AV EQUIPMENT (L19B1120)

YPbPr can support these video formats: 480i, 576i, 480p, 576p, 720p, 1080i.



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
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
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Insert Batteries Into the Remote Control



- Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Insert the 2 AAA 1.5V batteries making sure the polarity (+ or -) of the batteries matches the polarity marks inside the unit.
- 3. Close the battery cover.

Replace with new batteries when the TV set begins to show the following symptoms: Operation is unsteady or erratic. Sometimes the TV set does not function with the Remote Control.

- 1) Alkaline Batteries Recommended.
- 2) Remove batteries when they are exhausted or if the remote control is not to be used for a long time.

1: POWER

Press to power ON/OFF(standby) the TV.

Press to enter the TV channel number and select a channel (Press ". " tochoose the sub-channel).

Press to open theon screen display (OSD)menu or return to the previous menu.

4: CURSOR
