



Safety Instructions and Precautions

1. MAINS SUPPLY

90 - 250V AC 50/60Hz

Operate your product only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your local power company. Disconnect the product from the mains before you start any maintenance or installation procedures

2. OVERLOADING

Do not overload a wall outlet, extension cord or adapter as this may result in electric fire or shock.

3. LIQUIDS

The product should not be exposed to any liquids such as dripping or splashing. In addition, no objects filled with liquids, such as vase, should be placed on the apparatus.

4. CLEANING

Disconnect the product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Use a light damp cloth (no solvents) to dust the product.

5. VENTILATION

7. CONNECTION TO THE CABLE TV SIGNAL AND TV

Connect all components before plugging any power cords into the wall outlet. Always turn off the product, TV and other components before you connect or disconnect any cables.

8. LOCATION

Place the product indoors to avoid exposing it to lightning, rain or sun.

Do not place it near a radiator or heat register.

Make sure it has more than 10 cm clearance from any appliances susceptible to electromagnetic influences, such as a TV or a VCR.

Do not block the openings with any object and do not place the product on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface.

If you place the product on a rack or bookcase, ensure that there is adequate ventilation and that you have followed the manufacturer's instructions for mounting.

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

1.1 Package Contents

Please check all package contents before using the product.

- Faults may occur if the remote control is being left without a battery for a long time.
 Always keep the battery inserted in the remote control.
- Package contents may vary according to area.

1. Before Using the Product

1.2 Front Panel



1. STANDBY LED

Red light is emitted when the product is in standby mode.

2. TV LED

Green light is emitted when the product is in TV mode.

3. RADIO LED

Amber light is emitted when the product is in radio mode.

4. STANDBY Button

Switches between operation and standby modes.

5. TV/RADIO Button

Switches between TV and radio.

6. CH-/CH+ Button

Moves the TV/radio channel up/down.

7. SMARTCARD SLOT

Slot for a Smartcard.


1.3 Conditional Access

Although some TV and radio channels are free to air, most TV and radio/music channels are available on a subscription basis and can only be enjoyed via a Conditional Access component. The Conditional Access component is a removable Smartcard.

1. Inserting the Smartcard


The Smartcard looks similar to a credit card and is inserted into the slot behind the right-hand front flap of the product. A valid Smartcard entitles you to view and listen to all the channels you choose to subscribe to.

- Open the right-hand flap on the front panel of the product. Swing it down wards to expose the card slot.
- 2. Hold the Smartcard horizontally with the electronic chip (small square-shaped, gold in colour) facing downwards.
- 3. Insert the Smartcard into the top slot until the card is completely in.

1.4 Rear Panel



1. CABLE IN

Connects a cable to the CABLE input jack of the product.

2 TV/VCE

Connects the RF input jack of the TV/VCR to the product.

3. TV SCART

Connects to a TV SCART cable.

4. VCR SCART

Connects to a VCR SCART cable.


5. RS-232C

Connects to the PC to update the software programme of the product.

6. S/PDIF

Outputs the digital audio signals(S/PDIF).

1.5 Remote Control



1. SOURCE

Controls the input of TV.

2. TV/RADIO

Switches between TV and radio modes.

3. NUMERIC(0~9) BUTTONS

Enters a TV/radio channel number or menu option number.

4. LIST

Displays the channel list.

5. BACK

Returns to the previous menu and screen

6. ARROW BUTTONS

Changes the channel or moves the cursor up, down, left or right.

7. OPT+ (OPTION)

Displays the channel attributes while watching a programme.

8. AUDIO

Displays the audio list.

9. CH-/CH+ or PAGE-/PAGE+

Changes the channel or page.

10. MENU

Displays the main menu.

11. STANDBY

Switches between operation and standby modes.

12. GUIDE

Displays the programme guide.

13. EXIT

Exits all On-Screen Display (OSD) screens.

14. OK

Selects a menu, or confirms the selected operation. And displays the channel list while watching a programme.

15. FREEZE

Freezes the TV screen you are watching. Play the audio continuously.

16. SUBTITLE

Displays the subtitle language list.

17. V-/V+

Adjusts the audio volume.

18. MUTE

Mutes or unmutes the audio temporarily.

19. i (INFORMATION/INDEX)

Displays the information about the channel and programme in normal viewing mode. Moves to the index page in teletext mode.

20. WIDE

Changes the display format.

21. G (Game)

Displays games.

22. TELETEXT

a. SUB-PAGE

Search the sub-page in teletext mode. If it is not in the teletext mode, display the current time.

b. **TELETEXT ON/OFF**

Switches between teletext and TV modes.

c. **DOUBLE**

Displays the text size as double size.

d. MIX

Adjusts transparency of teletext screen.

e. **REVEAL**

Displays the concealed information.

f. HOLD

Holds the current page not updating it.

g. **CANCEL**

Hides the teletext leaving only the page number.

2. Setup


This chapter describes how to connect the product to the TV with the particular equipments for gaining optimum signal quality. The product provides various interfaces to connect to the TV, VCR or other devices. Select the most appropriate procedure depending on the equipment you have

Note: If you encounter any problems setting up your product, please contact your local product distributor.

2.1 Connecting the Cable

1. Connecting TV

This is the most simple setup mode.




- Connect your CATV line to the CABLE IN socket on the product for receiving cable services.
- The TV SCART is connected as in the figure above.


2. Connecting TV/VCR with 2 SCARTs

This is the optimal way to connect the product.



3. Connecting Hi-Fi system


If you wish to connect S/PDIF to the optical S/PDIF terminal and Dolby Digital decoder to listen to digital audio, connect as the following.



2. Setup

2.2 Powering On

1. Connect the power cord of the product to a wall outlet.



2. Power on by pressing the **STANDBY** (((a)) button on the remote control or the **STANDBY** (b) button on the front of the product.



3. Installation Wizard

When powering on the product for the first time after purchasing, the installation wizard will operate automatically.

You can easily set-up using simple organisation and options, and watch the broadcasting after completing the set-up procedure. You can select items using the **NUMERIC(0~9)** buttons.

Note:

- If you press the BACK (
) button or select Back and press the OK (
) button while running the installation wizard, you can return to the previous screen.
- The default password is 0000. If you have forgotten your password, please contact your local product distributor.

3.1 Language

Select the appropriate language from the list using the $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ button and press the **OK** (\circledcirc) button to save the selected language as a default language for menu, subtitle and audio.



3.2 Channel Search

You can search channels automatically or manually. If you select manual search, you have to set parameters for search.

- Frequency: Enter the frequency using the NUMERIC(0-9) buttons and press the OK (()x)
- Network ID: Enter the network ID using the NUMERIC(0-9) buttons and press the OK (

) button.



Select *Next* and press the **OK** ((∞) button to start channel search.

3. Installation Wizard

Please wait for finishing the channel search. If you want to stop the operation during search, press the **OK** ((∞) button.



Select $\it Save$ and press the $\it OK$ ($(\mbox{\tiny (M)})$) button to save the result and go to the next step.



3.3 Result

It displays the default language, country, time offset and channel search result.

Select *Finish* using the $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ button and press the **OK** (\circledcirc) button to complete the installation wizard.



4. Basic Operation

This chapter describes functions such as switching channel, volume control and basic features for watching programmes.

4.1 Switching Channel

You can switch the current channel using one of the following methods.

- 1. Press the CH-/CH+ (♠)/♠) or ▲/▼ button.
- Enter the channel number using the NUMERIC(0~9) buttons to move to the channel directly.
- 3. Press the **TV/RADIO** () button to switch between TV channel and radio channel.

Note: You can switch channel using the channel list or programme guide. For more information, please refer to *Chapter 5. Channel List* and *6 Programme Guide*.

4.2 Volume Control

- Press the V-/V+ (√√) or √/b button to adjust the audio volume.
- 2. Press the MUTE () button to stop the audio temporarily.

Note: The mute function remains set while you switch channels.

4.3 Subtitle

If the current programme provides subtitle information, you can select the language for the subtitle.

- Press the SUBTITLE (

) button to display the subtitle language list.
- Select a subtitle language using the ▲/▼
 button and press the OK (∞) button. Then the
 subtitle will be displayed in the selected
 language at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Select **Off** from the subtitle language list to hide subtitle from the screen.



Note: You can select a default subtitle language in MENU - Preferences - Language Setting - Subtitle Language.

4. Basic Operation

4.4 Audio

If the current programme is available in multiple audio languages, you can select the language you prefer.

- 1. Press the AUDIO (@) button.
- Select an audio language you prefer using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (※) button.
- Select audio direction (left, right, stereo) using the ◀/▶ button.



Note:

- You can select the default audio language in MENU Preferences Language Setting Audio Language.
- If the programme in use is Dolby Digital, you cannot set the audio direction.
- If you select Dolby Digital in MENU Preferences Language Setting Audio
 Priority, the programme is automatically broadcasted in Dolby Digital audio regardless
 of default audio language.

4.5 Teletext

When the channel supports teletext, the teletext icon (\blacksquare) is displayed on the i-plate. To enter Teletext mode, press the **TELETEXT ON/OFF**(\blacksquare) button or the **SUBTITLE**(\blacksquare) button to display teletext.

1. Using Teletext Menu

- Press the MENU () button to display teletext menu in teletext mode.
- Select the required teletext function using the
 √ b button.
- 3. Press the OK (Ox) button.



Teletext Functions

Ξij Index Returns to index page. If there is no index page, jump to page 100. **E** Sub-page Searches the sub-page using the sub-code written by users. If it is not in the teletext mode, display the current time. MIX Adjusts the transparency of teletext screen. ΞX Cancel Hides the teletext except page number. ≣? Reveal Displays the concealed information. ≣♦ **Double Size** Displays the text size as double size. ≣¥ Page Hold Holds the current page not updating it.

2. Viewing Teletext Page

- Enter the page number using the NUMERIC(0~9) buttons to move to the page directly.
- 2. Press the **b**utton to move to the next page.
- 3. Press the ▼ button to move to the previous page.
- 4. Press the **CH-/CH+** (button to move to previous/next page.
- 5. Press the **BACK** (((w)) button to move back to the recently viewed pages.





4.6 Programme Information (i-plate)

Programme information is displayed for a certain period of time whenever you switch channels. You can view the programme information by pressing the i (\mathfrak{j}) button while watching a programme. Press the **EXIT** (\mathfrak{p}) button to hide the i-plate.

1. General Information

General information is displayed as follows on the screen.



- 1. Channel number and channel name
- 2. Programme name
- 3. Icons

12	Represents parental control level. Indicates the minimum level of ages for viewing the programme.
-	Displayed only when the channel is a locked channel.
-	Displayed only when the channel is a scrambled channel.
_	Displayed only when subtitle information is available.

D Digital	Displayed only when Dolby Digital is in use.
4:3	Represents the screen ratio of the programme

- 4. Current time
- 5. Detail programme information: Displayed if detailed programme information is provided.

- Channel looping mode and channel list name: If you select Within the current channel list in MENU - Edit Channels - Channel Change Mode, the icon of channel looping mode is displayed. And the channel list, which you selected, is displayed.
- 7. Programme broadcasting time and progress bar: Displays programme playing time and progress bar.
- Next programme Information : Displayed if next programme information is provided. Press the button to display the next programme information.

Note: If there is no programme information available, programme information is not displayed.

2. Detailed Programme Information

You can see the detailed information about the current programme. Press the i ((i)) button when the i-plate is displayed to view detailed information.

Note:

- Press the i (i) button again to hide the information box.
- If the detailed programme information is more than one page, use the ▲/▼ button to move to the previous/next page.



4. Basic Operation

4.7 Option List

You can view and confirm detailed information about the current channel and change the information if necessary.

Note: Press the OPT+ () button when the channel list is displayed to view the option list.

Then the following functions in the option list are performed to the current channel where the cursor is located.

1. Adding a Channel to Favourite Group

You can add the current channels to Favourite group immediately. Also, you can add a channel to multiple Favourite groups.

- 1. Press the OPT+ (button.
- 2. Select *Favourite* using the ▲/▼ button and press the ▶ or **OK** (♠) button.
- Select Favourite group using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button to register for Favourite group.
- Press the **OK** ((ix)) button again on the selected Favourite group to release the registered channel.
- 5. Move to the parent menu using the ◀ button to save the changes automatically.

Note: For detailed information about how to change Favourite group's name and how to register all channels in Favourite channel, refer to **Chapter 5. Channel List.**





2. Locking/Unlocking a Channel

You can lock or unlock the current channel while watching a programme.

- 1. Press the **OPT+** (button.
- Select Lock using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊗) or ▶ button.
- Select *Lock* option using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK ((※)) button.
- Select *Unlock* option using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button.
- You will be prompted to enter your password. Enter your password to unlock the channel.
- 6. Move to the parent menu using the ◀ button to save the changes automatically.

Note:

- When switching to the locked channel, you must enter the password to watch a programme.
- The default password is **0000**. If you have forgotten your password, please contact your local product distributor.





5. Channel List

ΤV

Three types of channel lists are provided for easy and quick channel finding.

The list of all TV channels with two sub-groups: one is sorted by channel

number, the other is sorted by channel name.

Radio The list of all radio channels with two sub-groups: one is sorted by channel

number, the other is sorted by channel name.

Favourite The list of Favourite channels with five sub-groups that you can organise

channels by your private taste.

5.1 Displaying and Switching Channel List

You can display channel list using the **LIST** (with button and switch to another channel on the channel list.

 Press the LIST ((LIST)) button while watching a programme to display the selected channel list.

 Select a channel using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button to change the channel.

- Enter the channel number directly using the NUMERIC(0~9) buttons to move the cursor to the channel you want. And then press the OK ((iii)) button to change to the selected channel.
- Press the ◀/▶ button to change a channel list group while the channel list is displayed.

Note:

- If there are multiple channels, press the PAGE-/PAGE+ (@-/@-) button to move by page.
- Each time you press the TV/RADIO () button
 while the channel list is displayed, the channel
 list will be switched between TV and radio
 channel list.
- To display scramble icon () in the channel list, select ON in MENU - Preferences -Miscellaneous Settings - Option in CH List.
- The sub-group of Favourite channel list may exist or not depending on your configuration.
- If Within the Current Channel List option is selected in MENU Edit channels Channel Change Mode, you can only change programme within the selected channel
 list using the CH-/CH+ (@)/(@) button while watching a programme.





5.2 Edit Channel Lists

You can edit all channels or each channel by channel list group.

- 1. Press the MENU (button.
- Select *Edit Channels* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊗) or ▶ button.
- Select Edit Channel Lists using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) or ▶ button.
- You will be prompted to enter your password. Enter your password using the NUMERIC(0~9) buttons.



Note:

- The default password is 0000. If you have forgotten your password, please contact your local product distributor.
- Press the BACK (๑) or ◀ button to save the changes and return to the previous menu.
 Press the MENU (๑) or EXIT (๑) button to exit the menu screen.
- You can easily navigate all menus using the assigned number for each menu. Press the
 MENU 2 1 in order to select *Edit Channel*.

1. Selecting a Channel Group

You can select the channel list group to edit. TV and radio are included as the channel list groups.

- 1. Press the **OK** (♠) or ▶ button in group.
- 2. Select the group using the ▲/▼ button and press the **OK** (♠) button.



Note:

- Press the TV/RADIO () button to move to the TV or radio channel list directly.
- For editing the Favourite channel list, move to MENU Edit Channels Edit Favourite Channels .

5. Channel List

2. Locking/Unlocking Channels

You can lock or unlock one or more channels.

- 2. Select a channel and then press the **OK** (**(w)**) button. You can select multiple channels.
- Select Lock using the ▶ button and press the OK (⋈) button.

Note:

- When the locked channel(s) is selected or all channels are locked, *Lock* is switched to *Unlock*. When you select *Unlock* and press the OK () button, locked channel is switched to an unlocked channel.
- Enter the password using the NUMERIC(0~9) buttons to watch locked channels.





Note: The default password is **0000**. If you have forgotten your password, please contact your local product distributor.

3. Selecting/Unselecting All Channels

You can select/unselect all channels at once.

- 1. Select Select All and press the OK ((iv)) button to select all channels.
- 2. Select *Unselect All* and press the **OK** ((iii)) button to unselect all the selected channels.

5.3 Edit Favourite Channels

You can edit Favourite channel or Favourite channel list.

- 1. Press the MENU (button.
- Select *Edit Channels* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (♠) or ▶ button.
- 3. Select *Edit Favourite Channels* using the __/▼ button and press the **OK** (♠) or ▶ button.
- You will be prompted to select a Favourite Group. Select a Favourite group you want to edit using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button.



Note:

- Press the BACK ((((a))) or ◀ button to save the changes and return to the previous menu.
 Press the MENU (((a))) or EXIT ((((a))) button to exit the menu screen.
- You can easily navigate all menu items using the assigned number for each menu.
 Press the MENU 2 2 in order to select Edit Favourite Channels.

The buttons for editing the Favourite channel list are described in the following table.

Add Adds Favourite channel.

Remove Removes from Favourite channel.

TV/Radio Switches between TV and radio channel list.

Fav.Group Changes Favourite channel list group.

Moves the order of channel list within Favourite channel list.

Rename Renames the name of Favourite channel list.

Sort Sorts channels by number or name in all TV/radio channel list.

Unselect All Unselect all the selected channel.

5. Channel List

1. Adding/Removing Favourite Channels

You can add Favourite channel(s) to a specific Favourite channel list or remove the added Favourite channel(s) from the list.

- 1. Select Favourite group using 👔
- Select the channel(s) you want to add in all TV/radio channel list and press to add Favourite channel(s).
- Select the channel(s) you want to remove from Favourite channel list and press to remove Favourite channel(s).





2. Moving Favourite Channels

You can move Favourite channel(s) to the location you want within the Favourite channel list. This function changes the location only without changing the channel number.

- 1. Select Favourite group using
- 2. Select the channel to move within the Favourite channel list and press the **OK** (**(**) button.
- 3. Select (☑) and press the **OK** (☑) button.
- Move the cursor to the wanted location using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button.
- 5. The selected channel(s) is moved to the location you selected.



3. Renaming Favourite Channel List

You can rename Favourite channel list.

- 1. Select Favourite group to rename using 👔 .
- 2. Select and press the **OK** () button.
- 3. Enter Favourite channel list name using the keyboard displayed on the screen.
- When finishing entering Favourite channel list name, select OK and press the OK (⋈) button.





4. Additional Features

Additional features provides many useful functions necessary when editing Favourite channels.

Changing between TV and radio channel list

You can add not only TV channel(s) but also radio channel(s) to Favourite channel list. Press to switch all channel list into TV or radio channels.

Note: You can also change to TV or radio channel by pressing TV/RADIO () button on the remote control.

5. Channel List

Selecting Favourite channel list

You can select Favourite channel list to edit. Press $\[mu]$ to display Favourite channel list. Then select the channel list using the $\[mu]/\[mu]$ button and press the **OK** $(\[mu])$ button.



Sorting a channel list

You can sort all TV or radio channel lists by channel number or name for easy Favourite channel searching. If channel lists are sorted by channel number, obj is displayed. When you press this button, all the channel lists are sorted by name. Or, if channel lists are sorted by channel name, obj is switched to 123 Press this button to order channels by number.

Unselecting all the selected channels

Press to unselect all the selected channels.

5.4 Channel Change Mode

You can change the channel either in the group or in the entire groups while watching a programme.

- 1. Press the MENU () button.
- Select *Edit Channels* using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊗) or ▶ button.
- Select Channel Change Mode using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⊗) or ▶ button.
- Select All Channels or Within the Current Channel List using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK (⋈) button.



Note: When *Within the current channel list* is selected, you can only change the channel within the current channel list. To change the channel in another channel list in which the current channel list is not located, change the channel list or select *All channels* option.

6. Programme Guide

The programme guide displays programme information about each channel, based on the date and time. You can also schedule your watching using the information given.

Note: Press the GUIDE (@) or EXIT (@) button to exit the guide screen.

6.1 Viewing Programme Guide Information

You can view programme information for all channels.

- 1. Press the GUIDE (GUIDE) button.
- Move to previous/next programme within the same channel using the ◀/▶ button.
- 3. Move to another channel using the ▲/▼
 button. If there are multiple channels, use
 PAGE-/PAGE+ (/) button to move to
 channels by page. Also, you can enter channel
 number you want using the NUMERIC(0~9)
 buttons on the remote control to move to the
 channel directly.



- Select a programme and press the **OK** ((in)) button. You can watch the programme if it is
 on air or reserve it if it is the future programme.
- 5. Press the i (1) button in the selected programme to view the detailed information for the selected channel.

1. Viewing Guide Information by Channel List Groups

You can view programme information of the selected channel list by groups.

OTA, an abbreviation of **Over-the-Air**, is a standard for the transmission of software for equipment through cable. The manufacturers reserve the right to decide when and where an update is made available. The new software version is then downloaded via cable. The software update via cable will only occur under the following circumstances.

1. The equipment should have appropriate loader software.

Caution: Please note that if normal loader software is not equipped, the product may not be updated or operate properly after software update.

2. The manufacturer transmits the software via cable.

Caution:

- Please be careful to keep the power on and the power cord plugged in during software update. If the power is off during software update, fatal damage may be caused to the product.
- Please be careful not to pull out the RF cable during software update. Update may be interrupted and the product may not operate.

- The product will not activate while software update takes place.
- It may take 5 ~10 minutes to update software.
- Scheduling operation cannot work during software update.

1. If new software is found when powering on

- 1. A message will be displayed to notify that new software is found.
- 2. Select **Yes** and press the **OK** ((ix)) button to update the software.
- 3. Starts downloading new software. Please wait until the update is completed.
- 4. When completing the software update, the product is automatically powered off and on again.

2. If a new version of software is detected during watching a programme

- A message will be displayed to notify that new software is found.



13. Troubleshooting

13.1 Trouble Shooting

Before contacting your local service centre, please read the tips below carefully. If the problem persists after completing the following procedure, please contact your local product distributor or service centre for further instructions.

- 1. No message displayed on the front panel. (The product will not switch on.)
 - Check the main power cable and make sure it is plugged into a suitable power outlet.
 - Check that the mains supply is switched on.
 - Check that the power switch is on at the rear of the product (where applicable).
 - Connect the power cable to a different power outlet.

2. No picture on TV set

- Make sure that the product is power on and in operation mode (Press the STANDBY button).
- Make sure that the AV cable is firmly connected to the TV.
- Make sure that the cable is properly connected to the product.
- Check that you search channels in the menu.
- Check the brightness level of the TV.
- Check if the channel is currently on air. Contact the broadcaster to ensure that the channel is running.
- Press the SOURCE button if the product is in external input mode.
- 3. Poor picture & sound quality
 - Make sure there is no mobile phone or microwave oven near the equipment.

4. No/poor sound

- Check that your AV cable is connected correctly.
- Check the volume levels of your TV set and the product.
- Check if the product or TV is on mute.
- Check audio type or soundtrack option in the AV menu.
- 5. Remote control does not operate.
 - To control the product., the top end of the remote control should point directly towards the receiving part of the product.
 - Remove and reinsert the batteries in the remote control.
 - Replace the batteries in the remote control for a new set.
- 6. Cannot make reservations.
 - Check that no previous reservations are conflicting with the new reservation.
 - Check that the product is switched on at the time of the reservation.

- 7. Cannot watch scrambled channels.
 - Check that you have the appropriate Smartcard. Reinsert the Smartcard and make sure it initializes correctly.
 - Check in the menu that the product is detecting the Smartcard.
 - Check in the menu that you have a valid and working subscription to the channels you wish to view.
 - Ensure that the Smartcard is not damaged.
- 8. No password information is given.
 - The default password is always **0000**.
- 9. Channel search does not work.
 - Check that your cable is connected correctly.
- 10. Cannot update new software.
 - You can get an update. If the product does not show a message requesting update, that means no software is available.
- 11. Cannot watch pay channels.
 - Check in the menu that you have a valid and working subscription to the channels you wish to view.

15. Glossary

EPG (Electronic Programme Guide)

An electronic equivalent to a printed television listings magazine; it is an application used with digital set-top boxes and digital television sets to list current and scheduled programs that are or will be available on each channel, including a short summary or commentary for each program. The information supplied in the EPG is sent and updated by the channel broadcaster.

Frequency

The property of a signal measured in cycles per second (=Hz).

Hi-Fi (High Fidelity)

The characteristics of audio devices that can play back all the audio frequencies a person can detect, which is the range of 16Hz#20KHz. Sometimes it is used to indicate good quality of audio devices such as stereo tape recorders.

OSD (On Screen Display)

OSD displays the basic information necessary for the users to configure monitor or TV settings. OSD information may include brightness, contrast, tuning, RGB adjustment, and screen size and position.

OTA (Over the Air) or OAD (Over Aerial Download)

A standard for the transmission of software for equipment, through a broadcast system. Manufacturers reserve the right for deciding the release of the software for their products.

SCART

A 21-pin connector standard to connect two pieces of Audio-Visual equipment such as a TV and a VCR. Each device will have a 21-pin female connection; a cable with male connection at both ends is used for connecting the devices.

S/PDIF (Sony/Philips Digital Interface format)

A standard format for the transfer of digital audio signals. It allows the transfer of digital audio between two devices without any conversion to and from analogue, which could degrade the signal quality.

Smartcard

A credit card sized card that contains updateable chip memory. It is used for accessing Pay TV (encrypted) channel or services when inserted into an appropriate receiver.

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
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
