



Moves the TV/Radio channel up/down.





- b. **PLAY** Play at normal speed or resume.

#### c. **FAST FORWARD** Fast forward at high speed. Each time you press this button the fast forward speed is increased

- PAUSE Pauses the live programme or recording.



This chapter describes how to set up the product. Select the most appropriate procedure for your convenience. **Note:** If you encounter any problem when setting up the product, please contact your local product distributor.

# 2.1 Connecting Aerial


## 1. Connecting TV

- 1. Connect a scart cable from the TV Scart on you're the product to a scart connection on your TV set.
- 2. Connect your aerial to the Antenna In connection on the product.
- 3. Connect an RF (coaxial) cable from the TV/VCR (Loop out) output to the aerial input of your TV set.
- 4. Connect the mains plug of the product to a wall socket



## 2. Connecting TV and VCR

- 1. Connect a scart cable from the TV Scart on you're the product to a scart connection on your TV set.
- 2. Connect a scart cable from the VCR Scart on your product to a scart connection on your VCR.
- 3. Connect your aerial to the Antenna In connection on the product.
- 4. Connect an RF (coaxial) cable from the TV/VCR (Loop out) output to the aerial input of your VCR.
- 5. Connect an RF (coaxial) cable from the Aerial Output (RF Out) of your VCR to the Aerial Input of your TV set.
- 6. Connect the mains plug of the product to a wall socket



# 2. Connecting Audio System


Select the most appropriate procedure for your converience.

- Connect one end of the Audio L, R to the rear on the product and the other end to a rear on the audio system.
- Connect the optical S/PDIF terminal and Dolby digital decoder to listen to the higher quality sound.



# 2.2 Powering On

- 1. Switch your TV on
- 2. Connect the power cord of the product to a wall outlet.



- 3. Turn on the power switch, located at the left on the back of the product.
- 4. Power on by pressing the STANDBY (((i)) button at Remote Controller or the STANDBY ((i)) button at the front of the product.




# 3. Installation Wizard

This will guide you through the installation procedure to automatically search for the Digital channels. (Installation Wizard will also run after the product has been returned to Default Settings.)

## 3.1 Search

Please wait until the channel search is complete.

- 1. During the channel search, the cursor is located at *Stop*. Therefore, if you press the **OK** () button during the search, the search will stop and the channels found until then will be displayed.
- 2. If the search does not find any channels, then press the **OK** (()) button to access the installation menu to search for the channels again. Please make sure that you have connected your aerial correctly.
- You can delete unwanted channels from the found channels. Select your desired channels to delete and press the OK (()) button. Then select *Delete* and press the OK () button. To delete all channels, select *Select All* select all channels, select *Delete* and press the OK () button.
- 4. After completing the Channel Search and deleting unwanted channels, select Save to save the changes.



Warning: If you exit the Install Wizard without fully completing the channel searching procedure, you may not have all of the channels available. In this case, you can use the *Installation Menu* to search for the channels.

# 4. Basic Operation

This chapter describes functions such as switching channel, volume control and basic features for watching programmes.

## 4.1 Switching Channel

You can switch the current channel using one of the following methods.

- 1. Press the CH-/CH+ (\_\_\_/\_\_) button.
- 2. Enter your desired channel numeric using the NUMERICAL (0-9) button to go to the channel directly.
- 3. Press the TV/RADIO ( ) button to switch between TV channel and Radio channel.
- **Note:** You can switch channel using the channel list or programme guide. Please refer to *Chapter7 and 8* for more information.

## 4.2 Volume Control

- 1. Press the Vol+/Vol- (.....) buttons to adjust the audio volume.
- 2. Press the MUTE ( ) button to switch the sound ON/OFF.

Note: The mute function will remain off after changing channels.

## 4.3 Text and interactive services

If your chosen channel has Digital Teletext features, you can access them. Teletext services often load automatically shortly after the Digital Teletext window is displayed. In which case, simply follow the onscreen instructions(press color buttons).

- 1. Press TEXT ( ) button to access Digital Teletext.
- 2. Press **TEXT** (<u>)</u> button again to return to normal viewing.
- 3. Press the CH-/CH+ (\_\_\_\_) button to exit this service.


Note: If you have subitites displayed then you will not be able to access the Digital Text service.

# 4. Basic Operation

## 4.4 Switch ON/OFF or Change Subtitle

If the current programme provides Subtitle information, you can select the language for the Subtitle.

- 1. Press the SUBTITLE (()) button to display the subtitle menu.
- 2. Select your desired subtitle language using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊙) button. The subtitles will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Select Off from the Subtitle menu to switch the subtitles off.




Note: You can select a default subtitle language by selecting *MENU - Preferences - Language Setting - Subtitle Language.* 

## 4.5 Change Audio options

If the current programme is available in multiple audio languages, you can select the language that you wish to listen to.

- 1. Press the SOUNDTRACK ( ) button to display soundtrack list.
- 2. Select your desired audio language using the **A**/**v** button and **OK** (C) button to change Audio immediately.
- 3. Select Audio Direction(left, right, stereo) using the **4**/**b** button.
- 4. Press the EXIT or SOUNDTRACK ((@)) button to exit the soundtrack list.



Note: You can select your desired default audio language by selecting *MENU - Preferences - Language Setting* -Audio Language.

# 4.6 Programme Information (I- plate)

Programme information is always displayed for a specific period of time whenever you switch channels. You can view the programme information by pressing the  $i( \bigcirc )$  button while watching a programme. Press the **EXIT** (O\_) button to hide the i-plate.


- 7. Next programme Information: displayed if next programme information is provided. Press the button to display the next programme information.
- 8. Programme broadcasting time and progress bar: displays programme playing time and progress bar.

Note: The programme information will only be displayed when supplied by the broadcaster.

## 2. Detailed Programme Information

You can see detailed information about the current programme. Press the i ( o ) button where I-plate is displayed to view detailed information.



Note:

- Press the i ( o ) button again to hide the information box.
- If the Detail information is more than one page, use ▲/▼ button to move to the previous or next page.

# 4.7 Option List


You can view and confirm detailed information about the current channel and change the information if necessary.

Note: Press the OPT+ ( ) button when the channel list is displayed to view option list. Then the following functions in the option list are performed to the channel where cursor is located.

### 1. Add a channel to favourite group

You can add the current channel to the favourite group immediately. Also, you can add channels to Favourite groups.

- 1. Press the OPT+ ( button.
- 2. Select *Favourite* using the A/T button and press the OK () or button.
- 3. Select *Favourite* Group using the A/T button and press the OK () button to register for favourite group.
- 4. Press the OK () button again on the selected favourite group to release the registered channel.
- 5. Move to the parent menu using the < button to save the changes automatically.





## 2. Lock/Unlock a Channel

You can lock or unlock the current channel whilst watching a programme.

- 1. Press the OPT+ ( button.
- 2. Select Lock using the A/T button and press the OK () or button.
- 3. Select *Lock* option using the  $\blacktriangle/\checkmark$  button and press the OK ( $\bigcirc$ ) button.
- 4. Select Unlock option using the A/T button and press the OK ( ) button.
- 5. You will be prompted to enter your Password. Enter your password to unlock the channel.
- 6. Move to the parent menu using the < button to save the changes automatically.



#### Note:

- When switching to the locked channel, you must enter the password to view the channel.
- The Default Password is 0000. If you have forgotten your Password, please contact Humax Customer Support.

## 3. Delete a Channel

You can delete the current channel whilst watching a programme

- 1. Press the OPT+ ( button.
- 2. Select Delete using the A/T button and press the OK (C) or button.
- 3. Select Yes in the confirmation message and press the OK () button.
- 4. Enter your password using the NUMERICAL (0-9) button to delete the current channel.



# 5. PIP and Time Shifted Recording

# 5.1 Picture-in-Picture (PIP) Screen

If you press the **PIP** ((5)) button on the remote control while watching TV, you can watch 2 channels at the same time. The Audio from the Main screen will be outputted.

Each time you press the **PIP** ((5)) button, the PIP screen moves in order of **1:6** -> **1:1-> Normal**, as displayed in the following figure.





1:6 PIP screen

Normal screen



1:1 PIP screen

Note:

- The PIP screen is available only when you are watching TV channels. You cannot use the PIP function on Radio channels.
- The PIP screen is not available while recording.
- Only one scrambled (Pay TV) channel can be used with the PIP function.
- The teletext (MHEG) is only available on the main screen.

## 1. Swapping the PIP screen.

This function is available either 1:6 PIP or 1:1 PIP.

Press the **SWAP PIP** ((5)) button on the remote control to swap the main screen for the PIP screen. Press the **CH-/CH+** ((1)) button to change the main screen channel.

Note: You cannot use the SWAP PIP function in the following cases:

- 1. When you are watching radio channel.
- 2. When the screen displays the channel list, soundtrack and detail information.


# 5. PIP and Time Shifted Recording

## 2. Moving the PIP screen. (Only for 1:6 PIP screen)

Use the **MOVE PIP** (()) button on the remote control to move the position of the PIP screen.



Each time you press the **MOVE PIP** (()) button, the PIP screen moves in the order of **1**-2-3-3 (), as displayed in the following figure.



3. Switching channels in the PIP screen

You can change the PIP channel using the **PIP CH+/PIP CH-** (()) button. Press the **PIP** () button on the remote control to display the PIP screen, then press the **PIP CH+/PIP CH-** () button to change the channel on the only PIP screen.




# 5.2 Time Shifted Recording (TSR)

You can perform the time shift operations like VCR functions using the Playback control buttons while playing a programme.

The product automatically saves the programme on screen to the installed hard disk drive temporarily, so that users can pause, play, fast rewind, fast forward, replay, etc. even while watching the currently broadcasting TV programme.

#### 1. Time Bar

If you press the PLAY (----) button while watching TV, the time bar information will be displayed. Time bar displays the current operation status, the time difference between the broadcasting point and watching point and the amount of temporarily saved programme.



- 3. An amount of saved programme
- 5. Broadcasting (Live) Point
- 6. Current Time (hh:mm)

### 2. Pause

If you press the PAUSE ([\_\_\_]) button on the remote control, the current programme is paused. If you press the PAUSE ( button once again, the programme is resumed from that point.



Note: Pause makes the time difference or delay between the broadcasting (live) point and watching point. The time difference is equal to the period the programme was paused. Operations like slow motion and fast the live programme.

# 5. PIP and Time Shifted Recording

#### 3. Fast Rewind to Previous Scene

Press the **FAST REWIND** ((-) button on the remote controller to watch the scene passed by. Whenever you press the **FAST REWIND** ((-) button, the rewind speed increases. ( x 2, x 4, x 16, x 64)



If you press the PLAY ([--]) button, the fast rewind operation stops and the programme is played at normal speed.

**Note:** You can fast rewind back to the point. If you reach the start point while rewinding, the programme is automatically played at normal speed from that point.

4. Fast Forward to the Next Scene

Press the **FAST FORWARD** () button on the remote controller to fast forward the programme. Whenever you press **FAST FORWARD** () button, the speed increases. ( x 2, x 4, x 16, x 64)



If you press the PLAY ([---)) button, the fast forward operation stops and the programme is played at normal speed.

**Note:** You can use the fast forward operation only when there is a time difference between the current watching point and the broadcasting (live) point caused by some previous operations such as pause, slow motion or fast rewind. You can fast forward to the current broadcasting point. If the watching point reaches to the broadcasting (live) point, the programme is automatically played at normal speed.

## 5. Recording

Press the **RECORD** (••) button on the remote control to record immediately the watching programme. While the time shift operation records the programme temporarily, this record operation records the programme permanently so you can playback the recorded programme at any time. For more information about recording, refer to **Chapter 6**.

#### Adjusting the Recording End Time

Press the **RECORD** (••) button while recording to adjust the recording end time. You can adjust the recording end time by -/+10 minutes using the **4**/**>** button, and then press the **OK** (•) button to change the Recording End Time and hide the message screen. If you press the **BACK** (••) or **EXIT** (••) button after changing the Record End Time, you will cancel the Record End Time adjustment.

# 6. Additional Time Shift Operations

You can perform additional time shift operations using the following buttons on the remote controller.

### **Direct Jump**

Press the **PASUE** ( $\square$ ) button while watching TV. If you press the **()** button, a moving arrow will appear in progress bar. Movbutton, a moving arrow will appears in progresse bar. Move this arrow to a desired time point using the **()** button and then press the **OK** ( $\square$ ) button to play the programme from the specified time point.

#### **Instant Replay**

Press the **INSTANT REPLAY** ((3)) button, to replay the current programme from the previous 7 seconds. When the replay has been completed the programme will be play played from the current point. Refer to **Chapter 9.6.** 



### **Slow Motion**

Press the **SLOW MOTION** (()) button to play the current programme in slow motion mode. Whenever you press the **SLOW MOTION** () button, the speed decreases (x 1/2, x 1/4, x 1/8). Press the **PLAY** button to stop playing in slow motion mode return normal speed.

### **Commercial Skipping 30 seconds**

Press the **COMMERICAL SKIP** ((**C**) button to play the programme from the time point 30 seconds forward from the current watching point. You can use the skip operation only when there is a time difference between the current watching and the broadcasting point while you use the fast forward operation. If the time difference is less than 30 seconds, the programme is played from the current broadcasting point. Refer to **Chapter 9.6**.



# 5. PIP and Time Shifted Recording

#### **Repeat Mode**

You can select a specific block within a recorded programme and play it back repeatedly. Press the **A-B** ( $\bigcirc$ ) button to set the first repeating position. Select the second position using the  $\checkmark$ ) button and press the **OK** ( $\bigcirc$ ) button. Then the programme plays back the selected block repeatedly. If you stop the repeat mode, you will press the **A-B** ( $\bigcirc$ ) button during repeating the selected block.

Press the **STOP** (**\_\_**) button to stop playing the current saved programme and watch the current programme on air.

#### Bookmark

You can jump to a position directly by bookmark function in recorded programme playback. To search positions very quickly and easily, use bookmarks.





Adding a bookmark

Press the **ADD BOOKMARK** ((**(()**) button at the desired position to set a bookmark during playing back a recorded programme.

**Note:** The bookmark function is only available to recorded programmes.

Deleting a bookmark

Press the **BOOKMARK LIST** ((■) button after adding a bookmark and select the bookmarked position using the ▲/▼ button. Press the **ADD BOOKMARK** ((■) button to delete a bookmark.

Note: Press the BOOKMARK LIST (()) or EXIT ()) button to exit the bookmark list screen.

#### Going to a bookmark

Press the **BOOKMARK LIST** (( $\bigcirc$ ) button. Select the bookmarked position using the  $\checkmark/\checkmark$  button and press the **OK** ( $\bigcirc$ ) button. Then the programme plays from the bookmarked position.



# 6. Recording and Playback

Using the built-in hard disk drive, you can record a programme without an external media device such as a VCR.



## 6.1 Instant Recording

Press the **RECORD** (••) button on the remote controller to record the current programme instantly. The product will record the live broadcast feed, so if you are watching a time-delayed recording, the recorder will not save what you are currently watching. If you change channels while recording and press the **RECORD** (••) button, recording starts. You can record up to two channels simultaneously. While recording two channels simultaneously, you cannot perform TSR(Time Shifted Recording), however, programmes on air can be viewed.

Press the **STOP** () button to stop the recording while you record two other channels. Then you will be prompted to select one among the recording channels.

Press the **RECORD** (••) button again to record another channel while you record two other channels. Then you will be prompted to select one to stop for new recording.



#### Notice:

- Ensure that there is enough free space before recording. If the free space on the hard disk drive is insufficient, recording will stop. Recording one hour of programme may require up to 2 or 3GB of hard disk space. The space for recording 1 hour of programme may be different depending on the programme recorded.
- You can record radio programmes also.

# 6. Recording and Playback

## 6.2 Recording schedule

You can set a programme to record automatically by going to Menu - Record - Recording Schedule.

- 1. Press the MENU () button.
- Select *Record* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or ▶ button.
- 3. Select *Recording Schedule* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK ((○)) or ▶ button to display the reserved recording list on the screen.
- Note: You can schedule recoding easily in Guide. Refer to *Chapter* 8.

## 1. Programming the PVR to record

- 1. Select a blank list and press the **OK** ( ) button to add a new recording schedule.
- Change the *Channel* and *Date*. Press the button to display channel and date lists and select one item using the A/T button and the OK ((a)) button. You can also select your desired channel using the NUMERICAL (0~9) button.
- 3. Change *Time* using the **√** button and the **NUMERICAL** (0~9) button.
- Select one of *Repeat* mode options among *Once, Daily* and *Weekly* using the *A*/*b* button.
- 5. Select *Lock* mode using the *I*/*b* button.

- Select *Edit* using the *()* button and press the OK () button to edit the reserved programme. Select *Delete* using the *()* button and press the OK () button to delete the reserved programme.
- Change the *Channel* and *Date*. Press the ▶ button to display channel and date lists and select one item using the ▲/▼ button and the OK (○) button. You can also select your desired channel using the NUMERICAL (0~9) button.
- 4. Change the *Time* using the 4/1 button and the **NUMERICAL** (0~9) button.
- 5. Change the *Repeat* mode using the *()* button. The options are *Once, Daily* and *Weekly*.
- 6. Change the *Lock* mode using the *(*) button.
- 7. Select the Cancel and press the OK ( ) button to cancel editing.
- 8. Select the Save and press the OK ( ) button to complete editing.



**Note:** If you have set *Lock* on a recording reservation, you have to enter a password to playback the recorded programme.

# 6.3 Programme Playback

You can view the recorded programmes in the *Menu – Record – Recorded – Programme*. You also can easily view the recorded programme list by pressing the **PLAY LIST** () button. You can switch between VIDEO (TV) and AUDIO (RADIO) recording lists using **()** button.

- 1. Press the MENU () button.
- 2. Select *Record* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊙) or ▶ button.
- Select a *Recorded Programme* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or ▶ button to display the recorded programme list.
- 4. Select the desired programme to playback using the ▲/▼ button and then press the **PLAY** ( ) button to playback the programme.
- 5. Press the **STOP** ( ) button to stop the current programme and go to the current live programme.

Note:

- For more information on the time shift operations like VCR functions, refer to Chapter 5.
- You can perform fast rewind, fast forward, slow motion, pause, skip and replay functions while you are playing back a recorded programme from the *PLAY LIST*.
- Certain parts of the programme may be skipped when playing back a recorded programme in case the recording mode is switched from scramble to descramble or vice versa.

## 6.4 Editing Recorded Programmes

Select Menu - Record - Recorded Programme and then select the desired recorded programme to edit.

- 1. Press the MENU () button.
- Select *Record* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊙) or ▶ button.
- Select Recorded Programme using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or ▶ button. The recorded programme list appears.
- 4. Select the desired programme and then press the **OK** (C) button to display the information screen.



### 1. Deleting a Recorded Programme

Select Delete in the information screen using the 4/b button and then press the OK ( ) button.



## 2. Editing a Recorded Programme

Select *Edit* in the information screen using the  $\checkmark$  button and then press the OK () button. After editing, you have to select *Save* and then press the OK () button to save your changes.

## **Protecting Recorded Programmes from Deletion**

- 2. You have to enter a password to change the status from Enable to Disable.
- **Note:** If the protect option of the programme is set to *Enable*, you must enter password to delete the recorded programme.

### Locking a Recorded programme





# 6.7 Checking Hard Disk Drive

You can check the free space of the hard disk drive and can format (erase) the disk drive if necessary.

- 4. You can check the free, used, reserved and total space of the HDD.

**Note:** The format deletes all the recorded programmes saved on the HDD including TV, Radio, MP3s and Photos. Formatting does not delete the system files of the product.

# 7. Channel List

3 types of channel lists are provided for easy and quick channel browsing.

- **TV** The list of all TV channels with 2 sub-groups: one is sorted by channel number, the other is sorted by channel name (Alphabetical).
- **Radio** The list of all Radio channels with 2 sub-groups: one is sorted by channel number, the other is sorted by channel name (Alphabtical).
- Favourite You can create 5 Favourite list to give you quicker access to the channels you watch more often. This will allow you to ignore channels you rarely or never watch.

# 7.1 Displaying and Switching Channel List

You can display the channel list using LIST (O<sup>\*</sup>) button and switch into other channel on the channel list. You can also display the channel list by pressing the OK (O) button.

- Press the LIST (O<sup>\*</sup>) button while watching a programme to display the selected channel list.
- Select your desired channel using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) button to change the channel.





#### 4. Additional Features

Additional Features provides many useful functions which are necessary to add Favourite Channel.

#### Change between TV and Radio channel list

You can add not only TV channel(s) but also Radio channel(s) to Favourite channel list. Press 1 to switch all channel list into TV or Radio channels.

Note: You can also change to TV or Radio channel by pressing TV/RADIO (7) button at remote controller.

#### Select a Favourite Channel List

You can select your desired Favourite Channel List to edit. Press To display the Favourite Channel List. Then select your desired channel list using the A/T button and press the OK () button.

#### Sort a channel list

You can sort all TV or Radio channel lists by channel number or name for easy Favourite channel searching. If channel lists are sorted by channel number, *total* is displayed. When you press this button, all the channel lists are sorted by name. Or, if channel lists are sorted by channel name, *total* is switched into *total*. Press this button to order channels by number.

#### Unselect all the selected channels

Press slotton to unselect all the selected channel.

# 8. Programme Guide

The Programme Guide displays programme information about each channel, based on the date and time. You can also schedule your recording using the information given.

Note: Press the BACK(\_\_O), EXIT (O\_\_), or GUIDE (~\_O) button to exit the Guide screen.

# 8.1 Viewing Programme Guide Information

You can view programme information for all channels.

- 2. Move to previous or next programme within the same channel using the **4**/**b** button.

If specified frequency channel information and other channel information are provided together, the channel, belonging to other frequency channel, is also searched.

- 2. Select one option between *Enable* and *Disable* using the p or OK ( ) button.

### **10.3 Default Setting**

Default Setting restores the product to the default settings.

Warning: Please note that once you perform Default Setting, all data such as Channel List and User Configured data are deleted, no information on the HDD will be lost.

#### To perform Factory Default:

- 1. Press the MENU () button.
- 2. Select Installation using the / w button and press the OK () or b button.
- 3. Enter Password using the NUMERICAL (0-9) button.
- 4. Select *Default Setting* using the ▲/▼ button, press the OK () or button.
- Select Yes and press the OK () button to restore all setting to Factory Default. Select No and press the OK () or BACK () button to return to the previous menu.
- 6. Confirm again to start loading default setting. Enter *Password* using the **NUMERICAL** (0-9) button to perform restoring.
- When completing the default setting, press the OK () button to automatically run the *Installation Wizard*. For detailed information about Installation Wizard, refer to 3. *Installation Wizard*.



Note: The default password is 0000.

## **10.4 Antenna Power**

When you connect an active antenna to the ANTENNA IN connector on the rear of the product.

- 1. Press MENU () button.
- Select Installation using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or ▶ button.
- Select Antenna Power from Installation menu using the ▲/▼ button.
- 4. Press the OK ( ) or button to select On or Off.
  - **On** 5V power supply from the active antenna cable.
  - Off No power supply.



#### Note:

- Active antenna is the portable or indoor antenna which needs power supply from the set top box bacuse it does not have power cord for itself.
- The default value is Off.

# 11. Software Update

In order to maintain proper performance of the product, it is essential to have the most up to date software. The latest news and release of software versions may be found at Humax website - http://www.humaxdigital.com.

It is recommended that you periodically check for the availability of software upgrade.

# 11.1 OTA (Over the Air)

OTA, an abbreviation of "over the air", means downloading the software where the manufacturer reserves the right to decide when and where to release through aerial.

Over the Air(OTA) is simply another alternative for downloading software versions. However, the manufacturer reserves the right to decide when and where this software update can take place by "beaming" latest software versions over the air via aerial. The software update via aerial will only occur under the following circumstances.

1. The equipment should have appropriate loader software.

**Caution:** Please note that if you don't have normal loader software, the equipment may not be updated or work after software update.

- 2. The manufacturer decides to release software downloading via a designated aerial.
- 3. The equipment must be "tuned" properly to the same aerial that the manufacturer uses.
- 4. Update software when the quality of receiving signal strength is high. if the quality of receiving signal strength is not recommendable due to bad weather, upgrade the software later.

#### Caution:

- Please be careful to keep the power on and the power cord plugged in during software update. If the power is off during software update, it may cause fatal damage to the product.
- Please be careful not to pull out the Signal line (co-axial Cable) during software update. Update may be
  interrupted and the product may not work.

#### Note:

- · The product cannot work at all during software update.
- It may take 5 ~10 minutes to update software.
- Scheduling operation cannot work during software update.

#### 1. If new software is found when powering on

- 1. A message will be displayed to notify that new software is found.
- 2. Select Yes and press the OK ( ) button to update the software.
- 3. Starts downloading new software. Please wait until the update is completed.
- 4. When completing the software update, the equipment is automatically powered off and on again.

### 2. If updating software from Menu

- 1. Press the **MENU** () button.
- Select *Installation* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or button.
- 3. Enter *Password* using the NUMERICAL (0-9) buttons.
- Select Software Update using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (○) or ▶ button.





- Select Status using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊙) or ▶ button.
- 2. Confirm Hardware version, Software version, Loader version, System ID, Update Date and Slot.



# **12.2 Signal Detection**

You can view the signal strength and signal quality receiving for the channel that is currently on AV.

- 1. Select Signal Detection using the button and press the OK (⊙) or button.
- 2. Displays the channel name, frequency, mode, guard interval of terrestrial frequency and Signal Strength / Quality of the channel.



# **12.3 Common Interface**

You can view the current status of CI module.

- Select Common Interface using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊙) or ▶ button.
- 2. Select *Slot* and press the OK (()) or button. If Common Interface is available, you can view slot information.



Note: The displayed information about a Common Interface may differ depending on Common Interface type.


# 13. Games

# **15. Trouble Shooting**

# **15.1 Trouble Shooting**

Before contacting your local service, please read the following instructions. If the product does not work normally after completing the following trouble shooting, please contact your local product distributor or service center.

#### 1. No message is displayed on the front panel or product has no power

- Check the main power cable and check that it is plugged into a suitable power outlet.
- Check if Power Switch is On.

#### 2. No picture

- Make sure that the product is on Operation Mode.
- Make sure that the AV Cable is firmly connected to the TV.
- Make sure that aerial line is correctly connected to the equipment.
- Check the brightness level of TV.
- Check if the channel is on air.

#### 3. Poor picture & sound quality

- Install aerial where there is no obstacle ahead.
- Make sure to avoid putting mobile phone or mircrowave oven near the equipment.
- Use 75  $\Omega$  coaxial cable to connect TV and aerial.

#### 4. No or poor sound

- Check the volume level of the TV.
- Check the Mute status of the TV and product.
- Press the Audio button to change the Sound Track type.

## 5. Remote control does not operate

- To manipulate the equipment with remote control, the remote control's emitting part should directly point towards the receiving part of product's remote control.
- · Check the battery of Remote control.

#### 6. Reservation is unavailable

- Check if it is more than two reservations areoverlapped.
- Check if the power switch is off.

# 17. Glossary

#### 1. Aerial

A device that collects and amplifies electromagnetic waves. Also called "Antenna"

## 2. Coaxial cable

A specially designed and shields cable that can transport signals with high frequency

#### 3. Frequency

The number of cycles or events per one second, which is expressed in the unit of hertz

## 4. FTA (Free- To-Air)

An unscrambled broadcast, which you can view without additional payments to a service provider

#### 5. HDD (Hard Disk Drive)

The primary computer storage medium, which is made of one or more aluminum or glass platters, coated with a ferromagnetic material

## 6. MUX

The transmitter/frequency/channel where the programme provider/operator transmit a package of digital channels/services. Usually there are several MUX frequencies with different or same content.

#### 7. Network

The collection of channels/services that a programme provider/operator offer. These services may be transmitted from one or several MUXes. In the transmitted data stream the operator may transmit a service information table(network information) that informs the Product about all available services in the network.

#### 8. OSD (On Screen Display)

The function that displays the information about the monitor that the user needs or has to know on the screen directly. OSD information includes brightness, contrast, tuning, RGB adjustment and screen size and positions (top, left, width and height) and so on.

#### 9. OTA (Over The Air)

The software is downloaded with the manufacturer reserving the right to decide when and where to release them through aerial.

#### 10.PIP (Picture In Picture)

TV screen which can display another small screen within the main screen. The background screen is called the parent screen and the small screen is called PIP.

#### 11.PVR (Personal Video Recorder)

Video recorder that can record and play back programmes directly using the embedded hard disk drive(s).

#### 12.RF (Radio Frequency)

Frequencies occupied by radio waves of the total frequency range of electromagnetic waves

## 13.SCART

A 21-pin connector used for connection of this product, VCR and TV. Also called Euroconnector or Peritel connector

# 14.S/PDIF (Sony/Philips Digital Interface format)

Standard format for digital audio output. It outputs audio signals directly as digital audio signals without changing into analog signals because conversion into analog signals can degrade signal quality.

#### 15.Trick-Play

Pause, Fast Forward/Fast Rewind, Slow Motion, Instant Replay, Commercial Skip, Repeat A-B

# 16.TSR (Time Shifted Recording)

A function that record the present programme temporarily to support trick-play
