Personal Information and Data Security

The use of some functions or third-party applications on your device could result in your personal information and data being lost or becoming accessible to others. Several measures are recommended to help you protect personal and confidential information

- · Place your device in a safe area to prevent it from unauthorized use.
- Set your device screen to lock and create a password or unlock pattern to open it.
- Periodically back up personal information kept on your memory card, or stored in your device memory. If you change to a different device, be sure to move or delete any personal information on your old device.
- If you are worried about viruses when you receive messages or emails from a stranger, you can delete them without opening them.
- If you use your device to browse the Internet, avoid websites that might pose a security risk to avoid theft of your personal information.
- If you use services such as Wi-Fi tether or Bluetooth, set passwords for these services to prevent unauthorized access. When these services are not in use, turn them off
- Install or upgrade device security software and regularly scan for viruses.
- Be sure to obtain third-party applications from a legitimate source. Downloaded third-party applications should be scanned for viruses.
- Install security software or patches released by Huawei or third-party application providers.
- Some applications require and transmit location information. As a result, a thirdparty may be able to share your location information.
- Your device may provide detection and diagnostic information to third-party application providers. Third party vendors use this information to improve their products and services.

Customizing the Home Screen

Adding a New Home Screen Item

- Touch and hold a blank area on the Home screen until the Add to home screen menu is displayed.
- Select an item to add it to the Home screen.

Moving a Home Screen Item

- Touch and hold an item on the Home screen until the item expands in size and the mobile phone vibrates.
- Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the desired position on the screen, and then release it

Removing a Home Screen Item

- Touch and hold an item on the Home screen until the item expands and the mobile phone vibrates.
- Without lifting your finger, drag the item to the trash can. When the item and the trash can turn red, the item is ready to be removed.
- 3. Release the item to remove it from the Home screen.

Changing the Wallpaper

- On the Home screen, touch > Wallpaper.
- 2. Touch the following menu items to select a picture and set it as the wallpaper:
 - Gallery
 - · Live wallpapers
 - · Wallpapers

Application Screen

The Application screen holds icons for all of the applications on your phone. You can touch ### on the Home screen to open the application screen.

Moving Icons on the Application Screen

- On the application screen, touch %.
- 2. Touch and hold the icon you want to move on the application screen.
- Without lifting your finger, drag the icon to the desired location, and then release it.
- To move more icons, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- Touch ✓ or ⋾ to save.


Making a Call with the Dialer Application

Your mobile phone supports the SmartDial function, that is, when you touch numbers on the dialer, the phone automatically searches among your contacts and lists the matching results ordered according to the accuracy of the match. If no contacts match the information entered, the phone will not display any result.

- On the Home screen, touch > Dialer to display the dialer.
- Touch the appropriate number keys to enter the phone number or contacts name.
- Touch to initiate the call.

Answering an Incoming Call

Drag (?) to the right to answer the call.



Contacts

Adding a Contact

- In the contact list, touch > Create contact.
- If you have more than one account with contacts, touch the account to which you want to add the contact
- Enter the contact's name, and then add detailed information such as phone number and address.
- 4. When you are finished, touch Save to save the contact information.

Editing a Contact

You can make changes to the information you have stored for a contact at any time.

- In the contacts list, touch and hold the contact whose details you want to edit, and then touch Edit contact in the options menu.
- Touch the category of contact information you wish to change: name, phone number, email address, or any other information you recorded earlier.
- Make the desired changes to the contact information, and then touch Save . To cancel all of your changes, touch Cancel.

Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

You can use multimedia messages to make everyday communications very special. You can record a message and send it as an audio file, sing 'Happy Birthday' and send it to friend, or send a slideshow of photographs of a special event. The possibilities are endless.

- Enter a phone number in the To field, or touch to select a contact from Contacts or Groups.
- 2. Touch the composition text box to start entering your message.
- When the message is ready to be sent, touch Send.
- On the message editing screen, you can also touch @ , and then select your desired files to add

Adding a Slideshow

If you want to attach more than one file to your message, use the Slideshow option.

- On the message editing screen, touch to display the options panel.
- Touch Add > Slideshow, and then select a slide to start editing it.
- Touch Add slide to add more slides.
- Touch **Done** to finish composing your message and return to the multimedia message screen.
- To alter your multimedia message, touch the slideshow on the multimedia message screen. When the message is ready to be sent, touch Send.

Adding an Email Account

When using the **Email** application for the first time, you must configure an email account. The Email setup wizard helps you to configure your account. A number of popular email systems are supported. You can work with the same email service that you use on your PC or you can select another email service.

- On the Home screen, touch == > Email.
- 2. In the email system list, select a system, or select Others.

- To customize your email settings, follow the onscreen instructions, and then touch Next.
- Enter the account name and the name you want other people to see when they
 receive an email from you.
- Touch Done.

Adding Other Email Accounts

- After creating your initial email account, touch on the Inbox screen, and then touch More > Accounts to access the accounts screen.
- Touch on the accounts screen, and then touch Add account to create another email account.
- When adding an additional email account, you have the option to use the new account to send all outgoing messages.

Opening the Browser

Touch **Browser** to open the home page.

When known or open Wi-Fi networks and mobile data networks are available at the same time, your phone will preferably select a Wi-Fi network for Internet access.

Bluetooth

Your mobile phone has Bluetooth, which allows you to create a wireless connection with other Bluetooth devices so you can share files with your friends, talk hands-free with a Bluetooth headset, or even transfer photos from your phone to your PC. If you are using Bluetooth, remember to stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of the other Bluetooth devices to which you want to connect. Be aware that obstacles like walls or other electronic equipment may interfere with your Bluetooth connection.

Turning On Bluetooth

- Touch > Settings.
- Touch Wireless & networks, and then select the Bluetooth check box to turn on Bluetooth. When Bluetooth is turned on, the Bluetooth icon appears in the notification bar.
- Touch Bluetooth settings, and then select the Discoverable to make your mobile phone visible to other Bluetooth devices.

Pairing with and Connecting to a Bluetooth Device

Your mobile Bluetooth lets you do the following:

- Hands Free Profile (HFP): allows you to use a hands-free Bluetooth device.
- Headset Profile (HSP): allows you to use a mono Bluetooth headset.
- Object Push Profile (OPP): allows you to transfer files over a Bluetooth connection
- Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP): allows you to use a stereo Bluetooth headset
- AV Remote Control Profile (AVRCP): allows you to control audio playing using a Bluetooth headset remotely.

Before you use Bluetooth, pair your mobile phone with another Bluetooth device as follows:

- 1. Ensure that the Bluetooth function on your mobile phone is enabled.
- On the Home screen, touch "" > Settings > Wireless & networks >
 Bluetooth settings. Your mobile phone will then scan for Bluetooth devices in range.
- 3. Touch the device you want to pair your mobile phone with.
- 4. If required, enter the pairing password to complete the connection.

Play Store

Android PlayStore provides direct access to applications and games which you can download and install on your phone.

Opening Play Store

- 1. On the Home screen, touch > Play Store.
- When you open Play Store for the first time, the Google Play Terms of Service window will appear. Touch Accept to continue.

Installing an Application

- In the Play Store, select a category, and then touch the application you want to download.
- To install the application, touch **Download** (if it is free) or touch the button with its price (if it is not free), and confirm your download or purchase.


After the application has been downloaded and installed on your mobile phone, the content download icon appears in the notification bar.

If you want to install a non-Market application, touch ## > Settings >
 Applications, and then select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of the non-Market application.

Opening Your Camera

You can take and share photos using the camera. Your camera supports multiple capture modes and photo effects. After taking a picture, access the **Gallery** to view it. For information on how to share photos and videos, see the User Guide.

Setting Ringers

Adjusting the Volume

You can adjust the volume while on the Home screen or on most of the application screens (such as the screen displayed during a call or when playing music or videos). Press the Volume keys to adjust volume to the level you desire. You can also adjust the volume from the settings screen.

- On the Settings screen, touch Sound > Volume.
- 2. Drag the slider left to make the volume lower, or right to make it higher.
- Touch OK to save the adjustment.

Changing the Phone Ringtone

- On the Settings screen, touch Sound > Phone ringtone.
- 2. In the displayed list, select an option:
 - · Ringtone: Select a preinstalled ringtone. The ringtone plays when selected.
 - Music: Select the music stored in the phone or on the microSD card. The music plays when selected.
- 3. Touch the ringtone you want to use. The ringtone plays when selected.
- Touch OK.

Changing the Message Ringtone

- On the Home screen, touch > Messaging.
- 2. In the message list, touch = > Settings > Select ringtone.

Your Navigator Deluxe

With Your Navigator Deluxe, get all of the features of an advanced car navigation system on your mobile phone with voice turn-by-turn navigation enabled by GPS. Search for any destination including gas stations, ATMs, restaurants, and more. Get detailed maps of any location.

- In order to use Your Navigator Deluxe, you must first turn on your phones
 location and GPS settings. Touch ## > Settings > Location & security, and
 activate the following functions as required:
 - Use wireless networks: Allows applications (such as Maps) to detect your location using wireless networks. When you activate this function, a dialog box is displayed, asking you whether you allow Google to collect your location data anonymously.
 - · Use GPS satellites: Detects your location using GPS satellites.
 - Use Quick GPS: Uses Web servers to facilitate GPS locating. Note that data charges apply when you use this function.
- From the applications menu select the Your Navigator Deluxe application.
- 3. From the Your Navigator Deluxe Home screen you can select:
 - Drive To: for turn by turn direction to an address, airport, contacts addresses and more.
 - · Places: to search for nearby businesses, the cheapest gas prices and more.
 - Maps & Traffic: to see where you currently are located on a map and what traffic is in the area

Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safety. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not
 use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 5.9
 inches(15 cm) be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent
 potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are using a pacemaker, use the
 device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your
 front pocket.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids. For any such problems, consult your service provider.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Traffic Security

 - Do not talk on the device while driving. Use hands-free accessories.

- When you have to make or answer a call, park the vehicle at the road side before using your device.
- RF signals may affect electronic systems of motor vehicles. For more information, consult the vehicle manufacturer.
- In a motor vehicle, do not place the device over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Otherwise, the device may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.

Operating Environment

- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching the antenna affects
 the call quality and results in increase in power consumption. As a result, the talk
 time and the standby time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 32°F (0°C) and 113°F (45°C) while the
 device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between 14°F (-10°C) to
 113°F (45°C) for using the device powered by a battery.

Prevention of Hearing Damage

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

Safety of Children

Battery and Charger

FAQs

How Can I Use a microSD Card to Import Contacts to My Phone from a Different Mobile Phone?

Your mobile phone only supports contact files in the .vcf format.

- Save the contacts you want to import to your mobile phone to a microSD card as a .vcf file.
- 2. Insert the microSD card into your mobile phone and find the .vcf file using File Manager.

- Touch the .vcf file. The phone displays a message asking whether you want to import the contacts.
- 4. Touch OK to import the contacts.
- Compatibility problems may occur with .vcf files created by different mobile phones and certain contact information may be lost after contacts are imported.

How Do I Prevent Automatic Change of Screen Orientation When Rotating My Phone?

On the Home screen, touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen to disable the function

How Do I Set an Unlock Pattern?

On the Home screen, touch " > Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > Pattern

How Can I Change the Input Method?

Touch and hold the area where you write text and then select the input method you prefer.

How Do I Stop the Song Playing in the Background?

Touch the notification bar, flick downwards to open the notifications panel, touch the music playing notification to go to the music playing screen, and then stop playing the song.

How Do I Return to the Call Screen?

While in a call, if you're on another screen, you can touch the notification bar, and flick downwards to open the notifications panel. Then touch the current call notification to return to the call screen

How Do I Create an Application Shortcut on the Home Screen?

Touch and hold an application icon on the application screen until the Home screen is displayed. Then drag the icon to where you want to place it and release your finger.

How Do I Hide the Keyboard?

Touch \circlearrowleft to hide the keyboard.

How Do I Forward a Message?

Touch and hold a message, and then touch **Forward** in the menu that opens.
