Service. This service contains captions in a secondary language which are translations of the captions in the primary Caption Service. The other service subchannels are not pre-assigned. It is up to the discretion of the individual caption provider to utilize the remaining service channels.

1. Press the **MENU** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Settings** menu.

- 2. Press the ▶ button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select Closed Caption.
- 2. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use \blacktriangle / \lor button to select **Digital Caption Service**.
- 3. Press the \blacktriangleright button and then use $\blacktriangle/$ \blacktriangledown button to select caption: CS1, CS2, CS3, CS4, CS5, CS6.

4. When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.











Digital Caption Option (In DTV mode)

This allows you to modify how digital captions are displayed on your TV. Select from the following options to change the visual characteristics of your TV's digital captioning.

- Customize the DTV/CADTV captions that appear on your screen.
- 1. Press the **MENU** button and then use \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown button to select the **Settings** menu.
- 2. Press the button and then use \blacktriangle / \checkmark button to select Closed Caption.

- 5. Use \blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown / \blacklozenge / \blacklozenge button to customize the Style, Font, etc., to your preference.

- 7. When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to the previous menu or press the **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.
 - **Text Style**: Select the caption text style.
 - Color(Text): Set the caption text color.
 - Opacity(Text): Select the caption text opacity.
 - Size(Text): Select the caption text size.
 - Align(Text): Select the caption text-align position.
 - **Edge Color:** Set the caption edge color.
 - **Style:** Select the caption edge style.
 - **Background:** Set the caption background color.
 - Opacity(Background): Select the caption background opacity.
 - Frame Color: Set the caption frame color.
 - **Opacity(Frame)**: Select the caption frame opacity.







Caption Preference (In DTV mode)

 - Always Caption Service: Always to turn on analog caption service.
 - Always Digital Caption Service: Always to turn on digital caption service.
 - **Automatic**: Automatically turn on the analog or digital caption service depends on the source signal.



Parental Control

Parental Control can be used to block specific channels, ratings and other viewing sources.

The Parental Control Function is used to block program viewing based on the ratings sent by the broadcasting station.

The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by choosing the type of the program and the categories.

It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use this function, the following must be done :

- 1. Set ratings and categories to be blocked.
- 2. Specify a password
- 3. Enable the lock

Parental Control rating and categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcasting stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System (MPAA) only.

USA-TV Rating

The Parental control will automatically block certain categories that are "more restrictive". For example, if you block "TV-Y" category, then TV-Y7 will automatically be blocked. Similarly, if you block the TV-G category, then all the categories in the "young adult" group will be blocked (TV-Y, TV-Y7, TV-G, TV-PG, TV-14, and TV-MA). The sub-ratings (D, L, S, V) work together similarly.


Quick Program View

This function enables quick swap to the last watched program.

 $1\,$ Suppose the channel number you used just now is 8 and the channel number you are using is 18(as shown in the figure).

 $2\,$ If you want to return to the last watched program channel 8, you can simply press the Q.View button.

3 If you want to return to channel 18, press the button again. Use this function, you can easily change between the channel you are using and the channel you used last time.



Setting Up Your Remote Control

After it has been setup properly, your remote control can operate in six different modes: TV, VCR, CABLE, DVD, SETBOX or AUDIO. Pressing the corresponding button on the remote control allows you to switch between these modes, and control whichever piece of equipment you choose.

Note:

The remote control might not be compatible with all DVD Players, VCRs and Cable boxes.



Controller Operation

To control a device using the Controller

- Program the Controller to work with your device.
 Changing device mode by pressing the SELECT key. Default device is TV. When press SELECT key, current device led will be on. Keep pressing SELECT key to choose a device, the loop is: TV DVD VCR STB Cable Audio - TV. When device is set, related device LED will be on for 5 seconds and then be off.
- 3. Aim the remote at the device.
- 4. Press the **POWER** button to turn the device on.
- 5. Use the other Controller buttons to operate the device. Device LED will blink if user presses any key (if the key has data in current mode.). If the key has no data, then LED will not blink.
- 6. Default initstatus: TV/Haier001 code.
- 7. Bulb keyto control the flash light.

Programming the Controller

The Controller is factory-programmed to support up to 600 code sets.

- There are two ways to program the Controller:
- Selecting a brand code for the device you wish to operate, and then entering that code manually into the Controller.
- Using the PowerScan feature to find device codes automatically.
- The two programming methods are described in the following sections.

Manually Programming the Controller

- 1. Using **SELECT** key to choose the device you want to program.
- While Press and holding OK key, press SELECT key, and device LED will be ON. Keep the status for about 5 seconds, release both keys and then LED will blink twice per second, indicating that the Controller is ready for programming.
- 3. Led will blink once when you enter a digit key, indicating the digit key is programmed. If 3 digits are programmed successfully, device LED will be ON for about 3 seconds and then blink twice per second. Then User now can:
 - a) Try to operate the device by using **POWER** or **PLAY** keys. If operation can be done, press **OK** to save current 3-digits code and exiting manually programming mode.
- b) Return to beginning of step 3. Reprogram the controller.
- 5. If user's input is incorrect, LED will blink 12 times in 3 seconds. And then keep twice per second blink, user now can return to step 3 and re-program the device.
- Within 10 seconds, user should enter the 3-digit brand code corresponding to your device. If time out or any key other than POWER, PLAY and digits is pressed, LED will be off and manually programming process is exit.
- 7. Fast Programming Haier default TV code set. Press and holding the **EXIT** key and then press **SELECT** key for 5 seconds, default Haier code set (001) will be programmed to the controller.

Manually scan mode

With manually scan programming, the Controller tests all the codes available in the code set data base and assign the correct one for the selected device.

- To manually-scan program the Controller:
- 1. Manually turn OFF the device for manually scan mode. (TV, VCR, DVD, STB, cable box or audio equipment).
- 2. Press **SELECT** key to choose the device you wish to program.
- While Press and holding **OK** key, press the **SELECT** key and device LED will be ON. Keep the status for about5 seconds, release both keys and then LED will blink twice persecond, indicating that the Controller is ready for programming.
- 3. Press and release the CH+/CH- key. The LED blinks 10 timesper seconds, indicating that the Remote is in manually scan mode.
- 4. Press CH+/CH- key repeatedly until the device switches ON (CH+ key conducts a upward search while the CH- key conducts a downward search in the code set database).
- 5. When the device turns ON, press and release the **OK** key to program the Controller with the new code, saving the code and exit. To exit without programming, press any key other except **CH+/CH-** and **OK**. LED will be off after manually scan mode is exit.
- 6. If the device responds, no further programming is required. If the device does not respond, repeat step 1 through 5. And searching will start from current code set. If no keywas pressed in 30 seconds, manually scan mode will be automatically exit.
- 7. After searching the entire data base, this mode will be automatically exited and led will blink for 3 times.

Setting Up Your Remote Control



Automatic Scan Programming the Controller

To automatic scan program the Controller:

- 1. Manually turn OFF the device you wish to power scan. (TV, VCR, DVD, STB, cable box or audio equipment).
- 2. Press SELECT key to choose the device you wish to program.
- While Press and holding **OK** key, press the **SELECT** key and device LED will be ON. Keep the status for about 5 seconds, release both keys and then LED will blink twice per second, indicating that the Controller is ready for programming.
- Press and release the Mute key to enter automatic scan mode. And the remote will automatically sending power codes to the device.
- 4. When the device turns ON, press **OK** key to program the Controller with the new code, saving it and exit. To exit without programming, press any key other except **OK** key.
- 5. If the device responds, no further programming is required. If the device does not respond, repeat steps 1 through 4. And search will start from current code set.
- 6. After searching the entire data base, this mode will be automatically exited and led will blink for 3 times.

Punch-Through Features

The Controller provides two punch-through features that allow users to control TV volume and DVD or VCR operation while the Controller is in another device mode control certain features of another device.

Volume Punch-Through:

The TV Volume/Mute punch-through feature allows you to control the volume and mute function of your TV while the Controller is in another device mode. The feature is applicable for all devices and brands that do not use the volume control buttons for other purposes.

Transport Key Punch-Through:

The DVD or VCR transport keypunch through feature lets you control the PLAY, STOP, PAUSE, REWIND, FF and RECORD functions of your DVD or VCR while the Controller operates in other modes. The feature is applicable for all devices and brands that do not use the transport keys for other purposes.

Protection mode:

- 1. While press and holding **OK**, press **AUTO** key for 5 seconds to enterprotection mode. In this mode, all the above programming methods will be invalid.
- 2. To exit protection: While press and holding **OK**, press **AUTO** key. Current device related LED remains ON and then release **OK** and **AUTO**. Input three digitpassword **B 8 8**, LED turns off and protection mode is ended. If error password is input or no password input in 10 seconds, LED blinks three times and then turns off. Protection mode will remain.

Display mode:

- 1.To enter display mode, while press and holding **OK** key, press the **SELECT** key and device LED will be ON, keep the status for about 5 seconds. Release both keys and then LED will blink 2 times per second, indicating controller is ready for programming.
- 2.Sequence press 9, 8, 0 to enter display mode. And LED is off now.
- 3.Press digit 1 key to get the first digit of current code set. For example, if the first digit of code set is 1, so then led will blink once and remains OFF. Digit 0 in code set will not be displayed. Blink twice per second.
- 4. Press digit 2 key to get the second digit of current code set. For example, if the second digit of code set is 3, so then led will blink three times and remains OFF. Blink twice per second.
- 5. Press digit3 key to get the third digit of current code set. Blink twice per second.
- 6.Only digit **1**, **2**, **3** are valid in this mode. And the sequence is not fixed. You can repeat, if you don't remember clearly.
- 7.Controller will not send out data in this mode if user presses any keys other than digit **1**, **2**, **3**. And this can be regarded as no key pressed.
- 8. If no key was pressed in 10 seconds or any key other than digit **1**, **2**, **3** is pressed, display mode is ended.
