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



Camera top and back



1	Power light.
2	ON/OFF button.
3	Shutter button.
4	Delete button—Accesses the Delete function while in Playback.
5	Flash button—Accesses the flash settings while in Picture Capture . Settings are Auto, Red-Eye, Flash On, Flash Off.
6	■ ■ Picture Capture/Video Record/Playback selector—Switches between ■ Picture Capture, ■ Video Record, and ■ Playback (see Picture Capture, Video Record, and Playback on page 17).
7	Zoom lever (Digital and Optical)—In Picture Capture or Video Record, press 4 to zoom in or press 444 to zoom

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	out. In Playback , press [®] to magnify the selected image or press to view thumbnails of your images.
8	▲ ■ and ◀ ▶ buttons—Scroll through menus and images.
9	$\frac{Menu}{OK}$ button—Displays camera menus, selects options, and confirms actions.
10	Back button—Returns you to a previous menu or view. Press and hold to back out of all menus.
11	Image Display.



2 Setting up your camera

Install the batteries

1. Open the Battery/Memory Card door by sliding the door latch as indicated on the Battery/Memory Card door.



3. Close the Battery/Memory Card door.



Note If using rechargeable NiMH batteries, fully charge the batteries before using them the first time. Turn the camera off before removing the batteries.



Camera usage and battery type will affect battery life. Photo Lithium and NiMH batteries provide longer battery life than Alkaline

batteries. For complete information, see Appendix A in the electronic User Guide.

Actual battery life may vary based on usage.

Turn on the camera

To turn on the camera, press the ON/OFF button.

Choose the language

Set the region

Along with the Language setting, the Region setting determines the default date format.

Set the date and time

Accurately setting the date and time will help you locate images once you have uploaded them to your computer, and will ensure that images are accurately marked if you use the date and time imprint feature.

- Use ▲▼ to adjust the highlighted value.
- Use ↓ to move to the other selections and repeat Step 1 until the date and time are set correctly.



Press Menu OK when the date, time, and format settings are correct, then press Menu OK again to confirm.

Setting up your camera

Install and format an optional memory card

This camera supports standard and high speed Secure Digital (SD) memory cards, 32MB to 2GB.

- 1. Turn off the camera and open the Battery/Memory Card door.
- Insert the optional memory card in the smaller slot as shown. Make sure the memory card snaps into place.



3. Close the Battery/Memory Card door and turn on the camera.

Always format new memory cards before first use. Formatting removes all images from the memory card, so make sure to transfer existing images before formatting.

- With the camera turned on, slide
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- 2. Press 🗑.
- Use ▲▼ to select Format Card from the Delete sub-menu, then press ^{Menu}_{OK}.
- Use ▲▼ to select Yes, then press Menu to format the card.

Once you install a memory card, all new images and video clips are stored on the card, rather than in internal memory.

To use internal memory and view images stored there, turn off the camera then remove the memory card.

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Install the software

The HP Photosmart Software provides features for transferring images and video clips to your computer, as well as features for modifying stored images (remove red eyes, rotate, crop, resize, adjust image quality, add colors and special effects, and more).

To install the HP Photosmart Software, your computer must meet the system requirements as stated on the camera packaging.

Windows

- 1. Close all programs and temporarily disable any virus protection software.
- Insert the HP Photosmart Software CD into the CD drive and follow the on-screen instructions. If the installation window does not appear, click Start, click Run, type D:\Setup.exe, where D is the letter of your CD drive, then click OK.
- 3. When the software has finished installing, re-enable virus protection software.

Macintosh

- 1. Insert the HP Photosmart Software CD into the CD drive.
- 2. Double-click the CD icon on the computer desktop.
- 3. Double-click the installer icon, then follow the onscreen instructions.

Take a picture

You can take a picture when you are in **Picture Capture**.

- 1. Slide 🗖 🎬 🗖 to 💼.
- 2. Frame the subject in the Image Display.



- Press the Shutter button halfway down to measure and lock the focus and exposure. The focus brackets in the Image Display turn solid green when focus is locked.
- 4. Press the **Shutter** button all the way down to take the picture.

After you have taken a picture, the camera displays it briefly in the **Image Display**.

Record a video clip

You can record a video when you are in **Wideo Record**.

- 1. Slide 👩 🎬 🗖 to 🎬.
- 2. Frame the subject in the Image Display.



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- 3. Press the **Shutter** button halfway down to measure and lock the focus. The focus brackets in the Image Display turn solid green when focus is locked.
- 4. Press the **Shutter** button all the way down to start recording.
- 5. To stop recording video, press and release the **Shutter** button again.

After you have recorded a video clip, the camera displays it briefly in the **Image Display**.

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4 Reviewing and deleting images and video clips

Review images and video clips

You can review images and video clips in Playback.

- Use ↓ to scroll through your images and video clips. To play a video clip, press ▲ once the first screen of the clip appears on the Image Display.

Note To hear audio associated with video clips, transfer them to your computer.

Delete an image

You can delete individual images during Playback:

- 2. Use **()** to select an image or video clip.
- 3. Press 🗑.
- Use ▲▼ to select This Image from the Delete submenu, then press ^{Menu}_{OK}.

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5 Transferring and printing images

Transfer images

Use this procedure to transfer images and video clips to your computer.

Tip You can also perform this task using an optional HP Photosmart camera dock (see the dock User Guide).

- 1. Turn off the camera.
- 2. Connect the camera and computer using the USB cable that came with your camera.
- Turn on the camera and follow the instructions on the computer screen to transfer the images. If you have



installed the HP Photosmart Software and need more information, see the Help feature in the HP Photosmart Software.

Print images from the camera

You can connect the camera to any PictBridge-certified printer to print images.



 Check that the printer is turned on, there is paper in the printer, and there are no printer error messages.

Transferring and printing images

2. Turn off the camera, connect the camera and printer using the USB cable that came with your camera, then turn on the camera.



- When the camera is connected to the printer, the Image Display shows an image. Use ◀▶ to select the image you want to print.
- 4. Press Menu OK.
- 5. In the **Print Options** menu, select **Print this image now** to begin printing.

displays on the selected image in the Image Display to indicate that the image is being printed.

6. After the printer has printed the image, disconnect the camera from the printer.

Extending battery life

To conserve battery power, the Image Display turns off after a period of inactivity. Pressing any button wakes up the camera. After five minutes of inactivity, the camera turns off.

To further extend battery life:

- Set Display Brightness to Low (see the electronic User Guide for details).
- Set your camera to Auto Flash (see the electronic User Guide for details).
- Use optical zoom, video recording, and Image Display sparingly.
- When transferring or printing images, place your camera in an optional HP Photosmart dock connected to AC power.

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
